ALL'S WELL THAT ENDS WELL

A fitting caption, perhaps, for the end of the 1991/92 surf lifesaving season for Terrigal's star sprinter, Veronica Lee. Veronica would be the first to admit this past year has been one of difficult decisions, dilemmas and disappointments, but when she captured gold for her club and country at the recent World Surf Lifesaving Championships in Shimoda, Japan, those disappointments faded to nothing.

Onlookers at Shimoda who watched the Terrigal flyer blitz the field in the finals of both the World National Ladies Beach Sprint Championships and the World Interclub Ladies Beach Sprint Championship, as well as snatch a narrow but gutsy win in the Ladies Flags, might have imagined that the lead-up to this talented athlete's successes had been all smooth sailing, but such was not the case. It has been a traumatic year for Veronica, but one which she herself believes has strengthened her in more ways than physically.

"I knew my decision to combine Track and Field with Beach Sprinting would be difficult," she said the other day. "I didn't know how difficult." But then she smiled that familiar cheeky smile of hers and added, "But I'm going to do it again this year."

Is that courage or madness? Whatever, one thing is certain, no one is going to try to dissuade her. No one could.

But the heavy training and competitive load (Veronica trains seven days a week) did produce some unfortunate injuries last year, so that her record over this past season is an up and down one. After some stunning early victories on the track, tendinitis laid her low for eight weeks. Though she stopped competing on the track during that time Veronica felt a very real obligation to represent her much loved Terrigal Club at local carnivals, and she was undefeated in the Ladies Sprints at North Entrance, Ocean Beach and Terrigal twilight meeting in December, as well as South Curl Curl and the Australia Day carnival at Freshwater in January, by which time she was thankfully injury-free.

Veronica was subsequently selected in the Central Coast Branch team for the interbranch competition, and few people who were at Manly Beach on February 22nd, will forget the dramatic climax to the day's competition. After excellent performances from the Central Coast team - including wins by Veronica in the ladies beach sprint and the team relay - the Central Coast Branch was only trailing the powerful Sydney Branch by half a point going into the final event, the ladies flags.

It is now history that the field of eleven was finally reduced to two, Eloura's Champion Flags competitor Donna Collins, and Terrigal's Veronica Lee, who had never done the flags in competition before. When Donna stumbled slightly halfway down the run, victory went to Veronica, and the Central Coast Branch team - its first win in the interbranch competition since 1980.

Veronica still says that moment when she grabbed the flag and stood up to the ecstatic cheers of her team-mates will live in her memory as one of the best moments of her life.

"To win is always exciting, but I learnt that day what it means to win

for one's team. There's nothing like it in the world."

Perhaps it was this strong team spirit, as well as her undeniable talent, that made the selectors choose Veronica for the Australian Surf Lifesaving representative team, despite her lack of medals at the NSW and Australian championships this past season. She'd had to make the agonising decision to miss the State Championships at Thirroul because they fell on the same weekend as the Australian Track and Field Championships in Adelaide, where she was hoping to qualify for the Barcelona Olympics in the Women's 4 x 100m relay. Six girls were to be chosen. But despite finishing an excellent fifth in the 100m final, Veronica was overlooked for selection, only to see two girls she'd beaten on her merits both selected.

Though bitterly disappointed, she returned home, hoping to gain consolation by winning back-to-back Australian beach sprint titles at North Collaroy the following month, thereby consolidating her position as a possible Australian team member for the upcoming World Surf Lifesaving Championships in Japan. But a more bitter disappointment was yet to come. Whilst leading comfortably in the final of the beach sprint, Veronica hit a patch of uneven sand and fell, two metres from the line. As she lay, shattered, in the sand, Veronica felt she had lost, not only the Australian title but her chances of selection in the Australian team for the World Championships.

Imagine how she felt when she received a telephone call during the following week to say she had been selected anyway. She was to compete for Australia in Japan in June. Veronica unashamedly confessed she burst into tears on hearing the news. Though she felt deeply for the young lass from Northcliffe who had won the Australian Championship and had missed out - as she had missed out on Barcelona - Veronica felt her selection was justified. After all, she had been clearly in front before the fall, and the previous year she had won the Branch, Metropolitan, Interbranch, State and Australian sprint titles in fine style.

But her trial and tribulations were not yet over.

Selected in a small Australian Track and Field team to compete at the Asian Games in Thailand in late April (perhaps as a consolation prize for her omission from the Olympic team) Veronica flew out, excited at the prospect of representing her country in the 100m and 200m. She could hardly believe her bad luck when she had to pull up, injured, in the final of the 200m. The decision not to compete in her favorite 100m the following day for fear of aggravating the injury and putting at risk her upcoming performances in the Australian Surf Lifesaving team, was a heart-breaking one. But she made it.

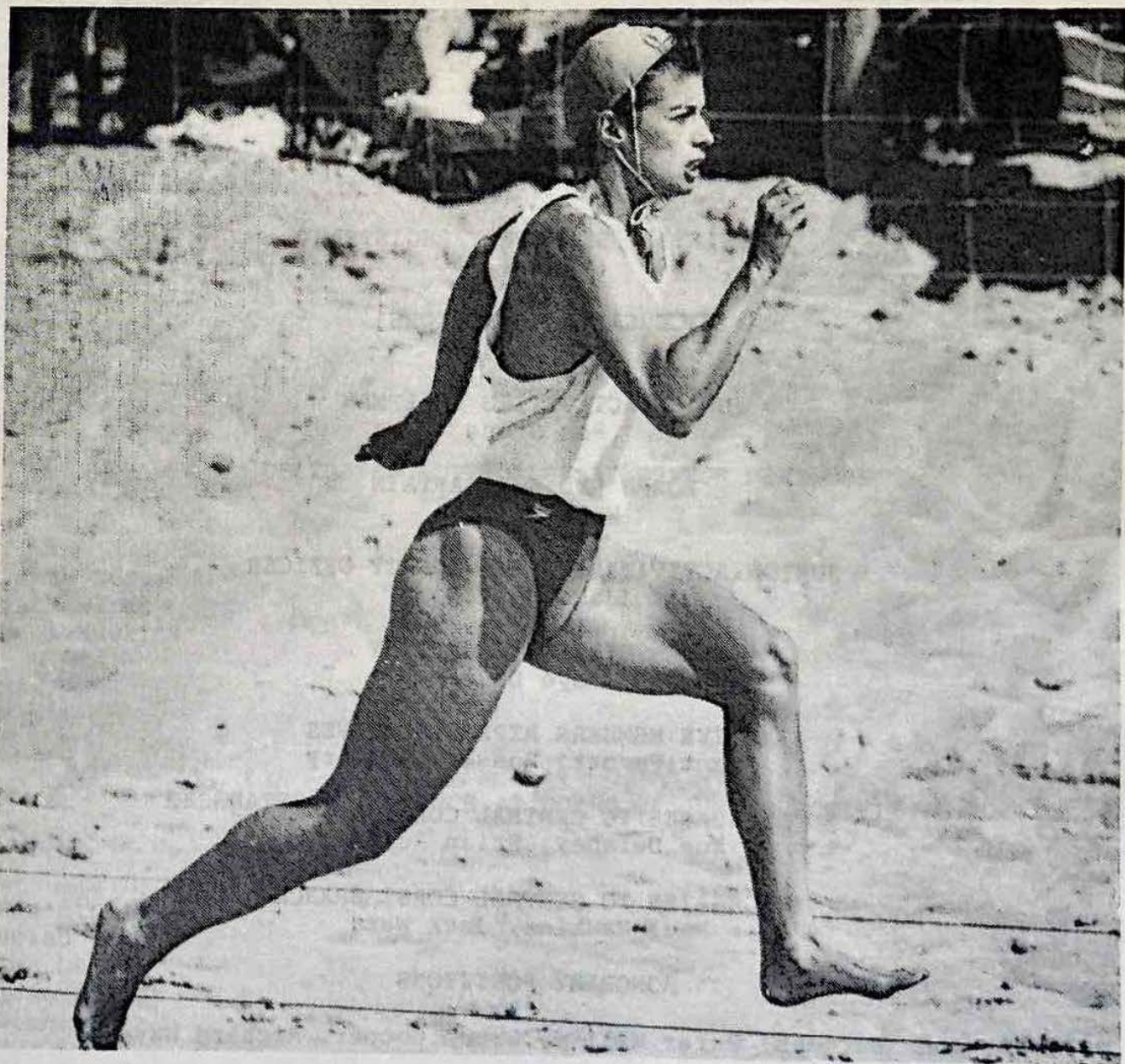
Home again, the news was better. With intense physiotherapy, her leg would be right as rain in a week, which was just as well since she was to go into training camp with the Australian Surf Lifesaving team the following weekend. They were preparing for a test match against South Africa at the Gold Coast three weeks later. As it turned out, Australia - and Veronica - bolted in, reaffirming the team's high hopes for the World Championships.

But niggling at the back of Veronica's mind was that ghastly fall, and the controversy her selection had caused. She wouldn't have been human if she hadn't lined up for her first race in Shimoda, Japan, feeling a

little nervous. Could lightning strike twice in the same place? Would she fall again? Would she be able to justify the faith the selectors had shown in her?

She could and she did. Quite splendidly, winning all her races in both sprints, as well as the helter-skelter flags, where luck sometimes plays as big a part as ability. (The only hiccup was in one heat of the sprint where she had won by so far the judges didn't see her and placed her seventh. Needless to say, Australian officials quickly stepped in to rectify the error.)

The winning of the World Championship Beach Sprint and Flags for Australia must have been very satisfying - and a huge relief - but Veronica told us that when she donned Terrigal's royal blue costume and cap to win the World Interclub Championships, she couldn't have been prouder. "Australia had won world titles before," she said. "Terrigal hasn't."

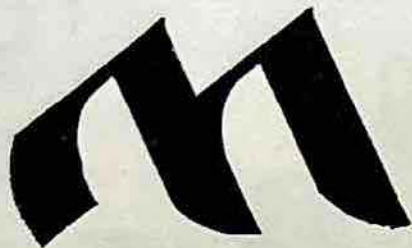

The Surf Club has had a good season in spite of not winning as many State and National titles as we have in recent years. Some poor weather in January did not help fund raising. On the positive side the Surf Club had more members gain Bronze Medallions than for many years and, as a result, there are more members doing patrols on Terrigal Beach than there has been before. Paradoxically, this year the Surf Club could not find someone competent who could commit the time required to be Chief Instructor.

The Clubman of the Year was Will Anido. Will contributed to the Surf Club in many ways: Will held the positions of Patrol Captain and Board and Ski Captain. Will achieved his 100% patrol efficiency award, Will's sportsmanship was always a good example to the many young members of the Surf Club. However, the greatest contribution made to the Surf Club this year was by Will Anido in Bronze Medallion training. Without Will stepping in to organise the training of bronze candidates few if any members would have achieved this critically important award this year.

Lorna also took responsibility this season for social activities when she accepted nomination for the position of Auxiliary Chairperson. Lorna has helped in the canteen, raffles and other activities. Her after patrol social events have been highly successful,

This year Ron Stone was awarded an Honour Blazer for his years of service as Chairman of the Junior Committee of the Surf Club and for always being willing to help in other activities.

Paul Minto was the Male Competitor of the Year. Paul has shown dedication, sportsmanship and leadership, not just in the season past but for many years. The Surf Club is always proud of the way Paul represents the Surf Club at Carnivals,

Female Competitor of the Year had to be Veronica Lee because nobody could train harder than Veronica has over the last eighteen months. Veronica was the reason that the Central Coast Branch won the Interbranch Carnival this season. Veronica had to win the Ladies Beach Flags, the last event on the programme, for the Central Coast to win. Veronica won and the Central Coast became the Champion Surf Life Saving Branch.

At the National Titles in the Ladies Beach Sprint Veronica was leading a very fast field till she fell over within metres of the line. Coming on top of missing out on a place in the Australian Athletics Team for Barcelona this was a severe disappointment. Veronica kept on training and while representing Australia at the World Life Saving Titles collected three Gold Medals in the Ladies Beach Sprint, the Ladies Beach Flags and the Cameron Relay and picked up a Bronze Medal in the Beach Relay. To top this off she also collected a Gold Medal in the World Interclub Ladies Beach Sprint wearing the Royal Blue of Terrigal. Veronica is still training hard and will go on to further success.

Rookie of the Year was Gary Walker. Nothing has been too much trouble for Gary. Gary has helped in the canteen, raffles and other fund raising. Gary has done three times the Patrol hours that he has been asked to do.

A year ago I decided that I would not stand for re-election to the position of President of the Surf Club. I believe that the Surf Club's greatest strength over the past ten years has been the stability and competence of the Management Committee. The Executive Committee has been honest and hard working. These combined with good sense and experience, are the key to the success of any voluntary organisation.

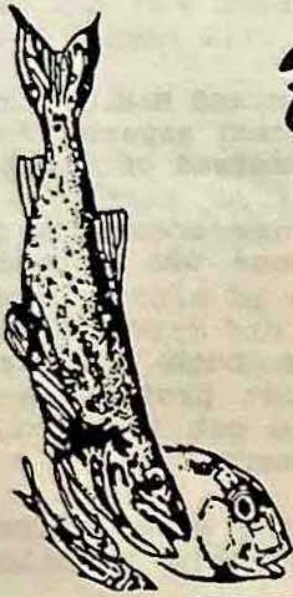
To do all of the above we must have a hard working group of people to organise the necessary arrangements needed to be able to allow these functions to proceed.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENT

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Cash Basis -

The financial statements have been prepared under the cash basis of accounting.

B. Revenue and Expense Recognition -

The Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club is a non-profit organisation and receives most of its income from donations and specific fund raising events. Amounts by their nature can only be recognised when they are recorded in the books of the club.

C. Imprest Accounts -

The Auxiliary Committee and the Sea Lions run imprest accounts from which they make minor payments. The imprest balances are \$500 each. The club treats these monies as spent when advanced. The income and the expenditure of the Sea Lions which was noted separately last year has been included in the descriptive categories this year. Total income this year was \$4033 and expenditure was \$5047.82.

D. Club Maintenance and Restructuring Provision -

This provision represents amounts provided for major repairs to the club house.
