THE BOATS ARE BACK

For a number of years now Terrigal Surf Club has been a powerful force in competition and is regarded as one of the countries great beach sprint clubs, having amongst its ranks State, Australian and World Champions. In recent times the Club has had two young Ironmen who have been able to match it with the countries best.

But there has been little or no interest in surf boats for many years apart from idle curiosity about two obsolete old boats hanging in the Club. Occasionally they may have been taken down and a team of old masters might have taken them for a social row. There has been no serious effort to enter in competition.

Well that was until the beginning of this season. Two boat sweeps arrived in town, one, Justin O'Donoghue, a former Queensland sweep and the other, Bob Grey, a former Manly sweep arriving via Newcastle. They looked at the Club and saw all these healthy young clubbies moping around wondering how to fill out the day.

Well before you could blink an eye they had the lads formed into three crews, organised sponsorship through Fuji Xerox Pty Ltd and Tooheys Limited, and purchased two competitive surf boats from the Manly Club. And compete they did - how they competed. Through hard training, motivation, discipline and most of all, pride in themselves and their Club the results started to roll in. Right across the State and on to the Australian Titles at Kurrawa Beach in Queensland they become a force to be reckoned with.

The Under 18 Boat Crew were the first to make their presence felt by winning the marathon boat race at North Cronulla. They followed this up in grand style by finishing sixth in the Tooheys Super Surf Boat Series, picking up a Silver Medal at the Branch Championships, making the finals at the State Titles and reaching the quarter finals at the Aussie Titles.

It's stretching the memory now but when did a Terrigal boat last win a Branch Title? I don't know but we did this year when the Under 21 Boat Crew became the Champions and on the way to the Title won the Bronze Medal in the "A" division. They also went on to make the quarter finals at the Aussie Titles.

But the crew who brought the lump to the throat or a tear to the eye of the old boaties around the Clubhouse was the Reserve Boat Crew, when on Boxing Day before their home crowd at the "Terrigal Twilight", won their division.

Its been a long time between drinks - hang on - the Terrigal Club has a great tradition in surf boats going right back to 1927 when they purchased "The Swordfish" from North Steyne for forty pounds. In those days surf boats were primarily a rescue craft and built up a great reputation in spectacular rescues right along the eastern seaboard. It didn't take long for the clubbies to find out that the boats could be great fun to race and Terrigal was right there where the action was.

In 1936 the President Jack MacArthur-Onslow put his hand in his pocket, and for one hundred pound purchased the Club's first new boat, the

"Spindrift". Like the "Swordfish" it was a double ender, made of solid cedar and took ten men to carry it. It was with this boat Frank Payne commenced his long and legendary career. His crew of Al Kilpatrick (stroke) and the Dibben Brothers won many carnivals along the coast. They devised a scheme whereby Al Kilpatrick swept to the cans with Frank as stroke, then swapped position and Frank drove them home. The "Spindrift" made headlines in 1938 when it was involved in attempted rescue in raging seas off the rocks at the Skillon. Its crew of Frank Payne, A. Macdonald, Ron Dibben, Roy Dibben and L. Dibben were granted the Royal Humane Society Certificate of Merit on 8th March, 1939.

The "Spindrift" was bedded down during the hostilities of World War 11. After the war Frank launched the old boat again and it served the Club well until Don Gordon, a sweep from Manly, came along and he introduced the first tuck stern boat to the Central Coast. With this boat they won Branch Championships and made the semi finals at the State and Australian Championships. In 1955 the Club received an award from the Maitland City Council for its courageous rescue work during the "Great Floods".

In about 1956 Frank decided to call it a day and Club had just been donated a brand new boat, the "Miss Florida", by the new international hotel. The Club was casting around for someone to take over after Frank and a young bloke by the name of Peter Wyllie said he would lend a hand. Peter was a swimmer of some note and for the previous ten years had been a member of the Club's crack R. and R. Team. This team had been undefeated throughout this whole period. Well the rest is history. Peter was the driving force behind the Club's boat crews right up until 1983 winning numerous Branch medals and some of the battles between him and the late Dick Gee of Avoca were breathtaking.

Peter takes great pride in the fact that from the first Carnival to his last he competed for fifty years. Some of the other surf boats he swept were "Jack Hi" (1969), "Seabreeze", "Coco of Terrigal" and "Miss International Trucks".

Any history of surf boats in the Club would have to include the Radio Station 2GO connection. In the mid seventies the Advertising Manager, Bob Earl, and Sports Commentator, Darrell, the "Big D", Eastlake joined the Club and brought with them the biggest sponsorship ever granted (until that time) to surf life saving. Amongst other equipment the Club purchased a new boat call "Marantz Hi Fi" and the sweep was the "Big D". Darrell coached numerous crews over the years with considerable success and competed in carnivals right across Australia. In 1979 they made the long haul across the Nullabor to compete in the Aussies in Perth.

Although not rowing any more, Darrell drops in from time to time to give advice, or you can tune to the Wide World of Sport on Channel 9 on any Sunday afternoon and hear him reminisce about the halcyon days of surf boat racing. Has there ever been a better race call than the final of the Open Boat Race at the Aussie Titles this year?

Well for the past ten years, apart from a brief flutter three years ago when Pepper on Sea purchased the Club a secondhand boat, surf boat racing has been in a lull. But now -



SECRETARY'S REPORT

It is with pleasure that I commend the 70th Annual Report and Financial Statement for 1992/93 to the members of Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated.


I guess it is a milestone, the 70th Annual Report. The Club has provided the longest continuous service to surf life saving on the Central Coast. One or perhaps two other Clubs were established before Terrigal but they ceased to operate for a period and were later reformed.

Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club has a proud record in surf life saving and competition and I am proud to have been the Secretary of the Club for the past decade.

It is in this context that I sadly advise of the death on 16th June, 1993 of Douglas "Budge" Campbell, O.B.E., one of the foundation members of the Club. I met Budge about four years ago when I was preparing a history of the Club. He informed me that as a lad he lived on a farm at Wamberal and he, along with a number of other young men, surfed at Terrigal Beach. Ted Sheedy, a former member of Palm Beach Surf Club, moved to Terrigal and suggested to those young men that they form a surf Club. This was in 1924. The Club was formed and Budge was its first Vice Club Captain.

He remained with Terrigal for about three to four years then move to The Entrance where he helped to re-establish that Club. He remained with The Entrance Club, became a Life Member, and attended its Seventieth Anniversary Dinner earlier this year.

From that early start with about twelve members Terrigal, through the 1930's and 1940's, grew to one of the most powerful in the country with a membership of about seventy. Things are certainly different today.

CLUB MEMBERSHIP

The senior membership continues to grow at a substantial rate, namely at 11.50% over the previous year. The number of active male members however dropped by 12% but overall the number of female members has almost doubled.

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Management Committee met on nine occasions during the year and of the 25 members only four attained 100% attendance. In all, there were one hundred and fifteen absences, leaving a small core of hard working office bearers to manage the Club. This had the problem of placing an exceptional load on these officers, and because of their narrow focus and limited experience, could not be expected to satisfactorily represent all aspects of the Club.

SUB-COMMITTEES

Sea Lions Committee:

The Committee had a very successful year under the Chairmanship of John Howick. Sunday morning competition was well represented as was attendance at carnivals. The Club finished second in the Branch Championships which was the best performance for a number of years and six Sea Lions were selected to represent the Branch at the State Inter-Branch Championships. Scott Roberts was selected from that Carnival to represent NSW at the Australian Championships in Tasmania. Not only did Scott compete at the highest level but the Club could not have asked for a better representative. Scott would be our first Junior State representative since the brilliant David Love. The Committee recognised Scott's achievements by naming him the Sea Lion of the Year on Presentation Day.

The Sea Lion membership continues to grow, 15% increase over the previous year. A comparative breakdown of membership is listed

Auxiliary Committee:

This Committee, under the Chairmanship of Auxiliary Delegate, Lorna Stone, had a very busy season organising the social activities of the Club. There were more activities this year than the previous year and were well supported by the membership.

A new innovation has been the Sunday morning breakfasts for the winter swimmers, winter training and participants in the Iron Men's Ironman. This has been very successful in bringing members together in winter and has gone a long way in lifting the esprit de corps of the Club.

The Auxiliary catered for 21 functions, including Junior and Senior Presentation of Trophies, The Twilight Carnival, Junior and Senior Xmas Parties, Back to Front Raffle Night, 10 B.B.Q.s and end of season functions for both Juniors and Seniors.

The liquor license was exercised at each of these functions and the net takings was comparable to the previous year. Thanks go to Ron Stone who organised all the liquor purchases and to Reg Delaney, Bob Baxter, and Kim Petley who worked so hard behind the bar.

Early in the season the Auxiliary organised a Fashion Parade which was well patronised and all the proceeds went to Club maintenance for renovations to the kitchen.

Judiciary Committee:

The Committee, under the Chairmanship of the Vice President Ron Stone, met on one occasion only during the year to consider allegations of misuse of the I.R.B. by a member. The Committee recommended that the member clean around the Club until he obtained his I.R.B. Drivers Licence. The recommendation was endorsed by the Management Committee.

Carnival Committee:

Again the Club conducted the Terrigal Twilight Carnival with great success and for this we can thank the hard work put in by Ron Stone and his Committee. Not only was the Carnival a financial success but proved to be a magnificent show place for life saving and very much appreciated by the large crowd it attracts.

The Club has submitted applications to hold four Carnivals for the coming season and the Committee has been expanded to meet the extra anticipated workload. All members will be called upon to assist in the preparation, organisation and participation in these carnivals if they are approved.

Building Committee:

The Management Committee established a Committee under the Chairmanship of John Howick to examine the feasibility of extending the surf club. The Management Committee set aside \$3000 for this purpose and to pay an architect to prepare a design concept to be submitted to State Centre and the various Government agencies. The charter of the Building Committee is to come up with a proposal which is cost negative to the Club. At this stage a site meeting has been held with the architect, Gosford Council, State Centre and the appropriate Government Agencies.

It is difficult to comprehend the grief experienced by Paul and by Lisa's family, particularly in the way she was taken from them. She was a bright, happy, bubbly young lady looking forward to her marriage to Paul in February this year.

All members expressed their heartfelt sympathy towards Paul and the family.

As if by some prophetic inspiration Lisa wrote the following poem several months before her tragic death.

"Do not stand by my grave and weep I am not here, I do not sleep I am the eagle that soars so high I am a star in the dark night sky. Frameon Jeamsonnest and Do not stand by my grave and cry becker and theresetons I am not here, I did not die."

Paul expresses his appreciation to all members for their support.

Clubhouse Maintenance

The Clubhouse is permanently booked each evening from Monday through to Thursday for community activities. The income from these activities substantially meets the cost of Club maintenance.

Two major renovations took place during the year. The Junior Gear Room was extended to enclose approximately half the members room. Regrettably very little room is left for members for changing or storing their push bikes when they are on patrol. The Club was never designed to cater for the size of membership we have nor big enough to store equipment a modern rescue organisation requires. It is not too soon that consideration has been instigated to determine the feasibility of extensions.

The Management Committee approved \$3000 being used to renovate the Kitchen area. This included \$500 donated by the Terrigal Women's Tennis Club and a similar amount being raised by a fashion parade organised by the Auxiliary. The renovations included a new set of cupboards but more importantly the Kitchen was independently connected to its own water and electricity supply. 

The I.R.Bs. and crews proved again last season that the "rubber duckie" is the best piece of rescue equipment that clubs have at their disposal.



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
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JUNIOR CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENT

1.ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- A.Cash Basis The financial statements have been prepared under the cash basis of accounting.
- B.Revenue and Expense Recognition The Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club is a non-profit organisation
 and receives most of its income from donations and specific
 fund raising events. Amounts by their nature can only be
 recognised when they are recorded in the books of the club.
- C.Imprest Accounts The Auxiliary Committee and the Sea Lions run imprest accounts
 from which they make minor payments. The imprest balances
 are \$500 each. The club treats these monies as spent when
 advanced. The income and the expenditure of the Sea Lions which
 was noted separately last year has been included in the
 descriptive categories this year. Total income this year was
 \$15946 and expenditure was \$17148.
- D.Canteen Net Contribution Due to a change in accounting policy, assets relating to the
 Canteen Fund have been included in the Accounts of the Club. The
 canteen Fund have been included in the Accounts of the results
 net contribution of \$22480 does not soley represent the results
 of the current year's trading but incorporates profits of
 previous periods not previous brought to account.


