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CHIEF INSTRUCTOR'S REPORT


Another season has come and gone with no loss of life on the Coast's beaches, all due to the Club's patrols.




BOARD AND SKI CAPTAIN'S REPORT



JUNIOR CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Time again for another Annual report, meaning the end of another season, but the work behind the scenes never stops. Again the year was a hectic but rewarding one. We trialled the new format for club days to create more time for training and development of the children and the feedback we received was that it was successful especially for the younger ages, but we are considering a variation next season to adapt to the older competitive age groups. Input from both children and parents is welcomed on this.

Our numbers once again were good with the Under 6 & 7 years group at 54 and Under 8 to Under 14 at 165. The children again carried on Terrigal's success at carnivals with good numbers in attendance and keen involvement earning many medals and placing Terrigal 2nd overall in just about every local carnival.

Nick Vrolyk, Joel Mason and Sarah Hull gained selection in the Central Coast Interbranch team with Joel & Sarah performing impressively and Nick having been injured and unable to compete. At the State carnival we had 88 competitors with just under half this number reaching the finals. Congratulations to State medal winners Tim Packer, Stuart Mak, Adam Bird, Corey Nicholas, Leighton Packer and Gold medallist Sarah Hull. Also at State representing the Branch we had the Under 9, 10,11 and 14 Board Relay teams, the Senior Cameron Relay team and the All Age Relay team.

In the area of Age Awards last year from 165 members we gained only 61% of awards and committed an effort to improve this number. I am pleased to say we gained this season 141 Age Awards which represents 85%. Thanks to Peta Daly, Beris Meldrum, Kirk Newport and Lynne Miller for assistance in instructing and as this is the primary goal of Surf Lifesaving we will be giving it greater attention next season. We also had 12 members gain their Surf Life Saving Certificate and hope they will continue into the senior ranks and we wish them many years of involvement and enjoyment in the Club.

UNDER 6 & 7 MANAGERS REPORT



REPORT


The financial report has disclosed the Life Members Fund enjoys a credit balance of \$10,799.34.

The only income received, was by way of Interest, (\$633.88) an increase of \$61.61 on the \$572.27 received in the previous 12 months. The Fund contributed to the payment of the major jacket trophies on presentation night. This was \$420.00 for the jackets and \$50.00 for the John Burgess trophy.
