

Well 2018-19 has certainly proven to be a season of change for Terrigal SLSC. I came into the role of President over a month after the 2018 AGM and with 5 new Board members as well as the task of replacing our longstanding administration officer, there was a lot to get on with.

Our Board priorities for the year have been twofold, to manage the operational aspects of the club, get our patrols on the beach, train our membership, provide the nipper program etc etc and also to have a really good look at the strategic management of our club and try to pull together a direction that we are capable of delivering with our membership and the present and future challenges of our organisation.

I would like to thank our Board Members, Cathy Cole (Membership), John Deacon (Lifesaving), Greg Elfick (Competition), Richard Green (Juniors), Marc Gunasinghe (Sponsorship), Beris Meldrum (Finance), Tim Pittolo (Education), Wendy Walsh (Administration) for their tireless efforts over the past 12 months, for the long meetings and tough decisions that have been made. I would especially like to thank our two Board members who are not continuing: Greg and Cathy, for their service to our club, not only in the past 12 months but over several years.

I would like to honour our club Patron and elder Life Member Peter Wyllie who was honoured this season for 75 years of service to Terrigal SLSC, and also Mark Power, another Life Member, who achieved his 50th year of patrol for our club, outstanding achievements which I don't think will be achieved again in my lifetime.

Once again, in our 99th season with no loss of life between the flags, Terrigal lifesavers have achieved 9453 hours of patrol, performed 11 rescues, prevented 1953 rescues and completed over 250 first aid incidents. Our focus this season has been to increase the visibility of our patrol force, by providing new uniforms for all patrol members and increasing water's edge management and engaging the community. Many of our members have also assisted other clubs on the Central Coast.

Our education team continue to provide excellence in training and assessment, with over 90 new awards trained and assessed, as well as over 350 junior awards and several hundred requals. Several of our assessors are currently upgrading their VET qualifications so they can continue to provide the high volume of assessments that are completed at Terrigal annually.

The Nipper program at Terrigal continues to prove very popular and it is especially pleasing to see the high numbers being retained into the senior club. I want to thank all our Age Managers for their commitment to developing the skills, confidence and engagement of these children and their parents in the Nipper program. We have a fabulous group of committed parents that are also driving fun social events such as the sleepovers, the upcoming female Hydrothon event and lots of other activity.

In Competition, our Pool Rescue Team continued their outstanding performances at the State and National Titles, with our Youth team winning the State Championship and our Open and Master's Teams in 3rd place at the Australian Championships in 2018.

Our IRB Team continues to grow both in size and skill, developing some really talented drivers and crew across all age groups. They picked up an awesome Bronze medal at the World Championships in Adelaide after a really strong 4th in the NSW Premiership Season. We also continue to develop on the beach, with our Nippers and Seniors performing well at State and National Championships, including an Aussie Gold to Emmy Wheeler in the U14 Flags.

A special mention to Paul Lemmon, who was inducted into the Australian Masters Sportsperson Hall of Fame this year during the Australian Titles, a well deserved honor for an amazing competitor and role model for our sport.

Over the past year, we have also had many notable honors for our club members including Emmy Pettiford who was recently a finalist in the Sport NSW Young Coach of the Year Awards, and Emmy, Callum Sutton (Junior Sportsperson), Rachelle King (Coach) and Paul Lemmon (Masters Sportsperson) who were finalists for the 2018 Central Coast Sports Awards, with Paul taking out the title of Masters Sportsperson of the Year again!

In 2019-20, Terrigal SLSC celebrates 100 years of lifesaving service to the community of Terrigal. We will have many celebratory events that will honor not only our current membership, but everyone who has served our club over the past 100 years. We look forward to celebrating this milestone with our community and members.

Patrol Report:

Terrigal Beach had amazing, inviting weather conditions this 2018/2019 season resulting in a higher than normal attendance from the public staying longer at the beach and vicinity. Our club responded delivering a safe and successful service to our community and members.

On behalf of the TSLSC Board we would like to give a big thank-you to all patrolling members for your fantastic work in attending and actively patrolling the beach to ensure no lives lost between the flags and outside the flag area at Terrigal

Beach and the support of our surrounding clubs.

Our major focus areas for this seasons patrol were on:

- Strong communication within our patrols through Captains briefings and delegation
- High visibility patrolling at the water's edge and working on preventions
- Focusing on skills and re-qualifications within the patrols
- Engaging the community
- Succession planning
- Delivering safety, calmly.



Our focus areas for the 2019-2020 season:

- Continuing the momentum from the previous season's success
- Delivering the new SLS service contract (commencing this season)
- Restructuring the patrolling teams to provide a better blend of skills across the patrol roster
- Developing a strong mentor program with the 'Cadet/Rookies' for their patrols
- Increase the participation of active reserve and long service members to the roster
- Support Central Coast Lifesaving with services to other clubs requiring patrolling assistance
- Engaging our community even more.

Proposed is to:

- Run a total of 12 Patrols
- Rebalance the number of members for patrol and blend the expertise to ensure we have the highest level of skills for every patrolling day
- Bring through a balance of succession into the roster including mentoring for new PC's, VC's
- Refine the land and water-based proficiencies starting as early as practical in the new season
- Supply a minimum of 6 full patrol days to another club (this would equate to ½ day per patrol of our 12 patrol teams) to support their operations
- Utilise the Surfguard online Patrol Application as the primary source for patrol logs
- Increase the education/pathways for our Patrolling members.

DIRECTOR OF MEMBER SERVICES

As we close out this season our Terrigal Surf Lifesaving Club approaches 100 years of patrolling Terrigal Beach.

In February of 1920 our surf club members had the materials on the ground and were waiting for Erina Shire Council (as the Central Coast Council was known at the time) to identify where the club could begin construction of our first club house. The Council gave a grant of 90£ for the building and the construction was carried out by club members.

And, most importantly, this club has proudly achieved 100 years of service since then with no deaths between the flags. That is a record few, if any, clubs could boast.

Our club has a proud history and a strong present-day membership position of just under 900 members which is a far cry from the few men that started patrolling back in 1919.

We now have strength in our Juniors, in our Active members, our Associates, supportive Life Members and strength throughout all the various areas of competition available through the Surf Life Saving Movement.

In our Nippers area there were 4 great leaders elected as role models this year. The Captains for 2018-19 were Susannah Palmer and Jack Quick and the Vice Captains Charli McDonald and Jayden Redfern.

This year our Terrigal nominees for SLSCC Junior Lifesaver of the Year were Teysha Tasker and Jayden Redfern. They both represented our club proudly and Jayden came out of the selection process as the male Central Coast Junior Lifesaver of the Year. Congratulations to both young leaders.

And, at the SLSCC Awards of Excellence, from a very strong contingent of Terrigal nominees, it was congratulations to Paul Lemmon Masters Competitor of the year, David Smith, Co Rescue of the month, Jayden Redfern Junior Lifesaver of the Year, TSLSC Overall Competition Point Score Winners.

Branch, State & Australian recognition of the Honouring Event won the SLSA Innovation of the Year, an extremely prestigious award that is not given out each year, but only to initiatives that have been deemed to, "significantly improve a facet of surf lifesaving in Australia."

Paul Lemmon covered himself in glory as one of the first intake into the SLSA Hall of Fame, for Masters Legends. There could never have been a more appropriate nominee.

In Member Services, early on in this season, a new specially designed Terrigal Surf Club swimwear range was introduced, and this was adopted widely and enthusiastically. Buying online has made this process very easy for the club. And a new 'online shop' will be introduced on our website for club clothing purchases in the near future. These changes are allowing the club to provide branded clothing without the storage issues of past years.

A new initiative of Youth Pizza night was trialled with the aim to create peer linkages within the 13-17 age groups. Not a speck of pizza was left at the end and all participants indicated that they had fun, learned and wanted a repeat night.

SLSA instituted strong Safeguarding Children protocols this year after the Royal Commission. Terrigal already had strong procedures in this area, with 7 trained Member Protection Information Officers within the club. More effort was made to ensure our club was compliant with all new requirements to keep our young club members confident and safe.

This Youth Retention program engages with our present and former members and results in biographies and stories to preserve our club's history. Everyone in the program is enjoying telling or listening to the great stories of Terrigal's past and one of the aims is to develop a DVD.

Terrigal Youth Committee is developing its role within the club and thank you to David Fawkes, Liam Renney and Lily Egan for their leadership in this area.

A new Alliance is being developed between TSLSC and Terrigal 50's+. Surf club members are volunteering to teach first aid/CPR to the group and the Terrigal 50+ members in turn are being encouraged to join Terrigal Surf Club as First Aid or Radio Award Members to bolster patrols.

And the club is still involved with many community initiatives such as the 5 Lands Walk, Lighthouse to Skillion Walk, Bay to Bay run, Terrigal Carols by Candlelight and the ANZAC Day March-Dawn Service and Terrigal's upstairs function for the Veterans and their families. We could not maintain our respected part in the community without providing service to these and many other events throughout the year. Congratulations to all who have been involved with them.

As we count down the days to our 100th Anniversary of lifesaving service to Terrigal Beach we look forward to a season of celebrations, from whole club novelty carnivals to community 'come and try days' to Centenary Balls. The Board of Terrigal Surf Club looks forward to seeing every member at the various activities in our Centenary Year.

EDUCATION REPORT

The 2018-2019 season was a very busy one for the education team. Not only did we have the usual training schedule of Bronze Medallions, SRC, ART and IRB courses we have had a busy year dealing with the changes to the VET sector and its consequences and requirements to maintain our ability to Train and Assess our members. These changes have meant that 4 of our trainers have spent over 170 hours undertaking training to renew their qualifications these hours have been spent on top of their regular patrolling hours and time spent doing other activities within the education team and The Club in general.



The remainder of the education team has not been slacking off either with 107 candidates been trained and 16 of these been for clubs other than Terrigal as some of our neighbouring clubs have struggled to either meet the demands of their clubs or had the resources to run the courses.

Terrigal members have undertaken a wide variety of training in the awards on the right.

The education team has also been expanding their skills with both Tim Pittolo and David Golightly gaining their Assessor Bronze Medallion. Toni Jones, Beris Meldrum, and Allison Sharkey Completing their upgrades to the Cert IV in Training and Assessment with Tim also completing the Design and Develop Assessment Tools Unit. During the season we also welcomed Amelia Cole, David Fawkes, and Tanhi DeAthe into the Team as subject matter experts with the hopes that they may take steps to become fully qualified trainers within our Club.

This year we have started the process of recording and recognising the time that trainers and assessors spend undertaking activities in the Education portfolio of the Surf Club. These hours are broken down into two main categories, training and assessing, and professional development. Throughout the 2018-2019 season, the Education Team spent 811 hrs delivering training or undertaking professional development.

I wish to thank the Education team for their help and support during the season as the work we do tends to go unnoticed and underappreciated by some within the Club, but at the end of the day, there is no lifesaving or competition without Education.

LIFE MEMBERS REPORT 30 April, 2019

The financial report has disclosed that the Life Members Fund enjoys a credit balance of \$72,566.87 (Seventy two The financial Tepot and Sixty six dollars and 87 cents). These funds are held at National Australia Bank A/c #53878thousand, live had been and Term Deposit #12-236-0215 (\$72,128.72). This Term Deposit is due to mature on 26th September, 5225 (\$430.10) The deposit and interest due to \$725.64 will be rolled over for a further term.

The Life Members Fund has seen an increase of \$1,854.82 over the past year. The majority of the increase was interest of \$1,804.82 and a donation by the Club's Masters of \$50.00.

Donations to the surf club have now exceeded \$30,940 since the Fund was established in 1983. The vision for the establishment of the Fund was to create a "Future Fund" for the enhancement of the Club's growth in the ensuing years. establishment of the Club's growth in the ensuing years. The Fund is not there for the utilization by any committee or committees. The Fund is fully run by the Life Members and is conducted on a perpetual basis.

Below is a short summary of the history of the Life Members Fund -

- Foundation of the Life Members Fund during 1983. Foundation members were Life Member Mark Power and Life Member Peter Wyllie.
- Fund established for future members to receive the benefit of the past and present members of the Club.
- Fund to be conducted on a perpetual basis and continue to remain this way.
- Core assets to be retained to ensure the future of the Trust.
- An amount of up to 80% of the interest earned to be donated to the Club and members and their families in the need of financial assistance at the discretion of the trustees on an annual basis. Thus, a minimum amount of the remaining 20% of interest income will be retained to ensure future growth of the Fund.
- The Fund will not intentionally impede on the Club's fund raising efforts and all funds raised in the name of the Fund to be retained by the Fund.
- Life Member Jack Tennent made a donation from his estate in 1989/1990 season of the sum of \$1,000.
- First objective target of the Fund was \$10,000 and this was achieved in the 1992/1993 season.
- Funds in excess of \$30,940 have been donated to the Club since the Fund was established in 1983. This amount has been made up of direct cash donations and the value of the jackets which are presented on the Awards of Excellence Night. Funds have also been allocated to a patrolling member to assist with medical costs.
- The vision for this Fund is that in the future the Fund will be able to provide one or more scholarships/ sponsorships for the members of the Club on an annual basis. These awards can take the form of educational funding or direct sporting cost funding. This, however, will not occur until the Fund achieves sufficient capital to make this possible.

The Trustees have received several enquiries with regard to legacies to the Fund. A Trust Deed is in the process of being prepared to meet the wishes of these donors.

Through the Fund, all donations are making a serious investment towards the training and resourcing of our volunteer lifesavers. Legacy gifts will ensure that the next generation of up and coming lifesavers will be prepared to take on critical lifesaving tasks in the future.

The Life Members are happy to answer any enquiries on the principal function and direction of the Fund at any time.

We will also be grateful for any meaningful input on future fundraising opportunities or direct contribution to the Fund.

TERRIGAL SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB INC. NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

a) Plant & Equipment Depreciation

Plant and equipment are recorded at cost and are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives. The depreciation rates used for each class of assets are:

• Building improvements: 4% to 20%

Surf equipment: 33%

Function room plant & fittings 20%

• Office equipment: 20%

Plant and equipment which has an estimated useful life of one year or less have been expensed at purchase and are shown as gear purchases in the Club's profit and loss account.

b) GST Units

Under the provisions of GST legislation relating to non-profit bodies, the Club has established independent accounting units for its separate functions with differing GST treatments.

The accounts of each of these independent units have been amalgamated in the preparation of the Club's accounts.

c) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax and accordingly no liability is recorded.

d) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

e) Leases

The Club leases the land on which the Club premises are erected from a trust pursuant to the Crown Lands Act. A license has been provided to another entity to operate a café on part of those premises (refer note 18). As the Club is a not for profit entity the value of the lease of the premises has not been estimated. License fees from the sub-lease are taken up as income on an accruals basis.

At the date of commencement of the lease of the air conditioning unit (refer note 17) the value in use and lease liability was determined as the present value of lease payments and taken as an asset and liability respectively. Subsequently the air conditioning unit has been measured at cost and depreciated (refer note "1a"). Lease payments are allocated between the reduction in lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, of low value are charged as expenses in the period in which they are incurred.

f) Revenue

Revenue is recognised as follows:

- Members income, donations and sponsorship revenue is recognised on receipt and recording in the books of the Surf Club.
- Income from the sale of merchandise and product from the canteen is recognised when the merchandise or product from the canteen is supplied to the customer.
- Income from hire of the club house (hall hire) is recognised at the time the club house is provided to the customer.

c) Insurance Coverage

The Club is covered for all public liability claims under the public liability policy established by the NSW Surf Life Saving Association. Policies covering damage to or theft of property and workers compensation have also been taken out directly by the Club. Accordingly, the Committee believes that its insurance coverage is adequate to cover contingencies in these instances.

NOTE 18 – CAFÉ LICENSE

The licence to operate the café has been agreed with the licensee but is awaiting consent from Gosford City Council.

The license to operate the café arose from the exercise of an option on an existing licence and is for a 5year period commencing 25 September 2017.

Rental is being paid in accordance with the terms of the licence in place to 25 September 2017. Under the terms of the new licence additional rent is payable. That rent will be paid on receipt of the consent from Council. The additional rent to 30 April 2019 to be payable is \$52,096 plus GST. This amount will be included as income when received.

The rental per annum from 25 September 2017 is \$102.400 plus GST. Rental increases by the consumer price index on each anniversary,

NOTE 19 - SURPLUS RESERVED FOR CLUB MAINTENANCE AND RENOVATION

Funds on hand are invested to cover the ongoing running and maintenance costs of club, part funding of planned future upgrade of the club and a safety net in case our yearly income, sponsorship or grants are no longer forthcoming.

NOTE 20 – EVENTS SUBSEQUENT TO REPORTING DATE

There have been no events subsequent to reporting date which would have a material effect on the Club's financial statements at 30 April 2019.

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
