

It is with deep sadness we learnt during the last twelve months of the deaths of two of our great members. Both were pioneers of the Club and their devotion to lifesaving and community affairs is greatly appreciated by both the members of the Club and the community generally.

JOHN BURGESS

John Burgess joined Terrigal Surf Club in 1939 and gained his Bronze Medallion the same year. It was the Club's intention to present John with his 50 Year Service Medallion at the Club's Seventieth Anniversary Celebrations later this year. An outstanding swimmer, John was the Branch Belt Champion from 1949 until 1952 and bronze medal winner at the State Titles in 1950. He was a member of the Club's crack R & R team from 1940 until 1955 and a member of the State Team in 1950. For many Years John involved himself in the management of the



Club. He was Treasurer for four years -1958, 59, 66 and 1967; Secretary for three years - 1955, 57 and 1958; President for three years 1964, 65, and 1966. In 1951 for his continued contribution to lifesaving, John was made a life member.

While on active service during Word War 11 John was involved in setting up a Surf Club at Torokina Beach, Bougainvillea on the Solomon Islands. Before the establishment of the Club, 88 allied servicemen lost their lives through drowning. During the first eight months following the establishment of the Club, the members performed 288 rescues.

John's wife, Joyce, was also very involved with the Club and during the war was one of the members of the auxiliary who took over the life saving duties of the Club. Her photo is also hanging in a place of pride in the Club. Our deepest sympathy is extended to Joyce and the family for their sad loss.

ROY DIBBEN

Roy joined the Club in 1935 and was a member of the Club's R & R team until 1940. He was deeply involved in the Club's administration, being the Club's Secretary over a period of seven years, 1948, 1950 through to 1956. For over ten years he was the official announcer at Branch Carnivals. Roy was heavily involved in organising the Club's highly successful Fiftieth Anniversary. His outstanding service was recognised by his elevation to Life membership. In the 1930's the Dibben name was synonymous with the Terrigal Club. Names like Fred, Hal, Gale, Alec, Ron,



Roy and Leo Dibben were all at some time members of the Club. On the 8th March, 1939 Roy was involved in an attempted rescue off the rocks at the Haven. For this, together with Frank Payne, Athol MacDonald, Ron and Alec Dibben, the Club was awarded the Royal Shipwreck relief and Humane Society's Certificate for Bravery.

In 1940 Roy enlisted in the A.I.F. and served in the Middle East, NewGuinea, New Britain and Dutch New Guinea. He was mentioned in dispatches after the Syrian campaign. Roy was best known as a journalist on the Central Coast, commencing work as a cadet with the Gosford Times. He established the Gosford Star which later merged with the Central Coast Express.

Roy is survived by wife Viv, daughters Val and Kay, son Patrick. To them we extend our deepest sympathy.

GARY LAMBERT

In tragic circumstances Gary Lambert (age 34) was drowned off Terrigal Beach on 4th March, 1995 while coaching young competitors for the State Titles. Gary was a member of the Wamberal Club. He was not always a member of that Club, but commenced his service in Lifesaving as a Terrigal "Nipper" when he was about the age of Four. He is remembered during these early years as a likeable larrikin, full of cheek, but never hurtful. He was always in mischief, the only nipper ever to be brought before the



Management Committee of the Club. Even in these early years he was a competitor - particularly on the board, he displayed enormous potential. In his last year as a 13 year old nipper he won the surf board for "Competitor of the Year".

When he entered the senior ranks Gary decided it was time to move out from the shadow of his father, Gordon. Gordon was President of Terrigal, State and Australian Ski Champion and Captain of the Country Touring Team. Gary transferred to the Wamberal Club where he remained, except for the year 1978 when he returned to Terrigal for twelve months as a tribute to the memory of his father who, that year, also died in tragic circumstances.

Gary was an outstanding competitor, picking up medals at Branch, State and National levels. As he got older he devoted all his spare time to coaching young competitors - he had a gift, to impart knowledge but at the same time making training fun. He was idolised. Over the past few years, under Gary's guidance and coaching, his Club and Branch Teams experienced enormous success. He was never selfish - no matter what Club a young competitor came from, Gary would go out of his way to help.


His loss is deeply felt by the community and to all in Lifesaving who knew him.




Medals came their way in the branch championships but eluded our crews at both State and Australian this season.

BOARD AND SKI CAPTAINS REPORT


