PRESIDENTS REPORT

It is an honour to be presenting my first President's report as the new President of Terrigal SLSC. The season has been very hectic with our volunteer members patrolling Terrigal Beach, training for awards and proficiencies, training and competing wearing the royal blue cap in the competition arenas not only in Australia but around the world and many, many hours behind the scenes in running not only a surf club, but a business to provide for our club's future.

Over the course of the 2014-15 season, our club numbering 1,185 members, volunteered over 10,975 patrol hours keeping the public safe. This included 644 hours of water safety watching over our junior members. We once again had no lives lost whilst patrolling Terrigal Beach, but performed 32 rescues this season. This could have been higher if not for the 1,949 preventative actions performed to ensure the public remained safe. Our skilled first aiders treated 169 cases in a professional manner.

Our patrol strength is continuing to grow not only in numbers, but in the expertise that is required of a lifesaver. These members are managed by a great group of patrol captains and vice captains and trained and up skilled by a very dedicated group of trainers and assessors. Terrigal also provides a large number of professional RWC operators that assist clubs from The Lakes to Umina during their rosters and many afterhours call outs. Patrolling Terrigal beach is our prime focus so I ask that all members try to gain an extra award each season and work as a well drilled team and enjoy your days on the beach.

Our junior members are given every opportunity to test their skills in competition all over the state and were thrilled to be able to compete at the Australian Youth championships in Queensland. Many hours of organising, training, planning and fund raising are done all year round by a small number of members to provide a high standard for our juniors. I ask that people step forward and ask "what can I do for my children and my club". You will be amazed how you will enjoy being involved in the activities and the avenues that are open to you.

The open competitors have excelled across Branch, State and Australian championships not only in ocean events, but also in Pool events, as well as World title events. Terrigal is honoured to have a number of Australian Team representatives amongst our members. Once again we extend our congratulations to Tim Schofield who was named in the Australian squad to compete at RESCUE 2016 in Holland, plus captain SLSA team at the Sanyo Cup in Japan. Terrigal SLSC holds proud the fact it provides for its members the chance to compete in every SLS discipline, being IRB, Surfboats, ocean, beach, lifesaving and pool events.

Terrigal SLSC, in conjunction with Terrigal-Wamberal RSL, hosted a memorable 100 year ANZAC DAY re-enactment Dawn service which drew the largest crowd ever seen at our Dawn service which was a fitting tribute to past and present service men and women. Many of whom also were past and current members of Terrigal SLSC.

I congratulate our Terrigal SLSC winners from our season of the clubs major awards. Colourworks Rookie – Deklan Smith; Instructor of Year - Allison Sharkey-Smith; Club Rookie – Jackson Heinze; Volunteer – Kevin Porter; Young Patrolperson – Rene Sturmborg; Patrol Person – David Smith; Young Clubperson - Annie Jones and Clubperson - Roger Stimson.

Terrigal walked away with a number of excited winners at the Branch awards night with Tony Smith taking the Presidents' award, Toni Jones the Trainer of the Year, Paul Lemmon Masters athlete, Tim Schofield Open athlete and Terrigal SLSC placing third in the Club of the Year.

All our efforts could not be achieved if not for our major sponsors supporting us being Crowne Plaza Terrigal; Raine & Horne Terrigal and Domain. Our support from The Surf Café and continued support from Gosford City Council and our Councillors. To all our sponsors that contributed in any way, we thank you for your support and hope to have you on board for years to come. Last season there was a distinct lack of consistency in our distances swam between each weekend of requals. Now the club has acquired a set of high quality range finding binoculars, there should be no problems with distances across the board.

I’d sincerely like to thank all of our patrolling members, including all of our wonderful rookies and SRC holders, for volunteering their time once again this season to keep our beach safe.

Surf lifesaving heavily relies on its volunteers, year in and year out, to maintain the safety of our beaches, with Terrigal being no different, with one of the highest membership numbers on the Central Coast, and indeed up there with most of the NSW surf clubs as well.

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES

The 2014/15 season has been another successful season for Terrigal Nippers with many nippers progressing successfully throughout the season. As a volunteer organisation we are indebted to small number parents and members who give up their valued time to assist nippers on a regular basis throughout the season. Without this support it would not be possible to conduct and grow participation in nippers and surf life saving in general, however more help is needed.

Terrigal Nippers is about providing the skills and education to develop future lifesavers with a key focus being the mandatory education conducted across the age groups culminating with the 14s and the completion of their Surf Lifesaving Certificate. For the second year we have worked to deliver surf education in practical hands-on sessions run by our age managers and supported by Maureen Reynolds from our education team which has again seen continued improvement in our nippers' basic understanding of beach safety and the role of surf lifesaving.

To Kevin Porter who has overseen our BBQ operations which is the largest revenue raiser for Nippers throughout the season a big thank you and congratulations in being awarded TSLSC Volunteer of the Year.

For the first time this season we commenced with preseason overnight boot camps in September with the aim of developing leadership skills along with preparation for the season ahead, over 50 nippers participated and we look forward to the return of the boot camps in 2015. Nippers moving into the U9s and also continued our pool based introduction to surf skills which seen 30 nippers participate over four September Saturdays.

The challenge for the JAC and age managers is to provide pathways into surf lifesaving for both competitive and social nippers, taking into account vast variations in skills, fitness and importantly anxiety in relation to the surf, this is one area that we need to ensure balance and to develop initiatives that retain as many nippers as possible in surf life saving. It was pleasing to see the support of many nippers and their families in several community events this season launch including; Santa arrival at Terrigal, the Christmas Toy appeal and January twilight nippers followed by our annual disco as well as participation in the 100th Anzac Day Dawn Service at Terrigal Beach. In addition to these events our 13-14s Rookies were active in the Ducks for Bucks and Cinema under the Stars raising funds to assist with surf lifesaving at Terrigal.

During the season our nippers from under 8s -14s had the opportunity participate in three Club Championship rounds and four Central Coast Carnivals, culminating with the Central Coast Branch Age Championships which were hosted by Terrigal and organised by Michelle Johns. The 9s – 14s then attended State Age Championships at Umina with many of the 14s also competing in the first Youth Aussies at the Gold Coast in March. In addition to these events Terrigal Nippers were represented at the Forster Weekend of Surf, Newcastle Permanent Junior Ironperson Series, Kracka Ironperson at Belmont, Bennett Board and Ironperson at Freshwater, Gardner Ironperson at Wamberal, Manly Nipper Nats and Wave Warriors at Newport, Rookies Challenge, Central Coast Junior Life Saver of Year, as well as Pool Rescue at both State and National level. We again were fortunate to see our nippers successful in representing the Central Coast as part of the Branch team.

As a club it is pleasing to see the sportsmanship that exists between our nippers wearing the royal blue and their competitors from other clubs, which is a key to being part of not only TSLSC but the wider surf lifesaving family.

LIFE MEMBERS REPORT

The financial report has disclosed that the Life Members Fund enjoys a credit balance of \$64,565.30 (Sixty four thousand, five hundred and sixty five dollars 30¢). These funds are held at National Australia Bank A/c # 53878-5225 (\$3,178.30) and Term Deposit #12-236-0215 (\$61,387.00). This Term Deposit is due to mature on 27th May 2015. The deposit and interest due of \$1,050.23 will be rolled over for a further term.

The Life Members fund has seen an increase of \$5,514.09 over the past year. The majority of this is interest of \$2,866.09 and the net proceeds of the Melbourne Cup function of \$2,638.00. In addition, gross bar takings of almost \$2,000.00 were received of which the surf club would have received approximately \$1,200 plus in net profit. In addition, a member of the public donated \$2,500 directly to the club due to the Life members efforts.

During the financial year the Life Members Fund has directly and indirectly contributed in excess of \$3,700.

Donations to the Surf Club have exceeded in excess of \$17,700 since the Fund was established in 1983. The vision for the establishment of the Fund was to create a "Future Fund" for the enhancement of the Club's growth in the ensuing years. The fund is not there for the utilization by any committee or committees. The Fund is fully run by the Life Members and is conducted on a perpetual basis.

Below is a short summary of the history of the Life Members Fund –

- Foundation of the Life Members Fund during 1983. Foundation members were Life Member Mark Power and Life Member Peter Wyllie.
- Fund established for future members to receive the benefit of the past and present members of the Club.
- Fund to be conducted on a perpetual basis and continue to remain this way.
- Core assets to be retained to ensure the future of the Trust.
- An amount of up to 80% of the interest earned to be donated to the Club at the discretion of the trustees on an annual basis. Thus a minimum amount of the remaining 20% of interest income will be retained to ensure future growth of the Fund.
- The Fund will not intentionally impede on the Club's fund raising efforts and all funds raised in the name of the Fund to be retained by the Fund.
- Life Member Jack Tennent made a donation from his estate in 1989-1990 season of the sum of \$1,000.
- First objective target of the Fund was \$10,000 and this was achieved in the 1992/1993 season.
- Funds in excess of \$17,700 have been donated to the Club since the Fund was established in 1983. This amount has been made up of direct cash donations and the value of the jackets which are presented on the Awards of Excellence Night.
- The vision for this Fund is that in the future the Fund will be able to provide one or more scholarships/sponsorships for the members of the Club on an annual basis. These awards will take the form of educational funding or direct sporting cost funding. This, however, will not occur until the Fund achieves sufficient capital to make this possible.

The Trustees have received several enquiries with regard to legacies to the Fund. A Trust Deed is in the process of being prepared to meet the wishes of these donors.

NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Plant & Equipment Depreciation

Plant and equipment are recorded at cost and are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives.

The depreciation rates used for each class of assets are:

Building improvements:	4% to 20%
Surf equipment:	33%
Function room plant & fittings	20%
Office equipment:	20%

Plant and equipment which has an estimated useful life of one year or less have been expensed at purchase and are shown as gear purchases in the Club's profit and loss account.

(b) GST Units

Under the provisions of GST legislation relating to non-profit bodies, the Club has established independent accounting units for its separate functions with differing GST treatments.

The accounts of each of these independent units have been amalgamated in the preparation of the Club's accounts.

(c) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax and accordingly no liability is recorded.

(d) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

(e) Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the Club, are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Leased assets are amortised on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives where it is likely that the Club will obtain ownership of the asset or over the term of the lease. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the period in which they are incurred.

(f) Revenue

Revenue is recognised as follows:

- Members income, donations and sponsorship revenue is recognised on receipt and recording in the books of the Surf Club.
- Income from the sale of merchandise and product from the canteen is recognised when the merchandise or product from the canteen is supplied to the customer.



- Income from hire of the club house (hall hire) is recognised at the time the club house is provided to the customer.
