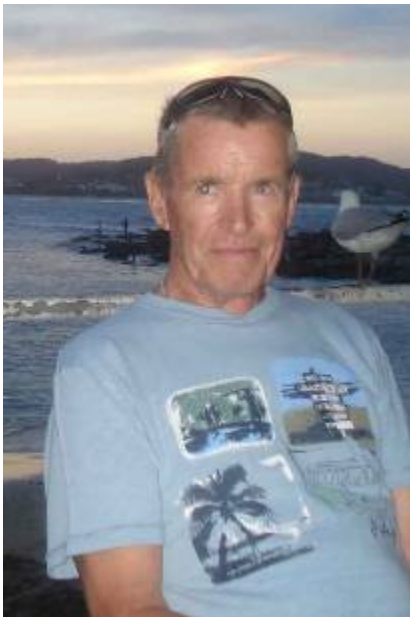

President Report

It is with great pleasure that I present the 2010-11 Annual Report on behalf of the membership of Terrigal SLSC. Terrigal continues to strengthen as a club in many areas, including a dedicated and skilled patrolling force, devoted instructors and examiners who develop our youngest nippers through to our highly skilled lifesavers, wonderful age managers who support our nippers through fun, skill development and education and our committed coaches who continue to produce quality athletes in competition.

One of the most pleasing aspects of our past season, even the past couple of years, has been the cohesiveness of our club as a whole. We, as a club, are moving together, working towards excellence in all areas and supporting each other. Examples of this are the IRB, Board and Ski teams assistance on our Lifesaving and Rescue Days with the Nippers, the choir performance at the Carols, the number and variety of helpers for the Ocean Swim, the fantastic Tremblers and their fundraising efforts for the Nippers and now the "Dukes of Hazard" who have launched themselves into many minor and major roles during the Anzac Day ceremony, Presentation Nite and other tasks, all with the assistance of many others within the club. It is the ability to complete all of these ancillary roles and events and the willingness of our members to give more of themselves that demonstrates the depth of our club. Thank you to all who give their time so generously to assist other areas within our club, know that you are appreciated and applauded by all.

Our membership this year once again exceeded 1000 people, including 303 junior members, 335 active patrolling members and 295 associates. The management of such a large number of members is a huge task and I would like to thank the tireless dedication of our Board members, for their leadership, drive and responsibility in keeping our club moving forward.

In lifesaving this past year, Terrigal had a very busy season, with large swells on several occasions resulting in over 150 rescues and nearly 4000 preventative actions in nearly 9000 hours of patrol. We also dealt with 803 bluebottle stings (a relatively quiet season in this area) and over 100 other first aid cases, keeping our patrol members active all year. I would like to thank our Lifesaving Team, including Glenn Bowles (Director), John Giffney (Assistant), Matt Robinson (First Aid), Josh Cole (Radios) and Daniel Hudson (IRB), Patrol Captains and Vice Captains for their continued leadership, professionalism and development of our lifesaving teams, and all patrolling members for their commitment in making the experience for Terrigal Beach visitors a safe and enjoyable one.

I would like to take this opportunity to publicly thank Kaye Kelly, our Director of Education over the last 3 seasons, for her tireless enthusiasm and dedication to this role. She has led the induction and development of new lifesavers, improved the instruction of our Surf Education program and presented opportunities for skill and knowledge development for all members of our club. Within our club membership, we hold nearly 2500 awards, most of which need to be requalified each year and Kaye leads her team of instructors and examiners with professionalism at all times, as well as taking on many other tasks such as editing Blues weekly and putting together our annual Ocean Swim.

Our Nippers continue to focus on skill, fun and long term involvement with lifesaving, with the introduction this season of the Lifesaving Day to compliment the NSW Sports Safety award winning Rescue Day. They are led by an extremely dedicated team including Greg Rippon (Director) and Beck Rodwell, Age Managers, Water Safety and Junior Coaches who are building the confidence, skills and knowledge of our lifesavers of the future. We are also developing a crop of young beach competitors under Chris Jones, our club's Instructor of the Year, which is exciting for our competition development.

Once again Terrigal had an outstanding season in competition, providing competitors in all facets of surf life saving competition under Clayton Schofield. The Board and Ski team proved again how dominant they are by achieving 6th place overall at the Australian Titles, a phenomenal effort and proof of the outstanding coaching abilities of Paul Broadbent, Paul Lemmon and Paul Stone. The Terrigal March Past team made the finals at the Australian Titles in only their second year of competition, which shows their potential for the future. Saxon Lumsden won our first board riding gold medal at the Aussies also, in the U19 event.

Terrigal also finished 4th at the NSW Championships, 2nd at the NSW Pool Rescue Championships, 5th at the Australian Pool Rescue Championships, 4th in the NSW Endurance Championships, 9th in the NSW IRB Championships. Individually we had 3 competitors in the Coolangatta Gold (Paul Lemmon winning the Over 40 division), 3 in the NSW State Team (Karlee and Amy Nurthen and Rachelle King), 3 in the U21 Development Squad (Ed Gourley, Lauren Hall and Rachelle King), 2 in the Australian U21 Team (Tim Schofield, captain and Rachelle King) and Amy Nurthen finished 6th in the NutriGrain Series.

In IRB racing, Terrigal is producing some great talent under the leadership of Steve Graham, with several placings in the NSW Premiership Series, including Gold with Daniel Hudson, Robbie Bellato and Alix Smith in the U23 Rescue Tube and the team finishing 7th overall. Our Boat team continues to develop under the leadership of coach Dennis Gee and captain Kristina O'Hagen.

This year has been a very challenging year in the administration of the club, with the finalisation of a long term lease with the Lands Department, negotiating a new cleaning contract and also with the sale of the Café, as well as the obtaining of several grants that will enable us to complete some renovations. I'd like to thank Debi Barnes as Finance Director for her steady hands on the purse strings and sage financial advice. We are also in a very strong financial position due to the hard work of Marc Gunasinghe as the Director of Sponsorship. He has developed many new opportunities and relationships for our club over the last season, and improved our professionalism in this area considerably, and should be applauded for his efforts.

I'd like to thank our major sponsors PKF Chartered Accountants and Business Advisors, Crowne Plaza Terrigal, Goodgear, Metal by the Metre and CSR Roofing. It is through the continued support of these organisations, as well as our wonderful patrol, competition and nipper sponsors and other supporters that we are able to achieve the high standards and success that we do.

After weathering a few stormy seas over the last few years, it is now time for Terrigal to look keenly to the future, to continue to develop our club in all ways. This will involve all of our membership in putting forward ideas and putting up your hands to implement them, so we can continue to foster opportunities and improvements that result in ongoing success in all facets of our club's life.

Finally I would like the Central Coast Branch, Chad and the staff, all Directors and office bearers, for their continued support and assistance in helping us achieve our goals.

Director of Lifesaving

The 2010 - 2011 Terrigal Surf Lifesaving Season has again been successful in keeping our beach safe, with no lives lost on Terrigal Beach during our Patrol year. This is a great achievement for this season, especially as we had some of the most challenging and dangerous surf conditions for the past few years.

Sometimes we take it for granted that we have so many patrolling members who have the skill, fitness, ability and confidence to dive into difficult surf to save a life. However, this is not something that just happens, instead it is the result of your commitment and hardwork over a long period and supported by our coaches and trainers. This year we had 103 members achieve 100% Patrol attendance and this is a testament to the professionalism of our club.

I congratulate you all for your efforts during the past season, as 103 rescues were completed despite 4,510 preventative actions being taken. This was the 3rd highest number of 'preventatives' and the second highest number of rescues across the Central Coast. In the previous season we recorded only the 8th highest number of rescues across the Coast. I have attached the overall Central Coast Patrol statistics for your review.

To further prove that we 'were on our game', many of the rescues completed over a busy weekend in mid January, were of swimmers well outside the flagged area. In witnessing several of these rescues, I have no doubt that these people would have drowned if not for the good management and experience of our Patrol Captains, combined with the vigilance of the Patrol members.

To further highlight our high Patrol standards, we were awarded 1st place in this years' Central Coast Branch Patrol competition. Three "audit inspections" were completed on all clubs throughout the season and our final pointscore tally was 5 points clear of second place. This was a fabulous achievement and the first time that most people can remember Terrigal winning this important competition.

Throughout the season several nominations were put forward for the SLSNSW 'Rescue of the Month'. One notable rescue that just missed the number 1 ranking, was completed by Patrol 3 on Sunday, 9 January. This rescue of an elderly man was completed approximately 20 minutes after the patrol had closed for the day, and required a real combined team effort of skills to save the man's life. Many onlookers provided feedback that they were amazed at the response of the team and how well they worked together in a desperate situation.

Our beach remains constantly busy throughout summer and it is the extra work of so many of our community minded members that positions us as one of the most respected clubs in NSW. For example, in one weekend in November we held the inaugural Nippers Lifesaving day. Greg Rippon did an amazing job planning and directing such a great initiative. On Sunday we supported the Central Coast Academy of Sport Ocean Swim with 4 races (1km, 2km, 5km and 10km), which received considerable media attention. In the middle of all this we still kept Requals, Nippers, Bronze Training etc; (and Sips !) going, whilst maintaining our patrol efficiency with big crowds drawn by the nicer beach weather. Each of these is a big event on its' own requiring lots of support from so many areas of the Club. To deliver them all so well over just 2 days was an amazing effort from all involved.

Congratulations to our Lifesaving Award winners for this season. These people continue to set standards that are the best in Surf Lifesaving anywhere across Australia. Congratulations also to Josh Cole, Andrew Reid and Bree Bowles who were selected to represent Terrigal and the Central Coast in the Lifesaving Exchange Program to Sydney on the 21st, 22nd and 23rd of January. Josh then went on to represent NSW in an exchange program with New Zealand Surf Lifesaving.

I also would like to recognise and thank the following people for their support this year:

- The Patrol Captains: for their strong leadership and experience.
- John Giffney: especially for his weekly conditions update to Patrol Captains.
- Matt Robinson & Toni Jones: for their hard work in keeping the First Aid room in great condition.
- Graham Baty: for spending so many weekends completing ATV training.
- Daniel Hudson: for ensuring our IRB's are in good working order.
- Josh Cole: for keeping us on the air with our radio's.
- Kaye Kelly: for being a highly professional 'backbone' of support in so many areas of the club.

All the Training and Assessors: who keep our members skilled and qualified. This is an enormous ongoing task and I greatly appreciate their hard work and support.

Thanks also to our President Mardi Love and my fellow Board Members, who work to make this club strong and always recognise that our core business is Lifesaving.

We ran our second Bronze course for the year using the option to assess along the way and this, along with lots of homework and extra board training meant that the guys involved finished the course as some of the best trained and most enthusiastic Lifesavers that we have ever produced. Josh Cole and I took our Under 13's through their SRC skilling as a group. We built on the knowledge that most of them already had from Surf Ed, Rescue and Lifesaving Days and tried to give them some practical and interesting ways to learn some of the theory. They all enjoyed the radio skills session and were very proficient, very quickly. They also had to present back to the rest of the group their research on rips and currents which gave them some new skills in presenting. Learning as a group developed some good bonding and I enjoyed getting to know some of these people who will be the future of the club.

During my time as Chief Instructor I have always been passionate about all of our members having the correct skills to save lives. I have hounded people to complete their requalification and been adamant that people refresh their skills so that they are ready for any incident. That skilling has definitely paid off this year with the number of successful rescues that our Active Members have performed and by the fact that Terrigal won the Patrol Competition this season where our lifesaving skills have been well and truly tested. We can never afford to relax these skills-this year has proved that we need to be ready willing and able at all times.

For the juniors, again we have provided some great basic skills that will help our young people to grow and learn. The Rescue day and Lifesaving day have been highlights for the season and I am always impressed by the knowledge our juniors already have and by their willingness to have a go at new things. The excellent behaviour of our Juniors is full credit to our Age Managers too who do such an excellent job of providing our young people with a broad and enjoyable experience. Thanks so much to Maureen, Matt and Andrew for your help and also to Greg Rippon whose support, innovation and attention to the things that matter are amazing.

In March 2010 Nathan Smith (Terrigal SLSC Rookie) was surfing off the rocks at North Avoca in 2 metre surf. Some teenage tourists had jumped from the rocks into the big surf and attempted to swim ashore. One of the guys (about 17 years old) really started to struggle and was in serious trouble. The others had made it ashore without help.

Nathan paddled over on his board and supported the guy and raised his arm to signal the Patrol for assistance. Instead of trying to paddle to the beach and chancing the more dangerous wave zone, he did the smart thing and stayed out the back reassuring the guy until help arrived. He jumped in the IRB as a Crewy to help the North Avoca Driver navigate the best way out through the break. They got there quickly and then managed to return the patient safely back to the beach.

Nathan did an excellent job remaining cool and confident while assessing the situation and making the correct decision. His fitness through competition and training also played a big part in saving his patient.

Life Members Report

The financial report has disclosed that the Life Members Fund enjoys a credit balance of \$46,896.56 (forty six thousand eight hundred and ninety six dollars 56¢). These funds are held at National Australia Bank A/c # 53878-3225 (\$276.07) and Term Deposit # 032-545 21-5139 at Westpac (\$46,620.49). This Term Deposit is due to mature on 28th October, 2011. The deposit and interest due of \$1,421.91 will be rolled over for a further term.

The Life Members Fund has seen an increase of \$4,761.53 over the past year. The majority of this is interest of \$3,161.83 and the proceeds of the 2007-08 Car Raffle of \$1,600 being paid by the Club.

Donations to the Senior Club have exceeded \$10,000 since the Fund was established in 1983. The vision for the establishment of the Fund was to create a "Future Fund" for the enhancement of the Club's growth in the ensuing years. The Fund is not there for the utilization by any committee or committees. The Fund is fully run by the Life Members and is conducted on a perpetual basis.

Below is a short summary of the history of the Life Members Fund –

- Foundation of the Life Members Fund during 1983. Foundation members were Life Member Mark Power and Life Member Peter Wyllie.
- Fund established for future members to receive the benefit of the past and present members of the Club.
- Fund to be conducted on a perpetual basis and continue to remain this way.
- Core assets to be retained to ensure the future of the Trust.
- An amount of up to 80% of the interest earned to be donated to the Club at the discretion of the trustees on an annual basis. Thus a minimum amount of the remaining 20% of interest income will be retained to ensure future growth of the Fund.
- The Fund will not intentionally impede on the Club's fund raising efforts and all funds raised in the name of the Fund to be retained by the Fund.
- Life Member Jack Ternent made a donation from his estate in 1989-1990 season of the sum of \$1,000.
- First objective target of the Fund was \$10,000 and this was achieved in the 1992/1993 season.
- Funds in excess of \$10,000 have been donated to the Club since the Fund was established in 1983. This amount has been made up of direct cash donations and the value of the jackets which are presented on the Awards of Excellence Night.
- The vision for this Fund is that in the future the Fund will be able to provide one or more scholarships/sponsorships for the members of the Club on an annual basis. These awards will take the form of educational funding or direct sporting cost funding. This, however, will not occur until the Fund achieves sufficient capital to make this possible.

The Trustees have received several enquiries with regard to legacies to the Fund. A Trust Deed is in the process of being prepared to meet the wishes of these donors.

Through the Fund all donations are making a serious investment towards the training and resourcing of our volunteer lifesavers. Legacy gifts will ensure that the next generation of up and coming lifesavers will be prepared to take on critical lifesaving tasks in the future.

The Life Members are happy to answer any enquiries on the principal function and direction of the Fund at any time.

We will also be grateful for any meaningful input on future fund raising opportunities or direct contribution to the Fund.

The present Trustees of the Life Members Fund are Mark Power, Paul Hawkins and Ron Stone.

The Life Members have conducted an election for the 2011-2012 season and the same Trustees will be forwarded for ratification at the Annual General Meeting.

NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Plant & Equipment Depreciation

Plant and equipment are recorded at cost and are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives.

The depreciation rates used for each class of assets are:

Building improvements:	4% to 20%
Surf equipment:	33%
Function room plant & fittings	20%
Office equipment:	20%

Plant and equipment which has an estimated useful life of one year or less have been expensed at purchase and are shown as gear purchases in the Club's profit and loss account.

(b) GST Units

Under the provisions of GST legislation relating to non-profit bodies, the Club has established independent accounting units for its separate functions with differing GST treatments.

The accounts of each of these independent units have been amalgamated in the preparation of the Club's accounts.

(c) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax and accordingly no liability is recorded.

(d) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

(e) Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the Club, are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Leased assets are amortised on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives where it is likely that the Club will obtain ownership of the asset or over the term of the lease. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the period in which they are incurred.

(f) Revenue

Revenue is recognised as follows:

- Members income, donations and sponsorship revenue is recognised on receipt and recording in the books of the Surf Club.
- Income from the sale of merchandise and product from the canteen is recognised when the merchandise or product from the canteen is supplied to the customer.
- Income from hire of the club house (hall hire) is recognised at the time the club house is provided to the customer.
