PRESIDENTS REPORT

It is an honour to be presenting my President's report for Terrigal SLSC. This past season and the long periods outside the patrolling season have been very busy for our club and the volunteers. None of our success would be possible without the hard work, experience and devotion of the Terrigal executive members who put their hand up to help guide our volunteer members in all the different sections that make up a surf lifesaving club. Thank you to Beris as our staff administrator for her work and Linda for the great work she has done to raise the profile and business of our function centre and always striving to make it better. The club thanks Mardi Love for her serving 13 years as a board member in many roles including a long term as President. Mardi is stepping down from the board but will no doubt still be heavily involved in helping the club. For her service, Mardi was awarded an Honour Blazer at our club presentation night.

Over the course of the 2016-17 season, our club membership stands at approx. 940 members. Our patrol strength of 287 active members kept Terrigal beach safe throughout the season and testament to their high skill levels is the fact we had only 7 rescues but 3,095 preventative actions. Meaning our lifesavers were able to pre determine the risk ahead and by taking action, prevent the public from getting into any great difficulty. A huge effort by these members in logging over 10,500 patrol hours at Terrigal. Also Terrigal had 11 members supporting the Branch as active RWC operators rostered on across 3 locations during the season, an achievement our club is proud of. Our lifesaving education team worked tirelessly to put through many new Bronze and SRC awards along with carrying out 9,180 award proficiencies this season to keep our members up skilled.

Once again our senior, junior and masters competitors, in every category of surf sports, were hard at it training and competing up and down the east coast of Australia. It was very disappointing for these members who put in so much time and effort for many months at training to be dealt with firstly the difficult conditions and cancelling of many events at the NSW State Titles and then to have The Australian titles cancelled from under them after Wednesday due to not the usual huge surf conditions, but "water quality". SLSA needs to have a serious look at how they manage such a premier event and reward their members for the devotion and skills they train for and aspire to. At least our small team of master's competitors had the chance to race with the highlights being the legendary Paul Lemon winning his 10th Australian surf race title, and our only two master's women boat crews taking out a Gold and Silver medal in surf boats. Congratulations to Tim Schofield for again being named in the Australia Squad for the World titles and Rachelle King for selection as Assistant Pool Coach for the Australian Youth Team.

I congratulate our Terrigal SLSC winners (and nominees) of the clubs major awards, they are all volunteers and go about their duties for the betterment of Terrigal SLSC. Our Branch awards nominees of Paul Lemmon, Beris Meldrum, Rachelle King, Col Baker, Paul Quick, Aidan Reid, Roger Stimson, Tim Schofield, John Robb. Sophie Halliday and the Furies boat crew were worthy recipients with Paul Lemmon and Josh Cole (RWC) taking out honours. The club is very proud to have Skye OMara take out the Branch Female Junior Lifesaver of the Year.

Terrigal as a community club, every season host many events at our beach from Ocean Swims, markets, carnivals, 5 Lands walk, Christmas Carols and again a very proud and moving Anzac Day Dawn Service in supporting our local RSL branch. Thank you to the branch clubs who supported this with their surfboats.

We congratulate Peter Wyllie on being awarded his OAM medal on Australia Day. When Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club was on its knees after World War II, having had most of its members enlisted, Peter Muir Wyllie said he was approached by some "young kids" who asked him to train them in the surf boat. Throughout the 1950s and 60s Mr Wyllie was credited with keeping the club afloat and after three terms as president the now 90-year-old is still very much the heart and soul of the proud and again thriving club as a life member since 1962 and patron from 1990.

Peter was awarded an OAM for service to surf lifesaving and to the community. The former Navy serviceman has also been a life member of the Terrigal Wamberal RSL Sub-Branch since 2004.

All our efforts could not be achieved if not for our major sponsors supporting Terrigal, namely Crowne Plaza Terrigal; Raine & Horne Terrigal, Hogs Breath, Brian Hilton, and Chemist Outlet . Our support from The Surf Café and continued support from Central Coast Council has been invaluable to our club. Thankyou also to all our minor sponsors and supporters that believe in the work that Terrigal SLSC does for our community.

Edwin Patrick Potts (Ted) 31/5/1933 – 10/4/2016

Edwin Patrick Potts (Ted) was born in Tenterfield on the 31st May 1933 to Monica Clare Potts (nee Donoghue) and Edwin Charles Potts. He was their first son followed by John (Jack) Potts a few years later. Ted spent his early years in Tenterfield before moving to Nowra and attending school in Sydney at Waverley College. Ted was a bit of a rebel and was expelled from Waverley College before completing his schooling. He wanted to be on the stage and his mother Monica arranged for him to have the worst possible job with a friend in the entertainment industry as an incentive to get him back to school and finish his studies. Ted went back to complete his matriculation at North Sydney Technical College and then studied Law at Sydney University attending St John's College. It was at university that he met some of his lifelong friends who also moved to Terrigal including Clem Strain and Patrick Stack.



Ted and his friends used to spend weekends up at Terrigal and have fairly wild parties which involved rolling kegs of beer up from the Florida Hotel to the house they rented in Ash Street. It was at one of these weekends that Ted was lucky enough to meet Terry (Marie Therese Morrison) with her great friend June Strain. Ted and Terry became an item and managed to reconnect after they both spent time travelling overseas in their twenties.

Ted and Terry married in 1966 and soon their first daughter Anna arrived, followed closely by Monique, Christina and Damien. Ted and Terry relocated from Mosman up to Terrigal in 1972 where Ted joined his good friend Clem Strain in Strain and Potts Solicitors who had an office in Kurrawyba Avenue and later moved to Church St. Ted and Terry and June and Clem Strain were fortunate to have a lifelong friendship and enjoy bringing up their families in Terrigal.

'Terrigal Ted' loved living in Terrigal and the view from the house where the family at the top end of Kurrawyba Avenue. He would often wake up in the morning and say 'another day in paradise'. He loved to swim in the mornings all year round down at the Terrigal Surf Club and was part of the early morning swimming contingent with all the Ted's. He was known for his early morning serenades for his swimming compadres and his stylish tie belt which was highly coveted amongst the swimmers.

Ted and his good friend Clem Strain (Strain & Potts Solicitors) were the Honorary Legal Officers for the Club from 1972 until 1994 – a period of 22 years until Ted retired. Clem stayed on for a further 6 years until 2000.

Ted passed away at home in Kurrawyba Avenue on 10th April 2016 as the sun was setting and the birds were singing their evening song. His family are very proud to have the opportunity to sponsor the Terrigal Ocean Swim and the Ted Potts Memorial Plaque in memory of their loving father Ted who was such a passionate, generous and kind man.

John Meldrum 10 May 1949 – 4 December 2016

December 2016 we said farewell to John Meldrum. John didn't wear red and yellow but saw more patrolling hours than most. Through his daily vigil in front of the club John was a historian to most of the major rescues and incidents performed at Terrigal. The surf conditions leading up to and on the day, the people involved, the causes and solutions all gave insight on how to predict or prevent future tragedies

John didn't wear the blue skull cap but would travel the country to follow and support our Winter and Summer competitors. He would often recall an individual progressing from nippers up to open competition and a sequence of events in a race that while not producing a medal resulted in a winning effort. He saw things many of us miss

John became a major fundraiser for our IRB race team over many years. His red and yellow umbrellas scatter the sand over summer. Each one contributing to performance race equipment allowing the team to be competitive against the best in the country. (Pictured above is The Crowie christening)

A Surf Lifesaving Club is run by volunteers and we come in all shapes and sizes. Not many are like Crowie and we are grateful for the time we had.

EDUCATION REPORT

This season saw over 70 members come through the courses offered by the education team and some changes to the way we deliver our courses. For the education team the season started in mid-August with our first Bronze Medallion course completed by the time the season started.



We then rolled into the U14 SRC group which we ran in-conjunction with the nipper's days until early December. We adopted a survivor style twist to the course to keep the kids interested and entertained.

January saw our first combined bronze medallion with Wamberal Surf Club for kids that have their SRC and need to upgrade to their Bronze. This worked well and I think most of the kids have forgiven me for the number of rescues that I made them do while on patrol for their final assessment.

We also ran some IRB courses during the season which has resulted in more IRB crews on our patrols and a few new IRB Racing team members as well. LIFE MEMBERS REPORT

The financial report has disclosed that the Life Members Fund enjoys a credit balance of \$68,222.30 (Sixty eight thousand, two hundred and twenty two dollars and 30 cents). These funds are held at National Australia Bank A/c #53878-5225 (\$230.30) and Term Deposit

#12-236-0215 (\$67,992.00). This Term Deposit is due to mature on 26th July, 2017. The deposit and interest due to \$430.22 will be rolled over for a further term.

The Life Members Fund has been an increase of \$1,258.33 over the past year. This was achieved after a donation of \$500.00 to the Lauren McNair Fund for the treatment of her gastrointestinal stromal tumour (GIST) and also \$448.00 for the Award of Excellence jackets on Presentation Night.

The Life Members have also been actively involved with \$9,000 being directly raised in donation to the Club during the year. The Life Members were also involved with the receipt of \$1,000 in sponsorship during the present financial year and a further \$1,000 in the 2017/2018 year to occur.

Donations to the surf club have now exceeded \$29,648 since the Fund was established in 1983. The vision for the establishment of the Fund was to create a "Future Fund" for the enhancement of the Club's growth in the ensuing years. The Fund is not there for the utilization by any committee or committees. The Fund is fully run by the Life Members and is conducted on a perpetual basis.

Below is a short summary of the history of the Life Members Fund –

- . Foundation of the Life Members Fund during 1983. Foundation members were Life Member Mark Power and Life Member Peter Wyllie.
- . Fund established for future members to receive the benefit of the past and present members of the Club.
- . Fund to be conducted on a perpetual basis and continue to remain this way.
- . Core assets to be retained to ensure the future of the Trust.
- . An amount of up to 80% of the interest earned to be donated to the Club at the discretion of the trustees on an annual basis. Thus, a minimum amount of the remaining 20% of interest income will be retained to ensure future growth of the Fund.
- . The Fund will not intentionally impede on the Club's fund raising efforts and all funds raised in the name of the Fund to be retained by the Fund.
- . Life Member Jack Tennent made a donation from his estate in 1989/1990 season of the sum of \$1,000.
- . First objective target of the Fund was \$10,000 and this was achieved in the 1992/1993 season.
- . Funds in excess of \$29,648 have been donated to the Club since the Fund was established in 1983. This amount has been made up of direct cash donations and the value of the jackets which are presented on the Awards of Excellence Night.
- . The vision for this Fund is that in the future the Fund will be able to provide one or more scholarships/sponsorships for the members of the Club on an annual basis. These awards can take the form of educational funding or direct sporting cost funding. This, however, will not occur until the Fund achieves sufficient capital to make this possible.

The Trustees have received several enquiries with regard to legacies to the Fund. A Trust Deed is in the process of being prepared to meet the wishes of these donors.

Through the Fund, all donations are making a serious investment towards the training and resourcing of our volunteer lifesavers. Legacy gifts will ensure that the next generation of up and coming lifesavers will be prepared to take on critical lifesaving tasks in the future.

The Life Members are happy to answer any enquiries on the principal function and direction of the Fund at any time.

We will also be grateful for any meaningful input on future fund raising opportunities or direct contribution to the Fund.

AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF TERRIGAL SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB INC.

Opinion

We have audited the financial report of Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Inc. which comprises the statement of financial position, the income and expenditure statement, and statement of cash flows as at 30 April 2017, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and the Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Inc. declaration.

In our opinion the financial report of Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Inc. has been prepared in accordance with Division 60 of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act ("ACNC Act") 2012*, and the *Associations Incorporations Act NSW* including:

- (a) giving a true and fair view of the registered entity's financial position as at 30 April 2017 and of its financial performance for the year ended 30 April 2017; and
- (b) complying with Australian Accounting Standards and Division 60 of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulation 2013*.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

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NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Plant & Equipment Depreciation

Plant and equipment are recorded at cost and are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives.

The depreciation rates used for each class of assets are:

Building improvements:	4% to 20%
Surf equipment:	33%
Function room plant & fittings	20%
Office equipment:	20%

Plant and equipment which has an estimated useful life of one year or less have been expensed at purchase and are shown as gear purchases in the Club's profit and loss account.

(b) GST Units

Under the provisions of GST legislation relating to non-profit bodies, the Club has established independent accounting units for its separate functions with differing GST treatments.

The accounts of each of these independent units have been amalgamated in the preparation of the Club's accounts.

(c) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax and accordingly no liability is recorded.

(d) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

(e) Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the Club, are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Leased assets are amortised on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives where it is likely that the Club will obtain ownership of the asset or over the term of the lease. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the period in which they are incurred.

(f) Revenue

Revenue is recognised as follows:

- Members income, donations and sponsorship revenue is recognised on receipt and recording in the books of the Surf Club.
- Income from the sale of merchandise and product from the canteen is recognised when the merchandise or product from the canteen is supplied to the customer.
- Income from hire of the club house (hall hire) is recognised at the time the club house is provided to the customer.
