




# CHIEF INSTRUCTOR'S REPORT

## I.R.B. CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The Terrigal I.R.B. had more use than most other boats on the Central Coast. There was only normal wear on the boat and motor at the end of the season. My standing instruction to the people training on it has been to take it through, round and over the biggest surfs they can find. A squad of six drivers and as many crew trained throughout the season and by the end all were well over the required hours. It is a tribute to their responsible attitude that the boat cost the club so little money.

Without the monetary assistance of the Australasian Order of Old Bastards the club could not have operated the boat. Barry Roffey's assistance and advice through the season was invaluable and always cheerfully volunteered.
