SECRETARY'S REPORT

I have great pleasure in presenting to the Members of Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club the 64th Annual Report and Financial Statement.

It has been a busy year - the workload placed on members was exceptionally heavy. In addition to the extended season caused by the variation to the school holidays - the Club was the host to four major surf carnivals throughout the year placing enormous strain on the resources of the Club.

The Sterland's Junior Surf Carnival was the first fully sponsored Junior Surf Carnival conducted on the Central Coast. Some 900 competitors took part and the organisation and management of the day was a credit to the Junior Activities Committee under the leadership of the Chairman, Keith Grimley. On behalf of all members of the Club I wish to express our appreciation to **Mr Maurie Vaughan**, Retailing Manager of Sterland Bros. Pty. Ltd. of West Gosford/Toukley for his support and sponsorship.

The Christmas week-end was massive. On Saturday, 27th December, 1986 the traditional Twilight Carnival was conducted under the sponsorship of **2GO Central Coast Radio**. Large crowds were in attendance and were treated to excellent competition.

Sunday, 28th December, 1986 was spectacular - sponsored by the **State Bank** in association with **Central Coast Radio 2GO**, 15,000 people were in attendance to watch some of Australia's greatest in action and were entertained by exciting novelty events.

The day opened with the Bay to Breakers Run-Swim-Run, organised in conjunction with the Gosford Amateur Swimming Club. Eighty competitors took part in the event and after a torrid battle with last years winner [Paul Lemmon] the title went to the Australian and State Ironman Champion, Robert Chapman. The fun continued with sky divers, fashion parades, rock banks, sand modelling, martial arts etc. and throughout all this, on the beach and in the surf, top Australian competitors were trying for substantial prizemoney.

The finances of the Club are healthy - our thanks to **Taubman's/Mitre 10** and particularly to **Joe Pickard** Regional Sales Manager and **Brian Long** Central Coast Representative from Taubmans.

For the first time in many years both oared boats were operational and for this we have Peter Heenan of **Central Coast International Trucks** to thank. Peter again, even in the most difficult of times, dipped his hand into his pocket to meet the cost for repairs and maintenance of the boats.

Licks Home Made Icecream of Terrigal, Bateau Bay and Umina are a new sponsor and got behind the Club to purchase a double Racing Ski. Our Board and Ski Captain was certainly excited and top competitors from all over the Coast came to try it out. All members wish to express their appreciation to **John and Vivienne Bruce** for their support and interest.

The Government has put a stop to fund raising at traffic lights, but fortunately our Club has three organisations who have supported us over the year in our fund raising. These business houses have our deep felt thanks,

Terrigal Bowling Club has given us fantastic support. This year that Club held a special fund raising day and the members contributed in excess of \$2000 towards

On close examination this has been brought about by the failure of parents of nippers to join the Club. Unless partents become involved with the Junior Activities Committee, we will go back to where we were a few years ago, when the juniors were about defunct. There is an expectation for at least one member of each family to become a member. Last year one junior parent held down five executive positions. Even for such a willing worker like Paul Hawkins, he could not do justice to all positions.

Finally, I would personally like to thank Jamie and Rick Legge and other members of the Committee for their support, Ray Duhurst for his typing, Morrie Abell for maintaining the Clubhouse and to Gail Grimley for organising the catering for the carnivals and the social activities of the Club - also Norm Galvin for his assistance once again.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club has had a very busy season. Doing patrols, keeping fit and up to date in new methods, raising funds, maintaining and repairing the building and equipment, training and inducting new members and keeping the more experienced members interested is enough to make every season busy. 1986 - 1987 has been busier than others because of the large number of new members, an extended surfing season and the holding of four separate surf carnivals.

TAUBMANS/MITRE 10 SPONSORSHIP

During the 1985-86 season the Surf Club arranged a very helpful sponsorship with the Taubmans and Mitre 10 groups for the 1986-87 season. This sponsorship this season provided funds for the purchase of over \$5,500 of new gear and equipment. This made a very busy season successful. Without this generous assistance members would have found the task of raising funds to provide minimum amounts of gear and equipment very difficult.

For seven seasons the Surf Club has been dependant on the bank overdraft to provide sufficient funds to start the season. This was not so at the beginning of the 1986-87 season nor will it be true at the beginning of the 1987-88 season. This makes life saving much more straight forward. Taubmans and Mitre 10 deserve some of the credit. Many Club Members have helped raise funds and save on expenses. Greatest credit should go to Doug Anido and Rick Legge.

CLUBMAN OF THE YEAR

Doug Anido has as Secretary of the Surf Club the job as communicating with all the Members. The Secretary has the very onerous task of communicating with a host of other organisations to do with such things as repairs and purchases, accounts for payment, community groups, sponsors, all sorts of government organisation, various individuals and businesses and many life saving organisations. Doug Anido found time to cope with the heaviest workload of any club secretary that I have known. Doug went further taking long service leave during January to raise money for the Surf Club. For these reasons Doug Anido was Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club's Clubman of the Year in 1987.

LONG SERVICE AWARD

Rick Legge has been Treasurer of the Surf Club for five years which is longer than anyone in the last thirty years. Rick was Treasurer for a period during the 1970's and has been again Treasurer for three years during the 1980's. Both times when Rick took over as Treasurer the Surf Club has a problem with overdrafts. Rick has also been an active member for seventeen seasons. At the presentation this year Rick Legge was presented with an Honour Blazer in recognition of his service to the Club.

PATROLMAN OF THE YEAR

This year's Patrolman of the Year was John Trickett. Patrolman of the Year are chosen not just for the number of patrols carried out but for the manner in which they are carried out. John brings more than competence to patrols, he brings enthusiasm as well.

PATROLS

Paul Martin, Club Captain, had his first year in the job as did his Vice Captain,

Stuart Boag. Half the Patrol Captains were carrying out their responsibilities for the first time. Considering these factors and the large number of new members, patrols went remarkably well. Patrols would not have been successful if Paul and the Patrol Captains had not led by example.

Peta Daly has been Chief Instructor for the past two seasons and has indicated that she will not stand for this position in the coming season. This season saw one of the largest inductions of new members for many seasons. Terrigal's success as a Surf Club will be related to the success of Peta Daly and the other instructors over the last few years. While Peta Daly has been Chief Instructor the Surf Club has gained more awards than in past season.

CARNIVALS

Sterland Bros. of West Gosford - Toukley, Australia's largest Mitre 10 Store sponsored the first Junior Carnival that Terrigal had chosen to hold for many years. It was a great success and our appreciation is extended to Sterland Bros. for their considerable support.

Terrigal, as in the past years, hosted the Central Coast Rescue Carnival and in conjunction with the Central Coast Branch Team, held the Terrigal Twilight Carnival. All these carnivals required considerable extra work from members.

In September, Terrigal Surf Club was told that it has been chosen to hold a State Bank Spectacular. Unfortunately the day that had been chosen was the day after the Twilight Carnival and the day of the Gosford Swimming Club's Haven to Breakers Event. The weekend involved the efforts of over eighty Club members. This was a magnificent effort. The State Bank Spectacular held at Terrigal was one of the two most successful held in the State last year.

SOCIAL ACTIVITIES

Two people contributed most to the success of social functions in the 1986-87 season. These were the Associates of the Year, Keith and Gail Grimley. Social functions are crucial to the success of the other activities of the Surf Club.

COMPETITION

Competition is important to the Surf Life Saving Movement. Competition increases keenness, encourages fitness and produces improvements in equipment and techniques. John Minto was the Terrigal Surf Club's Competitor of the Year. John was successful at Branch, State and National Titles. It is pleasing to note that John was only one of many members who participated in competition during the season. Len Cook, the old war horse of the surf, induced enthusiasm and competitive spirit not seen for many years. The Blues were seen regularly at carnivals right across the state.

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES

The Terrigal Junior Activities Committee continues to administer the activities of Terrigal Juniors efficiently and most importantly, with the best interests of the boys and girls foremost. Although not winning the Branch Titles this year they continue to be the best organised and friendliest junior activities group. Their success is evident from the many happy children and involved parents that can be seen most Sundays on Terrigal Beach during the surfing season.

THE FUTURE

The coming season sees new and greater challenges for the Surf Club. While gear

continually needs replacing as it wears out, each year means replacement at a higher cost. A new I.R.B. would cost about \$7000 and a new surf boat would cost about \$12000. The tougher economic conditions means that funds are harder to raise from individuals and businesses. The economic conditions means that it is getting harder to attract and keep new members. Many members find that circumstances force them into shiftwork, weekend work, commuting or moving. These work situations make it hard for members to fulfil their commitments.

1986-87 was the surfing season with the most patrols in it up to that date. 1987-88 will be the first of the new surfing seasons extending from the September school holidays to the April school holidays. This means more patrols.

Next year we will also see the introduction of a new training manual and a new award structure. For all instructors this will mean major retraining. A new expanded proficiency test will require all existing members to retrain in several areas.

The membership as a whole worked hard last season. More importantly, the Terrigal Surf Club was a happy club. The people mentioned in this report are only part of a larger group of great people. The Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club will meet the challenges of the coming season.

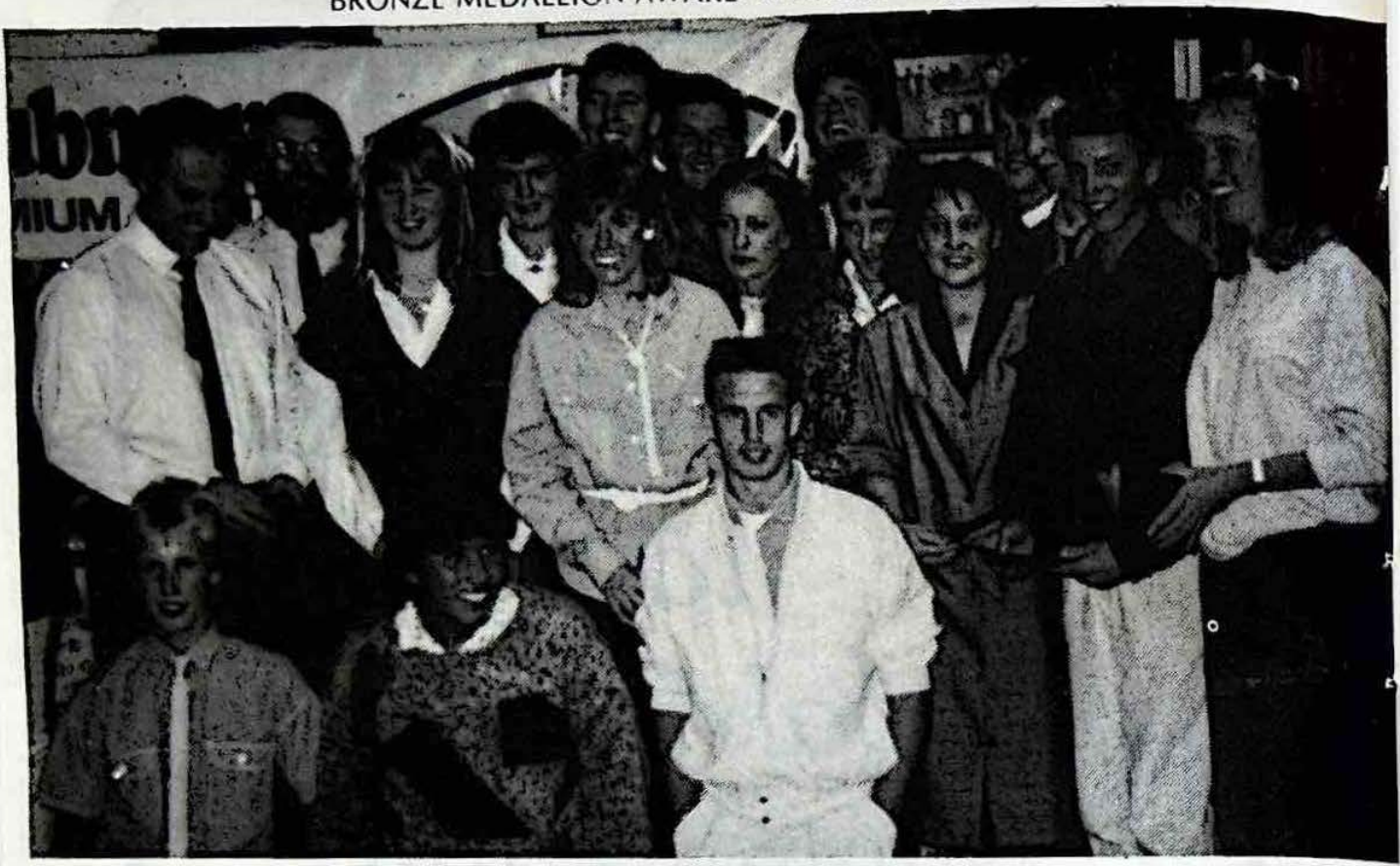

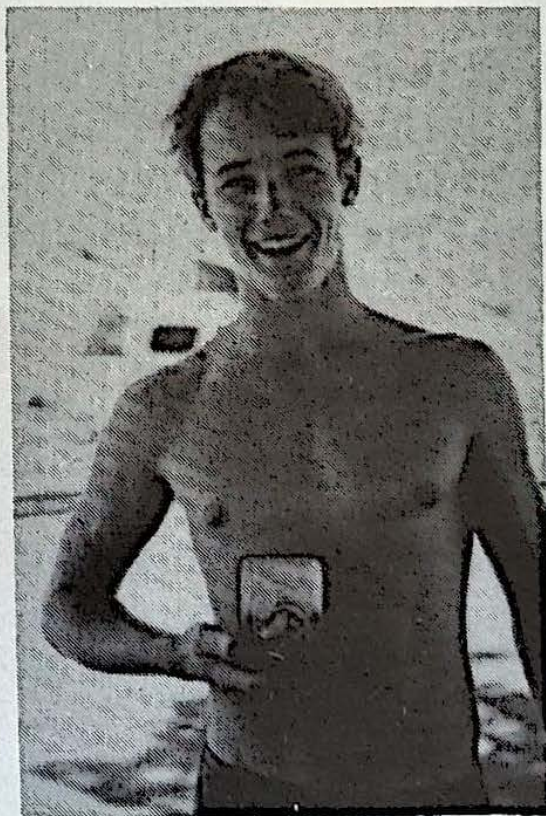

State Bank

SURF SPECTACULAR

Three seasons ago the State Bank introduced a new concept to Surf Life Saving - the "Surf Spectacular". In that time the State Bank Spectaculars have been accepted by competitors and spectators as a natural part of the surfing season.

This season Terrigal Beach was chosen as the venue for the State Bank's Surf Spectacular. 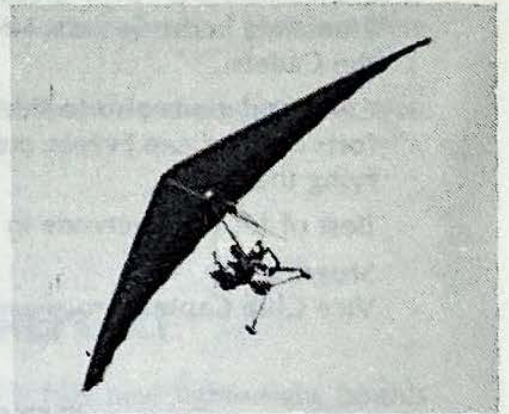

Many thanks to the Committee and to the parents who helped in any way throughout the season. Without your help the junior section of our club would not be able to function successfully.

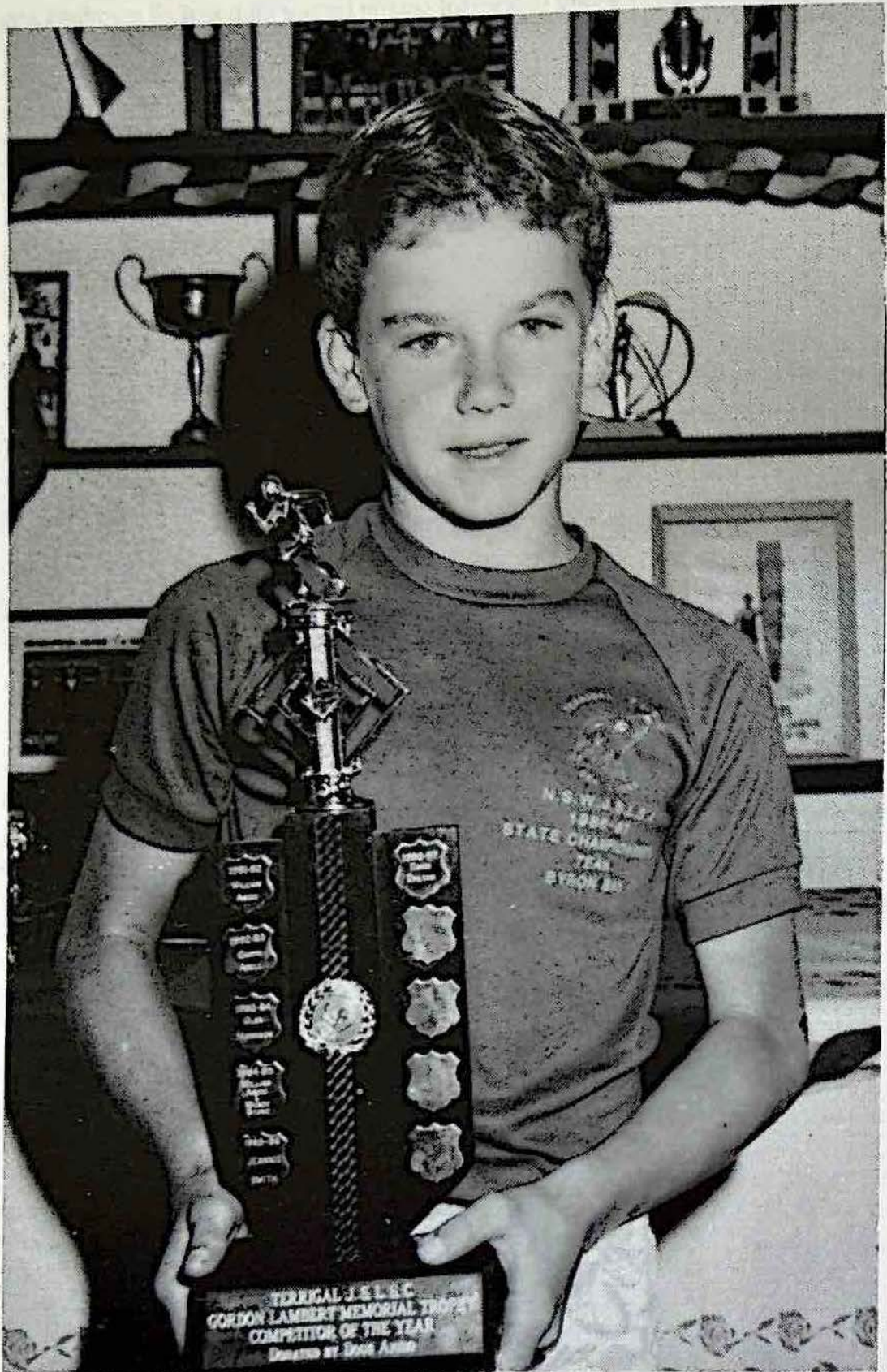

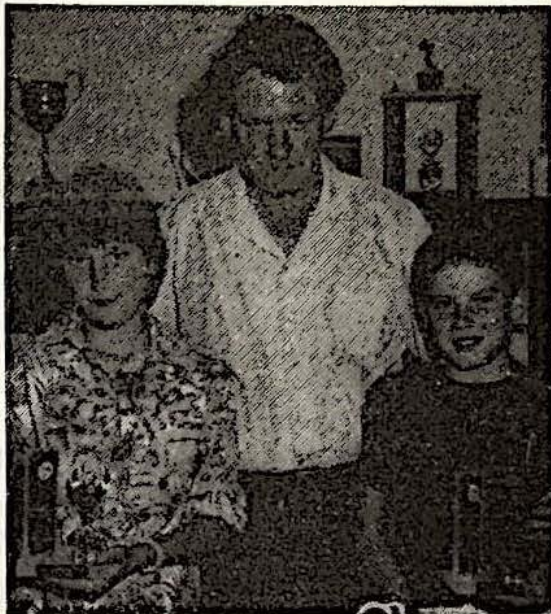

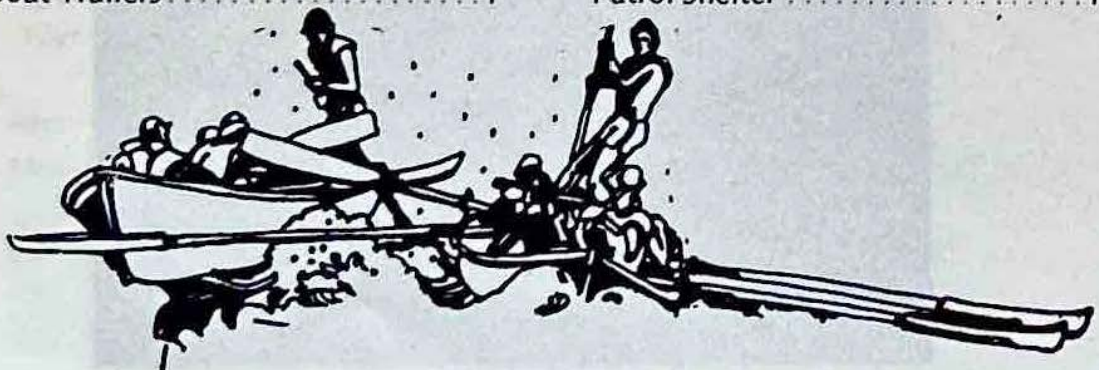

b. Revenue and Expense Recognition -

The Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club is a non-profit organisation and receives most of its income from donations and specific fund raising events. Amounts by their nature can only be recognised when they are recorded in the books of the Club.

Expenses are accounted for on the accruals basis.

c. Imprest Accounts -

The auxillary committee and The Terrigal Sea Lions run imprest accounts from which they make minor payments. The imprest balances are \$500 each. The Club treats these monies as spent when advanced.
