Most patrol members will know the constant supply of 'Stingoes' that was needed to treat the huge numbers of marine stings that occurred this season. All the medical supplies of the First Aid Room come from Terrigal Beach Thrift Chemist.

The club is also grateful to Planit Kitchens, Terry

Conroy who supplied new cupboards and benches and Tony Shakespeare for fitting the same. All members will agree that we now have a First Aid Room that we can be proud to deliver first aid in.

I would like to thank Carmen Blinds, Ian Triplett for the privacy blind and to Joe Mak and David Mansfield for painting and maintenance associated with the fit out.

Thanks to Dr Keith Evershed (Hon Medical Officer of Terrigal SLSC) of the Terrigal Medical Centre for his continued support of the Hepatitis B preventative program and for the care and attention shown to patients sent from the surf club to the Medical Centre staff and doctors.

I would like to emphasise to all that the First Aid Room is a clinical treatment room and should be respected as such. I hope that in the forthcoming season we can add to the First Aid Room another much needed Oxy Viva and detachable spinal board.



area and we hope to revitalise Terrigal's strenght in this area next season.






