7. To obtain improved facilities for surf bathing.
8. To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainments of the above objects or any of them.

Carnival attendance was not the Club's greatest strength during 1984-85. It was left to Justine Matthews, Jane Minto and Will Anido to represent the club on a regular basis. Their participation was recognised on Presentation Night when Justine received the prestigious "Rookie of the Year Award" and Jane and Will were voted 'Competitors of the Year'.

One sour note which comes to mind in respect of competition occurred at the end of the season. A number of the new members had become eligible to compete at carnivals and 21 sought to enter the Branch Championships. Unfortunately, through inexperience and mismanagement, the entries were not lodged with the Branch Superintendent by the closing date. Representations to the Superintendent the following day were unsuccessful and an appeal was lodged with the Branch Executive which in turn was rejected. It was sad, that some compassion was not shown towards these younger persons as the movement cannot afford to lose members. I am sure that if Clubs adopted the same autocratic approach, the movement would surely die.

The Inaugural Bay to Breakers Run-Swim was held on Sunday, 30th December, 1984 in conjunction with the Gosford Swimming Club. Although the entries were not what was expected the event nevertheless was a huge success. Paul Lemmon of Avoca Surf Club took out the first place and our congratulations go to him. I wish to express my gratitude to James and Rick Legge who set up the course, Rob Broue for supervising the water safety and to Avoca Beach Surf Life Saving Club for providing two surf boats and crew.

The social activities of the club were a huge success and for this we must pay tribute to Keith and Gail Grimley. It was a pleasure to see that their hard work and enterprise was supported by the members and that their dedication was recognised at the end of the season with their being the recipients of the Associates of the Year Award.

The Judiciary Committee met on one occasion during the year under the chairmanship of the Vice President, Paul Hawkins. Fifteen [15] members were interviewed for missing two [2] or more patrols. Members were warned and advised to make up the missed patrols. One member was suspended from using competition gear until he made up all the patrols plus penalty patrols.

Arising out of discussion with members during the Judiciary Meeting two matters were highlighted which required management action—

- [1] Because of the extension of Saturday trading a number of members were unable to attend Saturday Patrols.
- [2] A number of newer members were not fully appreciative of their responsibilities in regard to patrols and suggested regular meetings for new members with the Club captain.

During the season the Management Committee met on [11] occasions. As can be seen by the schedule of meetings attendance was not good. However, this can be explained by the fact that a number work and reside outside the district, others attend shiftwork, some because of their youth have a hesitancy in accepting responsibility and of course some are just indifferent.

For the past seven years I have been closely associated with the Terrigal Sea Lions and regretablely this year was my final year. I have thoroughly enjoyed my association with the Juniors and of the very good friends I have made over that time. I could not have been more proud of the performance of the children this year and the parents of the Sea Lions must be congratulated on their children's behaviour which was exemplary and an example to be followed wherever they went.

Finally on behalf of all the members of the Club I wish to express their ap-

preciation to Warren Lupica, District Supervisor, for his continuing advice, guidance and support.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT 1984-85

Looking Back to the club's situation at this time last year it is hard to believe just how much the club has improved in just a short time. The divisiveness and disharmony which threatened to split the club has almost miraculously disappeared to be replaced by enthusiasm, helpfulness and a gratifying esprit de corps.

How this change came about I'm not entirely sure, probably by a combination of factors such as the influx of new faces into the club and the committee, the departure of personalities at the centre of disputes and a fresh attitude by the management of the club. However it came about I hope it continues next season [and I'm sure it will].

Aside from this important improvement the club has improved in other ways.

Both deaths occurred outside the patrol area and although the prompt response and efficient resuscitation techniques of our patrol members enabled both victims to be revived, both later died in hospital.

Internal competition has increased during the year with big roll-ups for the Club Championship days, but unfortunately the ranks of our inter-club competitors hasn't similarly swelled. Perhaps next season will see an improvement so that Terrigal becomes a force to be reckoned with at the Branch Titles at both Senior and Junior level.

Congratulations are to be extended to all the recipients of awards on Presentation Night, especially Morrie Abell, the worthy winner of Patrolman of the Year and Peta Daly for winning Clubman of the Year for the second consecutive time.

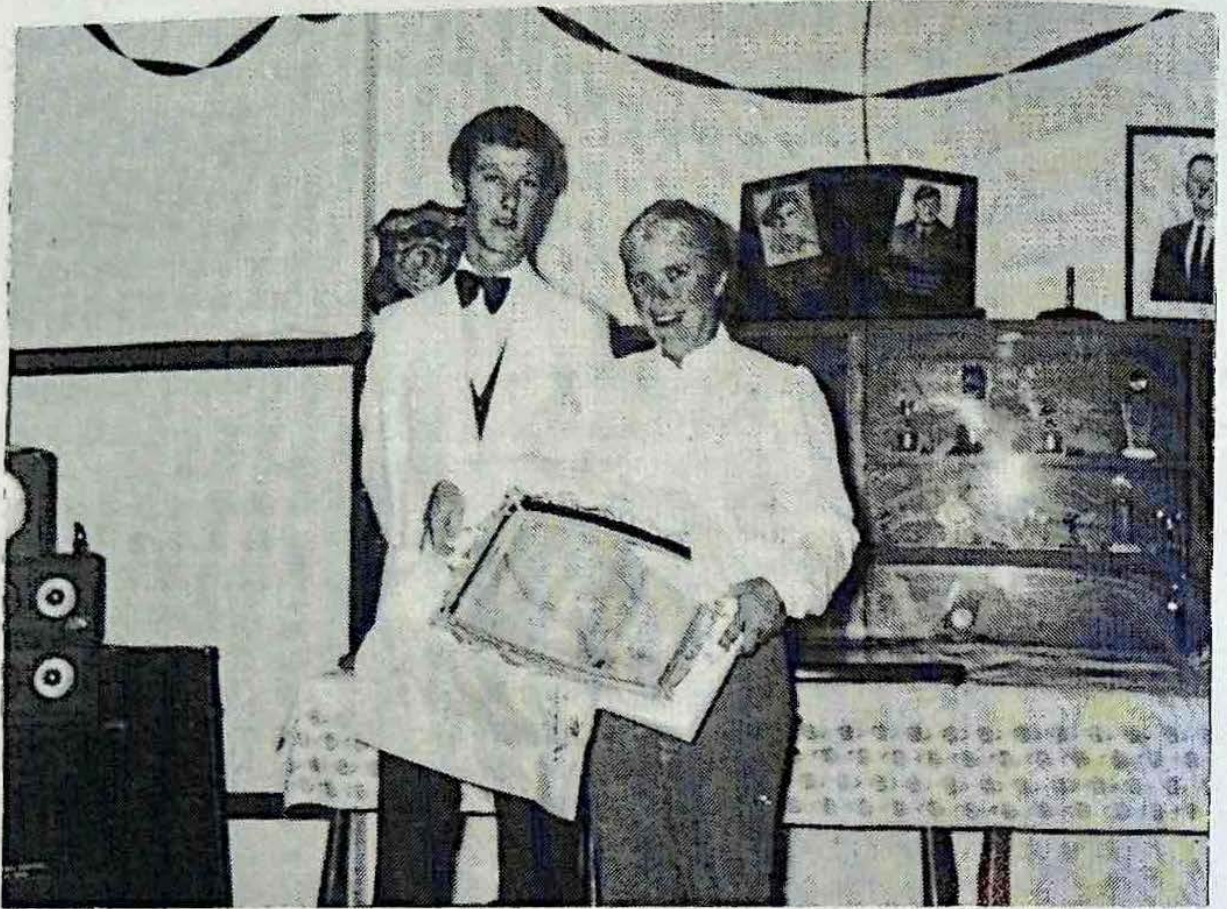

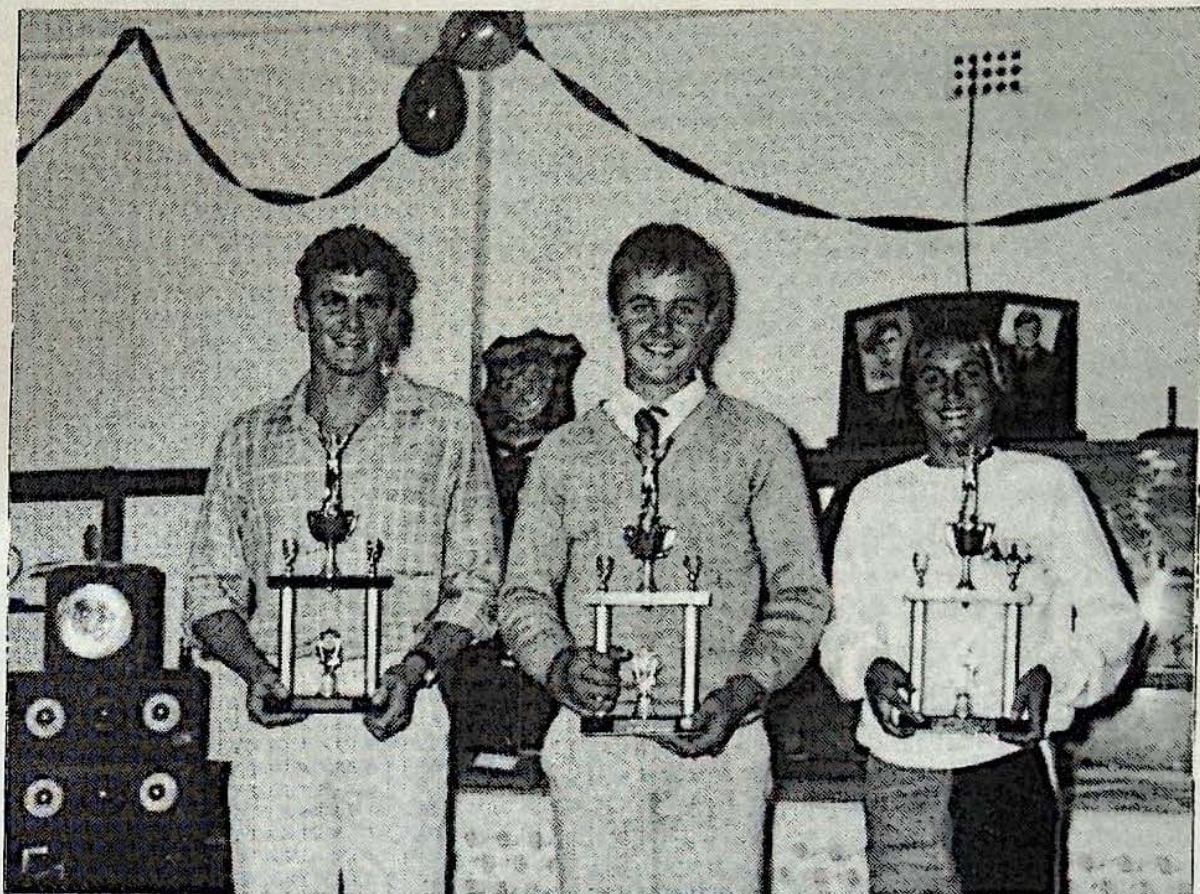

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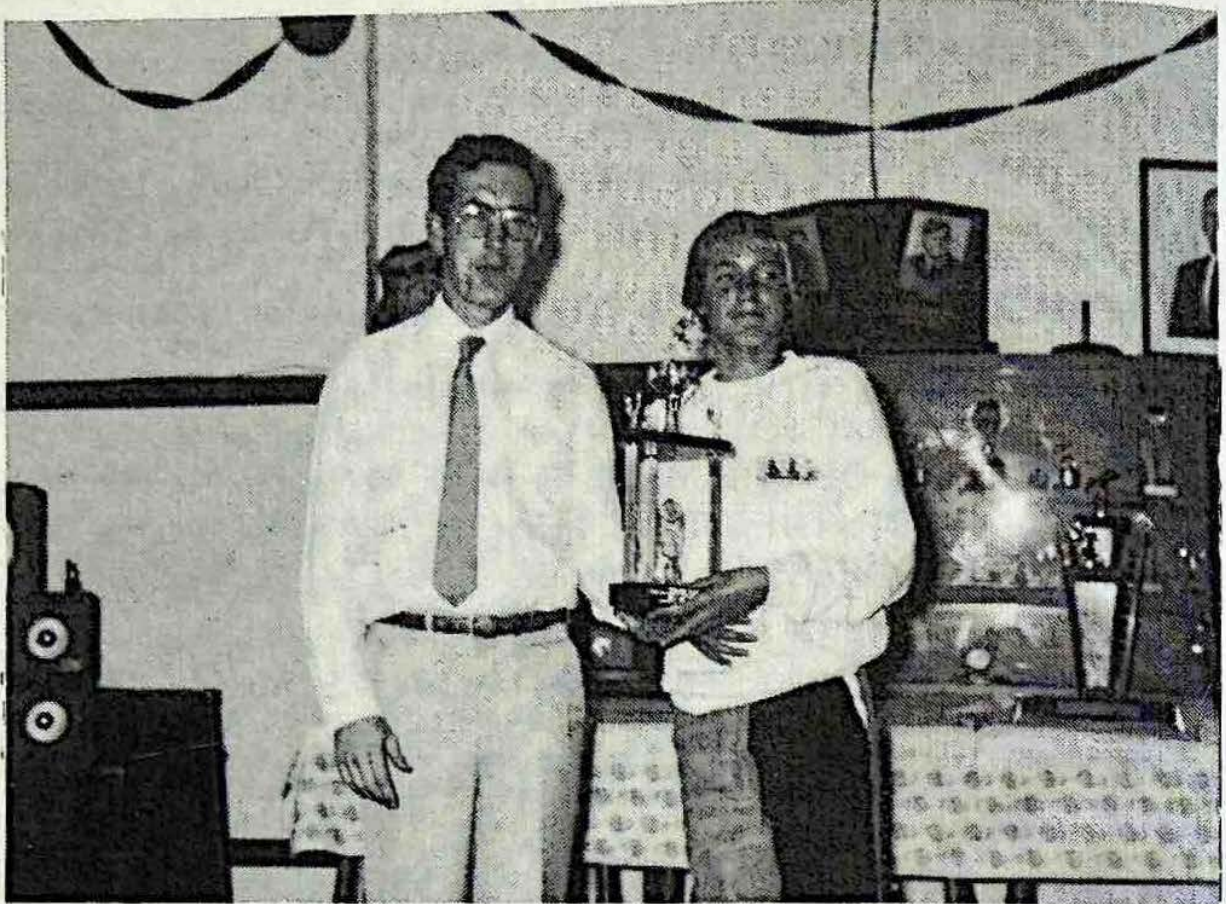

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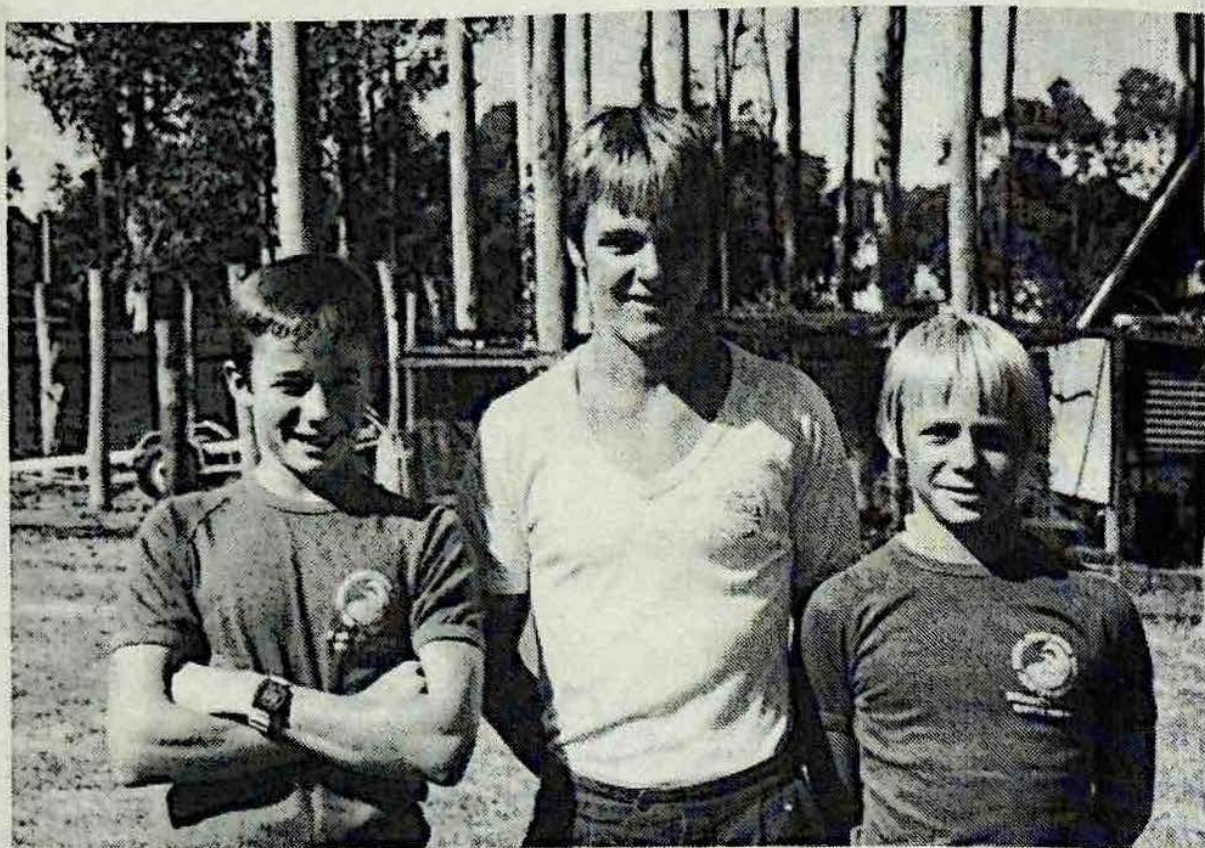


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THE MINTO FAMILY

BOARD AND SKI REPORT

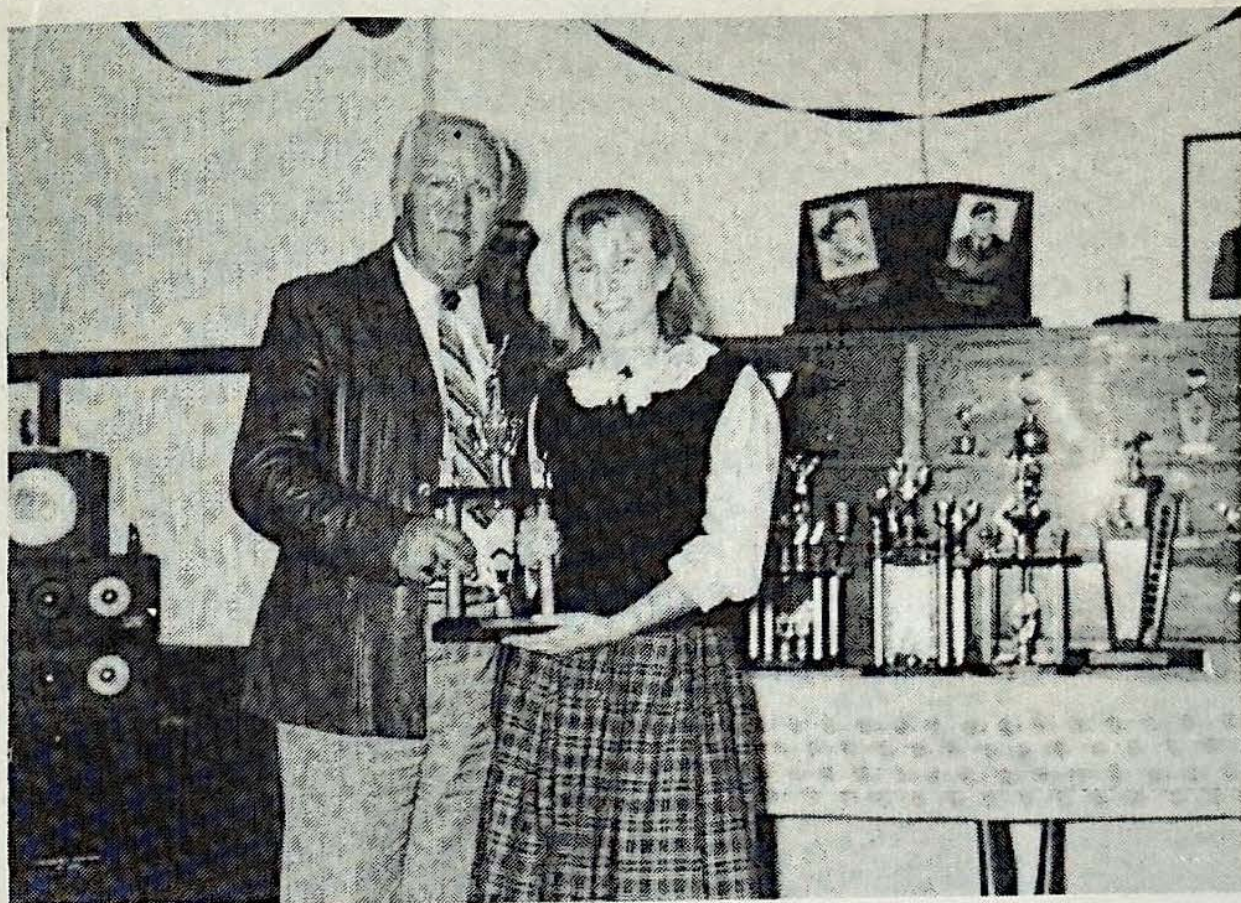
Two new rescue boards were received by the club this season. One was won in a branch resuscitation competition the other was donated by "Hunters Real Estate."

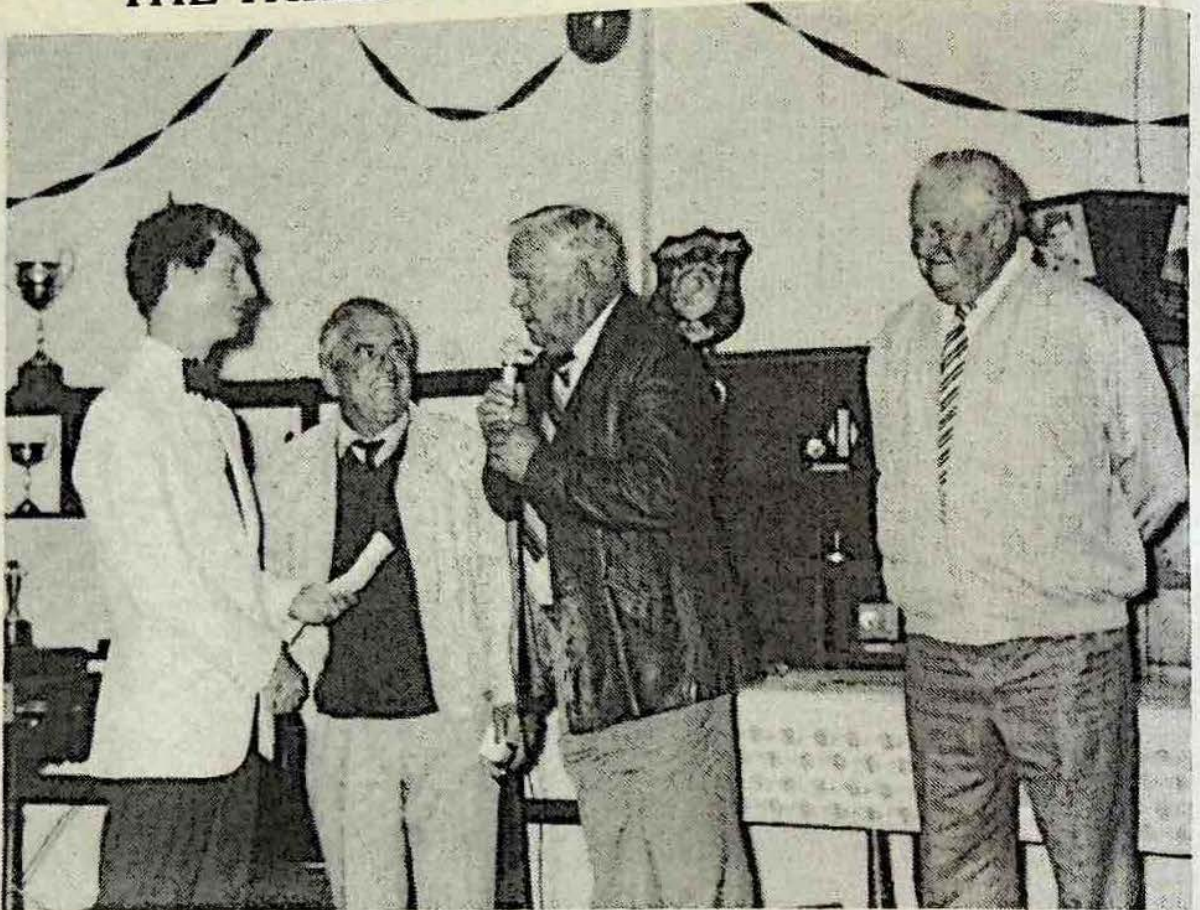

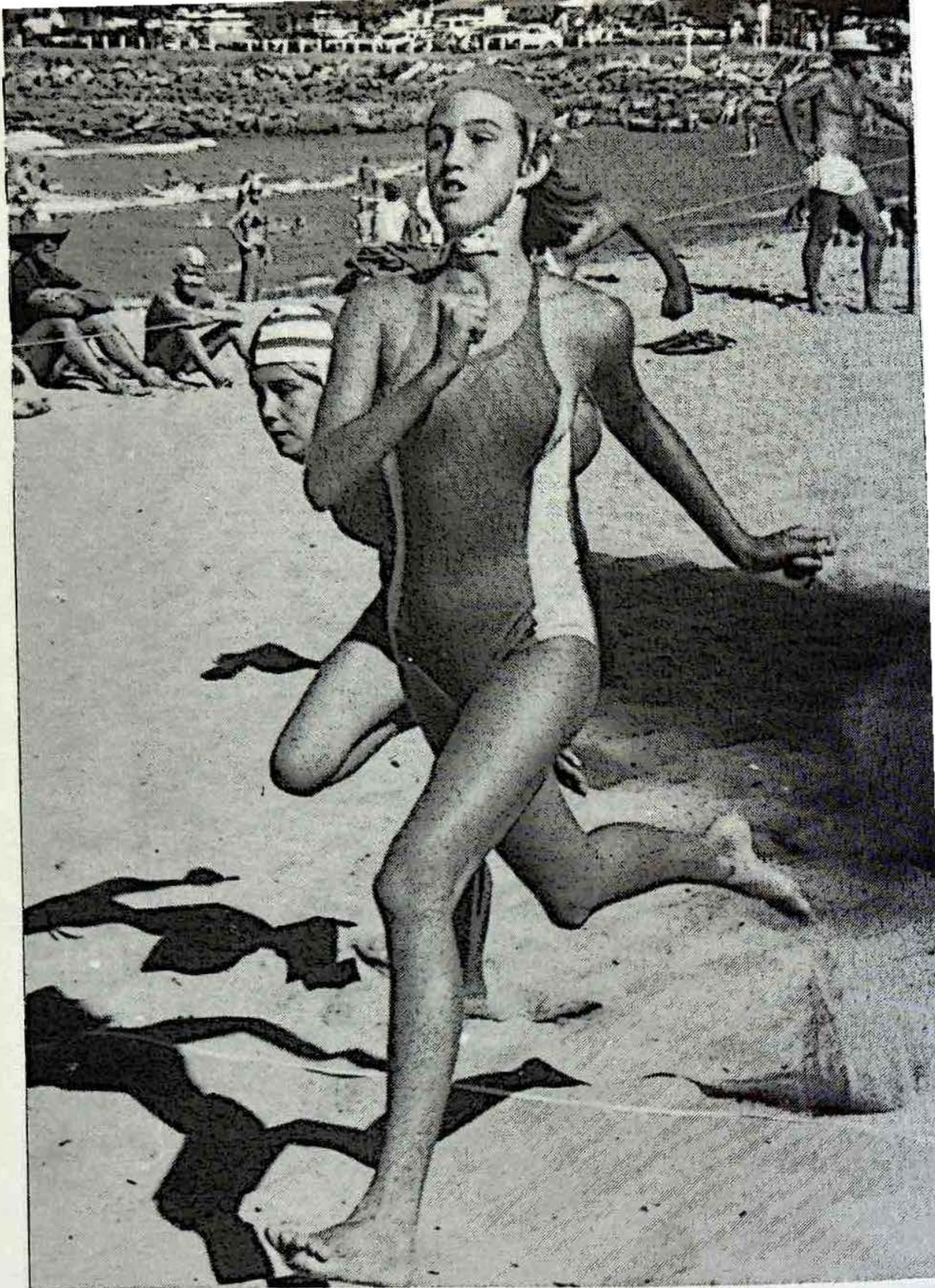

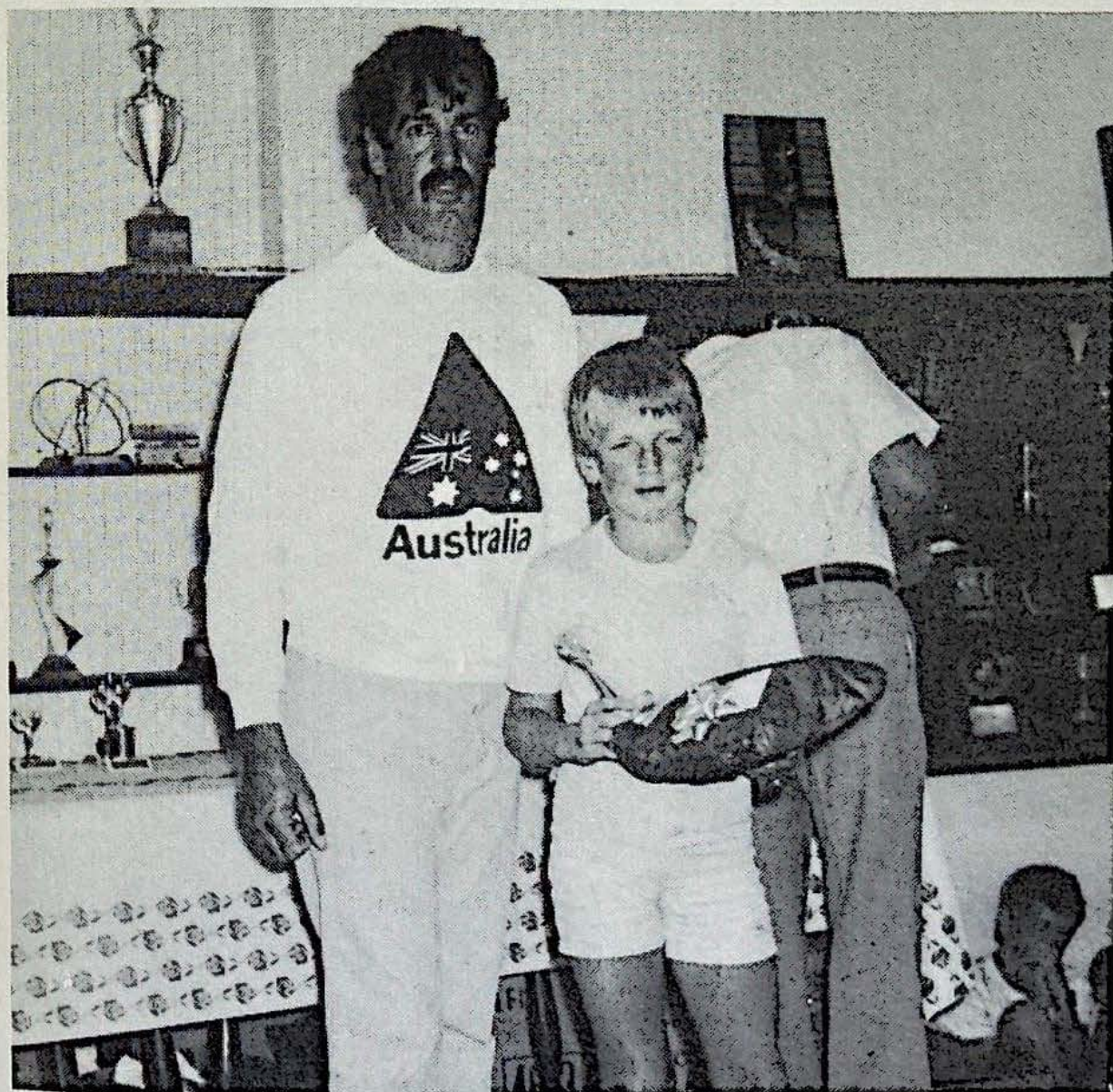

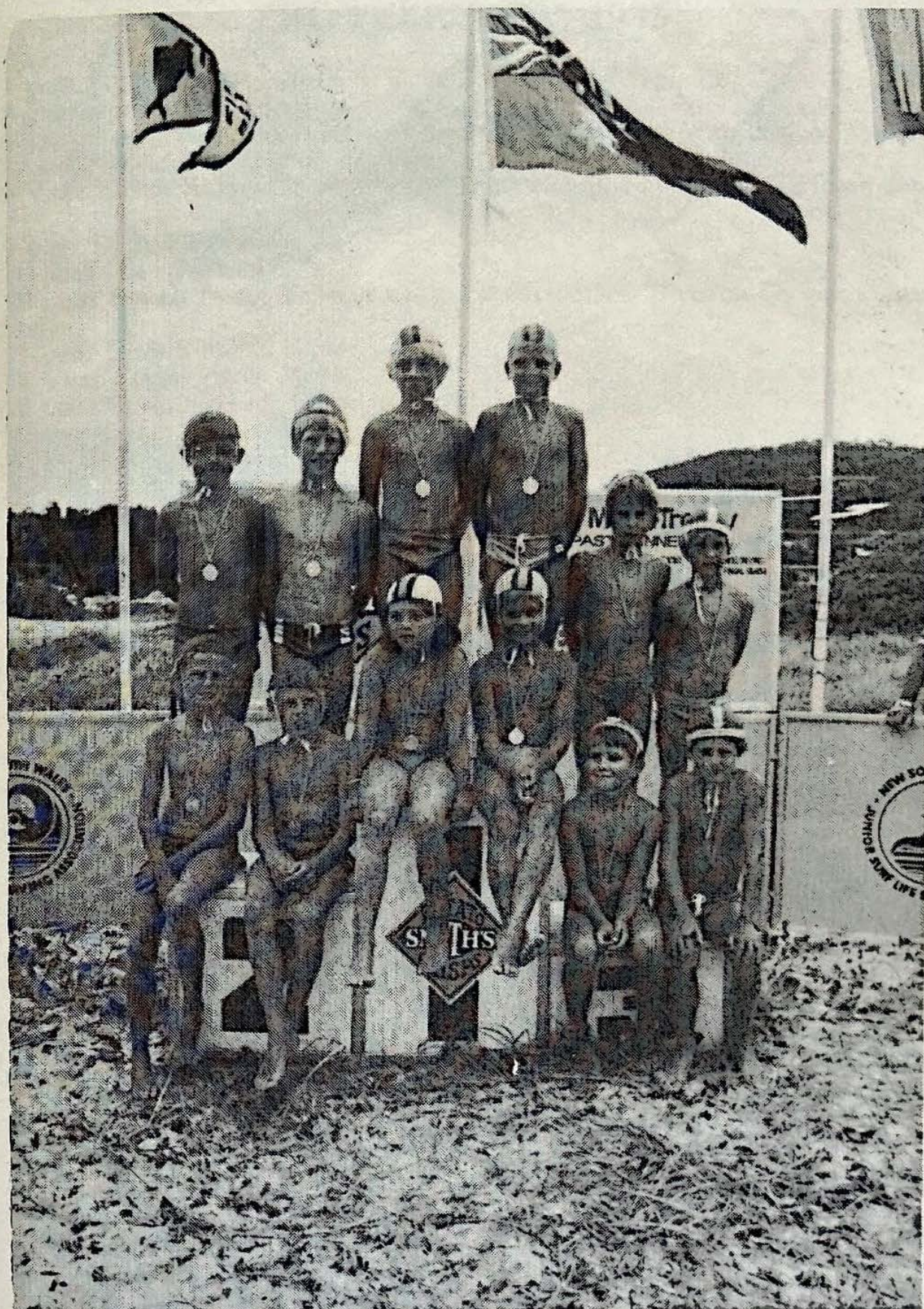

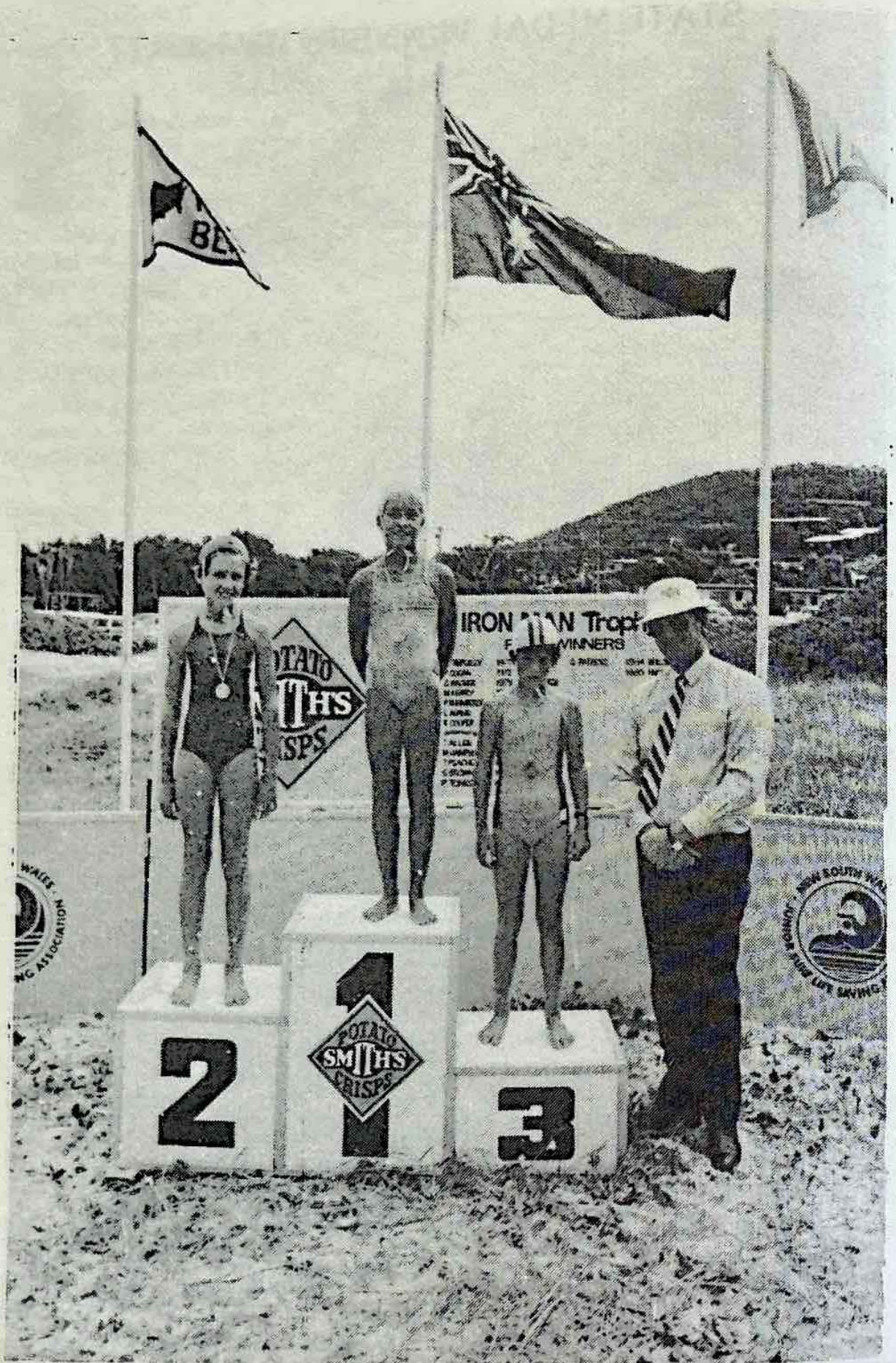
