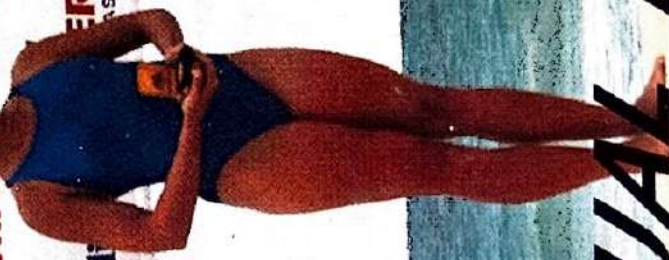

2GO SPORTS STAR OF THE WEEK VERONICA LEE

At the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships at Scarborough Beach, Perth W.A. Veronica Lee of the Terrigal Club won the Open Ladies Beach Sprint Championship. In doing so Veronica became the first woman from the Central Coast to win an Australian Title since women were admitted to the surf life saving movement a decade ago. The Championships were held on 24th March, 1991.

Throughout the season leading up to the Australian Championships, Veronica was undefeated in competition, winning the Central Coast Branch Championship, the Regional Championship, the Sydney Metropolitan Championship and the New South Wales Championship.

She is a great athlete, worthy of nomination for the award of the 2GO Sports Star of the Week and consideration for the 2GO Sports Star of the Year Award.

1990 - 1991

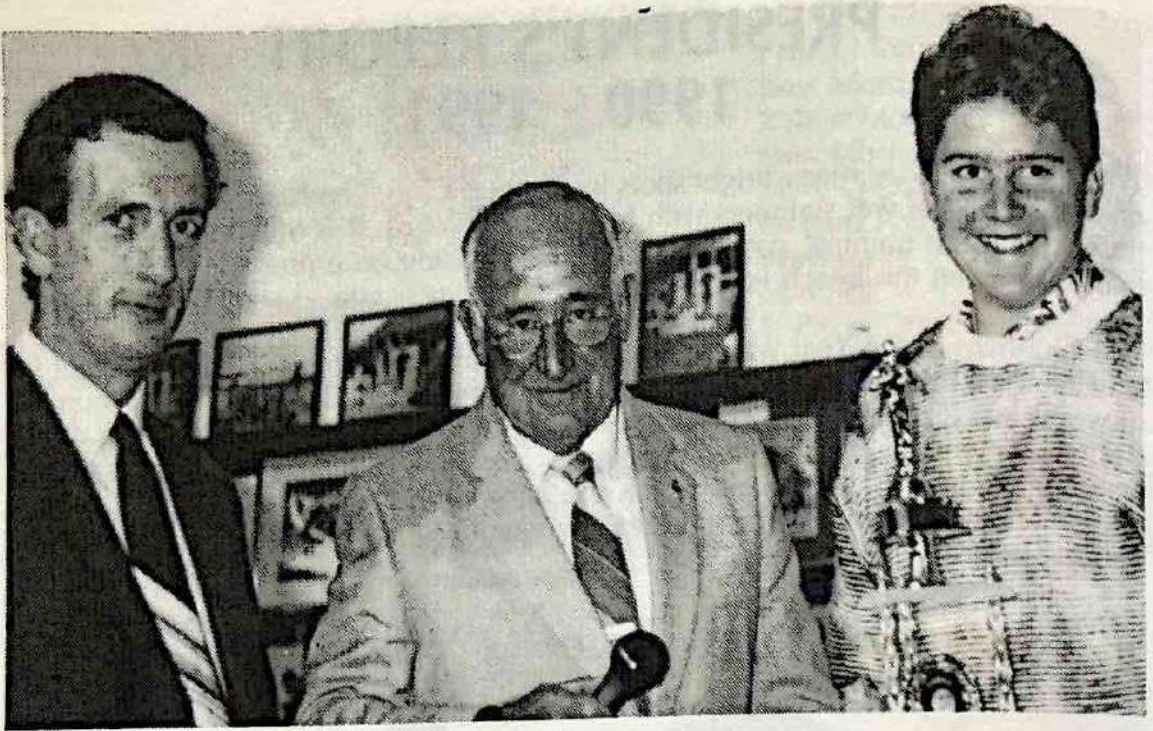
This season has had many bright spots for the Surf Club. The long, hot, dry summer ended a string of wet summers with few fine weekends. It is much easier to be enthusiastic about training, patrol work and fund raising on a fine sun soaked beach than it is when the beach is deserted due to torrential rain.

The Clubman of the Year was Sharon Ward. Sharon this season has been Chief Instructor and a Patrol Captain. While Sharon has contributed to the Surf Club in a number of ways, her single biggest contribution has been the number of bronze medallions gained by members this season. This reverses a trend over the last few seasons of fewer and fewer new lifesavers coming into the movement. Sharon has spent a great deal of time and effort that allowed almost thirty members to become active lifesavers on Terrigal Beach.

Patrolman of the Year was David Manning. David was punctual, 100% efficient in terms of attendance and one of our most proficient lifesavers. 1990-1991 was David's first season in the position of Patrol Captain. It is a job that is difficult and demanding for the best lifesavers. David led his patrol very well.

They also were conscientious in patrol work and willing helpers around the Club generally. Kirk was judged to be the Rookie of the Year because he was always cheerful and could usually be found helping with raffles or tidying the Surf Club without being asked.

Veronica Lee was the Club's female Competitor of the Year. Veronica won the Central Coast, New South Wales and Australian Open Ladies Beach Sprint. Veronica worked hard in a very determined and organised manner for nearly eighteen months. This meant sacrificing social and recreational activities so that she could train. It is pleasing to see hard work rewarded.

Jude Varcoe was male Competitor of the Year. Jude won the N.S.W. Cadet Beach Sprint and then joined with Brice Johnson, Luke Minto and David Dalton to win the N.S.W. Cadet Beach Relay. As President, I was most pleased to see the way these members involved themselves in activities besides competition like providing water safety for the Juniors.

At the 1990 Annual General Meeting of the Surf Club the nominations for Doug Anido and Paul Hawkins for life membership were confirmed. Both members have made valuable contributions to Terrigal S.L.S.C. for many years. Historically very few people have been granted life membership of Terrigal S.L.S.C. We hope that they will continue to contribute for many years yet.

Many people help to make a season successful by doing more than they are asked. Most of these efforts go unrewarded and unrecognised. Doug Anido took on the position of manager of the Surf Club Team to the National Titles. Doug and others went to a great deal of trouble to get the Club's gear to Western Australia as cheaply as possible. Craig Adams took on the job of coach to the sprinters and went to a deal of trouble to get the best advice on training available. An organisation like a surf club requires lots of effort from lots of people.

This season one of our life members, Frank "Tiger" Payne passed away. Frank was a past President of the Surf Club. He was the second longest serving President of the Central Coast Branch and was very active on the Central Coast Board of Examiners. Frank was more than a leading administrator he was also a keen competitor. Tiger Payne was part of a boat crew that attempted a rescue in a hugh and dangerous sea off Terrigal. Although their efforts were unsuccessful, the bravery of the crew was recognised by the Royal Humane Society. Frank Payne was a famous Terrigal Lifesaver whose many contributions to surf lifesaving extended over many decades.

New members of the Surf Club do not have Frank Payne to look upto. Older members, experienced members, even if they still think they are young must try to lead by example. Probably we cannot emulate Frank Payne, but we can do our best and we must show by example the younger members what is expected of them.

The fine weather has to some extent assisted the Surf Club to raise funds and gain new members. In the longer term money will be more difficult to raise. Paradoxically the lack of employment available due to the economic conditions actually seems to be assisting recruitment. The Surf Club will not be able to raise sufficient funds from donations and raffles as it has in the past. The challenge will be to develop new sources of finance. We will meet the challenges of the future as we have those of the past. We must do our best.

His fund raising activities through raffles, the canteen and hire services are well known. For the past five years he has been responsible for the hire and maintenance of the surf club.

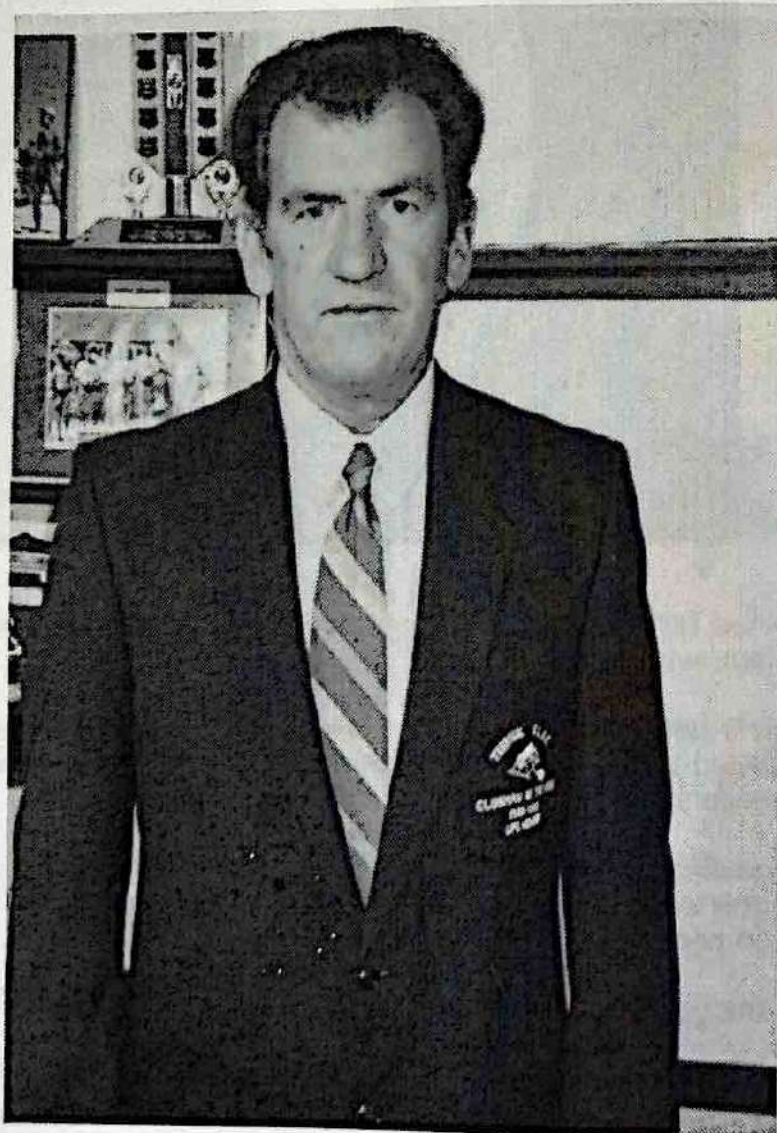
Over the years Doug has taken a great interest in competitive teams and has managed teams attending both the Australian and State Championships.

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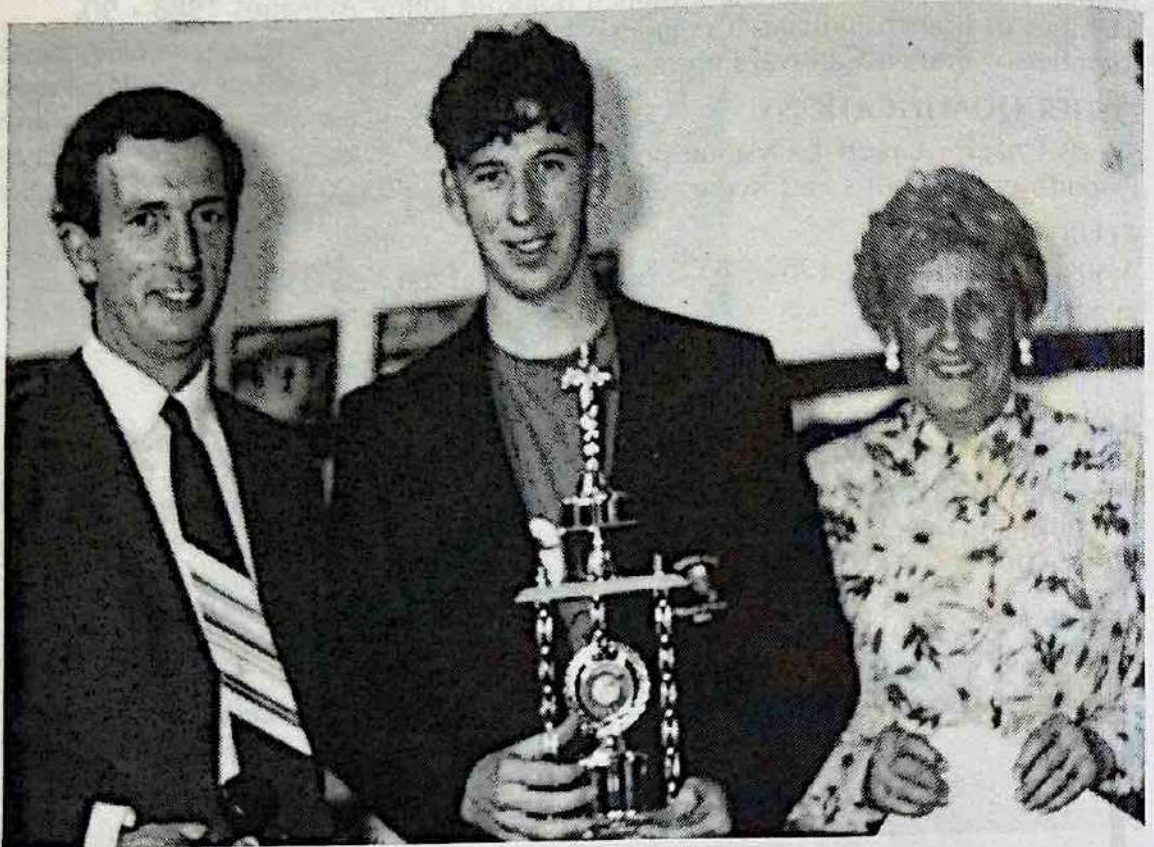

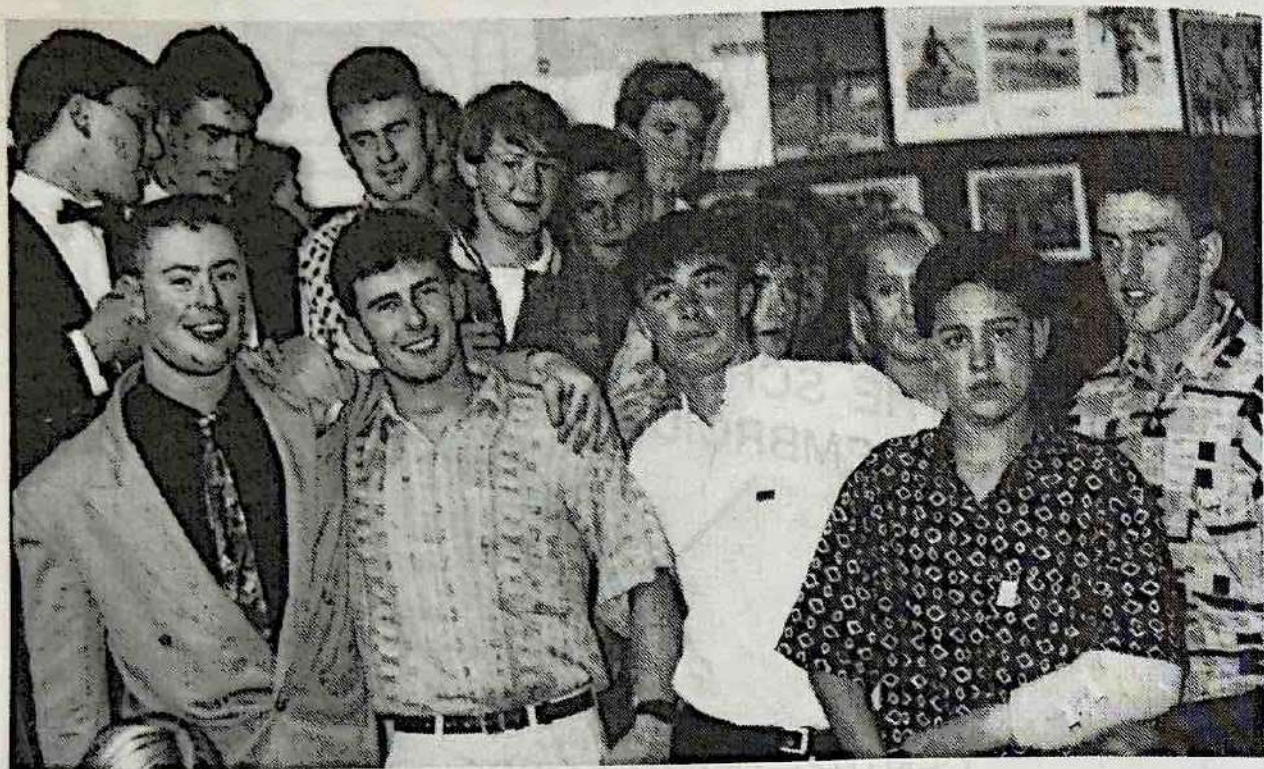

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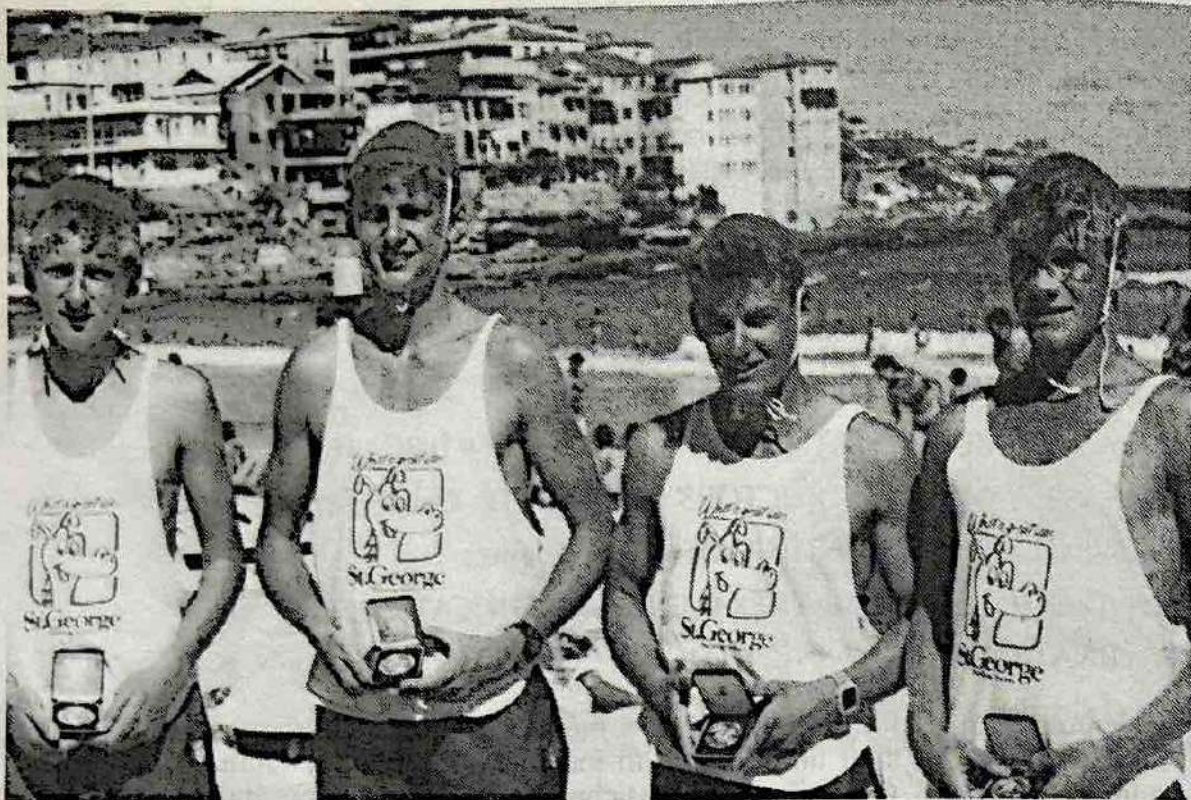
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CARNIVAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

Brice Johnson apart from being an important member of the relay team had an excellent season in the individual beach sprint capping off the season by making the finals in the Australian Championships.

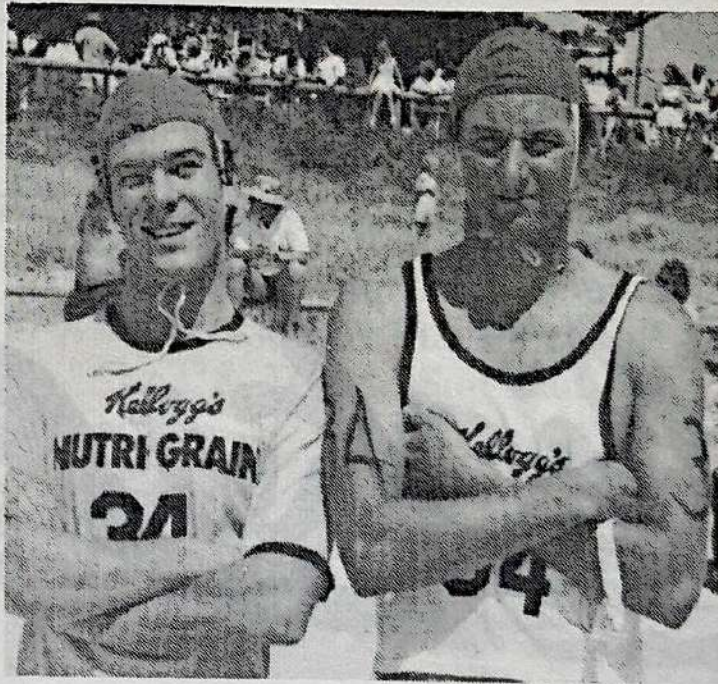

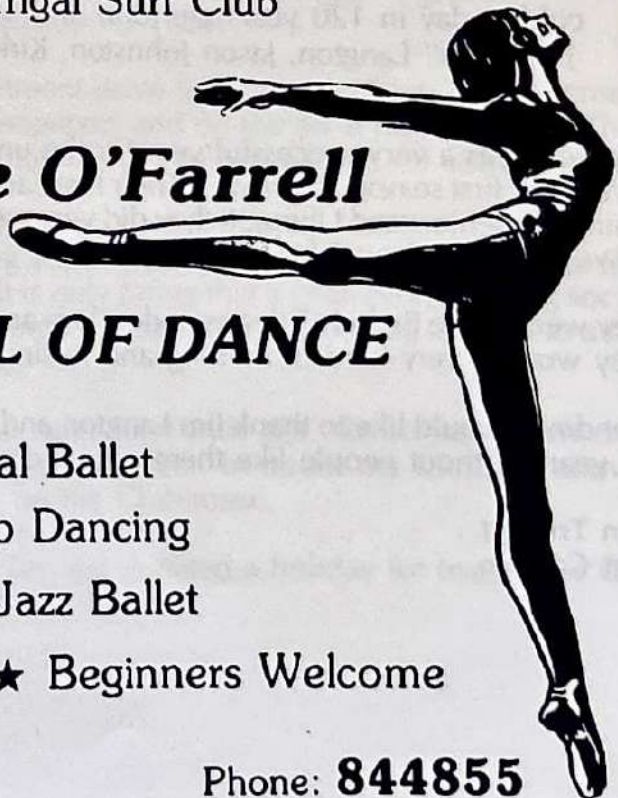

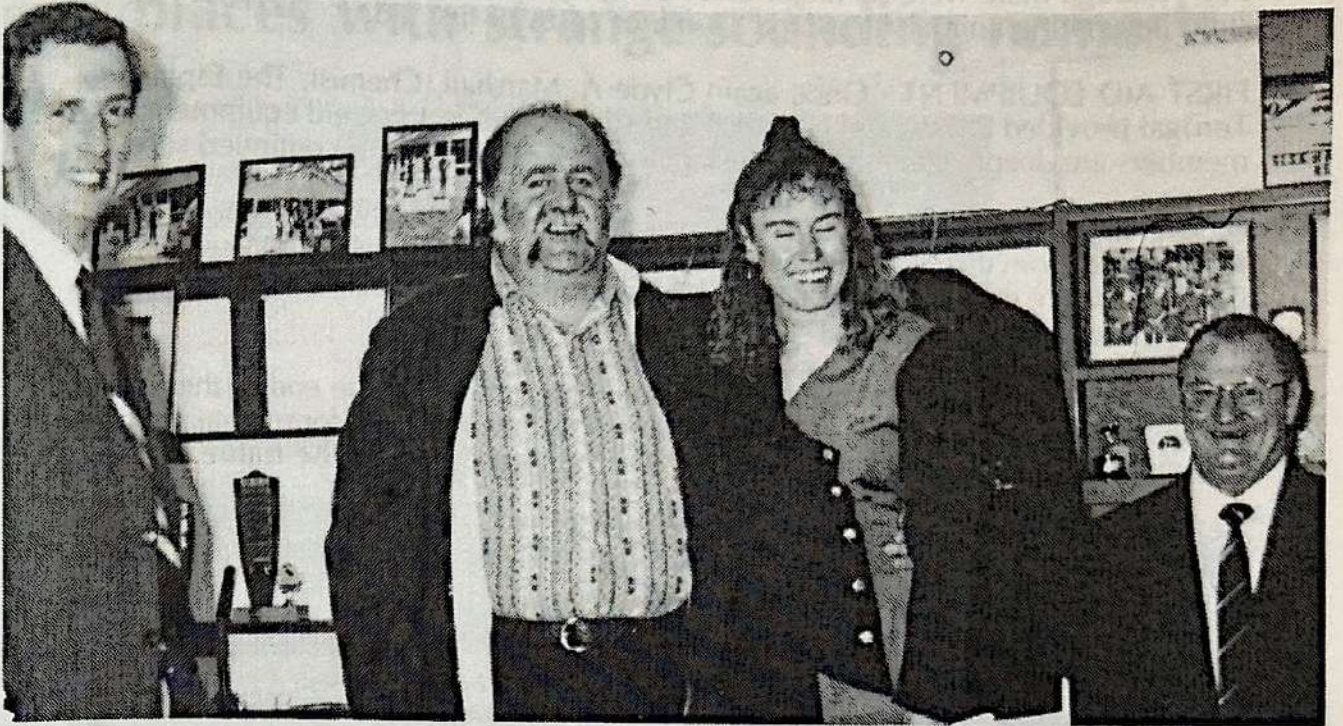

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THE NULLARBOR - and other far-away places with strange-sounding names!



'COTTESLOE! For me, Cottesloe Beach, was the first of the "strange sounding names" places, when with others in the Terrigal SLSC contingent we headed to W.A. for the National Titles in March. While the competitors contended with weather driven changed water and beach conditions of dramatic proportions, so did the spectators on the Sunday.

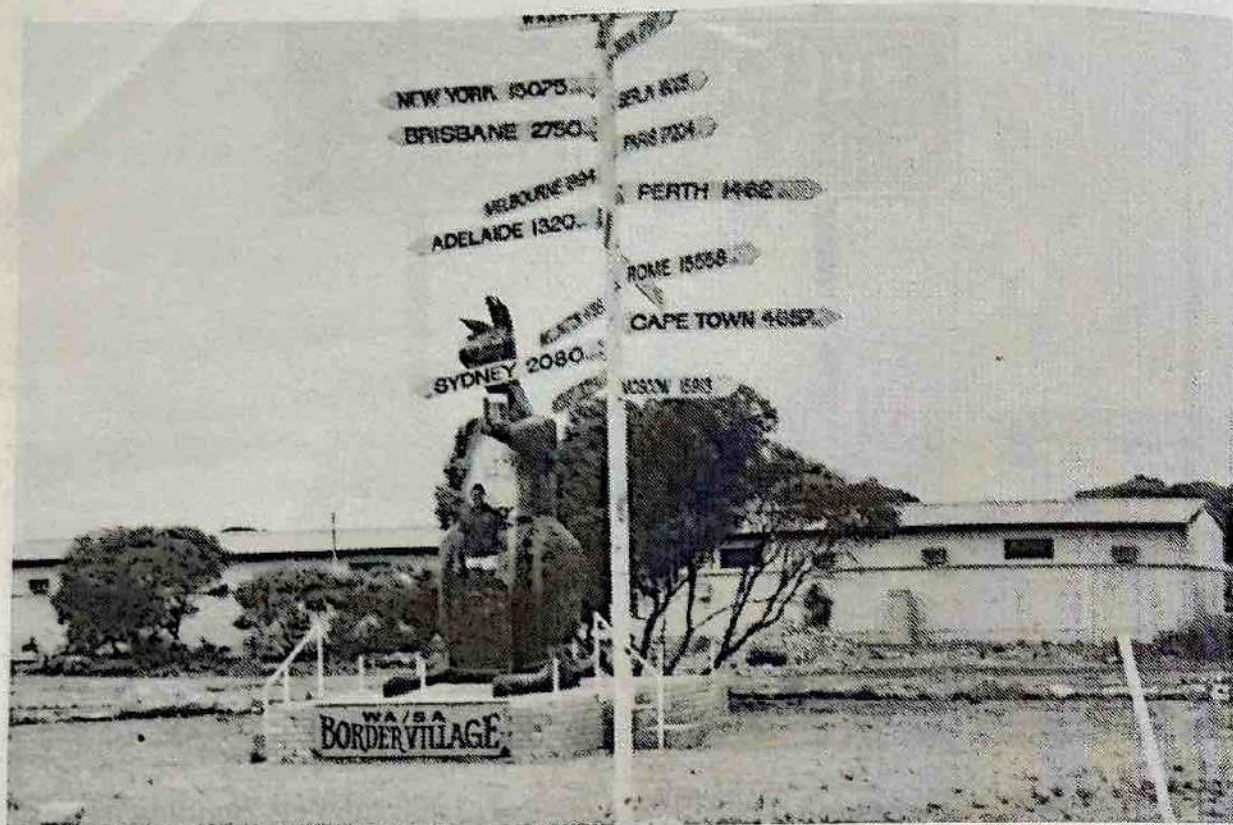
The setting sun dipping into the Indian Ocean's horizon was a delight for those with cameras, but for swimmers, board and ski paddlers, it must have been something else.

With the conclusion of the Aussie Titles came to time to farewell the beautiful city of Perth and head off in the "general" direction of East. Firstly, South East to the Margaret River area and its vineyards. Perhaps the earlier winetastings that day conspired with gloom of night to make the journey through the tall jarrah forests a little awesome. Albany that night provided our accommodation and a look at an historic port city.

Esperance next day, was a place of spectacular beauty, with its scores of off shore islands; not to mention the best meat pies between Perth and Sydney.

Norseman, Balladonia and then Caiguna that night saw us well along the Eyre Highway and Nullabor bound.

Before crossing into South Australia at Border Village, with its "Big Kangaroo" and International Signpost, little townships with names like COCKLEBIDDY, MADURA, MUNDRABILLA and EUCLA popped up to lead some variety to the immense sameness of the Nullabor Plain.

What a way to finish up a trip to an Australian Titles - to cross the country by road from the Indian Ocean, via the Southern Ocean, to the Pacific Ocean. This trip made us realise it really is a BIG country.

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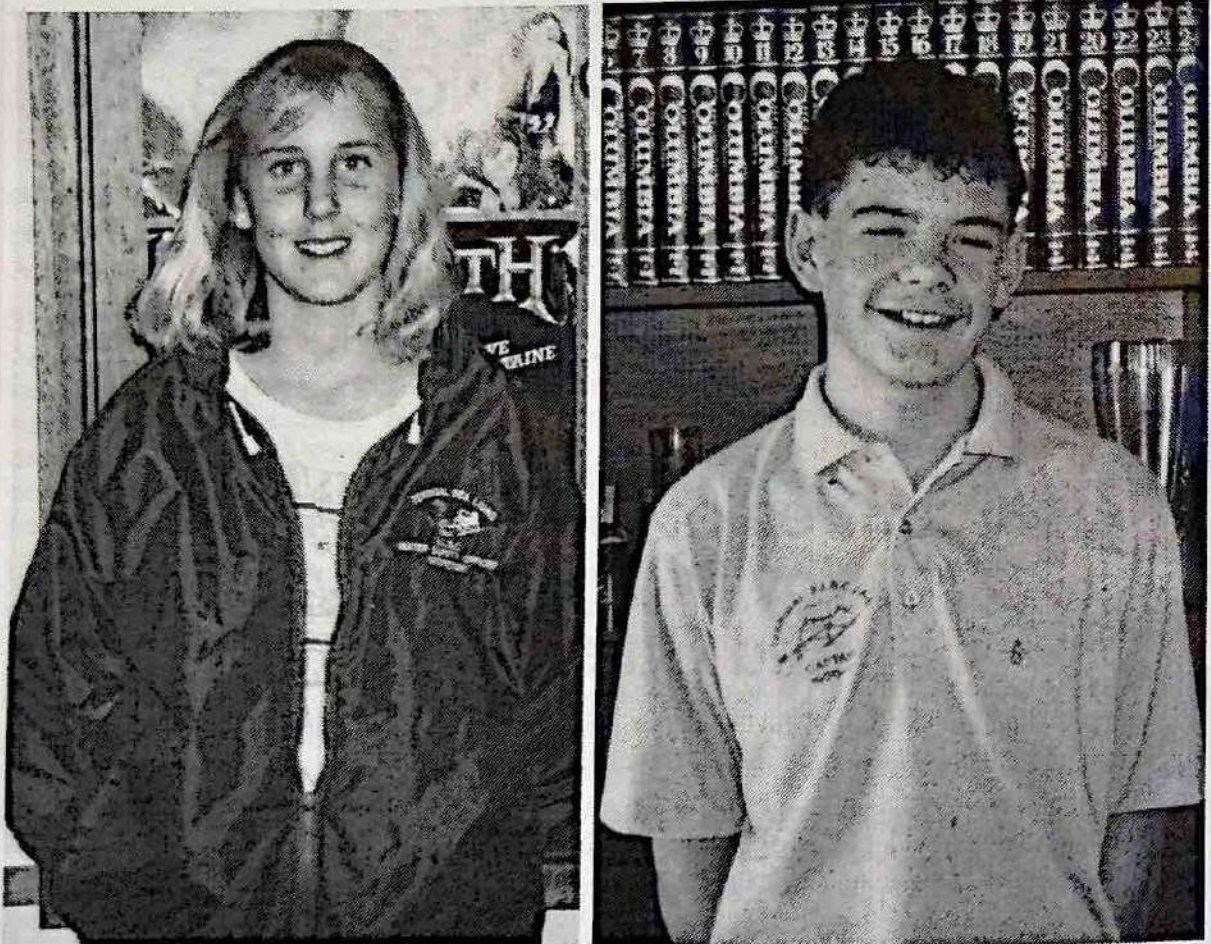

As always our liaison with the senior section of the Club has been harmonious, and I would like to thank the Patrol Captains and the Active Members for their support on Sunday mornings for water safety.

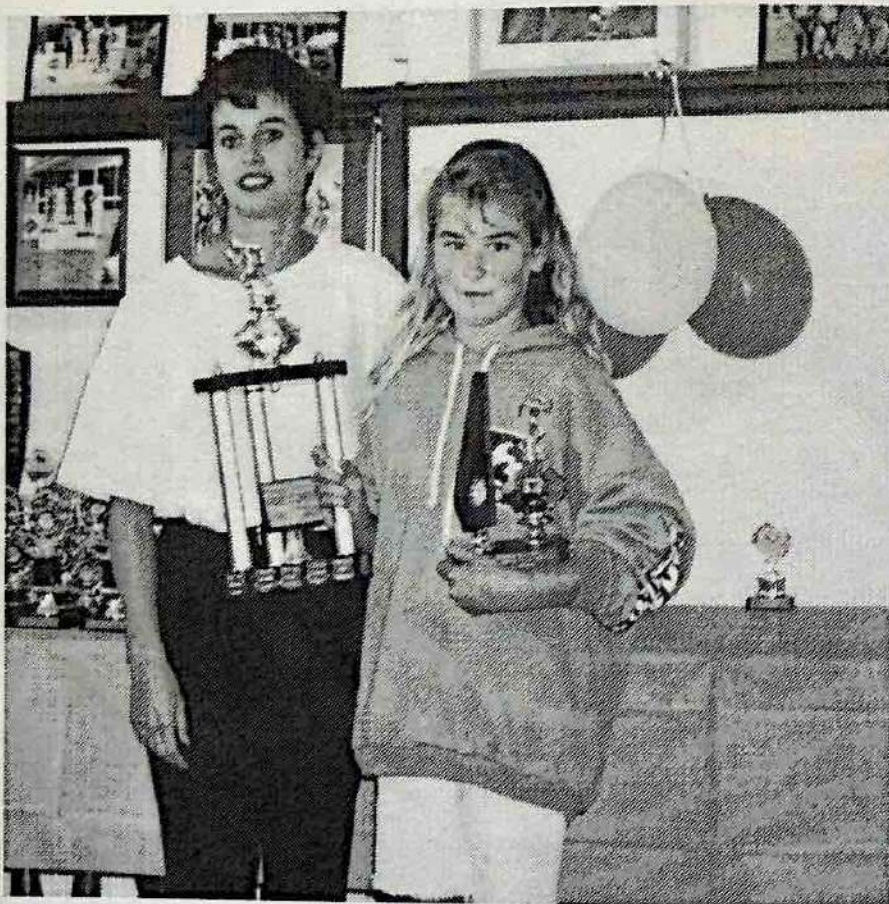

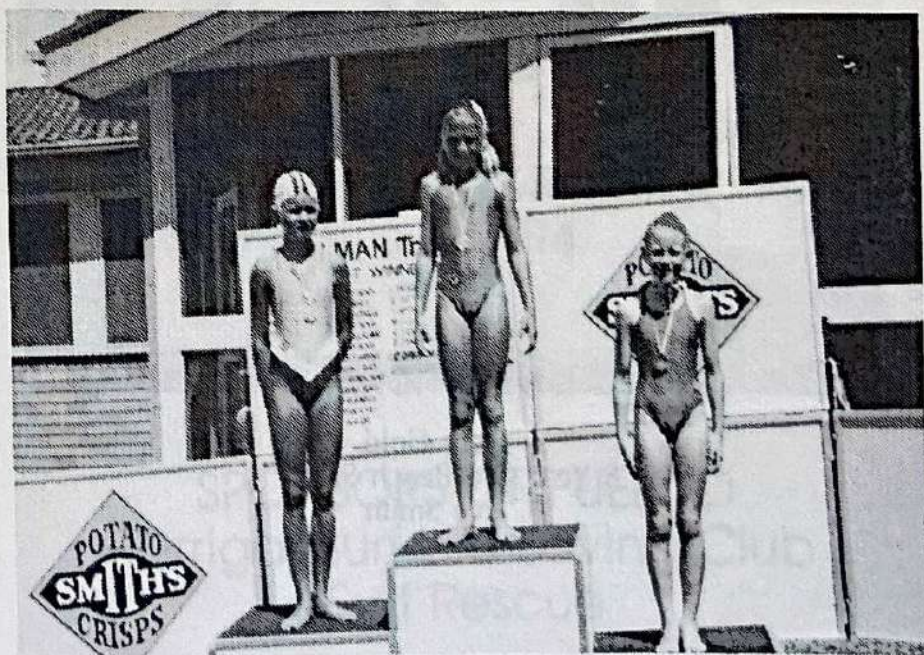

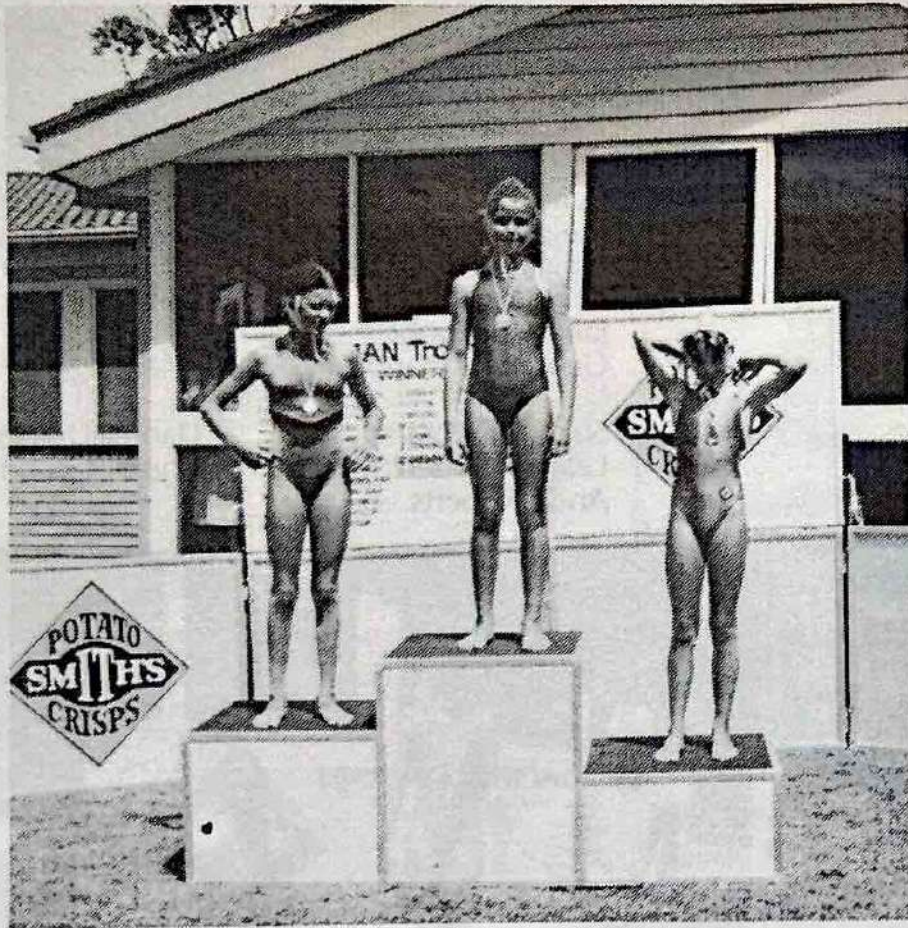
WATER SAFETY OFFICER'S REPORT

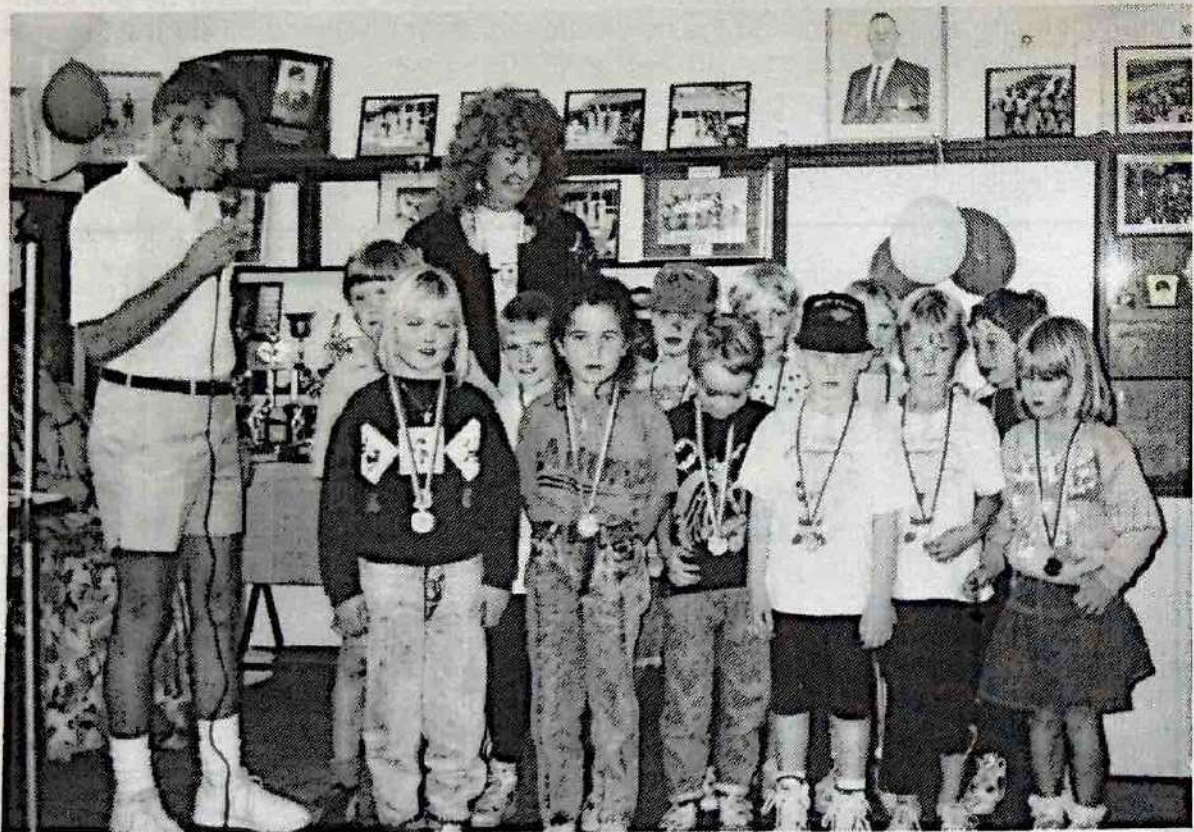

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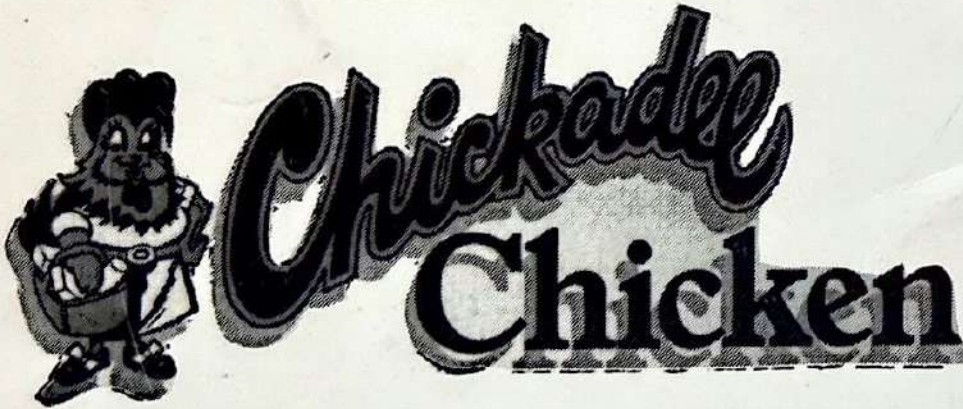
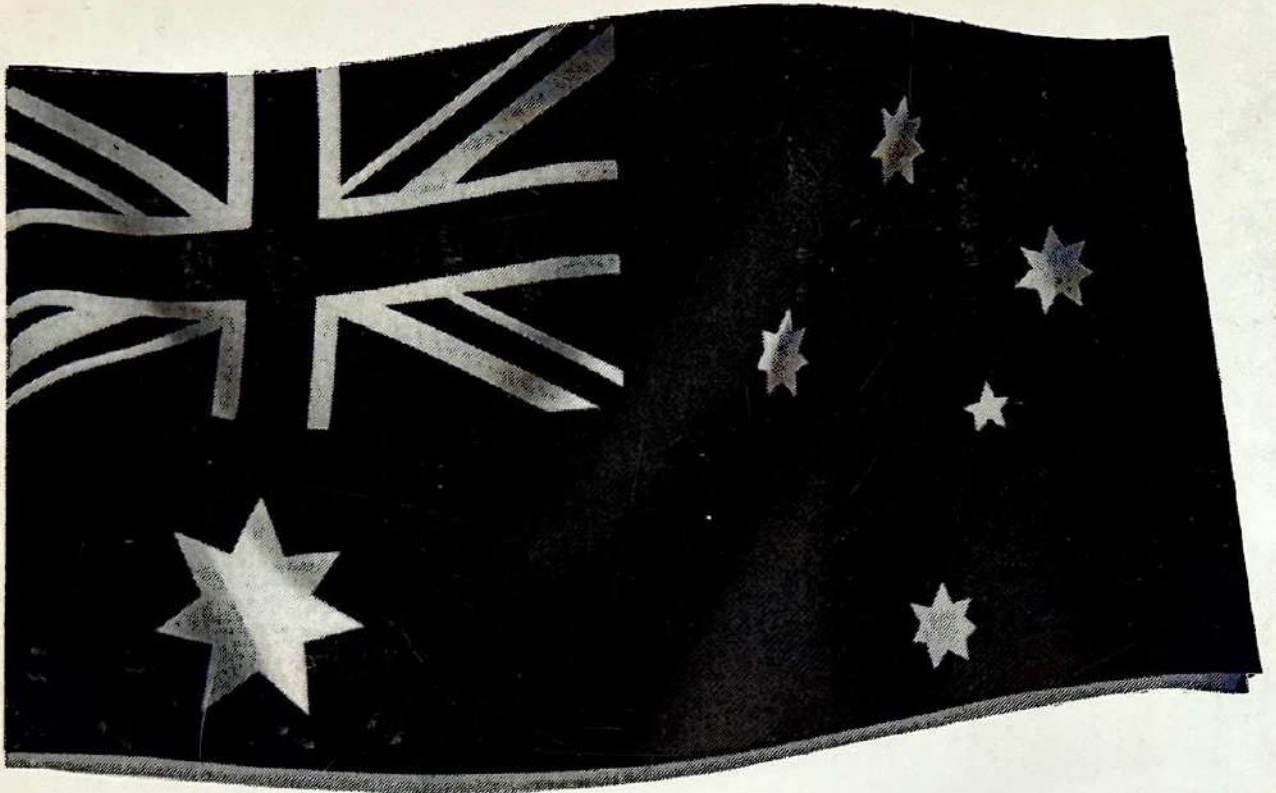


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
