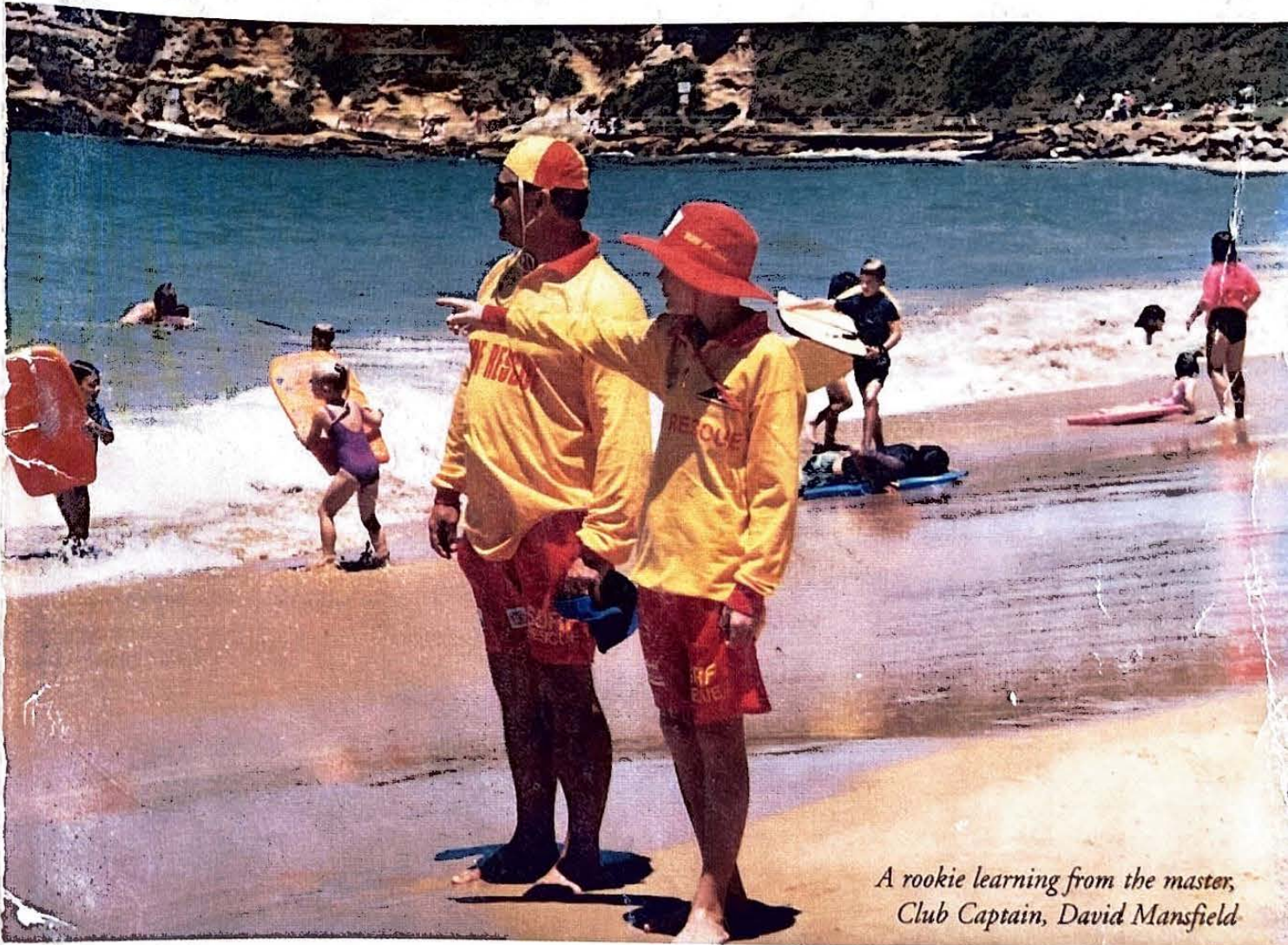

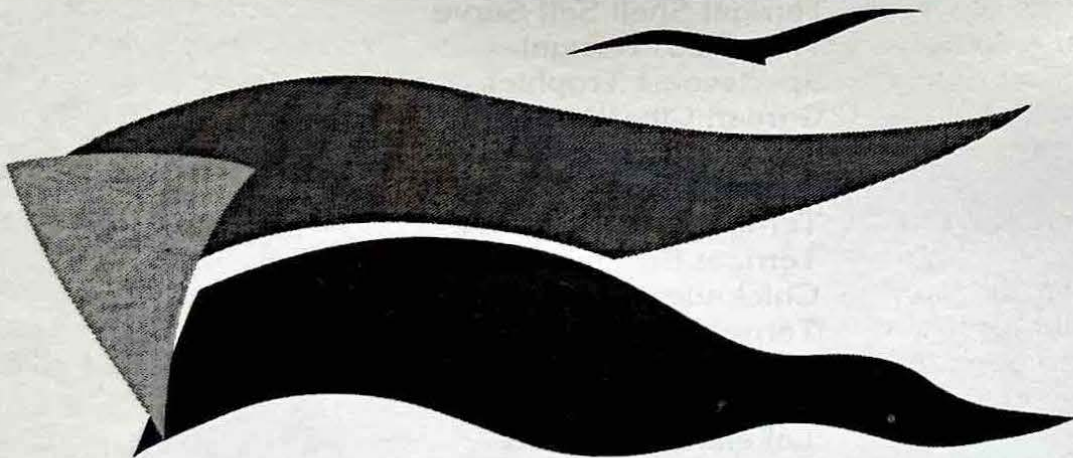

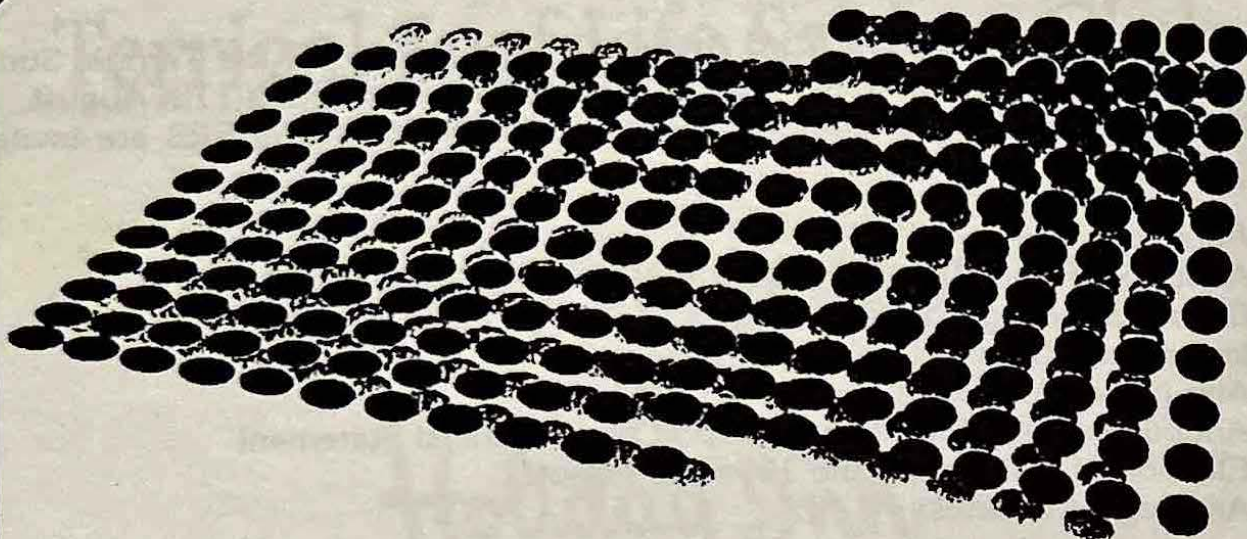
Persons standing for positions MUST BE FINANCIAL at the time of nomination.

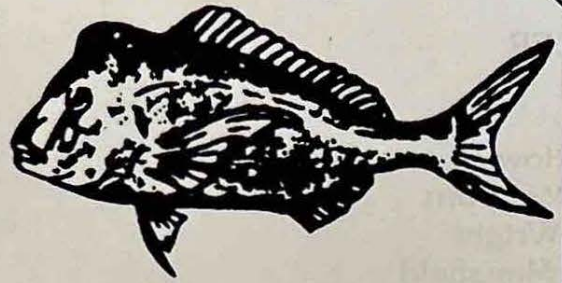

He joined the surf club in 1978 as a social member and took part in all the club's fund-raising activities. In appreciation of his dedication he was elevated to the position of Club Patron in 1982, a position held with great pride.

On Presentation Nigh for many years Norm awarded the trophy for Female Competitor of the Year. This award in the future will be known as the Norman A Galvin Memorial Trophy, in remembrance of Norm.

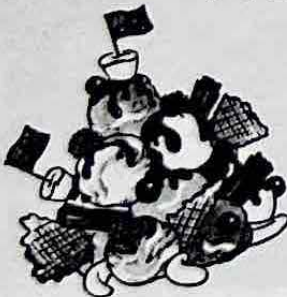

It is with pleasure that I present the 73rd Annual Report and Financial Statement for 1995-96 to the members of Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated.

The season began with the drafting of our Business Plan from the ideas expressed at the Open Forum in July. This Business Plan sets down our Aims and Objectives for the Club and ways of achieving these. With 6 monthly revision this Plan will see us through the next few years.

Thanks must go to the Terrigal Swimming Pool Committee who this year wound up their fundraising after many years of trying to get a swimming pool in Terrigal. They distributed most of their funds to the Surf Clubs in our area, Terrigal receiving \$30,000.

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## CHIEF INSTRUCTOR'S REPORT

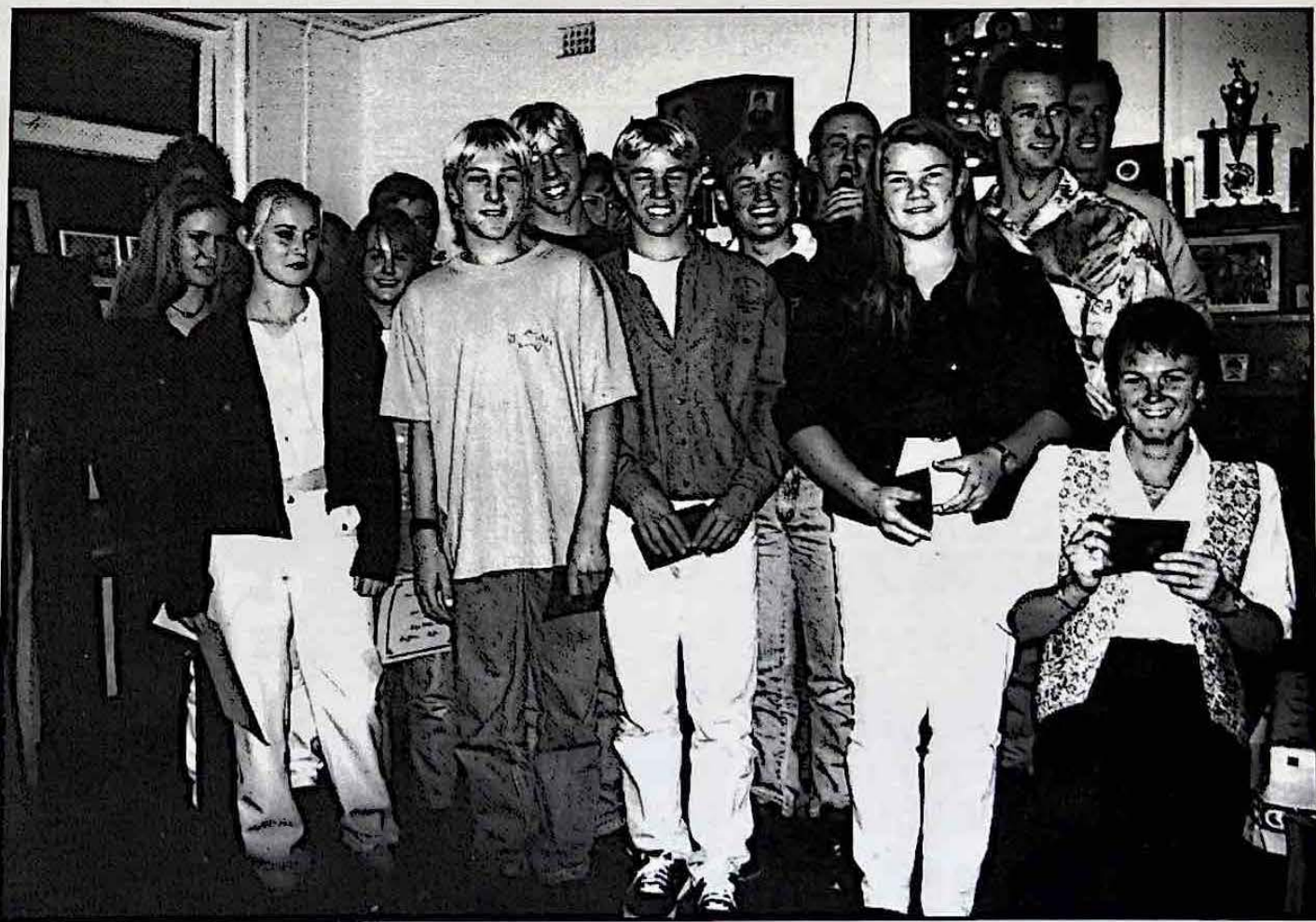
Another season has come and gone with no loss of life on the Coast's beaches, all due to the Club's patrols.

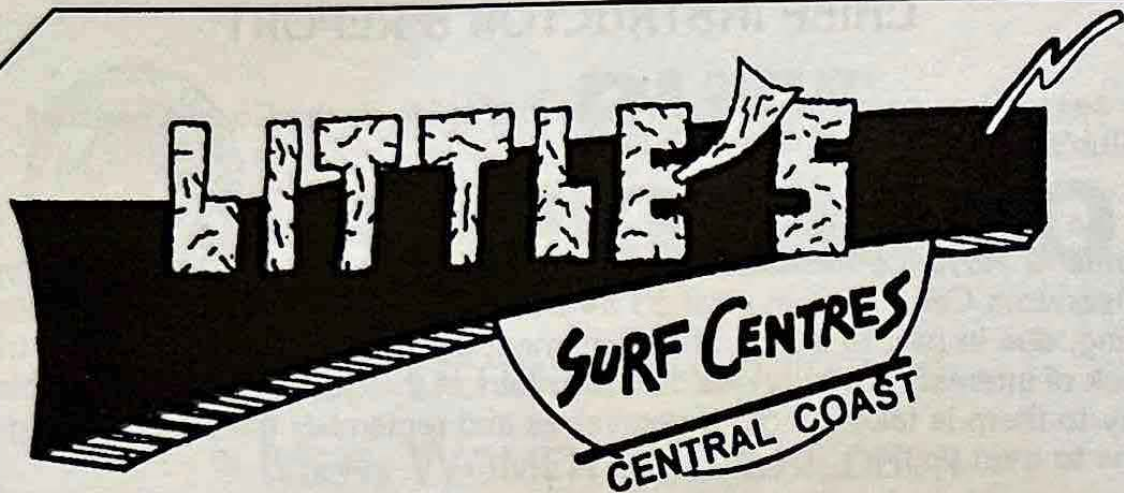

I would also like to thank the ladies from the craft group. Lorna, Pat, Maureen, Elizabeth, Sue and Dianne for all of the time and effort they put in during the year raising money for the surf club. This year the ladies donated a fibreglass spine board and a Laerdal infant resuscitator to the club. These items would not have been available without the efforts of these ladies.

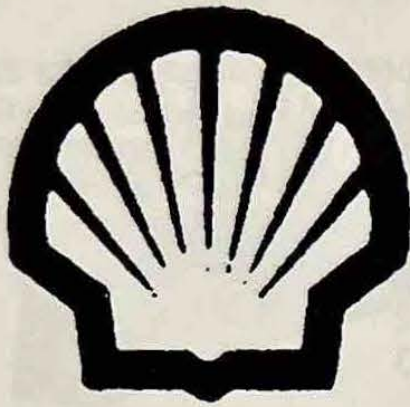
The club is also grateful to the doctors of the Terrigal Medical Centre who treat a lot of our casualties without waiting and also vaccinating our members against hepatitis B.

## BOARD AND SKI CAPTAIN'S REPORT

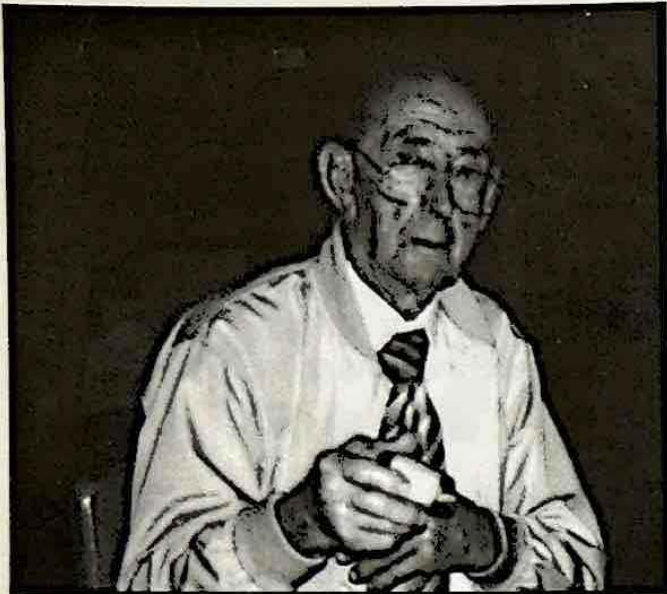

Once again a successful year for Terrigal with the best result being second placing at the Branch Championships. A great team effort with good attendance across all age groups to gain this result.

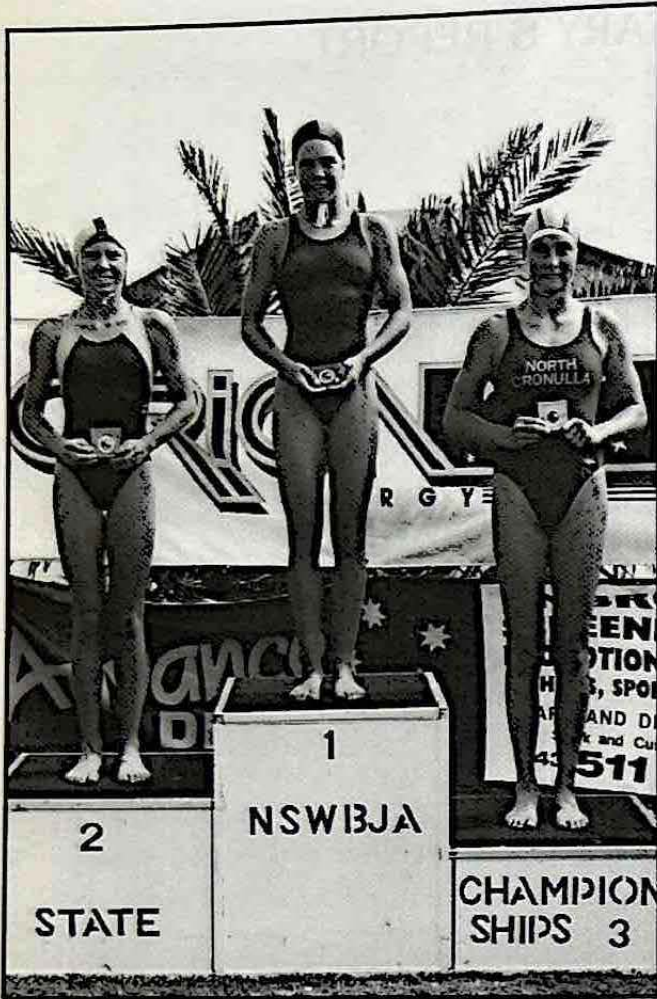

Tim Packer - Silver U8 Wade

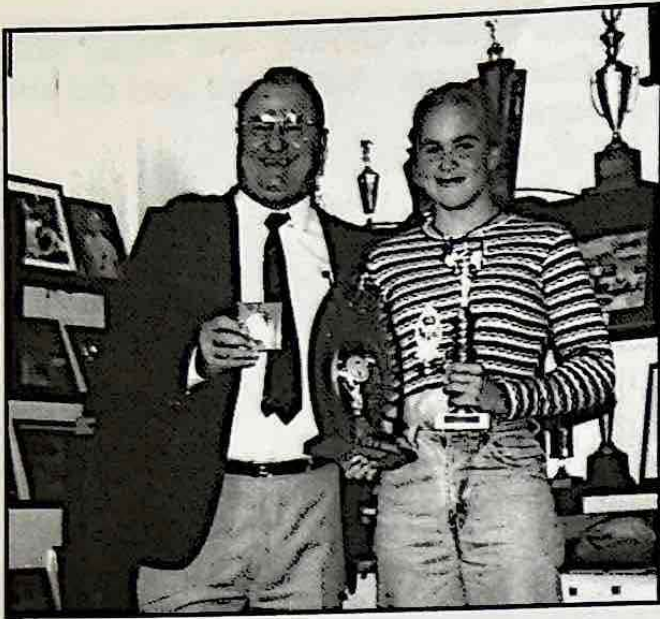

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

- A. Accruals Basis -  
The financial statements have been prepared under the accrual basis of accounting.
- B. Revenue and Expense Recognition -  
The Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club is a non-profit organisation and receives most of its income from donations and specific fund raising events. Amounts by their nature can only be recognised when they are recorded in the books of the club.
- C. Plant & Equipment/Depreciation  
Plant and Equipment are recorded at cost and are depreciated over their estimated useful lives using the reducing balance method.

## MAJOR DONORS

## REPORT

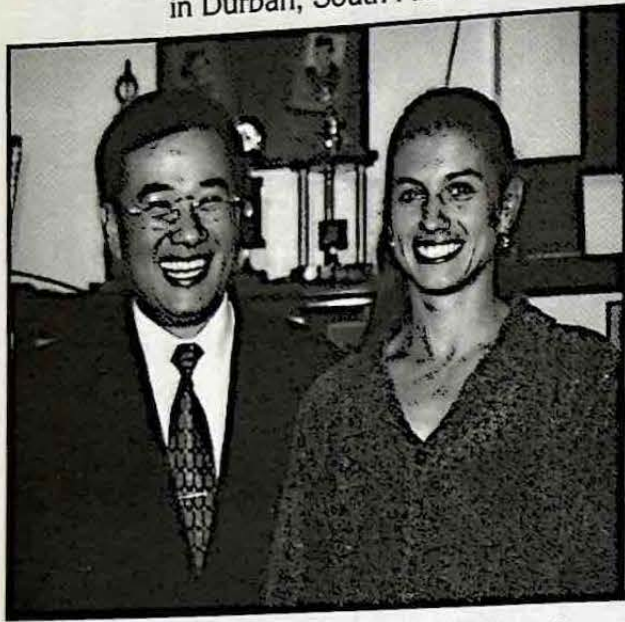
The financial report has disclosed the Life Members Fund enjoys a credit balance of \$10,799.34.

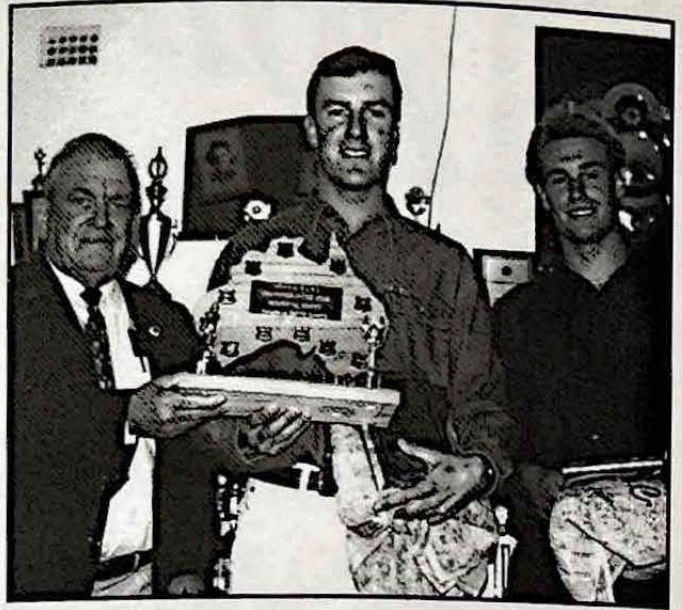
