

Wayne Packer – Water Safety Officer and Branch Water Safety Co-ordinator and always willing to help when needed.



NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 – ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AAS3 Accounting for Income Tax

AAS5 Materiality

AAS8 Events Occurring After Reporting Date

AAS17 Accounting for Leases

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

1. Accruals Basis

The Financial Statements have been prepared under the accruals basis of accounting.

2. Revenue and Expense Recognition

The TERRIGAL SURF LIFESAVING CLUB INC. is a non-profit organisation and receives most of its income from donations and specific fundraising events. Amounts by their nature can only be recognised when they are recorded in the books of the Club.

3. Plant & Equipment Depreciation

Plant and equipment are recorded at cost and are depreciated over their estimated useful lives using the reducing balance method.

Plant and equipment which has an estimated useful life of one year or less have been expensed at purchase and are shown as gear purchases in the Club's profit and loss account.

4. GST Units

Under the provisions of GST legislation relating to non-profit bodies, the Club has established independent accounting units for its separate functions with differing GST treatments.

The accounts of each of these independent units have been amalgamated in the preparation of the Club's accounts.

5. Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax and accordingly no liability is recorded.

6. Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the Club, are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Leased assets are amortised on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives where it is Tikely that the Club will obtain

ownership of the asset or over the term of the lease. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the period in which they are incurred.
