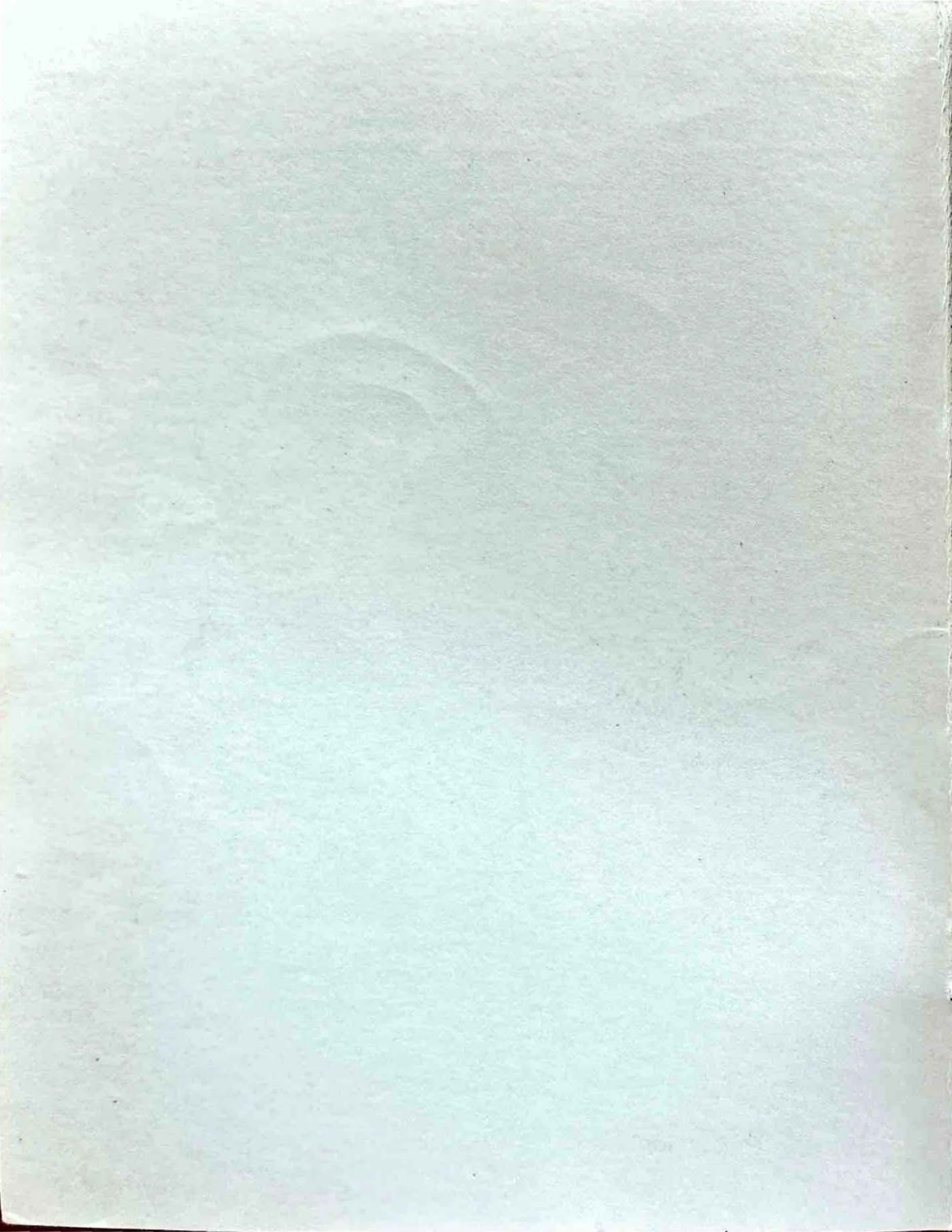

SECRETARY'S REPORT

I have much pleasure in presenting to the members of the Terrigal S.L.S.C. the 61st Annual Report and Financial Statement.

I believe that an Annual Report and Financial Statement has three functions. Firstly, it provides a chronical of events occurring over the season. The various reports seem to adequately cover this aspect.

Secondly, it should provide a clear detailed account of income and expenditure throughout the season. The only comment I have to make on this is that fund-raising for general revenue has been pitiful.

The third function of the report is to add to the recorded history of the club. It should be set out for future years, the growth and development of the club and achievements of its members. With this in mind, it was proposed to publish a quality report with photographic records of members' achievements. The cost of the report would have been \$720 and advertising had been pledged to meet the costs. However, at the Management Meeting of 21st June, 1984, Mark Power advised that a major sponsor, namely the East Gosford Apex, would consider withdrawing its financial support if the project was proceeded with. Why the concern? I do not know, as the report was not costing the club anything. The Management Committee decided against the project, and of course, the pledges lapsed. I trust that we can now be confident of continued financial support from the sponsor and hope that it does not make it a practise of involving itself in the internal management of the club.

SECRETARY'S REPORT continued

I feel that I must make some comment about club morale. I only became Secretary after the previous incumbent resigned over, what I understood, was a disagreement over management practices with other members of the Executive. This, together with the protracted proceedings over what has become known as the "Jamie Legge Affair" has been divisive, demoralising and polarised the two groups against each other. I hope that we can now accept that these incidents are in the past, bury our differences and work together in the interests of the club.

I wish to express my appreciation to members of the Executive and the Management Committee for their patience and support while I learnt the ropes. Special thanks must go to those hard-working persons - no - ladies of the Auxiliary, who maintained their enthusiasm despite the inert response to many of the social activities which they organised - it had to be masochism.

Finally, I must direct special appreciation to Peta Daly who turned up every day to assist me in the canteen throughout the summer holidays and to Gail Grimley for her continual support when others appeared to lose interest.

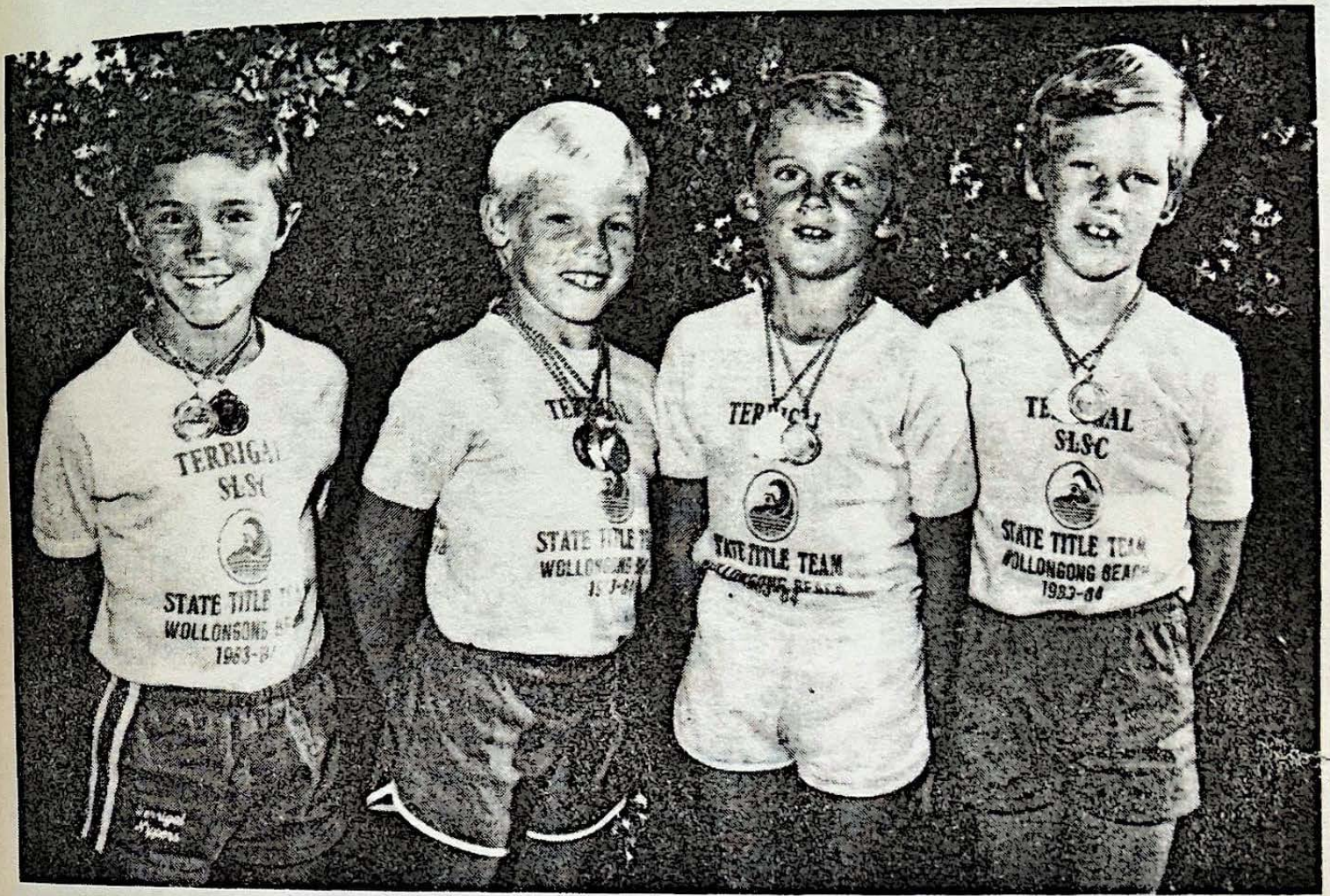
