President's Report

A surf club's success is due to a co-operative effort. If a club is to have a good season many individuals must contribute. A large number of people have sacrificed time, worked hard and contributed their money to make sure that Terrigal S.L.S.C. Incorporated saved lives and provided healthy activities in which people could take part.

Many people think that lifesavers are paid. The reverse is true. Lifesavers work hard to make going to the beach a safe pastime. When they actually do save a life they are rarely thanked. Lifesavers are an example of Australians contributing their time, effort and money to benefit the lives of others.

COMPETITION

The Surf Club has had a very successful season in competition. All members who trained hard and tried to compete to the best of their ability deserve to be congratulated. As do those who gave their time to train them. Competing as well as you are able is an achievement of itself.

The highlights of the season were when the Junior Beach Relay team won their event at the State Titles by a big margin and when David Love had the success he deserved in the Junior Ironman.

David Love was selected as Competitor of the Year not just for the Gold Medal that he won at the N.S.W. State Titles, but for the whole hearted effort that he put into training to be successful.

CLUBMAN OF THE YEAR

This year this award went to Paul Hawkins. Paul was there to help, usually before he was asked, all season. Paul's positions as Club Vice-President, Delegate to the Central Coast Branch, Delegate to the Central Coast Board of Junior Activities and Chairman of the Club Judiciary Committee meant that he was attending meetings all the time. Paul helped in fundraising, social functions, at carnivals and wherever he was needed.

PATROLMAN OF THE YEAR

Will Anido was made Patrolman of the Year. Will is one of the Club's most competent lifesavers holding more lifesaving awards than anyone else his age in the Club. Once again Will achieved 100% patrol efficiency. Beside his own patrols, Will was always willing to do extra patrols whenever he was needed.

This was Will's first season as a Patrol Captain. Throughout the season Will has taken a most responsible attitude to the performance of patrols and well deserves to be Patrolman of the Year.

SOCIAL ACTIVITIES

At the start of the season the Surf Club could not find anyone prepared to take responsibility for arranging the social activities necessary for any volunteer rescue group. The Club Vice-Captain, Greg Williams offered to do the organising rather than see it left undone. Greg was ably helped by Paul Minto, the Club's Gear Steward. The duo arranged some very successful social functions including the Christmas Party, Presentation Night and the monthly barbeques.

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES

Ron and Lorna Stone, Max and Ness Varco and quite a few other people, have worked hard all season to ensure the smooth running of the Junior Activities Group.

Scott Hawkins and Wendy Stone deserve special mention because they coached squads of juniors for their Life Saving Certificate. This is a difficult and time consuming job. They are very unusual amongst the people who helped make the Junior Activities successful in that they are teenagers and not parents of Juniors.

John Howick was Water Safety Officer this season and while he did other things for the Club, looking after the safety of the children was the most important. John never had less than one hundred children to look after. This season, there were many Sundays when the surfs were big and sometimes dangerous. John was always careful and was fortunate in being assisted by the many other members especially the Club's I.R.B. Drivers.

SPONSORS

Most of the money that runs Terrigal Surf Club is raised in very small amounts through raffles at 20c a ticket, beach float hire at a dollar an hour, membership fees and social functions. Sponsorships are a real help. Not only do Members have to pay less themselves but it allows more time for Members to do lifesaving. Peppers helped this season through the purchase of some gear and equipment. The Surf Club hopes that this will be an ongoing relationship.

Terrigal-Wamberal R.S.L. and Terrigal Memorial Country Club through the purchase of I.R.B. motors have helped to ensure that the beach is patrolled by I.R.B.'s.

Many other service organisations and businesses have helped keep the Club operating. Without the assistance the Surf Club Members would not be able to afford the gear, insurance, maintenance and other costs that have to be paid by a volunteer life saving organisation.

COMING SEASON

Members and money have always been hard to find. In the community real wages are lower, taxes and interest rates are higher. Ordinary people find it harder to give money to the Surf Club. With money tight, shiftwork and second jobs becoming the norm, members as a result, are harder to find. Members and money are harder to find now than they have been in the past.

We are fortunate in having talented lifesavers on the beach and on the Management Committee. The Surf Club must continue to train and foster those talents so that the Club is able to meet the challenges of the future.

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

Installation of Life Members

GORDON LAMBERT [1950 - 1978]



At the 65th Annual General Meeting of the Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated held on 14th August, 1988 the membership unanimously agreed that the late Gordon Lambert's services to the Club be recognised by his name being added posthumously to the list of Life Members.

Born in 1935 Gordon obtained his Bronze Medallion in 1950. He died in 1978.

Gordon became the first Terrigal member to win an Australian Title, when in 1954-55 at the age of 20, he won the Single Ski Championship.

He also won the State Title in 1959-60 and the NSW Inter-branch event in 1966-67. That year he was Captain of the Taplin Relay Team and Captain of the Country Team that toured New Zealand in 1970.

He won the Central Coast Branch Single Ski Title more times than anyone else, each year from 1949-50 to 1964-65 and again in 1967-68.


He was Captain of the winning Taplin Relay Team at the 1967 Australian Titles.

Gordon was President of the Club from 1967 to 1969 and 1973.

As a member of the Police Force, Gordon served most of his working life at Tetrigal and over the years had rescued many children from the lake and adults from the surf during his off duty hours.

His skill as a ski rider was responsible for saving many lives and his exploits in heavy seas are legendry.

JAMES EDMUND LEGGE [1970 -



Patrolman of the Year	



Richard Legge joined Terrigal S.L.S.C. in 1970 at the age of fifteen and started doing patrols immediately, gaining his Bronze Medallion in January, 1971.

When Rick did a patrol then, he had to arrange a lift from Tuggerah to Terrigal. This was more of a challenge than it looks because Wamberal at the time was a dairying area which was frequently subjected to flooding.

When Rick went to University in Newcastle he continued to do patrols, travelling home each weekend to do them. Given the size of the active membership at this time there were plenty of patrols to do.

In 1976 Rick was elected to the Executive of the Surf Club as Treasurer. At the time he was studying hard for an honours degree in accounting and at twenty, Rick was one of the oldest and most experienced members left in the Club.

Rick was re-elected Treasurer in 1977, continuing to do patrols whilst working as an accountant in Sydney and studying for his professional year.

Rick was again elected to the position of Treasurer in 1984. Rick brought to the job of Treasurer his professional expertise and his considerable experience on previous management committees of the Surf Club. Over the past four years virtually all Rick's limited spare time has been directed towards the Surf Club.

Although most people know that Rick has been helping to train the Club's bronze medallion candidates over the last couple of years, the majority do not know of the squads that Rick trained in the mid 1970's. Rick earned his Instructors' Certificate in January, 1976.

Rick was first made a Patrol Captain in 1973. He has been a patrol captain in most of the seasons since then. When Rick has not been a patrol captain it has usually been done so that a less experienced member could gain confidence.

In most of the seasons since he joined the Surf Club Rick has earned his 100% patrol efficiency award.

Rick has had little recognition for a loyal and conscientious effort spread over nineteen years. First as a committeeman and later as a treasurer, Rick has worked hard to ensure that Terrigal S.L.S.C. continues as an efficient life saving club.

Club Captain's Report

Again its the end of another season - and again it has been a successful one. The number of active members have remained static and with the increased number of bathers using the beach, there is a need to build on the numbers.

The safety record on the beach was pleasing with a low number of serious cases requiring attention. Thanks to all the Patrol Captains for their dedicated service throughout the year particularly the first timers who were amongst the best of the crop. One of these - Will Anidowas awarded the Harry Vickery Memorial Trophy for Patrolman of the Year.



Paul was also the lynch pin in our Open Beach Relay Team of John Trickett, Craig Adams, Peter Talbot, Andrew Fortis and Darren Boyle which took out its 3rd Branch Title and which has lost only one event in two years.



An outstanding young life saver, William has been responsible for numerous successful rescues and has also performed with success in top level competition being proficient at swim, board paddle and ski.

This year he is a Patrol Captain, Junior Club Captain and a member of the Management Committee of the Club.

BRANCH REPRESENTATION:

William has been a regular representative in Branch Teams since aged nine concentrating mainly on the paddle board. In 1982-83 he was a member of winning Board Rescue Team at the New South Wales State Inter-Branch Championships and in 1984-85 gained second place on the Board in the State Championships. Last year he was a member of the winning Board Relay Team at the State under 18 Inter-Branch Championships.

He was recently selected to the team to represent the Central Coast Branch of the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia to tour the United States of America and Canada in 1989.

RESCUES:

William was involved in two major rescues in the last twelve months. In the first instance on Sunday, 1st November, 1987, a young woman owes her life to Williams's skill in surf life saving and in the second case on Boxing Day, 26th December, 1987, although the person died, the attempt to save him was made in externely dangerous conditions which placed William and the other rescuers at great risk. These are only two of many resuces performed by William since he commenced patrolling our beaches.

At Club level William has gained many awards. In the junior activities section he was the Club Captain for three consecutive years, Club Champion since aged eight, twice Competitor of the Year, Clubman of the Year and four years Iron Man Champion. Since moving to the senior section of the Club William has been Cadet and Junior Club Champion and for the past two years has been Junior Club Captain.

William has just completed his final year at High School and was awarded the prestigious "Sportsman of the Year" Award at Terrigal High School. This achievement was not only for excellence in sport but also for attitude and decorum in sport. He represented in athletics, swimming and cross country.

First Aid Officer's Report

The 1988/89 season proved to be a great success, not only in competition but also in the treatment of first aid cases and also in the prevention of incidence.

During the season a total of 793 first aid cases were treated, which included 770 cases of marine stings, 4 cases of major first aid, and 19 cases of minor first aid. Most importantly through the vigilance, and the competence of our patrols there were no fatalities on our beach when the patrols were on duty.

First Aid Equipment - Once again Clyde A. Marshall, Chemist, The Esplanade, Terrigal donated all our first aid equipment and the members of the Club are deeply greatful for his continued support.

Hepatitis B - Surf life savers are a high risk group of coming into contact with Hepatitis B. The movement is currently conducting a drive to have its members immunized against the disease. Some sixtyfive members recently received their injections to combat the disease. The at risk group are the 16 - 25 age unfortunately a large number of this group in the Club saw fit not to have the injections.

We are grateful to our Honorary Medical Officers, Doctors Evershed and Little who gave their valuable time immunising our members against Hepatitis B.

Overall I wish to congratulate all members on a job well done, and also I wish to thank those members who helped maintain the first aid facility during the season.

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
I.R.B. Captain's Report

This season has been very active for the surf patrols. Seventy four rescues were performed without loss of life, four hundred and forty eight persons were audibly warned or directed to safety and seven hundred and ninety three were treated for first aid.

In competition our members performed at the highest level than for the past two decades, seven winning medals at the State Surf Life Saving Championships at Cape Hawke and nine winning medals at the State Junior Surf Life Saving Championships at Mollymook. Competition is designed around surf life saving activities and it is a pleasure to see that our members are performing at such a high level.

One member's prowess in the surf was recognised by Radio Station 2GO when he was pronounced "Sports Star of the Week" and another members contribution to the community was recognised by the Australia Day Council when on 26th January, 1989 he was awarded a Medallion for Achievement.

Highlights of the year were David Love's performance in winning the State Iron Man Championship for under 18 at Cape Hawke; the State Open Sprint Championship with Paul Minto running second; the brilliant John Minto's second in the under 18 State Beach Sprint; and Will Anido's performance in the Australian Junior Iron Man Championships at Burleigh Heads.

The Cinderella story of the year was unquestionably the performance of the Junior Beach Relay Team who came home from Cape Hawke the State Champions.

Two things about the season will always stay in my mind. The first was how all the competitors from the Central Coast supported each other at both the State and Australian Championships. Irrespective of which Club the competitor was from, if he had a problem, there was always someone to help. The second were the skills displayed by David Love and Will Anido in winning their heat of the Open Board Rescue at the State Championships. The seas were monsterous and to watch those two lads work their way through those treacherous waves, David in the swim leg then Will in the board leg was absolutely brilliant to watch - they had to use every trick in their repertoire, and then some.

To all those members who held positions on the various committees, congratulations on helping to make the season a success - a different task at the best of times but the way the weather was this year it was even more difficult.

My personal thanks to Ray Dewhurst who maintained the minutes of the Management Committee, to Morrie Abell and Mark Sutton for their help to maintain the club house and to Greg Williams, Paul Minto and Gerald Cadden who stepped in to help organise and manage the social events when no one stood for the Auxiliary Delegates position.

Finally, I would like to claim the usual weaver - to those who have been overlooked or some activity has been left out of the report - I apologise. On behalf of President James and myself we wish you all the very best for the coming season, specially to Norm Galvin who has not been enjoying the best of health in recent months.

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
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
