VALÉ Darryl Eastlake 11 JULY 1942 – 19 APRIL 2018



Darrell had saltwater in his veins; he loved the ocean, the surf, the coast and could not bear to be away from it. Surfboard riding and surf lifesaving were just two of his great passions.

During the 1960's and early 70's his love of surfing saw him running a surf shop at Cronulla and doing surf reports for 2UW on the radio. He then had a stint on the Gold Coast where he was president of the Windansea Board Riders Club. In Wayne "Rabbit" Bartholomew's autobiography titled "Bustin Down the Door", he mentioned Darrell's stint at Windansea and as a surf promoter. I thought, gee that book title could easily relate to Darrell- BUSTIN DOWN THE DOOR! For he did just that in many endeavours he threw himself into.

Darrell gained the iconic Bronze medallion for Surf Lifesaving on 23rd November, 1958, N4462, as a member of Tamarama SLSC. Darrell started his love of surfboats competing in their junior boat crew under Bluey Myers.

From there Darrell competed as a rower and a sweep with a number of clubs on the Central Coast. Mid 70's saw him at Wamberal SLSC when he bought a new flair to the old establishment. You always knew when Darrell was at a surf club.

He then joined Terrigal SLSC in the late 70's and was President in 1979. Again, surfboats were his passion; he formed new crews, got the young members involved, gained new sponsors and as always, publicity followed him wherever he went.

Then in the 80's Darrell had stints at Soldiers Beach and Toowoona Bay, again giving the members an added professionalism as well as encouraging young members into surf boat rowing. Darrell was great and got involved with the Mount Penang young inmates to give them an outlet with involvement in SLS.

During this time and with Darrell's stint at 2GO, SLS on the Central Coast gained an enormous profile and soon surf lifesaving had its own segment on the sports show. When Darrell moved into television commentating, the profile of surf lifesaving was given a huge lift.

From calling ironman races, to the Nutri-grain surf league, to the glory years of Aussie titles at Kurrawa from 1990-2001 and Swansea in 1994, his legendary calls of the surfboat races are still talked about today. He ignited the audience's interest with his immeasurable passion for the sport. From his experiences as a rower and a sweep he could talk the viewers through every stroke, every shouted call of the sweep, the various techniques of the rowers and the surf conditions so that viewers could imagine being in the boat and the excitement of the race. He educated the audience so much so that they came away from not knowing anything about the sport of surfboat rowing to having a better appreciation of the skills involved. So many memorable calls from those calls – from his "IRONMEN ROWING WOODEN BOATS" to the enormous seas of '96 when he said, "Gold Coast hospital has called to say stop sending boaties to our hospital to get stitched up, we are running out of room."

Darrell was a smart man, where else would you wish to have a heart attack then when calling your beloved sport then in front of 4000 lifesavers.

These past few years, we have enjoyed our annual catch up at the Grange Hotel with Darrell holding court over a group of boaties telling tales of everything and anything. Thank god, for the media technology, as we and the generations after us, will still be able to sit back, beer, or wine in hand and watch and listen to those magical calls of surf lifesaving events when the seas were HUUUUUUGE.

VALÉ Lauren Estelle McNair



This season our club lost one of our own. A young woman who progressed through Nippers to being an active and valued member of Terrigal Surf Club.

Lauren, then Brierley, joined Terrigal Nippers in 1994. She attended every day of her Nippers and was Vice Club Captain and Junior Club Person of the Year in 1998.

She achieved 100% Patrol Proficiency every year at Terrigal and was one of our longest serving Patrol Captains in our club, holding the position for a full decade.

In 2006 she was voted Terrigal Patrol Person of the Year for her dedication to her patrolling duties.

A month prior to her passing she was awarded the National Medal at a bedside ceremony with the club President, Paul Quick, and other club members present to honour her contributions to our club and the Surf Lifesaving movement.

Lauren had a vibrant and engaging personality, was 'no nonsense' and was simply passionate about patrolling her beach. She always had a smile for everyone when on patrol.

The club is honouring the memory of the woman known as 'Nugget' and have created a new perpetual award and trophy...the 'Lauren McNair Memorial Trophy' for Terrigal Patrol Captain of the Year. It seemed fitting as Lauren was a strong, committed and vocal Patrol Captain for 10 years.

She is a profound loss to our club and deeply missed by her husband, Mark, son Harrison, her family, her friends and all her patrol members.

VALÉ Lois Cambourn

Lois Jean Watkins (nee Cambourn) was an only child and was brought up on her parent's citrus and orchard farm in Gosford. From the start she was a strong swimmer and sportswomen, a proficient sprinter, played State Hockey and was an accomplished snow skier.

She also played tennis, rode horses, played bowls well, had a passion for fishing and enjoyed golf, square dancing, prawning, outback travel and craft of any kind.

Her life attitude was, "When you stop living, you die".



In 1942 she joined some friends and trained for her Bronze Medallion at Terrigal. She came first in the sprint and second in the Ocean Swim at the Terrigal Carnival in 1943. On patrol at Terrigal she was the belt swimmer in rescues due to her strength.

After WWII when the male club members returned to Terrigal she stepped back, married and raised a family although her strength of

character led her to be President of community organisations way before that was the norm in society.

Lois was unable to attend the 'Honouring our First Female Lifesavers' event in November 2017 as she could not receive clearance to travel from her Aged Care in QLD. So, the party came to her and in January 2018 the President of SLSQ and her local Member travelled to Lois's Aged Care on the Gold Coast and a ceremony was held to present her the Bronze Medallion she earned 75 years previously. Although frail Lois enjoyed the day and spoke of memories of the time.

Lois passed away peacefully in June 2018 and a Terrigal Surf Club representative spoke at her funeral to let her family know how much the club valued her wartime contribution.

VALÉ Nola Compton (nee Lawn)

Nola Lawn still had her drivers license, was living independently and was strong, opinionated and aware at 91.

A bold and beautiful woman, she joined Terrigal Surf Club at 17 in 1941. She followed her friends Joyce Marsh and Bessie Campbell and the 3 were the best of friends.

Even though she remembers being rostered on only every three weeks (as she was one of the first group to gain her Bronze Medallion) she would come to Terrigal every Sunday. She came on the first bus in the morning and left on the last bus to Gosford in the evening.

When the restrictions of the war years started to bite, Terrigal became her social outlet. With a laugh she stated, "Well, there weren't too many men around!".

When asked if there was fighting among the nearly 30 girls her reply was "Heaven, no! Jealousy was not a word at the time...we were all friends. It was a different era".

Nola was involved in a competitive R&R team with Jean Payne, Dinkie Campbell and Joyce Marsh, "...because we were all shorter than the other girls!". She competed all up and down the Central Coast, in Newcastle and even at Sydney Surf Carnivals.

Asked if the public gave them any grief when they were competing she replied, "No. there was no spitefulness at the time! People

liked to come and watch us and they treated us with respect!".

Nola did not think she had done anything spectacular in her service to the club in those dark years of war. She saw it as "Work that needed to be done" and she was looking forward to catching up with old friends at the Honouring our First Female Lifesavers event.

Sadly, we lost the bright and vibrant Nola a few weeks after she was interviewed and 3 months short of the event. She will always be remembered at Terrigal Surf Club.

VALÉ Muriel Dibben (nee Snowden)

During the War Years, Muriel joined the Terrigal Surf Club for social entertainment. She spent many days on the beach: loving the friendships that were formed, learning how to master the art of lifesaving, fundraising for the club, dances and even had her first drink on Terrigal Beach at the age of 21 ... which she remembers as a very weak beer shandy. She has moved on to enjoy little "twist top" beers, with the occasional glass of wineand it didn't have to be too late in the day either. She wasn't particularly fond of the taste of water.

Her father had encouraged Muriel to get involved in the local social life which included joining the surf club. It was here she met Ron (her future husband). He enlisted for the Army in 1941 & fought in New Guinea.

To retain some normality to a life that was fractured by the War, she joined with the other women who trained for and achieved their Bronze Medallions and continued with life on patrol at the beach. Ron returned on leave and married Muriel in 1943. Even their honeymoon was at Terrigal Beach.

Muriel was beautiful. A lovely figure, long blonde hair & legs to die for! She was also smart! Always good at figures & puzzles, she did the bookkeeping for her husband's business as well as working in that area after his death some years later.

Later in life she worked tirelessly with husband Ron in the formation of the Central Coast Leagues Club.

Our club lost the opportunity to re-connect with the vibrant, intelligent and humorous Muriel when she died 2 months short of the Honouring our First Female Lifesavers event. She would have brought the house down. Thank you from Terrigal Surf Club for your wartime service Muriel.



PRESIDENTS REPORT

Once again it is an honour to be presenting my President's report for Terrigal SLSC. It is always a good season on the beach at Terrigal, but even a better season when we can say that whilst our volunteer patrol members were doing their duty, nobody has drowned on our beach. Right from the start, pre-season the club was in full swing with the Executive, trainers, coaches and sub committees working tirelessly to have everything ready to hit the new season running. Thank you everyone for your work.

Just looking at Terrigal's club stats show the success of this pre-season work. We had volunteer patrol hours of 10,603; rescues 8; preventative actions 1,889; first aid 423 (including 1 spinal and 2 major cases); proficiencies/awards 9,321. This is again a huge effort by all involved.

We even had a French national, Lucas Grandidier, gain his Bronze Medallion at the club and complete a patrol. He is looking forward to continuing lifesaving at Terrigal upon his return from France.

We had 13 of our members enjoy lending a hand at Christmas time patrolling all day at North Entrance beach, a wonderful new experience for some and great to see our members supporting a struggling club.

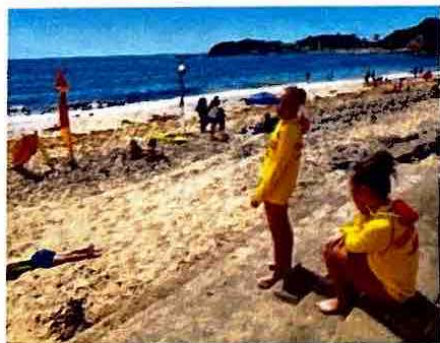
The high light of the season would be the SLS EVENT of the YEAR, our Women in Surf Lifesaving that recognised the wonderful women who gained their Bronze Medallion during WW2 well before their time in SLS. Of these 35 pioneering women, Cathy Cole was able to locate 25 of the women or their families and to have 6 women present on the day to receive their medals and recognition from His Excellency the Governor General Sir Peter Cosgrove. This event raised the profile of SLS, not only on the Central Coast, but around Australia and the world. The day was livestreamed across the state, in NSW Parliament and taken up overseas. This was an historic day for Terrigal SLSC and the SLS movement and was awarded the SLSNSW Initiative of the Year for the 2018 season.

The board thanks all those that contributed to make this event happen and CC Branch for their financial contribution. The executive expressed their disappointment that two of our governing bodies, SLSNSW and SLSA, did not contributing financially to this event which gained so much positive exposure for them.

Our club engaged in the community with many events over the year including, Anzac Day dawn service, 5 Lands Walk, Light house to Skillion walk, Ocean swim, Colour Run, Christmas Carols and more.

We hosted SLS events such as Streets Boat carnival, Board and Ski series, Twilight carnival, Nipper carnival and Rookie Challenge. Our members were chosen in many representative teams and further honours for Tim Schofield as captain of SLSA team, winning the German Cup in Pool Rescue and Rachele King as a pool rescue coach. Terrigal had success in venturing into the field of competition lifesaving events in many carnivals with Tamsyn Gould and Keaton Pollington both winning silver in the Champion Lifesaver at SLSNSW State titles and going on to the Australian Championships with Tamsyn finishing in sixth and Keaton taking out our first ever Gold medal in this event. Congratulations to both these emerging young competitors and their coach. Terrigal had a successful season dominating in Juniors, Masters and Open carnivals on the coast.

Unfortunately, during the season Terrigal lost two of its loved members. Firstly, Lauren (Brierley) McNair who had been at Terrigal since a nipper and progressed to a long-time patrol captain. Lauren had gained her 100% patrol proficiency every year since gaining her bronze and just weeks before her passing was awarded her 20-year patrol award and her National medal, an award she so dearly cherished and one that all through her illness thought she would not be there to receive. Taken way too young.



Also, we had Darrell Eastlake pass away after a long-time illness. A huge man that everyone knew and had plenty of stories about. Darrell was a past president of Terrigal and helped gain surfboat rowing a wider recognition.

At Terrigal club awards we had over 80 members been recognised by SLS for their patrol and service awards. The highlight was 8 members been awarded the National Medal for their over 15 years of exemplarily patrol service. We also awarded two members for their long-time service to Terrigal SLSC, Honour Blazers to Kim Petley and Peter Ives.

At the Branch Awards of Excellence, the following members were awarded honours for;

Volunteer of the Year - Cathy Cole,

Trainer of the Year - Tim Pittolo

Masters Competitor of the Year - Paul Lemmon

Coach of the year – Rachelle King.

They all attended the SLSNSW Awards, with 2 state awards achieved for the club in 'SLSNSW Initiative of the Year' for the 'Honouring our First Female Lifesavers' event and 'Volunteer of the Year' for Cathy Cole.

I am proud to say that over the past four years of my holding the President's role for Terrigal SLSC, our surf club has continued in its upward progress in strength in lifesaving and competition, community achievements and awareness and ongoing education of volunteer lifesavers.

In 2015 we place 3rd in the branch Club of the year results. Over this term we have continued strong relations with our sponsors and supports. We gained our largest sponsorship deal for the club, over four years with Raine & Horne and Domain, whilst also negotiating with our longest sponsor, Crowne Plaza Terrigal, from a year to year proposition to a multi-year partnership. We have seen our core business, lifesaving, reach its highest levels with supply of gear and resources for our members. The board has fought through some tough times that were put to us whilst going down the road of Central Coast Council amalgamations over these years and the difficulties with the club head leases put forward by SLSNSW and Crown Lands.

In this past year the club has seen success and growth in the following;

- Terrigal winning the Branch overall carnival point score for first time since 2010.
- Improved business with Sub leasing our Café with management skills and our highest monetary value to date.
- The club having its largest bank balance ever which allows us to plan for the future as we budget for the high maintenance of a surf club, protect our club for times when no income may be forthcoming and funding for the future expansion of the club building.
- We installed solar panels and water saving devices in all our showers to reduce cost and water usage to protect the environment. The solar panels have already yielded us a 10 % reduction in cost.
- We have brought our competition results at State and Australian titles out of a decline over many years to a strong placing this season.
- Our Member services ran a survey via Monkey to ask our all members what they wanted in the club and its direction and it came back favourably from the majority saying that the members were happy with the direction and successes of their club.
- We continued with the SLSNSW Club Quality program to give us direction and governance where we gained our Bronze and expect to complete the Silver level by July this year.
- I am happy to say that with the help of Kim Petley and Tim Pittolo, I was able to get the club memorabilia, photos and club honour boards erected back on the walls inside the club house to display our long and proud history.



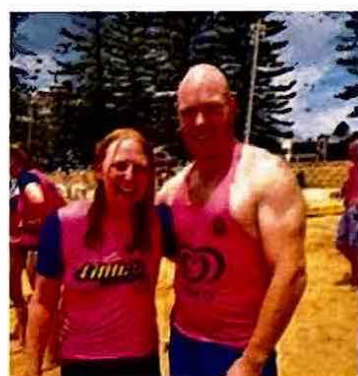

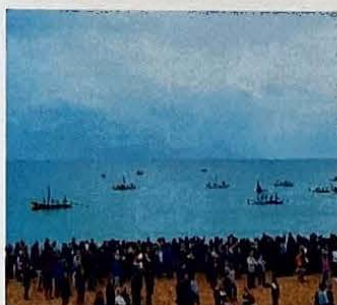

It hasn't always been easy, but I believe we have made a difference, and lifted the standard of our patrol members in that time, with increased training and auditing of our members skills.

Director of Member Services Report

2017-18 has been a very busy and successful season. Thank you to all the Terrigal members who gained awards, took on positions, carried out a role, provided support, assisted with fundraising or helped in any way around the club.

The Election process for Junior Club Captains early in the season resulted in Ryan Green and Ruby Pillon as Club Captains and Greta Barrale and Kyle Graham as Vice Club Captains for 2017-18. Our SLSCC Junior Lifesaver of the Year nominees were Lily Egan and Kai Green and they made our club proud while competing in the tough process.

Tamsyn Gould and Keaton Pollington were Terrigal's participants in the SLSCC GAP year program and David Fawkes was involved in the 15-17 year Development program this season. These are great programs and our young members were highly esteemed by the organisers.

This season saw Terrigal Surf Lifesaving Club step up in its recognition of members.

In November 2017 the club held a Vice Regal event which the Governor General of Australia, Sir Peter Cosgrove and Lady Cosgrove attended and presented the Bronze Medallions to the 25 women who patrolled Terrigal Beach during the years the men volunteered for the armed forces during WWII. These awards were presented 75 years after they were earned and the event was attended by 250 family members and 6 of the 7 surviving women. This 'Honouring our First Female Lifesavers' event was awarded the Initiative of the Year at the 2018 SLSNSW Awards of Excellence.

Also, at this seasons Terrigal Awards of Excellence, National Patrol Service Awards of different lengths were presented to 63 Terrigal Members and 26 Long Service Medals were awarded to members, including a 60 and 70-year Long Service Medal to our club Patron, Peter Wyllie who joined the club in the 1940's.

And, very specially, 8 club members received National Medals, an honour from the Governor Generals Office for Australians whose occupation or voluntary efforts put them in a position to risk their lives for their community. 15 years continuous effort with 30 hours a year is required to achieve this highly sought-after award. Congratulations to those who achieved it from Terrigal Surf Club in 2017-18.

All our club members provide an essential Emergency Service on our beach with pride and it is satisfying to see them honoured within the Surf Lifesaving movement.

Richard Bridge Memorial Young Patrol Person of the Year – David Fawkes

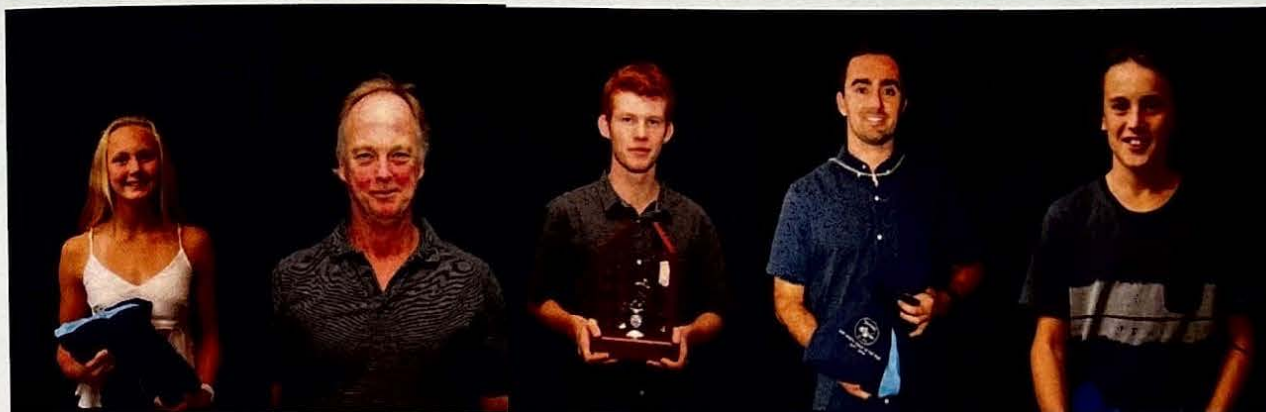

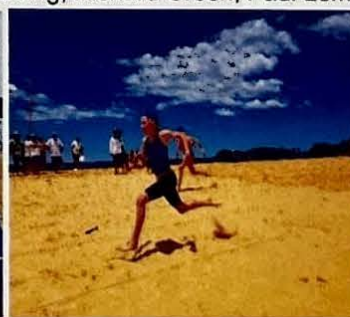

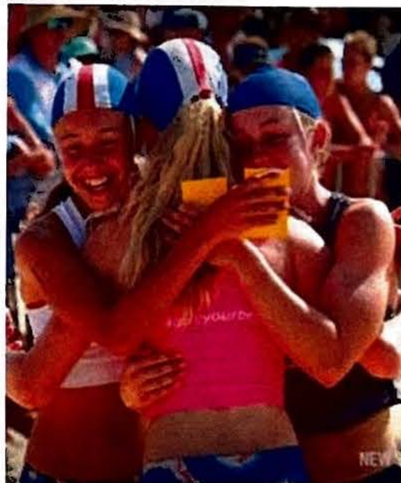

LIFE MEMBERS REPORT 30th April, 2018

The financial report has disclosed that the Life Members Fund enjoys a credit balance of \$70,712.05 (Seventy thousand, seven hundred and twelve dollars and 05 cents). These funds are held at National Australia Bank A/c #53878-5225 (\$388.15) and Term Deposit #12-236-0215 (\$70,323.90). This Term Deposit is due to mature on 26th September, 2018. The deposit and interest due to \$735.47 will be rolled over for a further term.

The Life Members Fund has been an increase of \$2,489.75 over the past year. This was achieved after a donation of \$292.15 for the Award of Excellence jackets on Presentation Night. The majority of the increase was interest of \$1,731.90 and donation by Mr John Burgess Jnr – see below.

The Life Members were involved with the receipt of \$1,000 in sponsorship during the financial year to the club. This was a sponsorship from the family of Mr Ted Potts for the trophy for the 2km annual Terrigal swim.

The presentation of the Bronze Medallions on 22nd November, 2017 to the 24 women who had patrolled Terrigal Beach during World War II was a remarkable event for them and their families. All those who attended, including the Governor General, had nothing but praise for the efforts of Cathy Cole who researched and organised the event.

The writer was pleased to meet up with Mr. John Burgess, the son of one of the recipients, Joyce Burgess (nee Marsh). Joyce was the wife of our Life Member, John Burgess Snr. John was my mentor when I first joined the Club.

John Jnr has kindly agreed to sponsor through the Life Members Fund the John Burgess Memorial Volunteer of the Year Award at the Annual Awards of Excellence presentation night.

Donations to the surf club have now exceeded \$30,940 since the Fund was established in 1983. The vision for the establishment of the Fund was to create a "Future Fund" for the enhancement of the Club's growth in the ensuing years. The Fund is not there for the utilization by any committee or committees. The Fund is fully run by the Life Members and is conducted on a perpetual basis.

Below is a short summary of the history of the Life Members Fund –

- . Foundation of the Life Members Fund during 1983. Foundation members were Life Member Mark Power and Life Member Peter Wyllie.
- . Fund established for future members to receive the benefit of the past and present members of the Club.
- . Fund to be conducted on a perpetual basis and continue to remain this way.
- . Core assets to be retained to ensure the future of the Trust.
- . An amount of up to 80% of the interest earned to be donated to the Club at the discretion of the trustees on an annual basis. Thus, a minimum amount of the remaining 20% of interest income will be retained to ensure future growth of the Fund.
- . The Fund will not intentionally impede on the Club's fund-raising efforts and all funds raised in the name of the Fund to be retained by the Fund.
- . Life Member Jack Tennent made a donation from his estate in 1989/1990 season of the sum of \$1,000.
- . First objective target of the Fund was \$10,000 and this was achieved in the 1992/1993 season.
- . Funds in excess of \$30,940 have been donated to the Club since the Fund was established in 1983. This amount has been made up of direct cash donations and the value of the jackets which are presented on the Awards of Excellence Night.
- . The vision for this Fund is that in the future the Fund will be able to provide one or more scholarships/sponsorships for the members of the Club on an annual basis. These awards can take the form of educational funding or direct sporting cost funding. This, however, will not occur until the Fund achieves sufficient capital to make this possible.

The Trustees have received several enquiries with regard to legacies to the Fund. A Trust Deed is in the process of being prepared to meet the wishes of these donors.

Through the Fund, all donations are making a serious investment towards the training and resourcing of our volunteer lifesavers. Legacy gifts will ensure that the next generation of up and coming lifesavers will be prepared to take on critical lifesaving tasks in the future.

Statement by Members of the Committee.

- (b) complying with Australian Accounting Standards and Division 60 of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulation 2013*.

Basis for opinion

We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Emphasis of Matter - Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Inc. financial reporting responsibilities under the ACNC Act and Associations Incorporations Act NSW. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Responsibility of the Committee for the Financial Report

The committee are responsible for the preparation of the financial report that gives a true and fair view and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1 to the financial report is appropriate to meet the requirements of the ACNC Act and the Associations Incorporations Act NSW. The committee's responsibility also includes such internal control as the committee determine is necessary to enable the preparation of a financial report that gives a true and fair view and is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial report, committee is responsible for assessing Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Inc.'s ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters relating to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the committee either intend to liquidate Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Inc. or to cease operations, or have no realistic alternative but to do so.

The committee is responsible for overseeing the Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Inc. 's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial report as a whole is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. - Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.

- a. the financial report gives a true and fair view of the financial result of fundraising appeal activities for the financial year ended 30 April 2018;
- b. the financial report and associated records Terrigal Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. have been properly kept during the year ended 30 April 2018 in accordance with the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 (NSW)*;
- c. money received as a result of fundraising appeals conducted during the year ended 30 April 2018, has been properly accounted for and applied in accordance with the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 (NSW)*; and
- d. there are reasonable grounds to believe that Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Inc. will be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due.

NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Plant & Equipment Depreciation

Plant and equipment are recorded at cost and are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives.

The depreciation rates used for each class of assets are:

Building improvements:	4% to 20%
Surf equipment:	33%
Function room plant & fittings	20%
Office equipment:	20%

Plant and equipment which has an estimated useful life of one year or less have been expensed at purchase and are shown as gear purchases in the Club's profit and loss account.

(b) GST Units

Under the provisions of GST legislation relating to non-profit bodies, the Club has established independent accounting units for its separate functions with differing GST treatments.

The accounts of each of these independent units have been amalgamated in the preparation of the Club's accounts.

(c) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax and accordingly no liability is recorded.

(d) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

(e) Leases

The Club leases the land on which the Club premises are erected from a trust pursuant to the Crown Lands Act. A license has been provided to another entity to operate a café on part of those premises (refer note 18). As the Club is a not for profit entity the value of the lease of the premises has not been estimated. License fees from the sub-lease are taken up as income on an accruals basis.

At the date of commencement of the lease of the air conditioning unit (refer note 17) the value in use and lease liability was determined as the present value of lease payments and taken as an asset and liability respectively. Subsequently the air conditioning unit has been measured at cost and depreciated (refer note "1a"). Lease payments are allocated between the reduction in lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, of low value are charged as expenses in the period in which they are incurred.

(f) Revenue

Revenue is recognised as follows:

- Members income, donations and sponsorship revenue is recognised on receipt and recording in the books of the Surf Club.
- Income from the sale of merchandise and product from the canteen is recognised when the merchandise or product from the canteen is supplied to the customer.
- Income from hire of the club house (hall hire) is recognised at the time the club house is provided to the customer.

NOTE 18 – CAFÉ LICENSE

The rental for the license to operate the café at the Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club is currently subject to rental review/ arbitration. The results of this review/ arbitration cannot be anticipated, but are unlikely to result in adverse consequences to the Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Inc. and may result in increased rental revenue.

The license to operate the café arose from the exercise of an option on an existing lease and is for a 5 year period commencing 25 September 2017. Once the market rent has been agreed rental increases by CPI annually.

NOTE 19 – SURPLUS RESERVED FOR CLUB MAINTENANCE AND RENOVATION

Funds on hand are invested to cover the ongoing running and maintenance costs of club, part funding of planned future upgrade of the club and a safety net in case our yearly income, sponsorship or grants are no longer forthcoming.

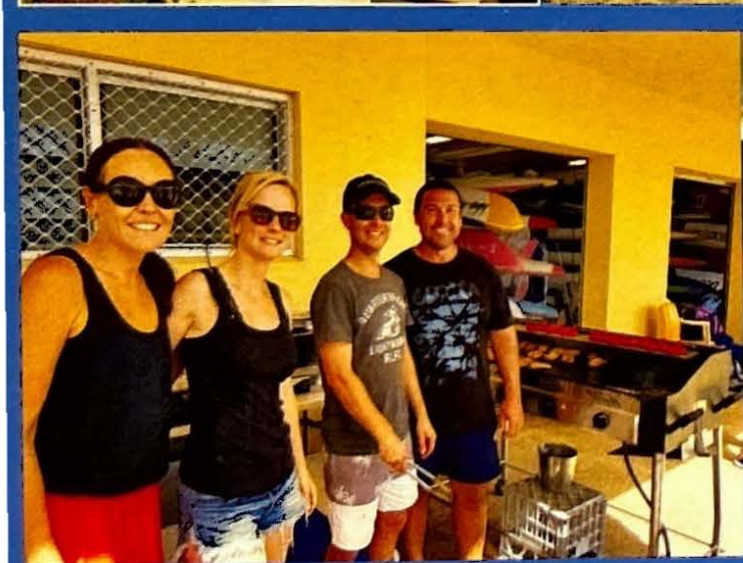
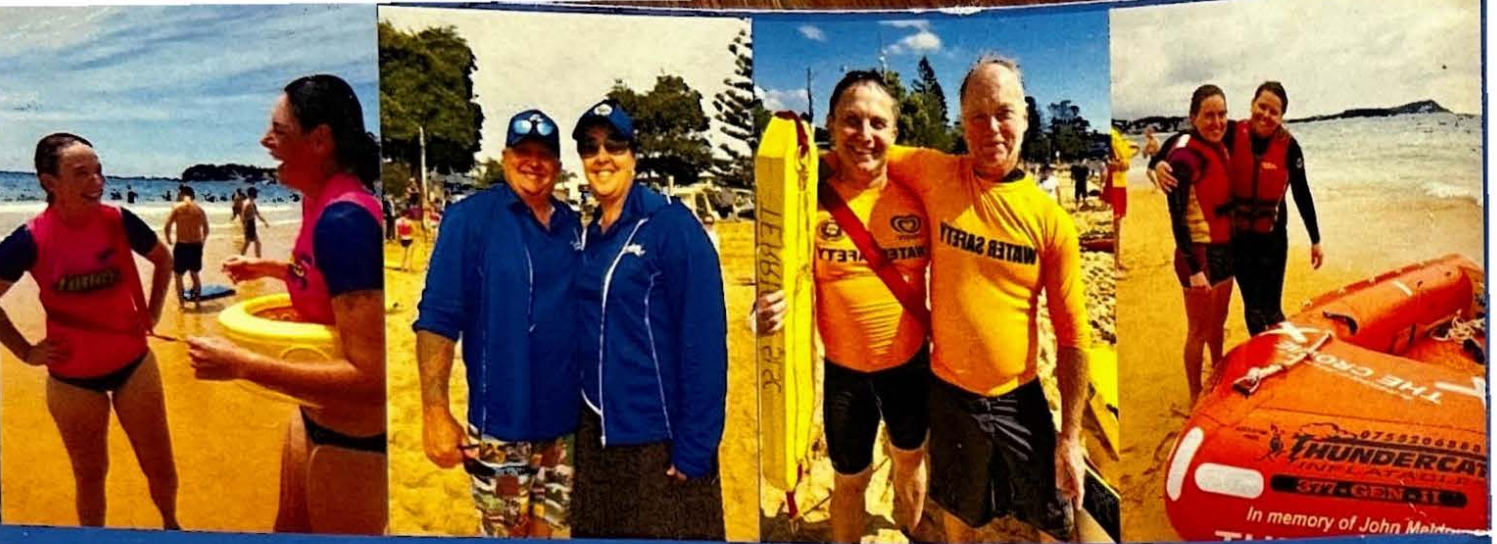
NOTE 20 – EVENTS SUBSEQUENT TO REPORTING DATE
