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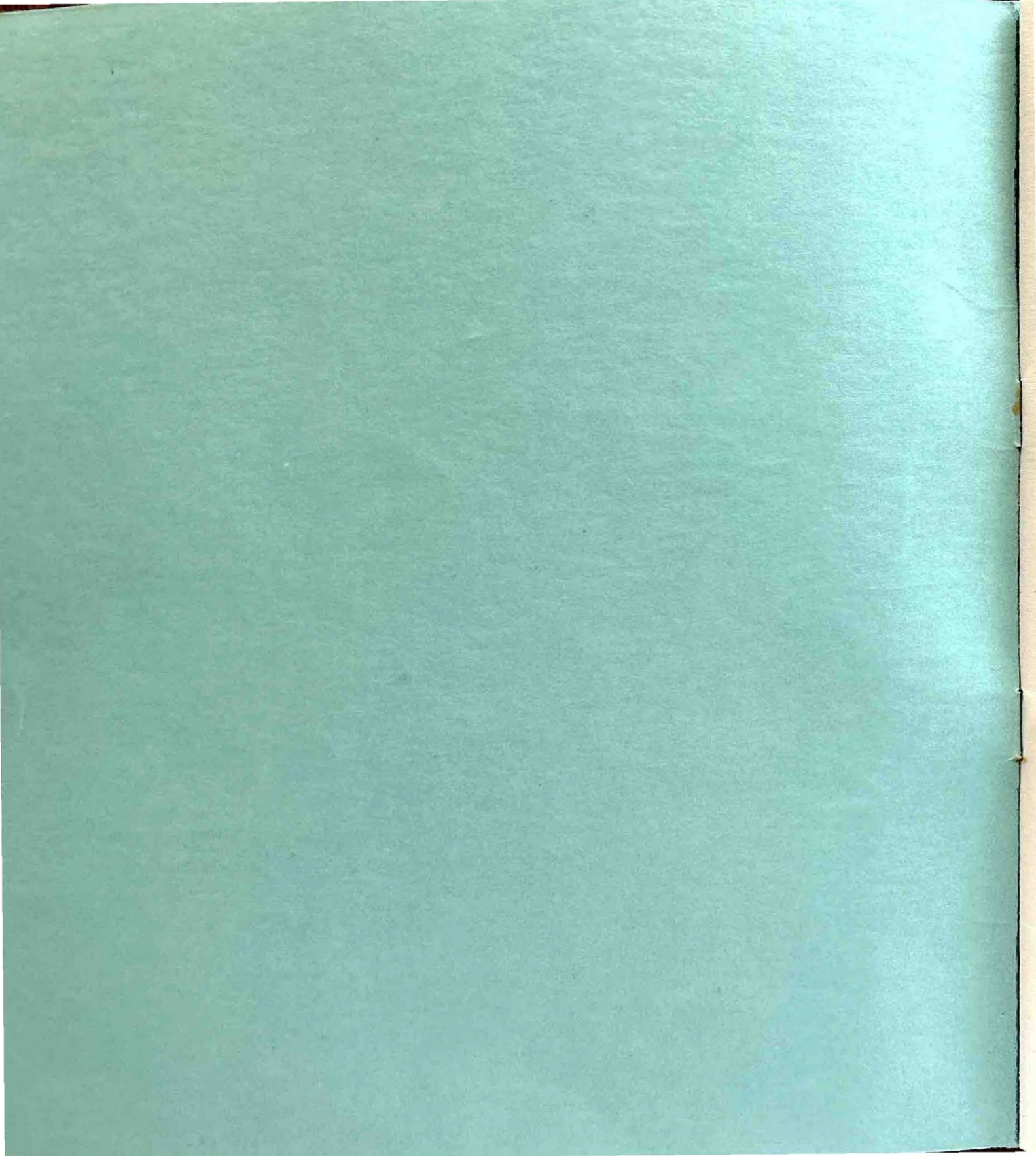

## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I have pleasure in submitting my report as President of Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club for the 1982/83 Season.

The Club has now completed 60 years of patrolling Terrigal Beach and I am pleased to advise that we have once again completed another season with no lives lost whilst the beach has been patrolled.

The year now past has been one of consolidation of the previous two seasons' efforts. The Club's rescue and competition gear has been maintained, improved and added to a standard that I believe is unmatched by other clubs. During the year we have been fortunate to have the strong support of East Gosford Apex Club with the generous donation of a fully-equipped I.R.B. We were also very fortunate with the members of Terrigal Bowling Club winning a fully-equipped I.R.B. at the Pelican Bowling Club Annual Carnival. A very big thank you to both of these clubs for their very generous support.

Financially, the Club's position has further improved with all accounts fully paid. The Club will enjoy, for the first time in many seasons, the pleasure of a balance sheet position which will enable the Committee of the next season the flexibility to manage the affairs of the Club in an efficient manner from the commencement of the season.

Membership figures have been maintained with in excess of 66 active and active reserve members patrolling the beach. The awards gained have been many with further awards still to be obtained when this report was going to press. The efforts of the Chief Instructor, David Honeyman, and his assistants, has resulted in at least 22 Bronze Medallions, 10 Qualifying Certificates, 20 Resuscitation Certificates, 2 Advanced Resuscitation Certificates, 2 Radio Operator Certificates, 3 Instructor's Certificates, 3 I.R.B. Driver's Certificates and 1 I.R.B. Instructor's Certificate.

Associate Membership was down a little on the previous season with approximately 50 members. The Junior "Sea Lions" continued to have a strong membership with in excess of 160 Nippers and Nipperettes.

Competitively, the Club was much stronger this year with mixed successes. The Senior Club was successful with Glen Beckers winning the Gold at the Branch Titles in the Longboard, with only a handful of medals in the remaining events.

The Juniors were much stronger with 8 Gold, 16 Silver and 16 Bronze Medals, won solely at their Branch Titles. A job well done considering the number of members they have compared with other clubs.

Both sections of the Club sent representative teams to the State Titles. Both teams were outfitted to a high standard and were very good ambassadors for the Club.

The Twilight Carnival conducted on the Boxing Day Holiday was again a huge success. This Carnival now attracts competitors of a high standard from all over the State. The Carnival is well run and is a credit to our Club and the organisers.

This report would be incomplete without my personal thanks to the Executive Members: Ken Smith (Secretary/Treasurer); Bob Broue (Club Captain) and David Honeyman (Chief Instructor). My thanks to the members of the Management Committee, Auxiliary Members, Patrons, Honorary Officers, all sponsors for all their financial assistance and especially all the members who carried out their patrols in a diligent manner on the beach. Also, I would like to thank my wife, Heather, for her understanding whilst I have carried out my duties as your President.

I am sure all the members of the Club can look back on the past season as a successful one and that they are looking forward to the many challenges of the next season.

# JUNIOR REGISTRAR & TREASURER'S REPORT

Over the past few years, Junior registrations have been on the increase, this season being no exception. At the close of the season, we had 109 boys registered and 70 girls, a total of 179 children compared with 168 last season. Of these 179 children, 58 children ranging from the age of 7 to 13 passed their Junior Awards.

Total income raised this season by the Juniors (as at 31st March, 1983) was approximately \$3,920. This was mainly from registrations, sale of Christmas Party tickets and beach raffles. Due to a ruling from the State Centre last year, children were unable to collect money in the way of bucket brigades. This was one of our main ways of raising money in previous seasons and the absence of this activity has depleted our income. It is hoped that next year we can find alternative methods of raising money for the Club.

I will not be standing for the position of Junior Treasurer next season. I feel that although the Juniors are now incorporated into the Senior Club, it will be necessary for the Juniors to maintain their own bank account so that it is possible to deposit and withdraw money when needed. It can be quite inconvenient at times when it is necessary to pay an account urgently and the balance of the Junior Float is insufficient. This procedure would help to reduce the work of the Senior Treasurer. I hope that the incoming Junior Treasurer for the 1983/84 season can organise a more suitable arrangement.
