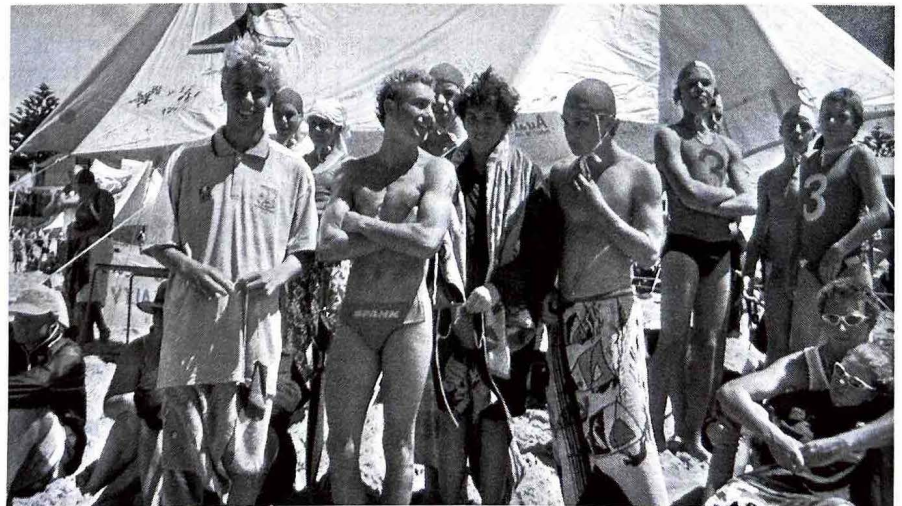

IRB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

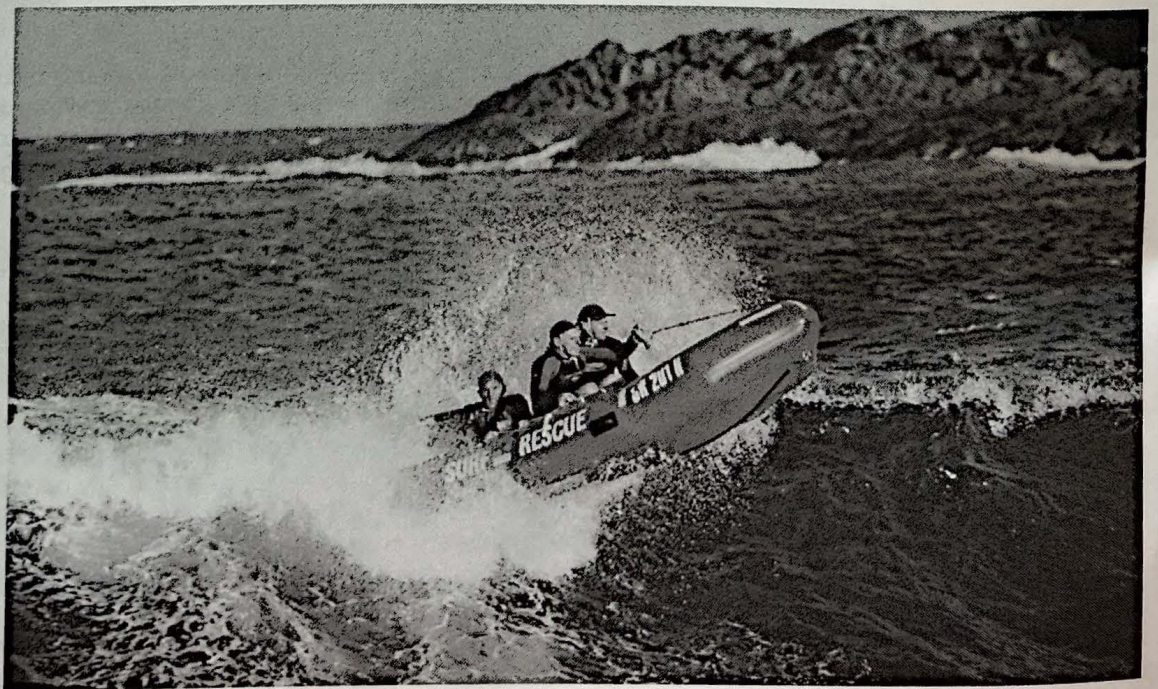

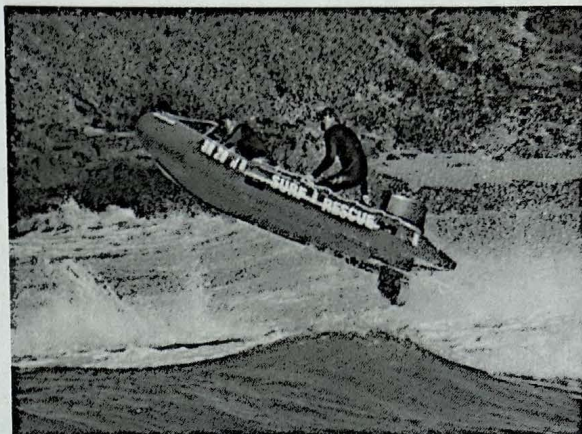

A good performance here is a good indicator of just how competitive your team will be. Kiama always offers a test with its surf conditions and this year was again a challenge with



no room for the faint of heart. In top company Terrigal again proved that it can give many of these top clubs a real run for their money. Terrigal lined up for four hotly contested finals with a spot in the A Grade 'Champion of Champions' final, a highlight. Run over three heats, this prestigious event contained four of the line up for the rescue final at last year's Australian Titles. Terrigal's tilt at the title was in disarray after the first heat. A 'freaky' Kiama wave taking its toll – a broken leg for the crewman and swamped driver wiping out heat one. The second heat saw Terrigal recover to finish seventh with a tremendous third place in the final race. Hank Blewitt again thrilled the big crowd on hand with some fearless solo driving in the teams event. A huge leap from a 4-5 footer on the way back in earned Hank the new nickname of 'Freefall' (and a long stint in the First Aid Room!)

The Branch Titles, contested at Terrigal, saw the team finish third overall. Again, a great effort reflecting the competitiveness of the team. Two gold medals, three silver and three bronze, a good haul for the day! The Syd Summons carnival at Ocean Beach provided a final hit-out for clubs a week prior to the State Titles. A good day for Terrigal with a second place overall, just two points behind Soldiers!

It was from there to South West Rocks for the State Championships. A sensational setting, South West Rocks was overwhelmed by orange boats and roaring motors for three days of intense racing. 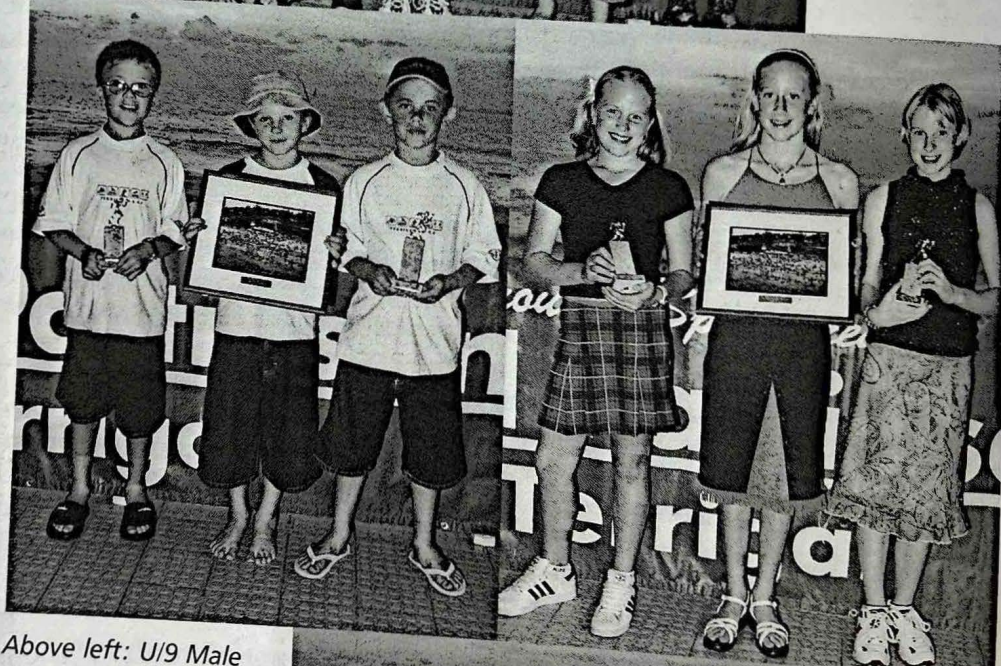

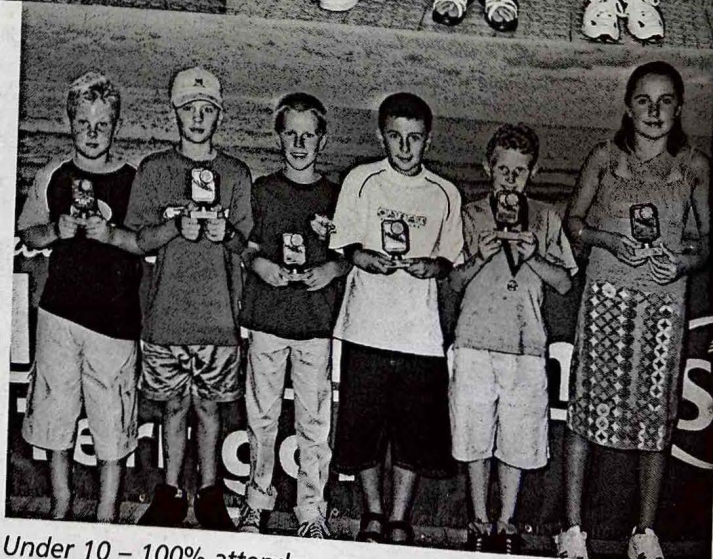


Left: U/8 - 100% attendance



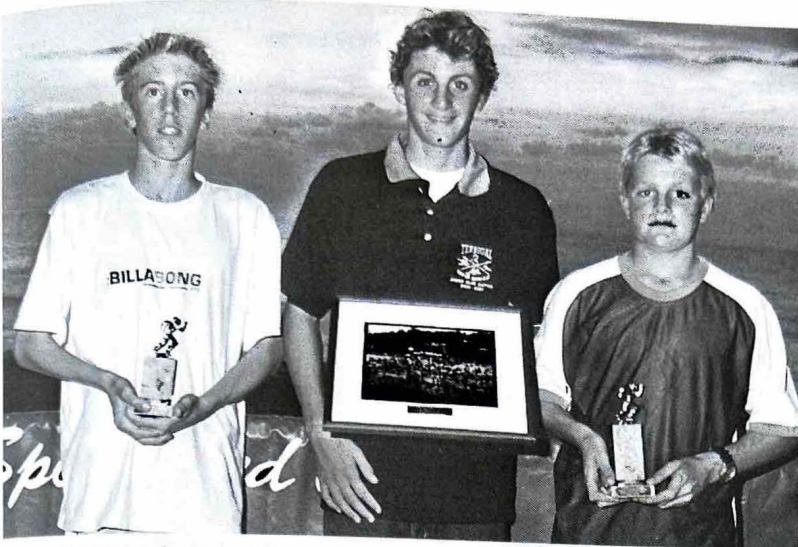
Above left: U/9 Male Age Champions, L-R; 3rd: Nick Powell, 1st: Jay Coster, 2nd: Nathan Clarke.

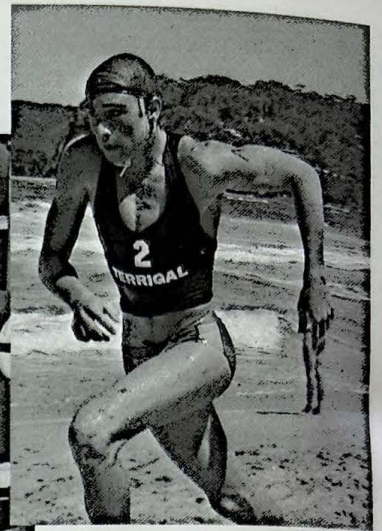

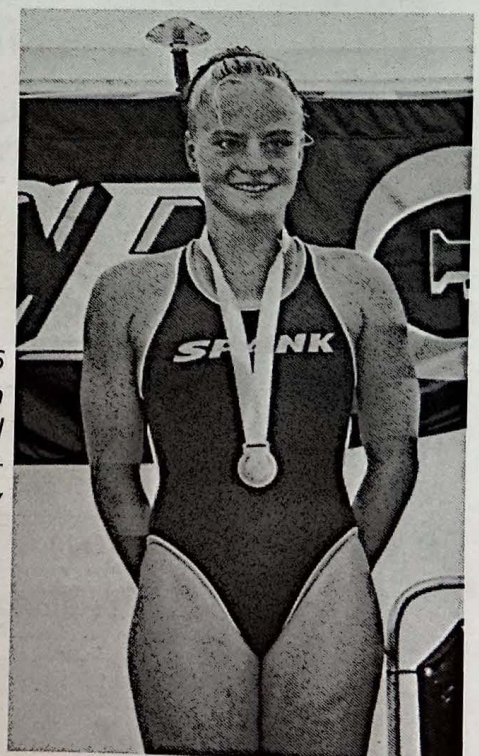
