

TERRIGAL SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB 1925 - 1988

Terrigal Beach, one of the most beautiful surfing beaches in the country recently received enormous media exposure when on 31st January, 1988, as a part of the Nation's Bicentennial Celebrations, was the venue for the Royal Surf Carnival, patronised by their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales.

It seems fitting that our beach was chosen by the State Protocol Committee for this event considering the grand tradition in surf life saving and competition associated with Terrigal Surf Club since its inception.

The Club which was one of the earliest to be formed on the Central Coast began in the 1925/26 season when a small band of dedicated men under the Presidency of the late A. J. Macarthur-Onslow got together to patrol the beach and later, build a club house. Mr Macarthur-Onslow was of course a member of that great family so closely tied to the history of this country.

From that small beginning grew a club proud of the achievements of its members in lifesaving, administration and competition. The Terrigal Surf Club first came into the news in 1938 when its boat crew was awarded the Royal Humane Society Certificate of Merit when it attempted to rescue two people off the rocks near the Skillion. The boat crew was also recognised for its rescue work in the great flood of the Hunter Valley in 1955. Over the years the various boat crews not only proved themselves in rescues but proved highly competitive at carnivals.

On two occasions the club was State Pointscore Champions and twice State Country Champions. While individual State Champions are too numerous to detail three competitors are worthy of mention.

John BURGESS: Joined the club in 1939/40, member of R and R team until 1955, Club Captain 1953-54, Secretary 1955-6-7-8-9, Treasurer 1960-61, Senior Club Captain 1940-41, 1946-47, 1949-50, 1950-51; Central Coast Belt Champion 1949-51-52; 3rd State Belt Championship 1950; Member NSW R and R team 1951; Life Member 1951, awarded Club Honour Blazer, Club President 1963-4-5-6.

While on active service during the war, John was involved in setting up a surf club in the Soloman Islands and over a period of eight months members performed 280 rescues, 244 rescues were performed with the line and 36 without. Before the establishment of the Club 88 allied servicemen had lost their lives drowning. John is still very involved with Terrigal Club and will be eligible to receive his 50 year Medallion next season.

Torokina Beach, Bougainville, Solomon Islands

Gorden LAMBERT became the first Terrigal member to win an Australian Title, when in 1954-5 at the age of 20, he won the Single Ski Championship.

He also won the State Title 1959-60 and the NSW Inter-branch event in 1966-67. That year he was Captain of the winning Taplin Relay Team and Captain of the NSW Country Team that toured New Zealand in 1970. He has won the Central Coast branch Single Ski Title more times than anyone else -each year from 1949-50 to 1964-5 and again in 1967-68.

He was Captain of the winning Taplin Relay Team at the 1967 Australian Titles.

Gordon was President of the club from 1967 to 1969 and 1973.

He was a Police Sergeant stationed at Terrigal, and over the years had rescued many children from the lake and adults from the surf during his off duty hours.

His skill as a Ski Rider was responsible for saving many lives.

It was a terrible tragedy that he died at such at young age in 1978.

Ron Sumner won the Australian Title in 1962 and 1963 and teamed with Gordon Lambert to win the State Double Ski title in 1962, and they came second also in the Australian Championships.

His performance in the Australian Championships on the Ski have never been beaten.

Ron is a businessman in Terrigal and although no longer actively involved with the Surf Club he has achieved many successes in Catamarans with the Terrigal Blue Water Sailing Club.

One of the great administrators in surf lifesaving was **Frank PAYNE** who joined the club in 1930, became Captain 1932-3 until 1938-39, succeeded A. J. Macarthur. Onslow as President, holding office from 1940-49 and 1954-56. Central Coast Branch Superintendent for 12 years and President from many years. Currently patron of club and branch. Life member of club, branch, NSW State Centre and National Council.

Frank is now retired and living in Ballina and from time to time pops in to make sure the club is still operating satisfactorily.

Another "first" for the club was when members of its Ladies' Auxiliary actively patrolled the beach during the war years when almost every active member was on war service.

The club minutes of October 1943 state that members of the ladies' committee were asked to undertake active patrol work in conjunction with club members.

This was the first time that women had been allowed to undertake such active duties and the Surf Life Saving Association would not allow them to go for their life-saving awards.

But Terrigal club put the girls through a test which was the equivalent of the Bronze Medallion, except for the swim section, and awarded the auxiliary members special certificates.

Following on in this tradition when ladies were permitted full rights within the surf lifesaving movement Terrigal Club had the first patrol of all lady members on the Central Coast under the captaincy of Linda Scott and Peta Daly became the first lady to be a full member of the Board of Examiners on the Central Coast, 1985-86 Season.

Many family groups were member, including Fred, Hal, Gale, Ron, Roy and Leo Dibben; Stewart, Jack, Harry and Reg McGlashan; Jack, Kev, Les, Alan, Peter and

Chris Graham; Harry, Kevin and Neville Vickery; Paul, Tony, Louie and Peter George; and Ted, Jack and Mitch Alexander.

Brian Gregory was Captain from 1961-64 and his father Frank was President in 1964-5.

Another grandfather - father - son combination was Jim Wyllie [Vice President four years], son Peter and grandson David, both active members in the early 1970's.

Carrying on the tradition of their father Karen and Phillip Vickery are current members of the club. Also members of some 17 years standing are brothers James and Rick Legge, President and Treasurer of the club. Looking to the future of course there is that great competitive family, the Minto's with nine of the family, members of the club.

In 1978 Terrigal Junior Surf Club amalgamated with the seniors and as a consequence has developed into one of the largest and strongest junior activities group on the Central Coast. Each year the numbers of juniors graduating into the senior ranks grows which augurs well for the future of the club and lifesaving.

One can only wonder whether that small band of dedicated lifesavers who came together in 1925 to form Terrigal S.L.S.C. had the vision to see what the Club would become today. There are 312 members of which 107 are actively involved in 10 patrols. In competition the club was runners up in the Branch Championships and Branch Handicap Point Score. Representative teams were sent to the State, Australian and the World Titles. Out of the team 12 at the World Titles seven made the finals. To some the highlight of the year was the performance of the team of Will ANIDO, Paul MINTO and Stuart BOAG under the leadership of Len COOK who at the World Titles came 3rd in NSW, 6th in Australia and 11th in the World in the Lifesaving Initiative Assessment Examination. This is a practical test of the use of lifesaving knowledge and skills in a mass rescue situation.

Whatever their vision I am sure they would be proud.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club has had an eventful season. The first half of the season was very busy. In the second half of the season the weather made patrol work difficult and boring. More importantly, there were so few fine weekends that the Surf Club had a very unsuccessful season financially.

THE ROYAL CARNIVAL - TERRIGAL BEACH 31ST JANUARY, 1988

On the 31st January, the Royal Surf Carnival was held at Terrigal. Terrigal did not apply for the honour of holding this carnival. Indeed, the management committee of the Surf Club read about it in the newspapers. Further, the Surf Club did not benefit financially from the carnival due to arrangements made by the Central Coast Branch of the Surf Life Saving Association. In spite of some problems in organising the carnival, it was very successful on the day.

Terrigal Surf Club was completely responsible for water safety on the day of the carnival. Patrols started at 7.00am and from 8.30am there was never less than eighteen people on patrol. During the carnival competition it became necessary for Terrigal's Taplin Team and Junior Boat Crew to pull out of their respective events to assist with water safety. This was due to a number of mass rescues occurring outside the patrol area. Other members assisted in the setting up and hosting of the carnival.

The day itself was as near to ideal as could be asked for. The weather was fine and hot. In the morning the surf was a little too big, but by the starting time the waves had settled down to a maximum of two metres. A large crowd of over twenty thousand spectators was enthusiastic and well behaved. Most importantly, no one was hurt.

COMPETITION

It was pleasing to see the attitude with which our competitors sacrificed the chance of winning a medal at the Royal Carnival to help save lives. They were lifesavers first and competitors second. In spite of this, Terrigal Surf Club won more medals at the Royal Surf Carnival than any other. Terrigal completely dominated the events that the Royals were best able to see, that is, the beach events.

The winning of events at carnivals is mostly due to the competitors themselves. Other people have contributed to that success. Len Cook and Bob Cairncross have made special contributions.

Len as Carnival Secretary, was always organised and can be relied on to see that things get done. Further, Len's positive and encouraging approach with the younger competitors makes competing enjoyable as well as successful.

Bob has helped the sprinters, particularly the Junior Relay Team. The Junior Relay team were the most successful competitors in the Club this season and were collectively awarded "Competitors of the Year".

CLUBMAN OF THE YEAR

Morrie Abel, the I.R.B. Captain and a past Patrolman of the Year, was selected as the 1987 - 1988 Clubman of the Year. Morri had an especially difficult year. At the start of the season, Morri had two old I.R.B's needing repairs before they could be fully operational, an old, unreliable motor, another motor that was not functioning, a shortage of drivers and very little help.

Financial contraints added to the difficulties that Morrie has faced, however, for the Royal Carnival, Morri had two I.R.B's operating. Just after the season Morri's patient training was rewarded when four members attained their I.R.B. Driver's Certificates.

Morri's efforts with the I.R.B's would have been valuable on their own, but Morri has been helping all year in any way that has been asked of him. Morri has helped with maintenance around the Surf Club, performed many patrols, attended meetings and was even involved in competition, being part of the belt teams when David Love won the Junior Belt and Len Cook won the Open Belt swims at the Branch Titles.

PATROLMAN OF THE YEAR

Jack Ward was a worthy recipiant of this award. Jack was always available to do substitute patrols for other members and performed voluntary patrols whenever they were required due to surf or crowd conditions or some other problem. The work Jack did as Chief Instructor was also creditable and involved spending many days and nights at the beach. These are not the reasons that Jack was Patrolman of the Year.

It is essential that members on patrol are punctual and reliable. In this Jack was an example to everyone. Further, Jack's knowledge and a serious approach to patrols were always displayed. These were the reasons that Jack Ward was made Patrolman of the Year.

SOCIAL ACTIVITIES

Kerry Cook led the Auxiliary Committee this year and as a result of her enthusiasm and energy was made Associate of the Year. The idea behind this year's activities has been that everyone should share the work and not just one or two. Although there were a few problems, this ideal of everyone sharing the workload and responsibility for successful social events continues to be an ideal worth aiming for.

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES

The Terrigal Surf Club's Junior Activities Group continues to be competitive at Branch and State Carnivals. More importantly all junior activities are well organised. The Terrigal Juniors are a credit to the Junior Committee.

Two people who deserve special mention are Julie Taylor and Paul Hawkins.

Julie has efficiently performed the secretary's job while being a teacher, wife and mother and has done it for many years.

Paul has held many positions over the years including being a member of the Surf Club Management Committee and the Junior Committee. Unfortunately, Paul has announced that the 1987 - 1988 season was his last on the Junior Activities Committee. As Chairman, Paul has done a good job.

SPONSORS

Terrigal had no major sponsor last season although, several businesses assisted particular activities within the Club. Considerable work will need to be done to attract one.

The Central Coast League's Club is rarely recognised for its regular and reliable financial contributions to various sporting and charity organisations. Under its Directed Allocation Scheme, members of the Central Coast League's Club nominate a sporting body that they would like to see get a donation. Currently, the League's Club donates

\$3.00 for each nomination. Over the past twenty years these annual donations have been of hugh benefit to the Club. Members of the Surf Club are urged to nominate the Terrigal S.L.S.C. when joining the Leagues Club and to patronize it when possible to ensure that this support continues.

Again our thanks to Chickadee Chicken who provided the prizes for our beach raffles. This is the seventh year that this company has provided us with support and through these raffles we have raised a substantial sum. Chickadee Chicken sponsored the Royal Carnival and not only did their support go a long way towards making that day so successful but they supplied the Official Programmes and T Shirts for all the Clubs on the Coast to sell to raise funds.

Governments usually give surf clubs little financial support, but this year under the Commonwealth Government's dollar for dollar scheme we were able to purchase a new outboard motor for the I.R.B.

In previous years the club received a subsidy from the Gosford City Council. This year the Club applied for and was granted by Council a number of concessions, namely surf hire gear, sun tan spray and umbrellas. A condition of the concessions was that the subsidy be withdrawn in future years. Unfortunately the weather this summer was so poor that we did not meet the cost of the hire equipment. However, there is a potential to make some profit, hopefully enough to cover the \$1200 subsidy withdrawn by Council.

THE COMING SEASON

Terrigal has been in the past very successful at preventing the loss of life through drowning. To be successful in the future will require the same things that it has in the past, that is, the induction and careful training of more lifesavers. In the season past, Terrigal, proved to be better at this than most other Surf Clubs. Next season the Surf Club has the members to do the same thing again.

THE QUIET ACHIEVERS

RESCUE 1 - ROYAL CARNIVAL - 31ST JANUARY, 1988

It was a magnificent day - a beautiful clear sky with a good surf running. In anticipation of a big crowd forty members were rostered to patrol duty - two patrols in the morning and two in the afternoon - the morning patrols started at 7.00am - one at the southern end of the beach and the other at the northern end - the centre of course was set aside for the Royal Carnival.

It all started peacefully, the rip was strong but not particularly dangerous - the crowd was quickly building up - ten, fifteen thousand taking their places to await the Royal couple's arrival. Of course it was hot - and why not cool of in the surf - particularly on the sand bank at the northern end where there was a nice wave running.

Then it happened - the sand bank collapsed and the rip grabbed about 40 swimmers and dragged them out to sea.

Seven young lifesavers, men and women, under the direction of Stuart Boag, Club Captain, went into action and relayed the distressed swimmers ashore with Rescue Boards - the I.R.B's kept becoming fouled with weed - so it was hard physical work -but they did it - fifteen of those rescued had to be placed under observation before being allowed to leave the beach.

Seven young lifesavers lay on the beach, exhausted, still alert, but happy no one had lost their life.

The Magnificent Seven - Brad Hindmarsh, Darren Ford, Helen Trehy, Morrie Abell, Chris Bowerman, David Cooper and Andre Kristoffersen.

RESCUE 2 - SUNDAY, 1ST NOVEMBER, 1987

Waters calm - no waves or rips near the patrolled area. Patrol Captain Paul Minto thought it should be a pretty quiet day.

However, he was not to know that their was a young couple frollicking down near the lake. They had arrived from Ireland only two weeks ago, unable to swim and no knowledge of the dangers of entering the surf outside the patrolled area.

There was a deceptive current running along the edge - they apparently did not realise they were being dragged along or its consequences until too late. They hit the rip and were quickly swept out to sea.

The cry went out - "people in trouble" - Paul Minto grabbed one Rescue Board and Will Anido, the Vice Captain, the other. By the time they reached them the man was about 100 metres from the shore and the lady a further 30 metres. Will being the stronger paddler arrived at the scene first to find the man floating face up apparently breathing - leaving him for Paul he paddled to the lady. She was floating face down under the surface - apparently not breathing. He placed her on the board - cleared her alrway and she commenced to breath again. In the meantime Peta Daly was observing the action from the First Aid Room - by the time the rescuers reached the shore she was waiting with the Oxy-viva. Both patients were unconscience and ambulances were radioed for through Central Coast Surf Rescue. Oxygen therapy was administered until the paramedics arrived. They were rushed to hospital where they remained in intensive care for four days before being allowed to leave.

Several weeks later a letter was received by the Club from the two thanking Paul and Will for their lives.

RESCUE 3 - BOXING DAY - 26TH DECEMBER, 1987

A fine day after a lot of rain - a big crowd was on the beach and although there were calm conditions along the patrolled area, large waves were crashing into the rocks under the Skillion.

Over the club radio came the call from Central Coast Surf Rescue that a fisherman had been washed off the rocks and assistance was needed.

Paul Martin, past Club Captain, with a crewman flew into the "Duckie" and raced to the area. The seas were too big to get in close and difficulty was being experienced in observing anything. By this time the Jet Boat and Surf Rescue Helicopter had joined in the search.

Realising there was a need to get in closer to the rocks to find the person Glen Beckers, driver of the Jet Boat, saw the need for swimmers. Stuart Pattison from the Avoca Club and a lifesaver from North Avoca dived in. Glen put a call into Terrigal Club for help. Stuart Boag, Club Captain and Will Anido, Junior Club Captain, each grabbed a Torpedo Rescue Tube and were rushed to the scene. With Chris Bowerman standing above the rocks spotting for them they spied the body. However, everytime they went into grab the man, the powerful waves snatched him from their grasp - and at the same time they had to fight the seas to stop from being crashed against the rocks. Finally a large wave picked up the body and threw him onto the rocks.

Chris Bowerman without any thought for his own safety jumped onto the rocks and held him.

Attempts to resuscitate him were to no avail.

The boys were conveyed back to Terrigal beach, exhaustion and dejection written all over their faces - they may have felt they had failed but what they did is what heroes are made of - typical of the efforts expected of young lifesavers whenever they take up patrol duties.







During the year it was good to see our Junior Boat Crew making some finals and showing what big hearts they had. Good job John Trickett and the boys!.





- ★ And GARTH ABELL came 10th in the 2km run, with STUART BOAG also reaching the final.


All in all, a great time was had by all, and my thanks go to all the party for demonstrating great team spirit despite the lousey weather!.













Joy Love and Jack Ward who pitched in to help with the canteen.

There has been a greater emphasis on competition over the past three years than for some time. Previously we had lost, for some reason or other, our experienced competitors. I approached Len Cook of the Avoca Club to come and give us a hand. Give us a hand he did, spending long hours after work training and coaching our young members. This year the club finished second in the Branch Championships and second in the handicap pointscore, an achievement which we owe to Len. 


