PRESIDENTS REPORT

As I reflect on the 2012-13 surf season, I see in our recent history a lot of great achievements and also some challenges ahead for our club to continue to thrive.

Firstly I would like to thank all position holders within our club, including age managers, officials, trainers, assessors, coaches, patrol captains/vice captains and of course the Board. The management of the diverse activities and opportunities offered by our club is a complex and demanding task, and all of our position holders have done a mighty job in their commitment to their roles over the last season.

This past season, our club has continued to grow, with a nearly 10% increase in membership, to just under 1200 members. Our increasing membership is a great testament to our club and its activities, and the great people who lead and drive these activities, however it also brings challenges – how big is too big?

While we would love to allow hundreds of new members, we know we have outgrown our existing facility, and have been working with architects and Council to develop new plans that will redevelop the southern end of the clubhouse. These plans are nearing completion and we hope to start moving towards approvals in the next 6 months, in the meantime we need to seek funding opportunities and also fundraise. Meanwhile, we continue to focus on member retention, skill development and encouraging more members to take on leadership roles within the club.

In November 2012, our club was named Club of the Year, by the Central Coast Sports Federation, a title we are extremely proud to have achieved and one that will drive our club into the future.

With 344 Active patrolling lifesavers, Terrigal is well placed to deliver on our lifesaving agreement. We patrol long hours over the summer season and are being called upon more and more out of hours, which is a cultural shift in lifesaving that we are still coming to grips with. Our patrol captains and other key position holders do a great job in lifesaving to encourage the skill development and continual lifesaving education of our patrol teams, which is vital for their continued evolution.

Our Nipper program continues to grow and develop, with an increase of nipper membership this season of 18%. We have a core of fantastic volunteers including the JAC and Age Managers who give our nippers a solid grounding in surf skills, education and fun. This is resulting in great retention of our youth through into lifesaving which is what we are all about. Activities such as Rescue Day, our great Surf Ed team of trainers, mentoring/coaching by our senior competitors and coaches, and the variety of nipper days offered at Terrigal keep our kids enthusiastic and developing throughout their nipper experience.

The Education team at Terrigal continues to train and qualify high quality lifesavers, this season they trained and assessed 46 new Bronze members and 22 SRC as well as numerous other awards. They are dedicated, highly professional trainers who do a fantastic job especially in guiding new members through their Bronze or SRC and onto patrol teams. It is also a huge task at Terrigal to put all members through annual requals, 914 were conducted this season alone and they manage this process efficiently and effectively for all Terrigal members.

In Competition, this season saw growth in boats and lifesaving particularly, which is very rewarding and gives our members lots of different pathways to follow. We had 4 members Tim Schofield, Rachelle King, Keelan Bridge and Jack Waddell represent Australia at Rescue 2012 and in other events and we have several competitors in the National High Performance programs including those already mentioned as well as Jack Moyes and Elyssia Gasparotto. Our Youth Team (with only small numbers) managed to achieve 2nd Place at Rescue 2012, which was an outstanding achievement. Terrigal would like to take this opportunity to thank Paul Stone for his years of coaching at Terrigal and wish him well in his new career in the tropics.

Behind the scenes, an enormous amount of work goes into keeping the club open for business including repairs, administration, maintenance, sponsorship and financial management. To everyone involved in these areas, thank you....thank you. This season we employed a dedicated functions manager, and Natalie Whinneray has definitely lifted the standard and delivery of functions which is driving a core revenue component for our continued success.

We would like to congratulate our major award winners for this season, Toni Jones our Clubperson of the Year, Kyle Stimson - Young Clubperson, Georgia Robinson - Junior Clubperson, Josh Cole - Patrolperson, Rene Sturmberg - Young Patrolperson, David Smith – Volunteer, Aaron Ronalds – Rookie and Derek Taylor – Instructor of the Year. We would also like to take this opportunity to congratulate Paul Quick on election to Life Membership of Central Coast Branch.



Finally I would like to thank the Board of our club, who contribute many, many hours and manage an enormously diverse and challenging organisation to the best of their ability....simply put, our club would not be the same without you. I would also like to thank Branch for their continued promotion of lifesaving within the community and support of all clubs.

In addition, to the painting, a very successful club working bee was held on the morning before the AGM in June. The club house was in a much better state following this. Thanks to all those members who gave their time for the working bee.

Not strictly the role of the Director of Administration, but this year I took over running the annual Terrigal Ocean Swim. Despite looming storms, we had another very successful day with just under 200 entries and making almost \$8000 for the club.

I look forward to continuing in the role of Director of Administration for the next year or two and coordinating the Ocean Swim into the future.

FUNCTION CENTRE REPORT

VENUE HIRE COSTS

Last year I introduced a new venue hire pricing structure, increasing the hire costs however including a more professional approach to our services. Now when you hire the venue you have a concierge to assist you during the day, we supply pads, pens, mints and iced waters and clothed tables. The more professional approach to our presentation and services has increased our corporate market. We are also offering catering packages with the assistance of the Surf Café and clients are able to use us now as a one stop shop rather than a DIY.

We have had to cancel a lot of the weekly community events to enable us to sell the room on a regular basis but the loss from these events are non-existent as the rates were not even covering cleaning costs. I have also increased the community rates to \$65.00 per hour for one off hire. As an example the Gosford Police in previous years used the venue and used to pay a donation of \$200 - \$250. This year they hired the venue at a fee of \$550.00 and did not hesitate.

Again venue hire has been increased slightly for evening events but we are including a more extensive service offering full styling, co-ordination, assistance with caterers etc. Again offering more of a one stop shop is proving to be popular with our clients. Last Wedding season we had 1 Wedding, for next season I have already secured 7 events in the past month or two and are hoping this will still increase.

QUOTE RESPONSE/RESULTS

My quote turnover time is proving to be successful picking up a lot of last minute bookings due to the fact that my attention is on response time. Because of this we are winning business because we are responding in a timely fashion unlike our competitors. In addition to this I am sending written communication, brochures and photos which are selling the venue also.

For the first quarter of 2013 I increased profit by 50% on last year and hope these results continue to be so positive.

MARKETING

I am now starting on a marketing drive offering daily delegate rates for Winter events, all inclusive venue hire for private functions (whilst eating into our venue hire profit slightly) I stipulate the offers are only available with a minimum bar tab which guarantees beverage revenue for the winter season.

BAR

I have stipulated to all staff that their presentation and levels of service must be higher. Staff are now in uniform and I will be designing a training programme in due course.

DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION REPORT

This last season at Terrigal has been a very busy and productive one in Education. We have produced some high quality Lifesavers, advanced the skills of many current lifesavers into higher levels of knowledge and requalified over 300 Active patrol members.

Personally my second season in this role has been extremely busy with me moving into more of a managerial role allowing space and freedom for our newer trainers to gain time in the field and lots of experience. I mentored many of our team seeing lots of improvements in knowledge and delivery across the season.

We started off the season by holding the clubs first ever education field day – good attendance and great participation by all. We came away more informed and open minded to future possibilities. We had updates on new techniques and plenty of group open forum time to let everyone get their ideas out on the table.

The education team always like to be innovative about the way things are done -this last season has been no exception. We ran both of our Bronze courses using the Vocational Education and Training assess as you go option. This makes for an easier end of course with no big drawn out assessment day required and no big stress for the participants. Thanks must also go to Tony Smith and Dave Mansfield for assisting with extra board training or outside of hours updates and support as required.

A big thank you this season must go to Toni Jones for her ongoing willingness to drag herself and or her family in to help us out as required. Toni also did her training officers certificate and assisted in training the nippers and all of our SRC participants.

We have over time developed and fostered a growing and tight education team at Terrigal. This last season has also seen the advent of a smaller core team I have used to assist with ongoing management and other education initiatives. So aside from the many helpers that put in countless hours helping to educate and train our members I must highlight a few stand outs that attend monthly meetings (even on freezing dark and cold off season week nights)

Toni Jones – absolutely awesome effort across the whole spectrum of education activities last season, Andrew Davison – has developed into one of the most committed & competent surf trainers I have worked with and has really learnt how to make things happen , Dave Mansfield – Plays a special role overseeing things, mentoring, offering advice and stories that really enlighten our new recruits and after all Dave`s years in this organisation he is always keen to learn new things , Kellie Snelling – wow Kellie agreed to take on the management of our proficiency days for me this season & took it on full steam ahead - one of the best run proficiency programmes I have seen, particularly given the super large number of active members we have to manage. Kellie roped in Craig Pollington and Allison Sharkey –Smith to join the fun, all doing amazing. The 2012/2013 season saw a significant changing of the guard at Terrigal Nippers, with the following key personnel stepping down from their roles in Junior Activities:

- Beginners Water Coaches – Greg Smith & Matt Reynolds
- Beach Coaches – Chris & AJ Jones
- U6-U7 Age Manager – Hilton Farquar



I would like to acknowledge our appreciation of the efforts of all of these people, which has laid a solid foundation for the ongoing success of our Junior Activities program. These people had a wealth of knowledge with the operation of our Junior Activities, and all were happy to assist and/or provide advice and/or information when requested. Hilton has even provided all of his personally owned nippers equipment for the new U6 & U7 age managers to use, which is greatly appreciated.

Fortunately, we had a number of nipper parents and non-parent volunteers step up and assist with filling and undertaking the required Junior Activities roles, and we have had a very active and dedicated Junior Activities Committee.

Significant achievements for our 2012/2013 season include the following:

- The JAC adopted the previous Strategic Objectives of:
 - **Strategic Objective 1 - "Systemise" Nippers into a repeatable process** – Thanks to the systems that Greg Rippon had put in place, we have documented a well-balanced Junior Activities program including special nippers days.
 - **Strategic Objective 2 - Improve our competitive capabilities and are respected for our team spirit and integrity** - We were very fortunate to have a number of new very dedicated water and beach coaches for the 2012/2013 season, which resulted in very good coaching participation rates, and clear improvement in skills and results for many of our nippers. Terrigal Nippers achieved fantastic results at all local SLSCC carnivals and at the SLSNSW State Age Championships, represented the Club with pride, and displayed great team spirit and sportsmanship.
 - **Strategic Objective 3 - Develop our coaching capabilities including succession and training systems** – We had Derek Taylor and James Purcell complete the SLSA Level 1 Coaching course. Plans have been put in place to conduct a SLSA Level 0 Coaching Course for all age managers and future coaches going forward (ie commencing early in the 2013/2014 season).
 - **Strategic Objective 4 - To get back to red and yellow basics** – This season we had a combined Nippers Rescue/Life Saving Day which continued on from the award winning programs established by Greg Rippon. This day included a range of activities such as Tube Rescues, Board Rescues, IRB & Jet Ski Rescues, How a Patrol Works, First Aid & CPR, and Life Saving Scenarios. Special thanks to all the volunteers who assisted on this special day, in particular from the lifesaving, education and IRB sections of the Club.
 - **Strategic Objective 5 - To improve the nippers experience** – This season we continued with the U8's "welcome tunnel" for nippers transitioning into the U8s, Age managers discretion days, the Inter Club fun day (with North Avoca and Wamberal), Twilight nippers, The Spirit of Terrigal Award to recognise club spirit and passion, and our now annual Father & Nipper Camping Weekend at Fingal Bay at the end of the nipper season. This season we also introduced "Fun Days" with the pontoon and fun activities the week after carnivals, our BBQ at the Haven (a lunchtime BBQ and social get together after nippers), and we had our inaugural Nippers Disco after Twilight Nippers. We also conducted a transition presentation for the U7's at the end of the season, introducing them to the U8 activities and general information about our nippers days, Club Championship and carnivals.
 - **Strategic Objective 6 - To support the beachface - our age managers** – Our new age managers attended the SLSCC Age Managers Course, and Tony O'Mara continued with mentoring of the new U8's age managers. All nipper parents were encouraged to support and assist their age managers at the DoJA briefing at the start of the season.
- **Terrigal Carnivals** – We were again successful with being granted the first SLSCC local junior carnival for the 2012/2013 season in early November 2012. There were approximately 1,300 nipper competitors and over 230 officials and water safety volunteers in attendance. Thanks to the efforts of many TSLSC members and

nipper parents, the carnival went extremely well, and Terrigal SLSC were subsequently praised by SLSCC for our efforts and for hosting such a successful carnival.

Terrigal SLSC also hosted the first SLSCC Newcastle Permanent Ironperson Carnival in late October 2012 which was also a success.

Terrigal SLSC also hosted a number of the water events for the SLSNSW State Age Championships which were re-located from Ocean Beach/Umina SLSC due to uncontested conditions. Again, thanks to the efforts of many TSLSC members and nipper parents, these events ran extremely well, and Terrigal SLSC were subsequently praised by SLSNSW for our efforts and for hosting these events so successfully at short notice.



- **Social Fundraising Events** – One of our objectives this season was to improve our social interaction, and to give nipper parents the chance to get to know each other, have a good time and also raise money for Terrigal Nippers while we do it. The Nippers Spring Ball held in early November 2012 was another huge success, with a great night had by all and we raised over \$7,000 on the night. This season we also held our first Nippers Trivia Night in early February 2013, which was very well attended, and another great night was had and we raised over \$4,000 on the night. A special thanks to our “Balls Up Committee” of Kim Baxter, Vicky Purcell, Kirsten Hartz and Sue Hayes for all their efforts, and to all of our sponsors and donors, for making these fundraising events such a huge success.

- **Other Social Events** – We also held the following other social events that were well supported and received:
 - BBQ at The Haven
 - Friday Night SIP's events
 - Post Carnival SIP's Presentations
 - Nippers Disco
 - Father & Nipper Camping Weekend
 - Nippers Presentation Night

- **Junior Activities Budget** – Thanks to the significant funds raised at the Nippers Spring Ball, the Nippers BBQ, the SLSCC Terrigal Carnival revenue, and The Nippers Trivia Night, the JAC are in the fortunate position of being totally financially self-sufficient (ie paying all our own operational costs including coaching and officials training, upgrades to the Nippers Cage, board and equipment repairs, new training aids and BBQ), and having significant funds left over which are available for discretionary spending. Items being considered by the JAC are a new Nippers Gear Trailer, new training aids and new nipper boards.



- **Membership** – Due to the success of our nippers program over recent years, we have grown our direct membership of nippers to around 385 nippers. This season saw a huge influx of new U6 and U7 nippers (approx. 135 in total), in addition to a number of competitive nippers re-locating to Terrigal SLSC from other clubs due to our nipper activities and coaching programs.

- **Competition Results** – Terrigal Nippers performed extremely well at carnivals this season, with clear 2nd overall placing at the three SLSCC junior carnivals and at the SLSCC Branch Carnival, a clear 1st overall placing at the SLSCC Beach Only Carnival, and an excellent 10th overall placing at the NSW State Age Championships (noting that many of the events that we do well in were cancelled due to the prevailing conditions).

We also had a number of Terrigal Nippers compete in a number of specialty ironperson events and other junior carnivals including the Forster Weekend of Surf, Manly Nipper Nats, and Hunter Branch junior carnivals.



At all events our Terrigal Nippers represented the Club with pride and achieved many fantastic results, with many medals and personal bests. Congratulations to all of our nipper competitors. The Club should be extremely pleased and proud of our Terrigal Nippers carnival performances and results this season.

- **Officials Training** – A significant issue that we have faced in recent years is getting nipper parents to participate and fulfil our obligations as carnival officials. This season we were very fortunate to have Chris Jones and Richard Hudson undertake two SLSC Level 0 Officials training courses, which has resulted in us now having more than 35 new accredited carnival officials. We are proposing to run these Level 0 Officials training courses each season, to further increase our accredited carnival officials numbers.
- **Water Safety Proposal** – Another significant issue that we have faced in recent years is getting nipper parents and Club members to participate and fulfil our obligations for water safety at our nippers days, nippers training and at junior carnivals. The JAC have proposed and now have TSLSC Board approval for a dedicated Water Safety Patrol which shall be trialled in the 2013/2014 season, which should cover water safety requirements at our nippers days, nippers training, and junior carnivals. The final details and composition of the Water Safety Patrol shall be finalised and confirmed in the off-season for implementation in the 2013/2014 season.
- **Juniors Communication** – Communication with nipper parents and Club members in the past and present season has primarily been thru “Blue News”. The JAC are reviewing additional methods of effectively communicating with nipper parents including an improved and interactive Juniors web site page (ie part of the Clubs web site), via Facebook (potentially with closed groups for each age group), direct email and/or sms communication, etc. Communication proposals shall be developed in the off-season for implementation in the 2013/2014 season.



- **JAC Strategic Review** - In March 2013 Tony O'Mara proposed to the TSLSC Board that the JAC undertake a Strategic Review of it's operations. Tony has provided the following details about this review:
 - In March 2013 the JAC commenced a review of our operations aimed at ensuring we were well placed to meet the challenges of the future. The issues confronting TSLSC and our JAC are no different to most volunteer sporting organisations in particular those involving children. The number of nippers in the younger years is growing, but most parents are new to surf life saving and many of our core volunteers children are now moving to the senior ranks leaving a skill shortage in many areas.
 - The strategic review examined areas we did well, such as coaching and also what we could build on and areas that as a JAC and Club we could improve on. This included our provision of water safety for both training and nipper events, engagement of parents and the use of social media as a communication tool. Importantly it provided the opportunity to look at why we are here? With consensus being Surf, Skills, Sport and Safety - Terrigal Nippers Future Lifesavers.
 - An outcome of the process and thanks to the input of many members, has been the opportunity to develop a JAC new structure aimed at engaging as many members as possible and allowing for the sharing of roles and mentoring of administrators, age managers, coaches and officials to ensure that TSLSC remains at the forefront of junior life saving on the Central Coast. The review is just the beginning with a new JAC charged with developing further and implementing for the coming season and beyond.

LIFE MEMBERS' REPORT

The financial report has disclosed that the Life Members Fund enjoys a credit balance of \$58,203.02 (Fifty eight thousand two hundred and three dollars 02¢). These funds are held at National Australia Bank A/c # 53878-3225 (\$530.30) and Term Deposit #12-236-0215 (\$57,672.72). This Term Deposit is due to mature on 29th August, 2013. The deposit and interest due to \$848.19 will be rolled over for a further term.

The Life Members fund has seen an increase of \$6,021.46 over the past year. The majority of this is interest of \$2,938.42 and the net proceeds of the Melbourne Cup Function of \$3,083.00. In addition, gross bar takings of \$1,700.00 were received of which the surf club would have received approximately \$1,000 plus in net profit. In addition, a further \$300 was donated to the Club by a member from the Melbourne Cup function and a member of the public donated \$500 directly to the Club due to the Life Member efforts.

During the financial year the Life Members Fund has directly and indirectly contributed in excess of \$1,800.00.

Donations to the Surf Club have now exceeded \$14,000 since the Fund was established in 1983. The vision for the establishment of the Fund was to create a "Future Fund" for the enhancement of the Club's growth in the ensuing years. The fund is not there for the utilization by any committee or committees. The Fund is fully run by the Life Members and is conducted on a perpetual basis.

Below is a short summary of the history of the Life Members Fund –

- Foundation of the Life Members Fund during 1983. Foundation members were Life Member Mark Power and Life Member Peter Wyllie.
- Fund established for future members to receive the benefit of the past and present members of the Club.
- Fund to be conducted on a perpetual basis and continue to remain this way.
- Core assets to be retained to ensure the future of the Trust.
- An amount of up to 80% of the interest earned to be donated to the Club at the discretion of the trustees on an annual basis. Thus a minimum amount of the remaining 20% of interest income will be retained to ensure future growth of the Fund.
- The Fund will not intentionally impede on the Club's fund raising efforts and all funds raised in the name of the Fund to be retained by the Fund.
- Life Member Jack Tennent made a donation from his estate in 1989-1990 season of the sum of \$1,000.
- First objective target of the Fund was \$10,000 and this was achieved in the 1992/1993 season.
- Funds in excess of \$14,000 have been donated to the Club since the Fund was established in 1983. This amount has been made up of direct cash donations and the value of the jackets which are presented on the Awards of Excellence Night.
- The vision for this Fund is that in the future the Fund will be able to provide one or more scholarships/sponsorships for the members of the Club on an annual basis. These awards will take the form of educational funding or direct sporting cost funding. This, however, will not occur until the Fund achieves sufficient capital to make this possible.

The Trustees have received several enquiries with regard to legacies to the Fund. A Trust Deed is in the process of being prepared to meet the wishes of these donors.

Through the fund all donations are making a serious investment towards the training and resourcing of our volunteer lifesavers. Legacy gifts will ensure that the next generation of up and coming lifesavers will be prepared to take on critical lifesaving tasks in the future.

The Life Members are happy to answer any enquiries on the principal function and direction of the Fund at any time.

We will also be grateful for any meaningful input on future fund raising opportunities or direct contribution to the Fund.

The present Trustees of the Life Members Fund are Mark Power, David Mansfield and Ron Stone.

Scope

NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Plant & Equipment Depreciation

Plant and equipment are recorded at cost and are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives.

The depreciation rates used for each class of assets are:

Building improvements:	4% to 20%
Surf equipment:	33%
Function room plant & fittings	20%
Office equipment:	20%

Plant and equipment which has an estimated useful life of one year or less have been expensed at purchase and are shown as gear purchases in the Club's profit and loss account.

(b) GST Units

Under the provisions of GST legislation relating to non-profit bodies, the Club has established independent accounting units for its separate functions with differing GST treatments.

The accounts of each of these independent units have been amalgamated in the preparation of the Club's accounts.

(c) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax and accordingly no liability is recorded.

(d) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

(e) Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the Club, are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Leased assets are amortised on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives where it is likely that the Club will obtain ownership of the asset or over the term of the lease. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the period in which they are incurred.

(f) Revenue

Revenue is recognised as follows:

- Members income, donations and sponsorship revenue is recognised on receipt and recording in the books of the Surf Club.
- Income from the sale of merchandise and product from the canteen is recognised when the merchandise or product from the canteen is supplied to the customer.
- Income from hire of the club house (hall hire) is recognised at the time the club house is provided to the customer.
