It has been particularly reassuring to have the experience of Paul Quick as Director of Life Saving in such a crucial role and I thank him for his support and guidance navigating through the significant challenges imposed on surf lifesaving operations over the past two seasons.

Thank you to the Board for their endeavours & support throughout the last two season especially during the 107 day lockdown last year and have successfully managed all aspects of the Club, Life Saving/Education, Nippers, Surf Sports, Finances and Member recognition which has been the highest in memory.

Education underpins the whole of Surf Life Saving and the immense contribution of trainers, assessors and facilitators is greatly appreciated by Board. This season the Club welcomed Dwayne Robinson as the new Director of Education and despite the restrictions of COVID policies has carried the workload along with his team in an effective and professional manner - the Education team oversaw 100 new awards and more than 470 re-qualifications during 2021/22.

Surf Sports competitors provided some of the highlights of the season and Club thanks DOC Joel Green and Head Coach Ryan Quick for the contribution to a successful season. Whilst State Championship were cancelled the performances at Aussies 22 were exceptional. Highlighted by Hayden Macgregor's Gold in U13 Surf Race and Bronze in the Iron person; Ryan Green's Gold in the U19 Board race was one the performances of Aussies 22 and congratulations to Ryan on his selection for Australian Team at the World Championships. And not to ever forget the annual elite performances of the Club Masters athletes in Paul Lemmon & Hayden Smith who again achieved remarkable performances.

The Club is well served by the strong IRB Team, evidence by the number of awards they received at the Clubs presentation. With a full racing season for the first time in 3 years IRB have a had strong performance over the first 4 rounds including putting on a great carnival at Terrigal.

Terrigal SLSC is fortunate to have Julie Redfern as its Member Services Director. The pandemic provided many challenges for the Club over the past 2 years, Julie ensured our Club complied with the numerous State Health & SLSNSW policies changes throughout the past two years and provided clear communication to the Board and our members on compliance directives from NSW Government Health Policies and SLS NSW which were so important to ensure the Club operated in the safest environment possible. In addition, Julie has promoted the recognition for many our members for their outstanding contributions to Surf Life Saving including SLSA National Medals of Service, Central Coast Australia Day awards , Central Coast Sports awards , SLSCC, SLSNSW & SLSA Awards of Excellence, Terrigal SLSC Life Members and Honour Blazer nominations. The Club acknowledged Julie's contribution by awarding her the Club Volunteer of Year 2021/22 as to reinforce how fortunate the Club is - Julie Redfern was named by NSW Government as the NSW Woman of Excellence for 2022 and also won the SLS NSW Volunteer of the Year.

Financially the Club, despite the extend COVID lockdown 107days operated profitability and continues to maintain its strong financial position. The Club has sourced several grants to support the purchase of vital surf lifesaving equipment. One of the Boards successful initiatives was to apply for funds through the NSW Office of Sport to fund the installation solar panels on the Club. Installation completed November 2021 and to date the Club, (despite the poor weather) has saved over \$4,500 in energy costs with an estimate annual savings of over \$10,000.

Club Renovations – Minister for Sport Stuart Ayres announced that the Club has been successful in its grant application and has been awarded \$500,000.

The Club was delighted for Beris Meldrum (Director of Finance) being recognised for her longstanding contribution to Surf Life Saving as Beris was awarded Life Membership of Surf Life Saving Central Coast – a wonderful acknowledgement of Beris' 30 plus years' service to Surf Life Saving.

It has been a privilege to be part of a strong and committed Club as Terrigal SLSC over the past two challenging but thoroughly rewarding seasons.

LIFESAVING REPORT 2021.2022

VIGILANCE AND SERVICE. That is what we are about, as a club and as Lifesavers.

Terrigal SLSC has wrapped up for the patrol season that was certainly one to be looked back on. We have endured a start were COVID required patrol strengths to be limited for the first 13 patrols in accordance with SLSNSW COVID policy. We endured many weekends of dangerous seas, closed beaches, polluted waters, floating debris and a Tsunami alert.

Through all this, our patrolling members performed wonderfully in their duties keeping the public safe on our beach. No lives were lost. 30x Rescues were performed. First aid treatments totalled 1,985. Patrols carried out 1,616 preventative actions. There were 7 lost children incidences, all with a happy outcome. We had 170,808 people attend Terrigal beach over the season. Overall, our members carried out 7,914 patrol hours.

Not only whilst on rostered patrols did club members perform rescues but also out of hours and on weekdays, they were called upon to assist or carry out rescues during the season. One area of concern that developed this season was down by the bend where many after hours' rescues were performed by members and also assisting Council lifeguards.

The Terrigal board nominated a number of these rescues by members through Surf Lifesaving NSW for recognition of rescue of the month. Terrigal was awarded state Rescue of the Month by SLSNSW for a mass rescue on the 2nd of April in this area by patrol 9 headed by patrol captain Glenn Bowles. Well done to all involved. Due to the increased dangers down near the bend I have being lobbying with Central Coast branch and Central Coast council to have the installation of a tower for lifesavers and lifeguards in carrying out their duties. We hope to have

something in place for the coming season. The board of Terrigal SLSC give a huge thank you to all our patrol members for the time they have given.

The club is in good stead, with the amount of quality rescue equipment we have at our disposal. We have sufficient IRB's, motors, radios, rescue boards and first aid equipment to perform our duties at Terrigal beach when called upon. Each season we have new bronze medallion and award members step up to patrols and I asked for any members that wish to expand their awards, to come forward for patrol captain, IRB driver and IRB crewperson training to bolster these fields. A lot of behind-the-scenes work is carried out by a few members and not seen by the majority of our membership throughout the season. I would like to thank our call out team personally, Noeline Hickey our first aid officer, Peter Connolly radio officer, John and Roger IRB captain and our trainers and assessors who put our members through their awards and proficiency's.

Thank you to Central Coast Branch for their assistance and support and also the good working relationship we have with Council lifeguards throughout the year. Thank you to all our club sponsors and especially our patrol sponsors who give us invaluable support to enable us to provide such a professional service to the community year in year out. I would like to congratulate the Terrigal board for their guidance and strong work ethics throughout the year to get Terrigal surf club to the strong position it is currently in. Well done to our outgoing directors Kevin Porter, Joel Green and Richard Green for your years of service. Terrigal surf club over the past years has increased its financial stability, has progressed through the DA stage of the extensions to our surf club that will provide a great asset to our members and the community in future years. I will stand down next season from Club Captain role and allow another member to fulfill this role.

MEMBER SERVICES REPORT

The challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic continued for the first half of the 2021-2022. This presented many challenges including a vaccination policy introduced by SLSNSW and reduced patrol hour requirements for competitors. We were pleased Terrigal SLSC was largely able to continue activities during the pandemic despite the closure of shower areas in order to meet social distancing and hygiene compliance requirements introduced by the NSW Government. Our club also had to prepare numerous COVID-safe plans, introduce check-in QR codes, cleaning and COVID-vaccination regulation. We understand this was not ideal and the pandemic placed enormous strain and stress on people all around the world.

As a public-facing entity with a focus on health and safety we felt the club had an important role to play in our local community. Our club became a place where people could continue to have physical activity and some social interaction despite social distancing requirements. We thank all our members for their patience through this period and we are hopeful we are now past the need for further regulations. Despite the pandemic, most club activities continued (although some in a modified format). Our members were involved in competition, lifesaving, education, recognition and events across the sphere of surf life saving activities. As Director of Member Services, it is my passion that Terrigal SLSC be a place where people from varied backgrounds and with varied skills and interests can be involved. At Terrigal SLSC we remain committed to Child safe practices and this includes confirming working with children checks, child safe training and implementation of the SLSA Member Protection Policy.

Communication

The club utilises a variety of communication strategies. We encourage all members to be proactive about reading and accessing these. They include social media, BluesNews, surfguard (text and email) and our club website (www.terrigalsurfclub.com.au). It is a massive undertaking to prepare and produce content rapidly for these various platforms and we are thankful to all our volunteers who produce the. We thank Fiona Killman who is stepping down from this role at the end of the 2021-22 season. We also encourage members to share any content with the Director of Member Services for potential inclusion. This season we endeavoured to have an active and positive social media presence. Our primary social media channels have very active followings 'Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Facebook Page' (3167 followers) and 'Terrigal Nippers' Facebook page (1079 followers) and @terrigalslsc Instagram account (1661 followers). Our TSLSC facebook page had a reach of around 37,000 during the season which is quite extraordinary. There are also numerous other private groups for training and other areas of the club (e.g., training, IRB, Master's and pool rescue groups). Directors and Nipper Age Managers also utilise communication platforms such as 'What's App' in addition to club email addresses. These pages are an excellent way of linking with other clubs and promoting and sharing activities at Terrigal SLSC. All are closely monitored and are an efficient communication strategy but must also meet SLS policies regarding use of social media.

SLSCC and SLS NSW Participation

Several of our juniors attended the SLSCC Development session and presented ideas to the Board early in the season. Congratulations to all our junior leaders. Youth activities include several Members achieve Duke of Edinburgh Awards through SLS. This included Bronze Awards to Erin Hamilton, Jayden Redfern and Trent Pantle. Jayden Redfern also achieved his Silver Award and Emma Amies her Gold Award. These are a wonderful achievement and involve service to SLS as a key component pf the overall awards. Jayden Redfern was also a

facilitator for the SLSCC 13-14 Development Program and participated in the 17-19 years SLSC Leadership Program as well as being selected for the SLS NSW Youth Opportunity Makers Camp. We are also please to advise that Dwayne Robertson and Ben Hibberd attend the SLS NSW State Conference and learned an enormous amount during the 2-day program. Julie Redfern also was also selected to be a panellist for the SLS NSW Awards of Excellent Selection process.

EDUCATION REPORT

My first year in the role as Director of Education and I have been on a steep learning curve (with a few bumps along the way). I will start by expressing my sincere thanks to the Education Team and the other Directors who have assisted with their knowledge, experience and good-will to guide me in the right direction (as best they could).

Education underpins the whole of Surf Life Saving and the contribution of the trainers, assessors, and facilitators is not always appreciated. These people give of their time freely, to train, maintain, assess, and qualify every award that is necessary for the continued operation of the TSLSC. This includes maintaining their own development, education, course preparation and administration. All this time and commitment is unseen. This has included the obtainment of over 100 new awards and more than 470 requalification's during the 2021-22 season.

This season TSLSC performed 30 rescues, all had successful outcomes by having qualified, skilled people in the right place. In short, people got to go home from the beach that probably would not have. This is something that individually and at a club level we should be very proud of (not to forget the first aids, preventive actions etc).

Covid19 has presented ongoing challenges in conducting training and re-qualifications. This has included learning to use various delivery and assessment techniques. It has been important to maintain functionality in anticipation of a return to 'normal training and re-qualification' practices in the next season. There is ongoing progress in this space and is should be anticipated that 'apps' and the use of computer-based education will continue to grow.

There has been and will be ongoing change in relation to awards and education practices. It is anticipated that a Patrol Captains Day will be conducted to make sure that the knowledge and practices through the club are current and consistent (anticipating that the relevant knowledge will be passed forward to the Patrols by the Patrol Captains/ Vice Captains).

Report on the Audit of the Financial Report

Opinion

We have audited the financial report of Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Inc. which comprises the statement of financial position, the income and expenditure statement, statement of cash flows as at 30 April 2022, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and the Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Inc. Statement by Members of the Committee.

In our opinion the financial report of Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Inc. has been prepared in accordance with Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act ("ACNC Act") 2012, and the Associations Incorporations Act NSW including:

- (a) giving a true and fair view of the registered entity's financial position as at 30 April 2022 and of its financial performance for the year ended 30 April 2022; and
- (b) complying with Australian Accounting Standards and Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulation 2013.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. We are independent of the registered entity in accordance with the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Emphasis of Matter - Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Inc. financial reporting responsibilities under the ACNC Act and Associations Incorporations Act NSW. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Responsibility of the Committee for the Financial Report

The committee are responsible for the preparation of the financial report that gives a true and fair view and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1 to the financial report is appropriate to meet the requirements of the ACNC Act and the Associations Incorporations Act NSW. The committee's responsibility also includes such internal control as the committee determine is necessary to enable the preparation of a financial report that gives a true and fair view and is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial report, committee is responsible for assessing Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Inc.'s ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters

NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Plant & Equipment Depreciation

Plant and equipment are recorded at cost and are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives.

The depreciation rates used for each class of assets are:

Plant and equipment which has an estimated useful life of one year or less have been expensed at purchase and are shown as gear purchases in the Club's profit and loss account.

(b) GST Units

Under the provisions of GST legislation relating to non-profit bodies, the Club has established independent accounting units for its separate functions with differing GST treatments.

The accounts of each of these independent units have been amalgamated in the preparation of the Club's accounts.

(c) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax and accordingly no liability is recorded.

(d) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

(e) Leases

The Club leases the land on which the Club premises are erected from a trust pursuant to the Crown Lands Act. A license has been provided to another entity to operate a café on part of those premises (refer note 19). As the Club is a not-for-profit entity the value of the lease of the premises has not been estimated. License fees from the sub-lease are taken up as income on an accrual basis.

(f) Revenue

Revenue is recognised as follows:

- Members income, donations and sponsorship revenue is recognised on receipt and recording in the books of the Surf Club.
- Income from the sale of merchandise and product from the canteen is recognised when the merchandise or product from the canteen is supplied to the customer.
- Income from hire of the club house (hall hire) is recognised at the time the club house is provided to the customer.

The above relates to the photocopier. In addition to the above, a charge of one cent per black and white copy and ten cents per colour copy is payable.

b) Insurance Coverage

The Club is covered for all public liability claims under the public liability policy established by the NSW Surf Life Saving Association. Policies covering damage to or theft of property and workers compensation have also been taken out directly by the Club. Accordingly, the Committee believes that its insurance coverage is adequate to cover contingencies in these instances.

NOTE 20 – CAFÉ LICENCE

The licence to operate the café has been agreed with the licensee.

The license to operate the café arose from the exercise of an option on an existing licence and is for a 5 year period commencing 25 September 2017.

The license per annum from 25 August 2020 is \$106,119 plus GST. Rental increases by the consumer price index on each anniversary.

Relief in accordance with National Cabinet Mandatory Code of Conduct SME Commercial Leasing Principles During Covid-19 was provided. The relief consisted of a rent waiver of \$5,924 and a rent deferral of \$5,924 in relation to the year ended 30 April 2021. The deferred rent was paid to the Club in the year ending 30 April 2022.

NOTE 21 – SURPLUS RESERVED FOR CLUB MAINTENANCE AND RENOVATION

Funds on hand are invested to cover the ongoing running and maintenance costs of club, part funding of planned future upgrade of the club and a safety net in case our yearly income, sponsorship or grants are no longer forthcoming.

NOTE 22 - EVENTS SUBSEQUENT TO REPORTING DATE

Except for the event described in Note 22 there have been no events subsequent to reporting date which would have a material effect on the Club's financial statements at 30 April 2022.

NOTE 23 - CORONAVIRUS IMPACT ON THE CLUB

To 30 April 2022 there has been considerable economic impacts in Australia and globally from the outbreak of the Coronavirus, and Government actions to reduce the spread of the virus and compensate for the consequent economic losses. Subsequent to 30 April 2022 these economic impacts continue to occur and evolve.

The Committee has assessed the effect of the Coronavirus and its impact on the financial performance. For the year ended 30 April 2022, the Club has been affected by the Coronavirus in the following manner:

- (a) The club received support from the NSW Government the small business hardship grant \$10,500 (2021- \$nil
- (b) The Club has received the Federal Government's Cash Flow Boost of \$Nil (2021: \$10,000).
- (c) The Club received funding from Surf Life Saving NSW of \$nil (2021: 19,433)

The financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2022 reflect the events described above up to that date.

Other financial effects of the Coronavirus on revenues, membership etc are not possible to be determined,

At the date of signing the financial statements the Committee are unable to determine financial effects, if any, the Coronavirus may have on the Club from 30 April 2022.
