

I am a proud member of Terrigal SLSC and will continue to be for the rest of my life and a lot of this has come from my association with the all members, but more particularly the patrolling members of Terrigal SLSC.

We have had a long season this year due to the Olympics, and although there was no where near the expected crowds or visitors at Terrigal, it was something that was required to happen. Following is our rescue statistics for the past season. I encourage you to read through them and reflect on the rescues and first aid cases we have done over the last season and we will all appreciate how important it is for us to patrol Terrigal Beach.

### IRB CAPTAIN'S REPORT





Terrigal lined up for four hotly contested finals with a spot in the A Grade 'Champion of Champions' final, a highlight. ### COMPETITION SECRETARY'S REPORT


