Persons standing for the positions **MUST BE FINANCIAL** at the time of nomination.

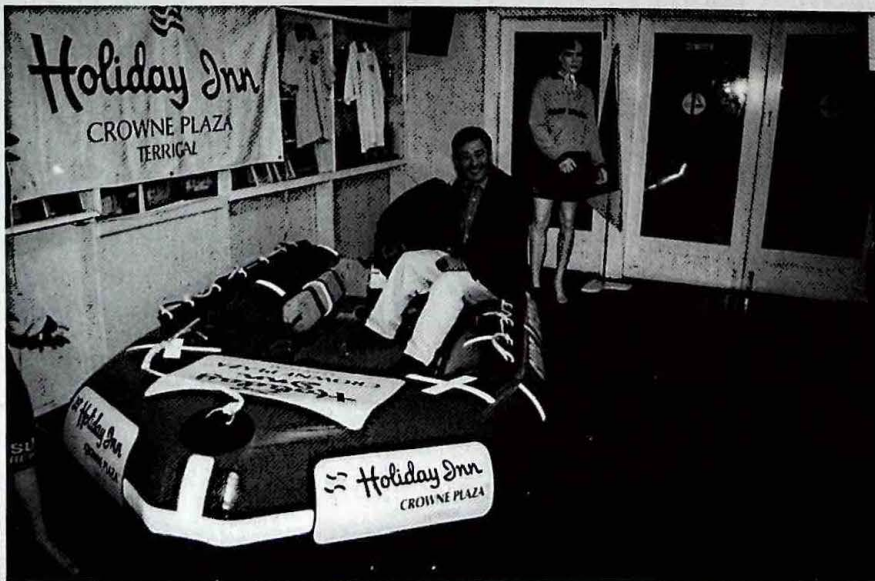

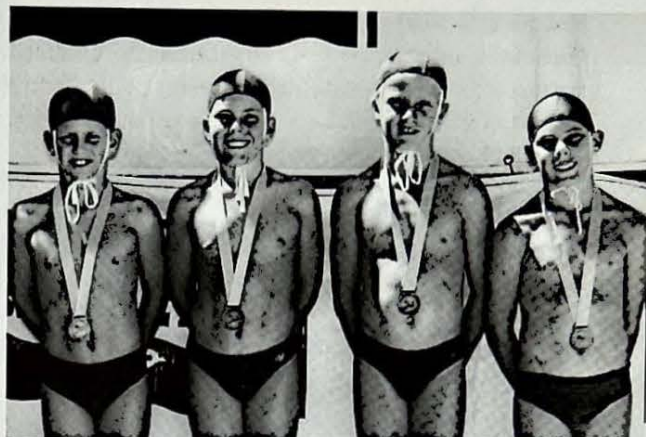
