BACKGROUND

In the 2003-04 season the Management Committee have conducted a trial of a departmental style Management committee.

For a while now, the existing management structure of the club has been seen as unwieldy, and inefficient, with overlong meetings not achieving decisive results, and not always communicating effectively. The State and Branch structures now have moved to a more departmental style of operation, whereby the departments had their own internal meetings, and the actual management meeting consisted of department heads, or as an executive committee style.

The trial consisted of using the elected office bearers and organising them into 7 Departments with the "Directors as below:

President
Treasurer (Finance Department)
Club Captain (Lifesaving Department)
Chief Instructor (Membership & Training Department)
Junior Activities Chairperson (Youth Activities Department)
Secretary (Administration Department)

The office bearers and the relevant sections of the Club were organised into these Departments. Each department has meetings monthly prior to each Management meeting. The management meeting normally consists only of the Directors (although this can vary depending upon the circumstances). The conclusion of the trial was that this style of Management should be adopted for future seasons. In order to operate in this manner, the Club Constitution must be amended accordingly.

The Motion is "that the revised constitution be passed and adopted as the working constitution of the Terrigal Surf Lifesaving Club." The relevant sections are detailed below:

Any Financial member may stand for election to any position on the Management Committee with the exception of; Club Captain, Vice Captain, Boat Captain, IRB Captain, Chief Instructor, Board & Ski Captain, Gear Steward, Active Members Representative (2 positions) & Junior Activities

Water Safety Officer, who shall be elected from the Active members only. To be eligible to nominate for the positions of Club Captain & IRB Captain a member must hold the Association's IRB Drivers Award. To be eligible to nominate for the position of Chief Instructor a member must hold the Association's Instructors Award. To be eligible to nominate for position of Radio Officer a member must hold the Association's Radio Operators Award. ***Note that should the changes to the club constitution be passed in the prior Special General Meeting, some of the positions will be changed. See these attached details, and the nominations call.***

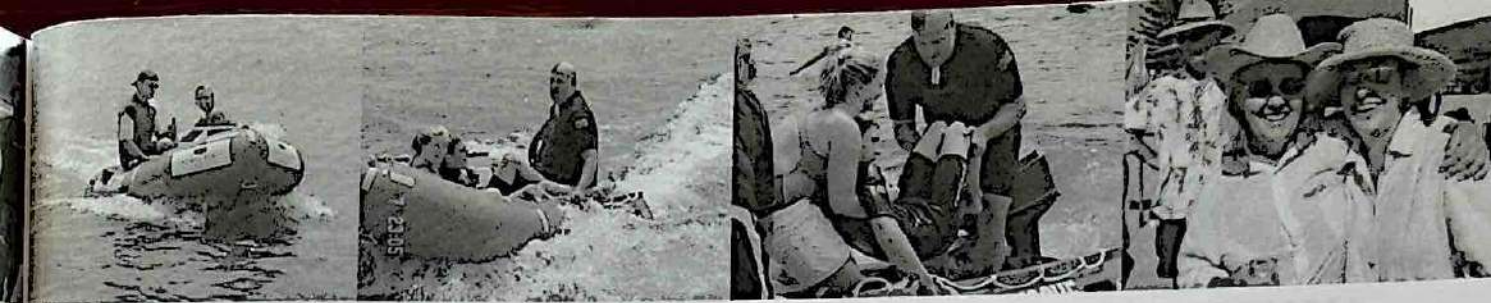

LIFESAVING DIRECTOR'S REPORT

I have pleasure in submitting the club captain's report for Terrigal SLSC 2003/04 patrol season.

The club started the season under very difficult conditions with an after hours search for a missing windsurfer that involved club members, IRB's, police and ambulance services. Fortunately this did prove to be a false alarm and all was well.

Tragically a young child drowned in the Terrigal lagoon and many of our members were involved in the search for this child. Members from Rookies, to active members, to long service members worked alongside police and emergency service members in a most professional manner in carrying out their duties. I believe, from this tragedy a keener sense of efficiency, strength and awareness of our role as "surf life savers" emerged amongst our members and set the high standard with which Terrigal SLSC carried out its patrol duties this season. I truly respect those members for their effort over that trying period.

Once again we have gained many new awards with large numbers of bronze medallions, SRC, radio operators and IRB members going through under the guidance of our chief instructor and trainers. A job well done. Surf life saving is expanding the skills members can gain and use not only in surf life saving but in their work place as well with the introduction of VETAB approved courses that are recognised in those areas. Along with joint share of council equipment we now have quad bike usage to expand our patrol area to cover up to Wamberal and a quicker response time. Defibrillator, first aid courses and jet ski

roles are all extra qualifications our members can upskill to.

This season we have close to 230 patrolling members whilst introducing 3 new patrols and 6 new patrol captains. We had a 50% increase in members achieving their 100% patrol proficiency at 86 members (over 33% of members) and a further 36 members doing 90% proficiency. This indicates the change in our movement and the need for our large presence to service the beach going community. To continue our standards we call on members to come forward for next season to become instructors, trainers and examiners in Terrigal, which is very rewarding. Also a need for 2 active members representatives from patrol members are required to further the relationship between our members and the committee for future seasons. The season has truly been one of expansion and development.

Finally, whilst once again Terrigal SLSC club can proudly say "no lives were lost between the flags while our members were on duty" our service is further out reaching, going beyond these boundaries. VIGILANCE and SERVICE will always be the life saving motto, and we at Terrigal will strive to surpass this.

None of these awards are possible without the assistance of the Instructors at Terrigal. Thank you to Sue Packer, Beris Meldrum, Graham Baty (Radio component) and Dave Mansfield for Bronze Training, Greg Collins for IRB, Joanne Jameson for her work with the young SRC candidates and Beris for ARC instruction. Also this year we have seen a number of people volunteer to begin the training towards their Instructors Certification. Welcome to Justin McDonald(SRC), Chris Ward(IRB), Stephen Reid(SRC & Bronze), Claire Bunch(SRC), Amelia Cole(SRC & Bronze), and soon to be Lee Lang and Richard Bridge.

In the Youth area, to attempt to improve retention rates of members between Nippers and the senior club, a program called Terrigal Retention of Youth Scheme (TROYS) has been developed. It provides opportunities for young members to become more involved in the running of the club. Members aged 13 to 20 can become involved with and can eventually gain accreditation in Officiating, Instruction and Coaching. Also there are opportunities to help with Administration, Carnival set-up/assistance, Fundraising and Event Management and it is intended that participants will learn leadership skills that will in turn support the club in the future. At this point there are around 12 young people involved with the program with 4 young members having attained their Level 1 TROYS by fulfilling 25 hours of effort in at least 3 of the possible 7 areas. Congratulations to these 4 young people.

Around 30 members aged 13-20 are presently involved with the Duke of Edinburgh program at



Terrigal. One group has completed their Bronze award after participating in a practice and qualifying bush walk in Bouddi National Park. Most of them have used their Surf Patrols for their community service and then participated in a sport and a hobby/skill. This program is increasing in popularity and participation.

To allow the young members a voice and an ability to influence the decision making process at our club, we have developed a Youth Committee at Terrigal. There are around 20 young members aged 13 to 18 that regularly attend the meetings. They have elected a spokesperson and a secretary and the members of the committee are learning meeting procedures and how to develop and work through an agenda.


The Youth Committee offers manpower assistance to the club in various ways. They help to set up (and close down) carnivals, special nights at the club and provide support in many different ways. Their latest project is to organize a Mobile Blood Donation Drive at Terrigal SLSC, involve the wider community in this event and then challenge the other surf clubs on the coast to equal or better

the number of donations given. They want to show that Surf Lifesavers not only protect the beach going public but they actually give back to their community as well. Many thanks to Richard Bridge for his involvement as the Youth Development Officer for the club. His assistance and enthusiasm has been invaluable with all the youth initiatives.

Another aspect of Membership and Training is the position of Member Protection Officer. As part of this important aspect of the club, that allows all members to feel safe and equal within their club environment, a presentation was made to each age group of parents of our junior members. Darren Jameson did a great job of explaining the Member Protection Policy and how it affects and impacts on our young competitors and their parents. We also had a presentation at a management meeting in late 2003. The policy is available in several areas of the club for members to read. We aim to be proactive in educating our members on their responsibilities under our Member Protection Policy.

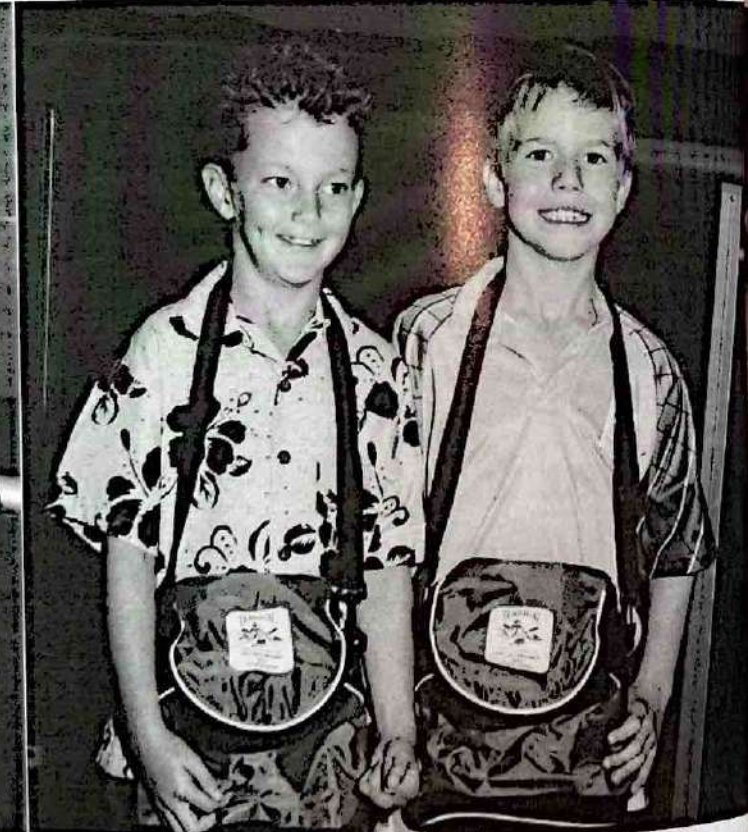


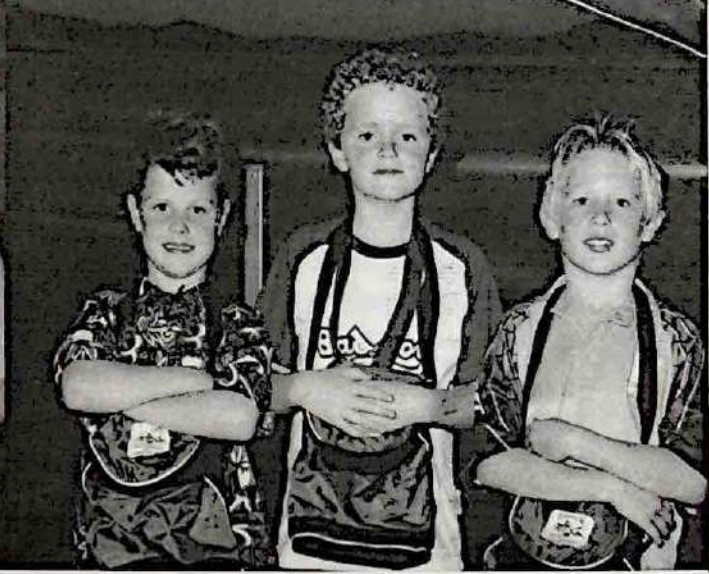

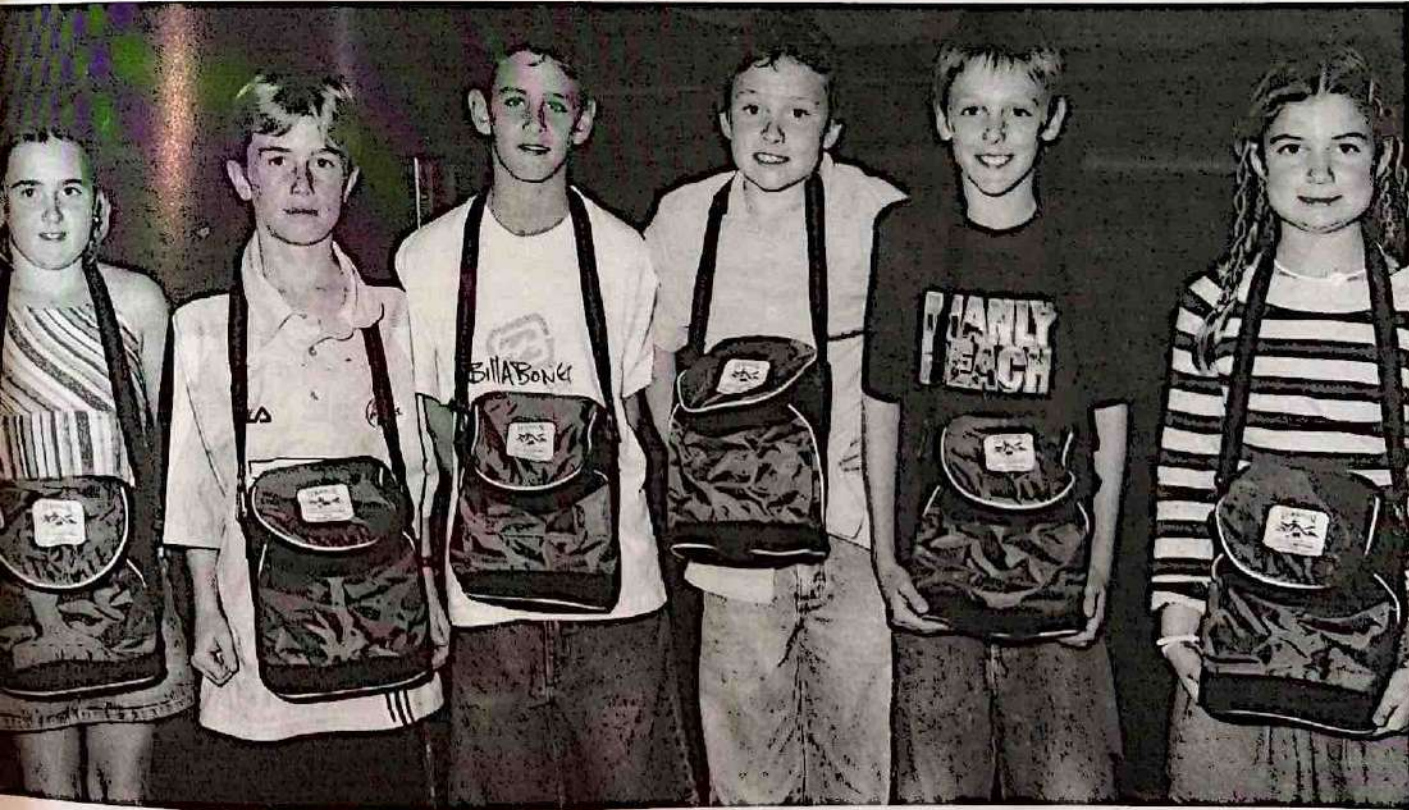

JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The Surf Lifesaving Mission Statement is that "Surf Life Saving Junior Activities will enrich the lives of children through fun, involvement and the acquisition of personal, lifesaving and competition skills in a safe aquatic environment". I can happily report that we have again achieved these objectives in the 2003/2004 season.

During the season we have continued with, and expanded on, some concepts that were introduced over the last few years as well as introducing some other activities. These include:

Skills Nippers mornings – John Giffney provided surf skills and training to the younger club members on Sunday mornings, teaching them such basic skills as wave catching, swimming out through the swell and board riding. The U/14s also came down and helped out by "buddying up" with those Nippers who were a little uncertain in the water. These activities were not only educational but were also fun as only "The Giff" can make them. The U/14s also provided assistance with water safety for the younger age groups which again helped to provide confidence for those Nippers who required it.

Twilight Nippers – this is a concept where we hold Nippers on a Saturday afternoon and then follow it up with some socialising. Unfortunately, because of some scheduling conflicts, we were only able to hold one twilight meeting this year instead of the two planned but the one held was a great success and we will be continuing with this concept next year.

Formal Coaching – this year we have been able to put together a formal coaching program under water coach, Paul Lemmon, and beach coach, Tony Clarke, providing skills training during the

week throughout the season. Together with their coaching teams, they have provided high quality coaching to our Nippers that is the envy of all other clubs on the Central Coast. Their efforts have resulted in improved surf skills throughout the junior club and some excellent results at the surf carnivals we have attended. Quite a number of parents have expressed interest in joining the coaching teams and next year we are planning to expand this coaching even further.

Surf Education – surf education is where Nippers are taught the less physical skills that are required by surf lifesavers. These include such things as identifying rips and dangerous swimming conditions, as well as performing Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR). Surf education has always been a requirement of the Nippers program but sometimes it has not been taught in an overly structured manner. This year our chief instructor, Cathy Cole, and her assistant, Joanne Jameson, have put together a very full and structured program that ensures that all Nippers gain the knowledge about the surf that they will require to be successful lifesavers.

Terrigal again put in for the first surf carnival of the year. Unfortunately, the date clashed with the new NSW Premiership Series and we were not able to reschedule it due to a clash of bookings for Terrigal Beach. The first carnival was eventually run on Wamberal Beach and turned out to be a very trying time for everyone. The carnival was eventually called off at 2:00pm due to high winds and lightning. Some of our top competitors were not able to compete in their favourite events due to the early end of the carnival and we came second behind Avoca. At the next carnival at Umina and the branch carnival at Avoca, we



again came second to Avoca but we were not far behind them and it augurs well for our chances next year as our competitors continue to improve under our coaching teams.

And then there was the State Carnival at Shellharbour. For those who were there, it will be a State Carnival not forgotten for many a year. After a summer without surf, the sea made up for it in one weekend. A big thank you to our carnival secretary, Sharon Hudson, who made sure that all the children were entered in the correct events and a thank you to all the parents who had to transport the children from beach to beach as the events were moved around. A very big thank you to John Bellato, our gear steward, who ensured that all the boards made it to the beaches they were needed at, and then finding them again at the end of the day. Again, a number of events had to be cancelled because of the conditions. Overall, Terrigal came seventh but we were only a few points behind the top clubs. Congratulations to all our competitors, especially our 50 finalists, who competed in especially trying situations. Special mention to our individual medallists, Donnica Clarke (2 gold) and Matt Hurst (1 gold). Especially pleasing was the performance of our teams which demonstrates the depth of talent we have in the club. The teams that medalled were U/10 swim team (gold), U/10 male board relay (gold), U/10 female board relay (silver), U/11 male board relay (silver), U/11 swim team (bronze), U/12 male board relay (gold), U/13 swim team (silver) and U/13 male board relay (bronze). We are looking forward to an even more successful State campaign next year when the State Titles will be held at Ocean Beach and Umina Beach.

This year there were new stringent requirements

placed on clubs with regard to providing officials and water safety personnel to help out at carnivals. The number of Terrigal competitors who attended the carnivals was significantly higher than in previous years. This was extremely encouraging to see but it meant that we had to provide a large number of officials and water safety. On behalf of the Nippers, I would like to say a big thank you to all the parents and older brothers and sisters who stepped up to the responsibility and provided the numbers we needed at the carnivals that allowed our Nippers to compete. I would also like to say thank you to those people who helped out on Sunday mornings. Without their efforts, Sundays would not have been possible. A special mention for Richard Hudson, our beach set-up coordinator, and his helpers, for ensuring that all the equipment was on the beach ready for the children and then getting it back in the club house at the end of the day. Especially pleasing was seeing the large numbers of older brothers and sisters (previous Nippers) who helped out at the carnivals and on Sundays. Their attitude bodes well for the future of the surf life saving movement.

Congratulations to our Interbranch competitors Maddie Powell, Donnica Clarke, Timothy Schofield and Luke Eltham. And especially to Donnica Clarke who went on to win two individual gold medals at the Nippers' equivalent of the Australia Championships.

A special thanks to Cathy Cole who again worked with the children to have a Terrigal R&R team. Hopefully next year, when we own a new R&R reel, we will have even more children competing.

Our young March Past team is developing nicely under the guidance of Sue Bennett and Debbie

Northey. For the first time in memory, Terrigal had two full March Past teams competing at the State Titles and both teams looked very professional.

A big thanks again to Bruce Moy and his merry bunch of helpers, with the U/6's and U/7s. We had over 80 young children in this group this year, and Bruce and his friends made sure that they were continually occupied and enjoying themselves. A task that I will gladly leave to someone else.

Thanks also to our barbecue coordinator, Richard Bridge, who ensured that the barbecue ran smoothly and provided much needed funds for the club.

Thank you to our Rookie Coordinator, Jenny Schofield, for looking after our rookies and ensuring they were allocated to a patrol and made it the other functions for the rookies. Our U/14's have performed well this year and have assisted with performing water safety for the younger age groups. I wish them well as they move into the senior club and I would encourage them to use the skills they have gained in the time they have been in Nippers to further the ideals of the surf lifesaving movement both in patrolling the beach and in competition. Thanks to our club captains Kerrin Hudson and James Polglase and to our club vice captains Jocelyne Pengilley and Nathan Higman. And congratulations to our Junior Lifesavers of the Year – Jocelyne Pengilley and Michael Bowman.

NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

- AAS3 Accounting for Income Tax
- AAS5 Materiality
- AAS8 Events Occurring After Reporting Date
- AAS17 Accounting for Leases

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Plant & Equipment Depreciation

Plant and equipment are recorded at cost and are depreciated over their estimated useful lives using the reducing balance method.

Plant and equipment which has an estimated useful life of one year or less have been expensed at purchase and are shown as gear purchases in the Club's profit and loss account.

(b) GST Units

Under the provisions of GST legislation relating to non-profit bodies, the Club has established independent accounting units for its separate functions with differing GST treatments.

The accounts of each of these independent units have been amalgamated in the preparation of the Club's accounts.

(c) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax and accordingly no liability is recorded.

(d) Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the Club, are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Leased assets are amortised on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives where it is likely that the Club will obtain ownership of the asset or over the term of the lease. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

The Club is covered for all public liability claims under the public liability policy established by the NSW Surf Lifesaving Association. Policies covering damage to or theft of property and workers compensation have also been taken out directly by the Club. Accordingly the Committee believes that its insurance coverage is adequate to cover contingencies in these instances.

c) Loan Commitments

Gosford City Council (Unsecured)

During the 2002 year the Club entered into arrangements with the Gosford City Council regarding the financing of the shortfall in the Council's budget for the fittings of the new clubhouse and for the installation of the clubhouse air conditioning system. In November 2002 these arrangements were finalised as an interest-free loan due to the Council of \$216,500.
