SURFBOAT SWEEP**

Faster than a tiger shark - more powerful than the biggest wave - able to leap surfboats in a single bound - Look!! Look out in the surf - is it a fish? is it a whale? - NO!! - its sssSSSUPERDAFF!!



Now and again someone comes along and makes such an impact, nothing is the same again. Superdaff is one of those beings. They are a rare breed and must be nurtured. To find out more about this - being? I sent along that intrepid reporter Louis Lane to interview our super hero.

**LOUIS LANE:** Why did you come to Terrigal?

**SUPERDAFF:** Ellen got a transfer in her employment, as simple as that and I wasn't working permanently.

**LOUIS LANE:** No!! What made you decide to join Terrigal S.L.S.C.?

**SUPERDAFF:** When I knew for sure that we were moving I looked at Central Coast Clubs that I thought had potential at the 1992 State and Australian Titles. After which I went around some Clubs to see how welcome I would be. The majority weren't interested, with one shutting the door in my face, I can't remember their name but it was next to a golf Club. Terrigal did seem interested in a curious way and at least seemed willing to talk about the possibilities of establishing surfboat crews.

**LOUIS LANE:** So how did it all start up?

**SUPERDAFF:** The Terrigal President at that moment in time James Legge and myself had a meeting at the Central Coast Leagues Club. James seemed keen on the idea of surfboat crews, however he did express some reservations of the current personnel and the possible cost of setting up. But after about a dozen schooners that faded into unimportant matters. It was finally resolved to meet with the Terrigal Executive, James agreed to plead my case. We left the Club three parts p....d and convinced that the rocket would fly. I knew that I wouldn't be able to build this project on my own so my next step was to contact an old china, Justin O'Donoghue, in Newcastle and tell him of the idea of mine

to establish surfboat crews at Terrigal. After convincing him that I hadn't gone insane but had discovered another Manly, he agreed to accompany me to the Executive Meeting.

LOUIS LANE: What happened at the Executive Meeting?

SUPERDAFF: James nearly got Justin and myself 20 years hard labour, just kidding. There was lots of verbal exchanges, finally however it was resolved that the Club would support us if we could make it fly and raise the majority of the funds needed for gear ourselves.

LOUIS LANE: Where did the funds and gear come from?

SUPERDAFF: We begged, borrowed and borrowed again from old boatie mates and past Clubs. Justin acquired some funds out of his employer Xerox and after much persuasion Tooheys came good with a small sponsorship. This combined with the Club's support was enough to get two secondhand surfboats from Manly. The rocket was on the launching pad, countdown had begun. However, the astronauts that were to crew the rocket were still very young and inexperienced.

LOUIS LANE: Well how did you go?

SUPERDAFF: Contrary to popular pub discussion we went very well, the boys learnt quickly at the technique and boat skills sessions held in the early months of pre-season training. However, Justin and I were both of the same opinion that we had to be competitive from the beginning to maintain the boys confidence and trust whilst they gained experience from competition. Achievable goals were set, such as making quarter/semi finals in Sydney competition or being in finals in Newcastle and Central Coast competitions. As these goals were obtained confidence grew, performance enhanced and the next thing the boys were running places in Sydney and winning local finals. Terrigal were now no easybeats, respect and credibility had been established amongst fellow competitors.

LOUIS LANE: What about the season just finished?

SUPERDAFF: What can one say when you have a super season such as the one we have just experienced, except well done. The boys built on the experienced gained the year before and left a large number of big name Clubs in their wake.

LOUIS LANE: Where to now and what about new goals?

SUPERDAFF: Good question. Having experienced such a terrific season, it would be easy to stay in orbit, however you soon find yourself crashing to earth with a huge crunch when competition begins again. What is that saying, "It's a quick trip from the penthouse to the shithouse", anyway I don't believe that will happen at Terrigal as there is still very much to achieve. Firstly stabilisation of performance and formation of a competitive A crew are important areas that must be worked on. Next is the continuing introduction of new blood into the boatshed, because without that we will grow old and wither on the vine.

LOUIS LANE: So you see nothing but sunny days ahead?

SUPERDAFF: A sunny day can cloud over very quickly. When an athlete loses enthusiasm to do the task required he or she is no good to anyone including themselves, you know the story about the apples in the barrel. It doesn't matter if it was your prize apple, if it's bad, get rid of it, otherwise you'll have no apples at all. Terrigal by coming fourth in the Tooheys State Club Championship and by winning State as well as Australian Medals proved they are a force to be reckoned with, but with that new found prestige comes pressure to maintain that new found standard of being amongst the best. Dawn Fraser once said, "getting to the top was easy, staying there is another matter".

EDITOR: With your enthusiasm and guidance, Daff, we'll stay there.

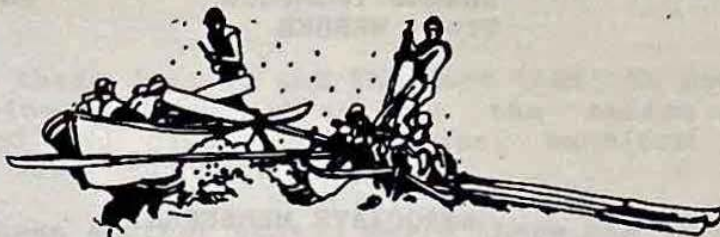

## SECRETARY'S REPORT

It is with pleasure that I commend the 71st Annual Report and Financial Statement for 1993/94 to the members of Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated.

It has been a mixed season with a heavy workload placed on our competitors because of the introduction of the Tooheys Surfboat Premiership and the Nutri Grain Pointscore Championship. The latter conducted carnivals right across the country and to gain maximum points, 120, a competitor virtually had to follow the circuit.

The Club also conducted four major carnivals which tested the resources of the membership.

As a consequence of these demands and the fact that the position of Vice Club Captain remained vacant throughout the season our domestic competition suffered. No Club championships, handicap pointscore or ironman competition was conducted.

Fortunately it has been another season where there has been no drownings or serious injury in the patrolled area. I compliment the patrol captains and the patrolling members on their dedication and diligence throughout the season. With the changing social profile of the township, particularly with the development of a mammoth shopping complex on the outskirts and the movement of the work force towards part time and casual work, difficulty was experienced in maintaining the patrols at full strength. When members are called to work at short notice and with so many young people working at weekends, difficulty was experienced in securing substitute patrol members. At times this required the Club Captain or other members of the Executive to display initiative and flair to meet the challenge of maintaining full patrols.

Considerable difficulty and unpleasantness was experienced at certain times over the requalification and examination of our members which placed the Management Committee in conflict with the Board of Examiners. This has now been resolved to the satisfaction of the Management Committee and the Club looks forward to a positive and harmonious relationship with the Branch Superintendent, Barry Roffe and the District Supervisor, Kevin Stanford, next season.

### CLUB MEMBERSHIP

The active membership continues to fall at a substantial rate, namely at 20.42% over the previous year. This reduces the total active membership for the past two seasons by a third. A comparative breakdown of members is listed hereunder:-

Unless the Club conducts a successful recruitment drive prior to the commencement of next season serious consideration will have to be given to reducing the number of patrols. This in turn will place additional pressure on the active membership.

In recent years a number of Nipper parents have obtained their Bronze Medallions and can be relied upon to provide the water safety on Sunday mornings for Nipper events. This in turn releases active members for other duties. However, it would greatly add to the strength of the Club if those members were to participate in rostered patrols. They would provide maturity, leadership and experience that is so difficult to obtain.

#### MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Management Committee is made up of twenty six positions of which three were not filled; these were Vice Club Captain, Junior Club Captain and Active Members Representative. The Committee met on nine occasions and only the Club Captain attained 100% attendance. Only eight met the Club's requirement of not having more than three absences. One Meeting was abandoned for failure to have a quorum and others only had the bare numbers required for a quorum.

Times and days of Meetings were varied in an effort to improve attendance but these strategies made little difference. One can only speculate how long the Club can remain viable at this rate of interest.

Delegates to both the Branch and to the Board of Junior Activities are to be congratulated for their regular attendance at Meetings and for bringing credit on to the Club.

#### SUB-COMMITTEES

##### Sea Lions Committee:

The Nippers achieved their best results ever. The Club won the pointscore competition at every Branch Carnival and were the Branch Champions. The Club members are proud of the record achieved by the children and congratulations to all the coaches. I am sure a lot don't realise the hard work that has to be put into training in the pool, on the beach and in the surf.

Success is the result of good management and this comes through hard work. Congratulations to John Howick and Sea Lions Committee for this great achievement.

Five members of the Sea Lions were selected to represent the Central Coast Branch at the State Inter Branch Championships. These were Jessie Keaveney, Jason Mak, Kinga Pletikosic, Cal Roper and Eve Smith. All performed with distinction and brought credit to the Club.

Eve Smith was elected Team Captain and I've received numerous reports as to the dignity and maturity in which she carried out her duties. On Presentation Day the Club recognised her qualities, not only for this year, but over many years, by naming Eve, Sea Lion of the Year.

The Sea Lion membership declined dramatically this year. There was a drop of 22% in membership, in keeping with the overall reduction in active members. Again it would seem that we must look at the recruitment procedure adopted by the Club.

#### Auxiliary Committee:

This Committee had probably its busiest season for many years in organising the social activities and catering for the four carnivals undertaken by the Club. Lorna Stone and her hard working group were unfazed by it all and met every challenge thrown their way.

In addition to the carnivals, the Auxiliary catered for 22 functions, including Junior and Senior Presentation of Trophies, Junior and Senior Xmas Parties, Back to Front Raffle Night, B.B.Q.s and end of the functions for both juniors and seniors.

The Liquor Licence was allocated for the maximum number of functions. Approval had been obtained from the Licensing Court to run functions on each Friday night during January and February in conjunction with night beach volley ball. After the first two nights, however, because of insufficient support by the members, the licence was transferred to other functions.

The best supported functions were still the B.B.Q.s after junior carnivals.

#### Judiciary Committee:

The Committee met on one occasion during the year to consider allegations of breaches in patrol obligations by nineteen members and of the misuse of the I.R.B. by two members.

The Committee decided on the following course of action in respect of those who allegedly breached patrol obligations:-

To serve one Penalty Patrol	5 members
To serve two penalty Patrols	6 members

In respect of the alleged misuse of the I.R.B. the Committee laid out strict guidelines to be followed by those two members in the future.

#### Carnival Committee:

The Carnival Committee under the Chairman of the President had an extremely busy year organising and presenting four major carnivals.

The panograph on the cover of this Annual Report is a tribute to the carnivals held on Terrigal Beach this season.

The workload in the preparation and presentation of the carnivals was enormous and the Management Committee was extremely please with the way the members responded to the challenge.

The carnivals were as follows:-

30/10/1993	Terrigal Surf Lifesaving Spectacular
14/11/1993	Junior Branch Carnival
26/12/1993	Terrigal Twilight
19/3/1994	Branch Masters

The "Spectacular" was probably the biggest carnival we've undertaken since Terrigal hosted the State Championships on 13th March, 1954. The carnival was a State major carnival and incorporated a "AAA" rated round of the Tooheys Surfboat Premiership. Early in the preparation for the carnival the focus of the Committee appeared to be directed towards the surfboat events and concern was felt that not enough incentive was being directed towards the more traditional events. This concern was conveyed to Ray Bannon of Crown Realty & Investments Pty Ltd and his company immediately made \$2,000 available for the ironman event. We were able than to advertise the event statewide as "The Terrigal \$2000 Crown Realty Ironman". This, together with the wonderful sponsorship of all other major events attracted a quality field of competitors.

As a matter of interest, the winner of the Crown Realty Ironman was Drew Blatchford who went on to win the NSW Ironman Title.

Crown Realty & Investments Pty Ltd have indicated that the company would like to see "The Terrigal \$2000 Crown Realty Ironman" be a permanent part of the annual surf lifesaving competition circuit.

Although the other three carnivals didn't have the dimensions of the "Spectacular" they nevertheless were equally as successful. All members of the Club, I am sure would like to express their appreciation to all the hard work and worry taken on by the Carnival Organiser, John Howick.

Any expression of appreciation must include the Club's major sponsors, Radio Station FM 108 and Rusty Wallis and her marketing team. Their publicity and support is an integral part of the success of the Club.

#### **Building Committee:**

On 1st November, 1992 a Committee was established under the Chairmanship of John Howick to examine the feasibility of extending the surf club. The Committee was to submit a report to the Management Committee with a proposal which was cost neutral to the Club. \$3000 was set aside for an architect to prepare a design concept to be submitted to State Centre and the various Government agencies.

On 4th July, 1993 the Management Committee authorised expenditure of \$1000 for consultant's fee to be paid to the Architect, Mr Peter Andrews, in respect of work relating to the design concept of the



extensions to the Clubhouse. No report or recommendation has been made by the Committee at this stage.

However, the Chairman, John Howick, has asked that the following information be placed before the membership of the Club. "Before proceeding with having any building plans drawn up it was decided to contact the various State Government bodies i.e. Public Work's Department (PWD) and Conservation and Land Management (CALM) to ascertain what requirements, if any, they may have. It was considered that by adopting this course of action it would help save unnecessary costs and then a final building application could be submitted to Council for approval.

"As the Club and surrounds have been identified by PWD as being in a beach hazard area an on-site meeting was arranged on 10th June, 1994 between the Club's consultant, representatives from PWD and members of the Building Committee. As a result of the meeting certain suggestions were made by PWD representatives on structural materials which might be used to eliminate any danger to the building due to heavy seas. These will now form the basis to assist structural drawings and it is anticipated that an artists impression of how the clubhouse will look will be available for perusal by members prior to the start of the 1994/95 season."

The Club wishes to express its deep appreciation to Andrews-Neil, Archtects and Trehy & Ingold, Surveyors for all their assistance.

#### Clubhouse Maintenance

The Clubhouse continues to be permanently booked each evening from Monday through to Thursday for community activities. The income from these activities substantially meets the cost of Club maintenance. No major renovations have been implemented this year. Doors and grills have been added to the kitchen thanks to a very generous anonymous donor.

Unfortunately the Club has received severe damage from rampaging vandals. Undoubtedly it has been worse this year than any period during my eleven year as Secretary. Hardly a week goes by when I'm not awoken during the night by the security service advising of some destruction.

The Club deeply appreciated the work done by Ron and Pam Gerrish of the Lemon Tree Gallery, East Gosford for restoring all the Club pictures and photographs damaged by vandals.

Quotes have been obtained to install security doors but funds are not available at this time. The Club also intends to replace the hot water system when funds become available.

#### LITIGATION

On 23rd September, 1992 the Club and two of our members were served with a copy of an Ordinary Statement of Claim lodged with the District Court, Gosford on 15th September, 1992 for the sum of \$100,000. It relates to an alleged collision between a swimmer and the Club's I.R.B. The matter was settled by the Club's insurers on 24th November, 1993.

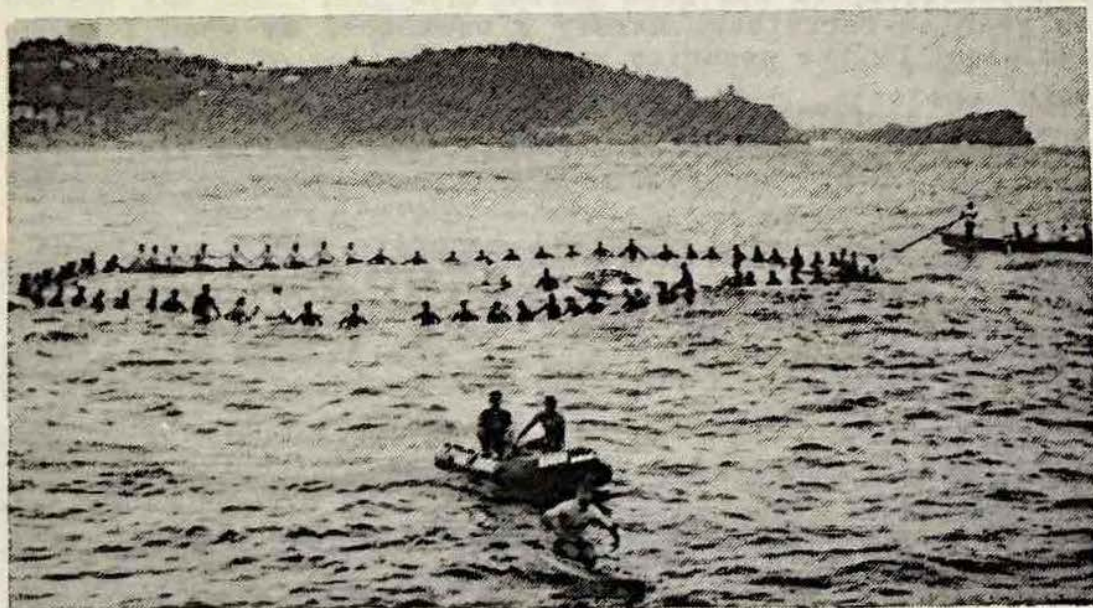
The sporting and surf lifesaving community was stunned by his dreadful death.

And so you see I have observed and known Howie over many years and he was a wonderful young person, friendly, with a dry sense of humour, and always he had time to stop and talk.

He will be missed but not forgotten. To parents, Spike and Nan, sisters Belinda and Samantha, and brother Gordon, the members of Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club extend their heartfelt sympathy.

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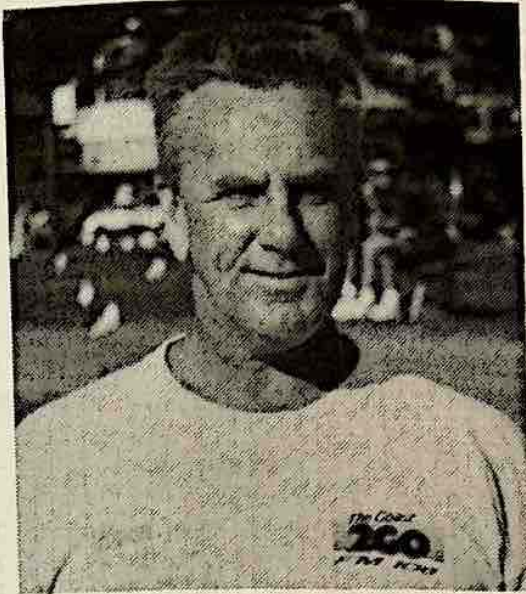

The dedication shown by our competitors form the nucleus for keeping alive the high profile that Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club enjoys, and hopefully this will continue into the future.

Speaking of carnivals, Terrigal certainly had its share. The success of the four carnivals held on our beach was mainly due to the organisation and work done by a dedicated group of people who contributed great deal of their time and energy, both on the beach and in the clubhouse. To see and be part of this group made me aware of the terrific spirit which exists within the Club, and to all those concerned, I thank you. There is one person that I would like to give special mention to, and that is JOHN HOWICK, who was the driving force behind the organisation.

I would like to congratulate all the Patrol Captains for the way in which the patrols were conducted throughout the season. It was mainly due to them and their patrol members that no fatalities occurred at Terrigal Beach, and that is really what we are really all about. As our beach is becoming more and more popular with the bathing public this will place an ever increasing demand on our patrols in the future, which will require us to become more and more diligent.

We have been fortunate with the quality of our Patrol Captains over recent years. They are an experienced and dedicated group who have given up their time over a number of years in the interest of lifesaving and providing a secure bathing area for the public. In recognition of their dedication and loyalty the Executive, on Presentation Night, rewarded each of the Patrol Captains with an "Honour Jacket".

The 1993/94 saw the introduction of staggered patrol hour and starting times depending on the time of the season. During the slower months, patrols operated from 10.0am to 4.0pm and during the busy period, from 9.0am to 6.0pm. Although at times the changing hours caused confusion, the new arrangements proved popular with the members.

Again this year, part time and casual work created difficulty in maintaining full patrols at all times. With the close proximity of a large supermarket, members could be called to work at short notice, making it difficult to obtain substitutes for their patrol. Part time or casual work seems to reflect overall social change in the workforce and in future years strategies will need to be devised to overcome the strain imposed on patrols to meet their obligations.

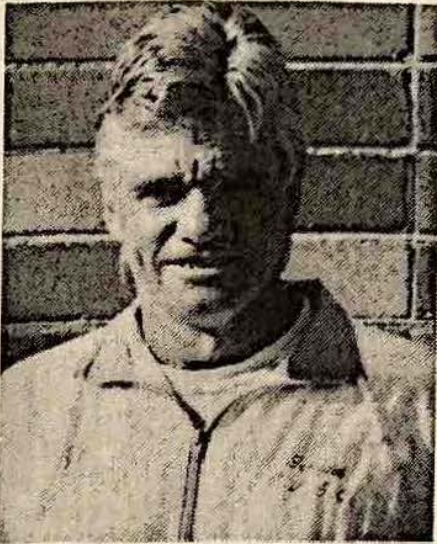

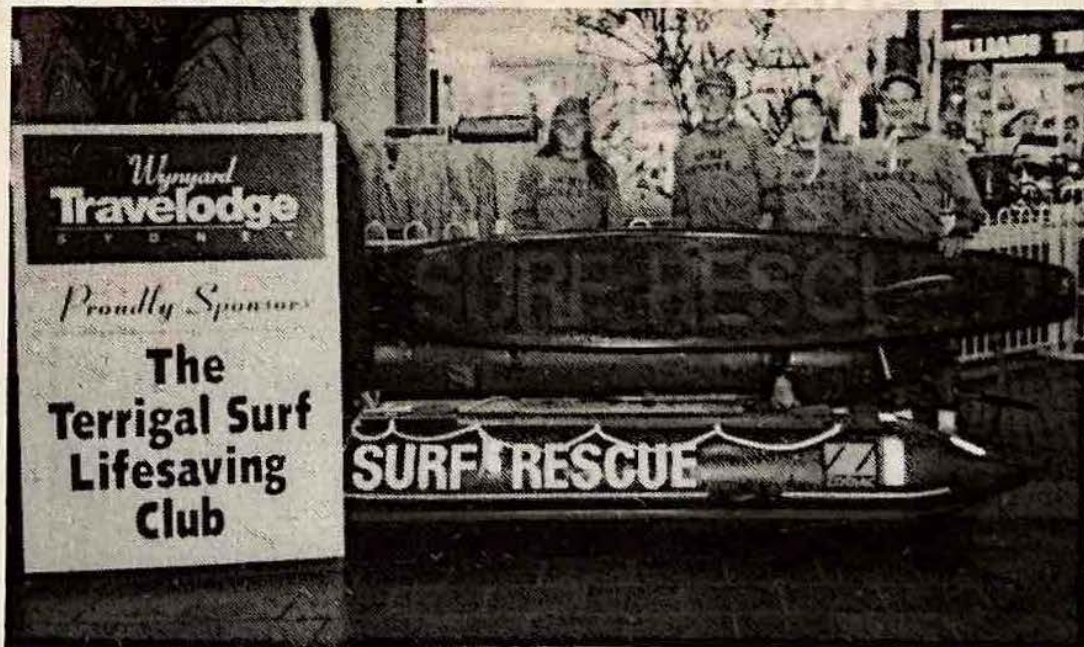

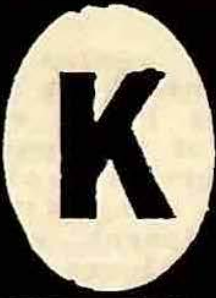

The boys had to travel from one end of the State to the other, placing enormous strain on the fitness of both the person and equipment, but the rewards came at the end of the season in the form of medals and prizemoney.

Led by the Branch Champion Darren Borg who was also a finalist in both the State and Australian Championships, the board paddlers had a successful season. Darren, along with Will Anido and Paul Stone, made a very competitive Board Relay Team, picking up Silver Medals at the Branch Titles and Bronze Medals at the State Titles. In the first season of the Nutri Grain Pointscore Competition, an Australia wide series, Darren finished third in the pointscore and fifth in the final.

Ellen Gray took the Under 16 paddlers in hand and spent many hours coaching them. Although not particularly successful in their first year, Adam Montgomery, Paul Delaney and Michael Masters displayed a lot of potential. I wish to complement Ellen for going on to become an accredited Grade 1 Board Coach with the Department of Sport and Recreation. Although adept, the ski paddlers of Scott Deveril, Matt Raward and Anthony Vysma did not reach their potential, but showed enough to indicate that they will be a force next year.

And what superlatives have I not used over the years to describe the performances of Veronica Lee? A journalist somewhere this year described her as "the veteran Veronica Lee". I guess I can understand this confusion when you look at her record - World Champion, three times Australian Champion, twice State Champion, Nutri Grain Pointscore Champion, four times State Team Representative, Australian Representative in Tests against New Zealand and South Africa and to the World Championships. Again selected to the Australian Team to contest the World Championships in Cardiff in September this Year. Yes, I can understand the confusion. What a record! A veteran? She's not yet twenty four - nowhere near her peak.

## CHIEF INSTRUCTOR'S REPORT



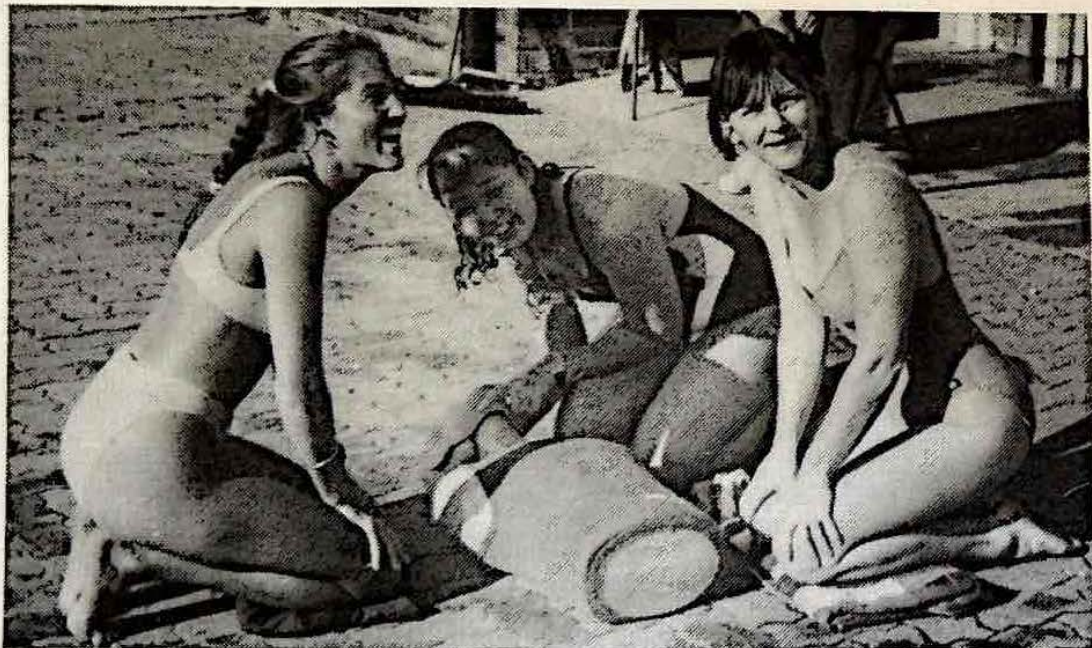

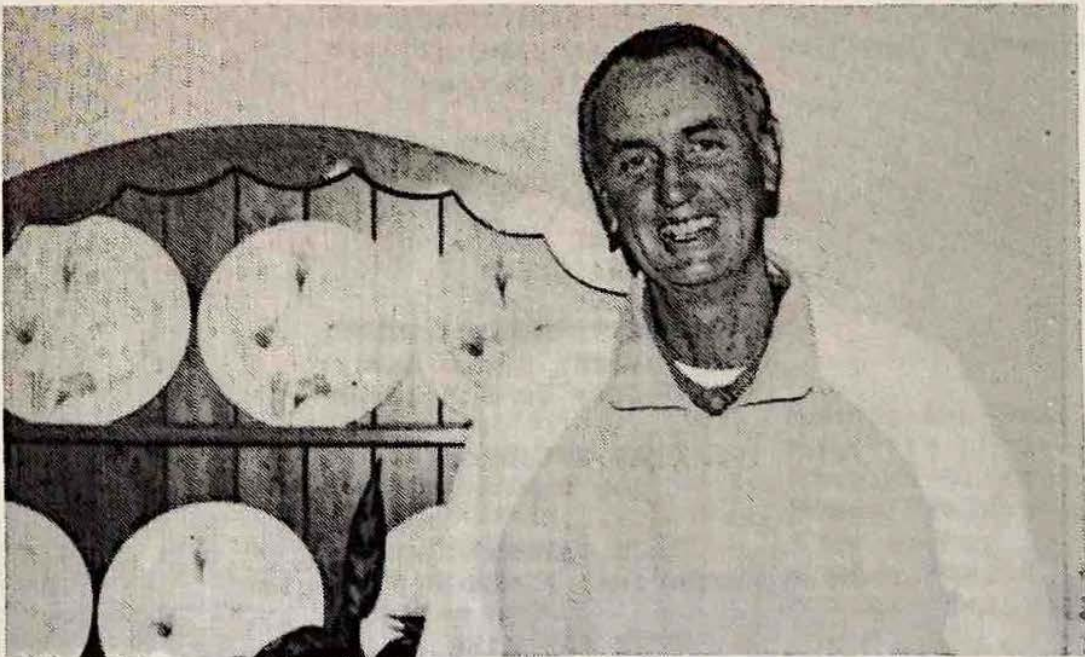
Beside the usual B.B.Q.s the Auxiliary were require to cater for four major carnivals during the season. This placed extra demands on the members but they came through with flying colours.

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## JUNIOR CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

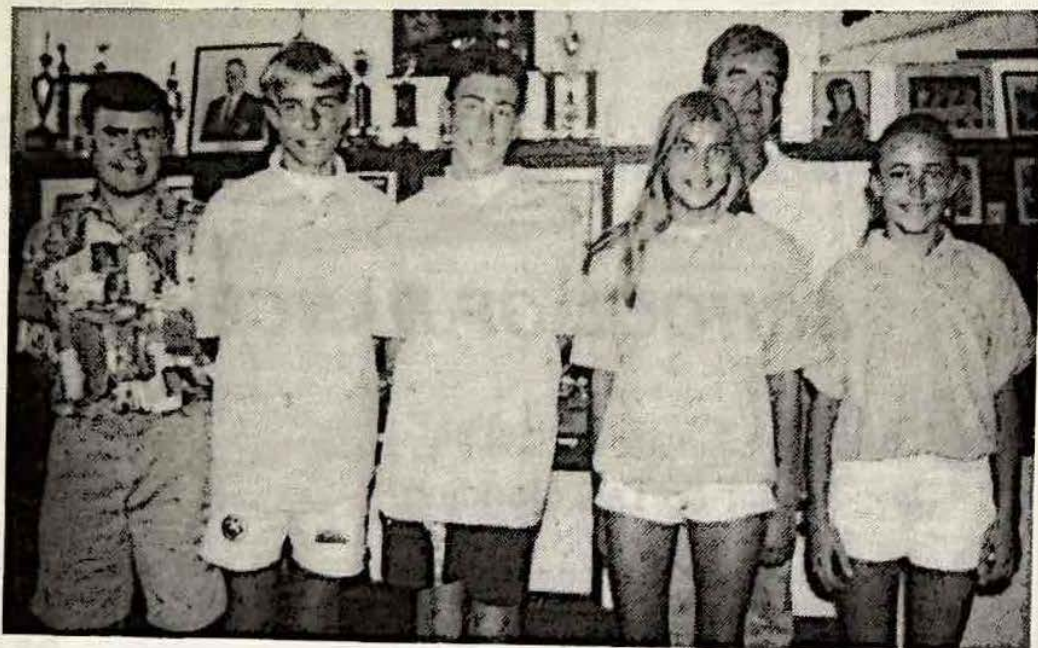
It is with much pleasure that I submit this report after a most successful season for the Terrigal Sea Lions.

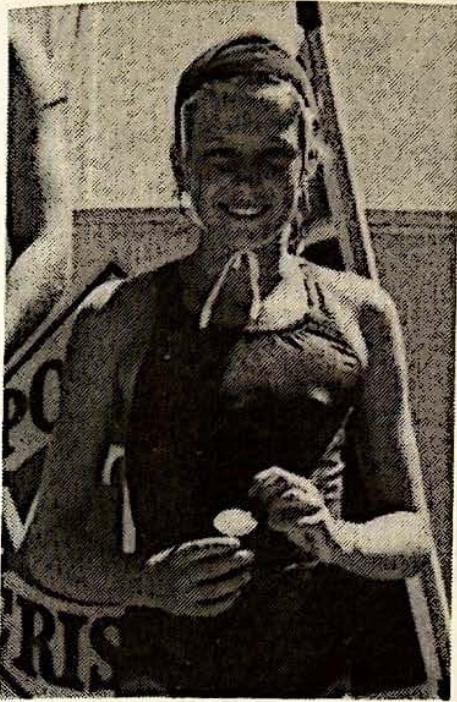

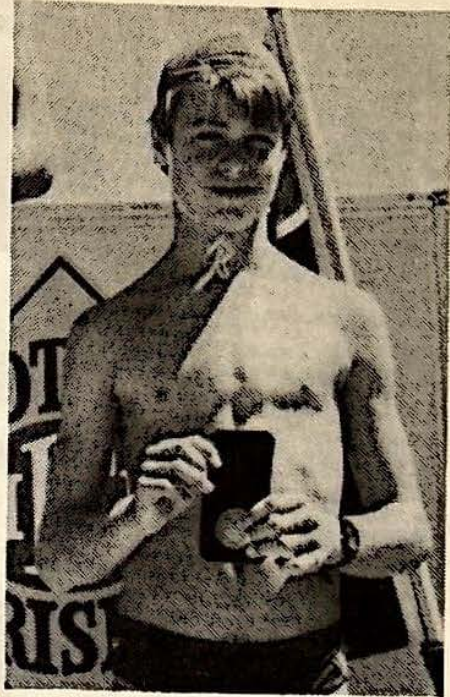
Thanks competitors, medal winners or not, and parents. Great work team managers - think of all the exercise you got running up and down the beach. Without your help our children could not be a part of nippers.

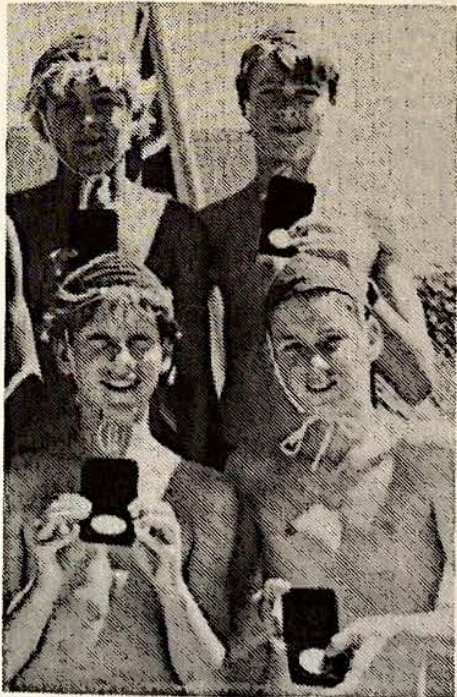

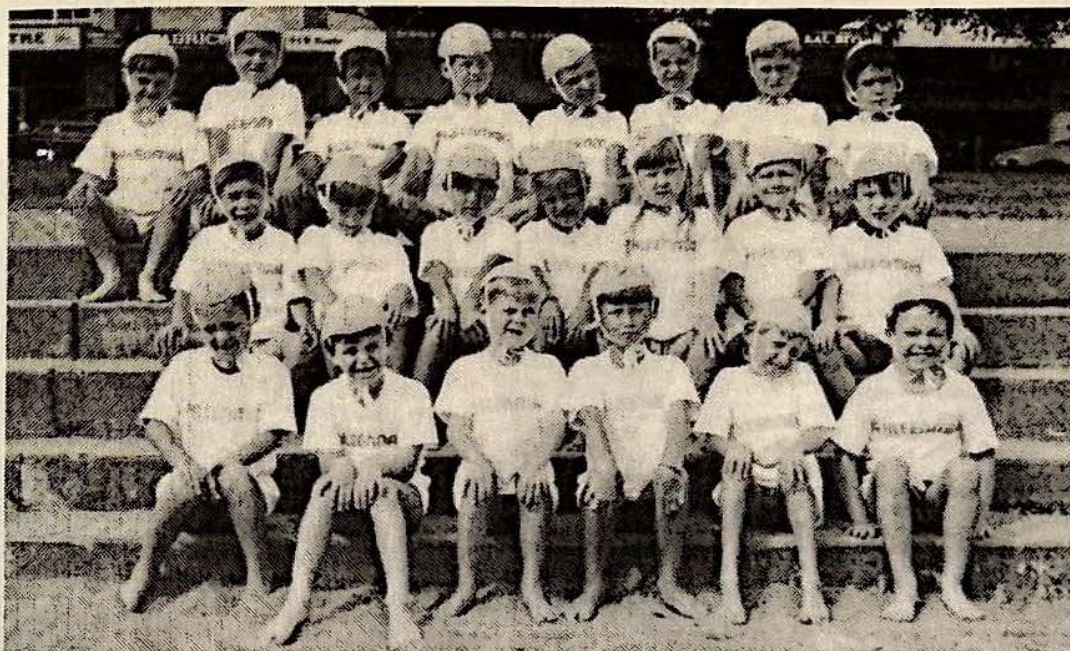

**NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENT**

**1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**A. Accruals Basis -**

The financial statements have been prepared under the accruals basis of accounting.

**B. Revenue and Expense Recognition -**

The Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club is a non-profit organisation and receives most of its income from donations and specific fund raising events. Amounts by their nature can only be recognised when they are recorded in the books of the club.

**C. Imprest Accounts -**

The Auxiliary Committee and the Sea Lions run imprest accounts from which they make minor payments. The imprest balances are \$500 each. The Club treats these monies as spent when advanced. The income and the expenditure of the Sea Lions is no longer noted separately but is now included in the descriptive categories. Total income this year was \$18,372 and expenditure was \$19,068.

**D. Canteen - Net Contribution -**

The net contribution of \$13,835 represents the current year's trading. The net contribution of \$22,480 does not solely represent the results of the 1993 trading but incorporates profits of previous periods brought to account due to a change in accounting policy in that year.

This is of course incentive and rewards for excellence throughout the year.

Recently it was put to me by a nipper parent that the Club should purchase quality competition gear for him because he has obtained his Bronze Medallion and does water safety on Sunday mornings for nippers. My only comment is that I think it is noble that a parent is prepared to care for his children, but it is not my intention to raise money to buy gear so he can play.

Similarly, I believe that its the parents responsibility to purchase competition gear and uniforms for the nippers or raise funds for that purpose as we, who have gone before, have done - and not look to others to do this.

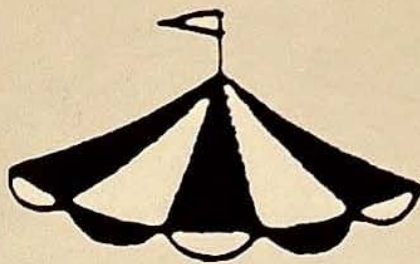

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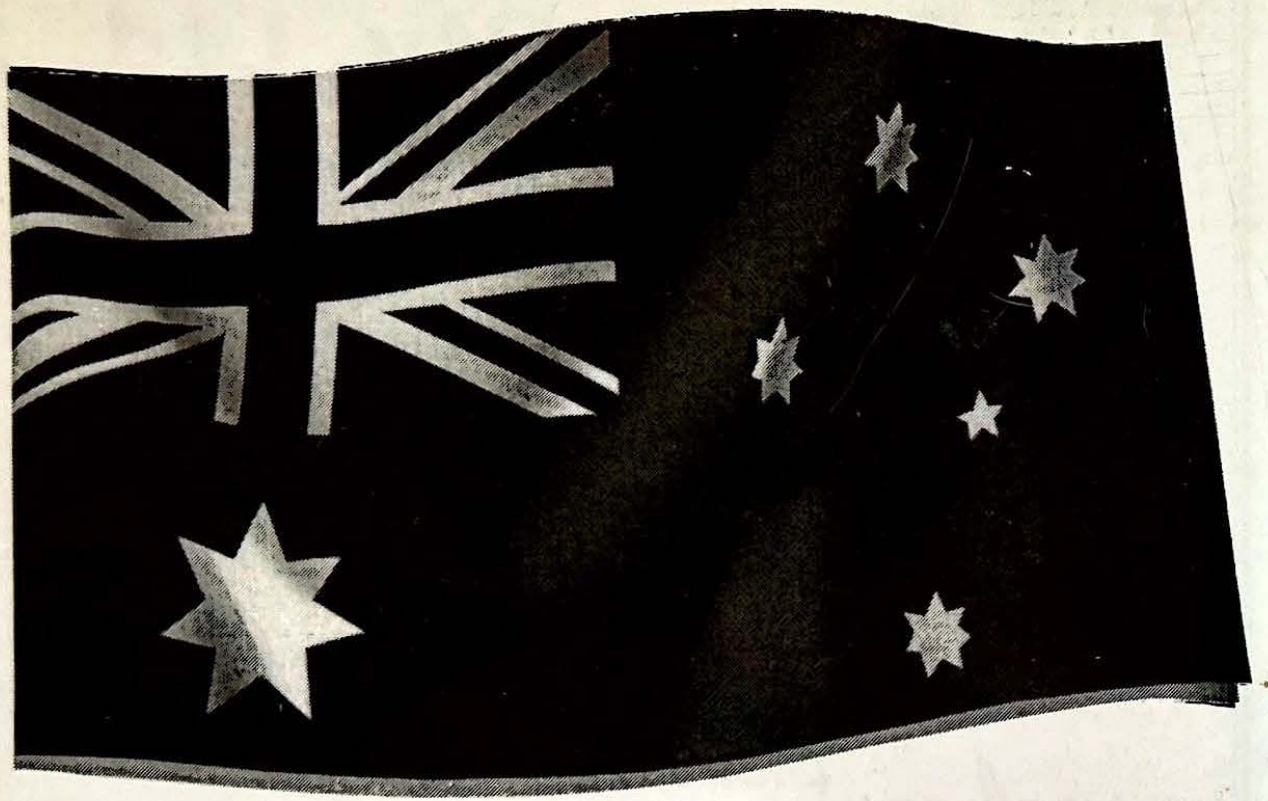
