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



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CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The 1996-97 season started with new expectations due to the appointment of three new Patrol Captains taking up the vacant positions left by parting captains, James Langton, Paul Stone and Scott Hawkins. On behalf of the club, I thank them for their dedication to patrolling over the past years. The new season saw a new approach to the captaincy role, with a focus on professionalism and rescue co-ordination, through the conducting of the Patrol Captain's Course, a Surf Life Saving Australia endorsed course, which was held over two nights at the Holiday Inn. This course resulted in the Captains gaining a higher understanding of their rescue role as a co-ordinator through lectures by the emergency services. The successful participants received a certificate as acknowledgment that they had completed the course. These people were:

This course will be extended over the next couple of years, where the Patrol Vice Captains will do the course. These courses will then be opened to the rest of the club and will be a prerequisite for obtaining the positions of Patrol Captain and Patrol Vice Captain.

The club has experienced a busy season on Terrigal Beach, with patrol members being observant and dedicated to their duties. This has once again resulted in no lives being lost in the Terrigal Patrol Area. Rescues for the season also increased from the previous season, with preventative actions taking a dramatic jump, showing that the patrol members were alert whilst conducting patrols and preventing problems before they became rescues. Of particular note this season is the amount of 'out of hours' rescues conducted during the season. The club had one IRB rescue prior to patrol hours and two after hours. The latter was a sea search and rescue on dusk. The statistics for the season at Terrigal Beach were:

From our rookies comes the Westfield Rookie of the Year.

The Clubs recipient of this award this season is Michael McBain. As a member of Patrol 10 this season, Michael has approached his patrolling duties with a high degree of professionalism for his age, whilst assisting Terrigal Surf If Saving Club, at club and branch level, which far exceeds his normal commitment. Congratulations to Michael as it was well deserved.

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

The Club's Rookie of the Year is Ben Gibbons. Ben transferred to the Club this year with his family and his commitment to Surf Life Saving was evident on his very first weekend of patrolling duties. Throughout the season he has amassed 132.75 patrolling hours, a fantastic effort. Well done Ben.

PATROLPERSON OF THE YEAR

As I am a nominee for this award, I have not been privy to the result. I have been nominated with other excellent patrolling members. It is a privilege just being nominated and congratulations to the winner on Presentation Night.

CLUBPERSON OF THE YEAR

This award went to Paul Quick. Paul has provided the club with his undivided attention throughout the year. including Chairman of the Junior Activities Committee, Club Vice President, Judiciary Committee Chairman. On top of this he has competed within and for the club, including becoming a state finalist for Life Saver of the Year. Paul has also organized a number of working bees at the club that has made the club house more workable. Congratulations on your award as it was well deserved.

HERO OF THE SURF AWARD

This award is to recognise the efforts of patrol members for an outstanding rescue effort for the season. There were a large number of nominations throughout the season with some very commendable rescues conducted.

The recipient of the award this year is David Mansfield. The day commenced with David Mansfield beginning training for his Bronze Squad. He then responded to render first aid to an elderly lady that had collapsed due to the heat, losing consciousness on the grassed area near the club. First aid was successfully administered with his squad looking on in quiet amazement. David then went on with the Bronze Training thinking that all was back to normal at Terrigal. However, whilst overseeing the bronze board and tube rescues, he saw two persons in difficulty in a rip near where he was training. This was outside the patrol area. He then had to take a rescue board off one of his students and conduct a rescue on the two persons caught in this rip.

After reaching them, he calmed them down and the first person was taken to shore with the assistance of another club member. David then attempted to bring the second person in on the board, however every time David started to paddle, this person panicked and continually jumped off the board and at one stage pulled David underwater. David used the patient releases he had only recently taught his pupils to escape injury and the patient was eventually placed back onto the board. Assistance was called for from the IRB and the person taken to shore. A great effort David.



Three days of rowing on the Barwon River in the heat, mud, flies and dealing with drunks. Overall, Terrigal finished fourth in the point score but had their day on the Saturday winning that leg. Unfortunately, broken gear took its toll on the finals day. The journey home coincided with the club attending the running of the Coonamble Gold Cup. A truly unique and major Australian bush racing event. The Terrigal Team represented the club with great distinction, with the girls appearing on national Sky television. A Boat Rowers punting syndicate was formed much to the delight of the local country book makers and at the end of the day several Terrigal rowers were seen leaving the course without their shirts.



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The Peter's Surf Boat Series was once again a feature of the rowing season. All crews competed strongly throughout the series with the U21s - Edmund Thompson, Ben Newport, Ryan Dallas and Adrian Thompson - finishing equal winners of their division. The ladies finished 3rd, the Reserve Grade 3rd and the U21 Blue Crew 3rd.

Kirk Newport established a junior crew during the 1996/7 seasons of David Rolph, Shamus Thompson, Brian Goldsmith and Luke Petley. The crew's best results were making the semi-finals at Manly, 3rd at the Branch Championships and quarter finalists at the State Titles. Not a bad effort for a first year crew.

On the Veteran's scene, Terrigal again competed strongly. Seasoned rowers - Peter Harris, Paul Quick, Kim Petley, Ellen Gray, Col Higman teamed with a variety of newcomers - Bob Morrison, John Giffney, Peter Ives and of course "the old sea dog himself" Club President, John Howick. The crew's results at the Branch Masters were 140 years Bronze, 160 years Gold, 180 years Silver.




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JUNIOR WATER SAFETY OFFICER'S REPORT

The revised point score system used in 1996-97 was a success. It encouraged participation and training for the younger ages plus the incentives of a handicap competition for the under 11 through to under 14 age groups. We seem to have the correct balance.

Thank you to our age managers, those who helped on the beach, the water safety teams, carnival officials and those who helped at the Blue Light Disco, BBQs and the other activities of the Club.

However, in particular, thanks to Bob Bowman for undertaking the task of training our nippers for their age awards. Your efforts resulted in a record number of children passing their awards.

We are again fortunate to have received the continuing support of our sponsors and in particular Verna and Barry Dinnar of Terrigal Beach Thrift Chemist who sponsored our State Touring Team plus the Iron Person Championship. Without your help we would not be able to provide the training and activities for our nippers.

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This will be my last report as Secretary of the Junior Activities Committee as I will not be seeking re-election for 1997-98. I would therefore encourage all parents to continue to take an active role in the running of the club as it will only continue to prosper if supported with new ideas and enthusiasm.

Finally, thank you to the club executive for the support given to the nippers throughout the year. In particular we must thank Junior Chairman, Paul Quick for his leadership and hours of effort in ensuring that 1996-97 was a successful season.


