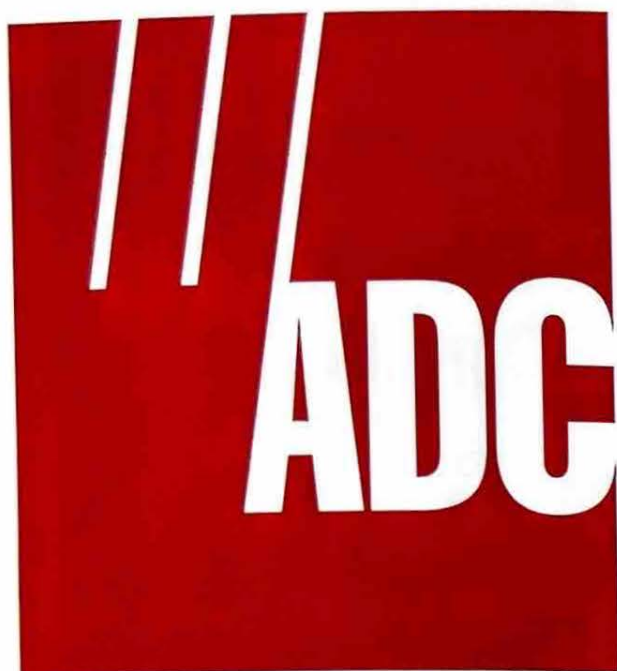

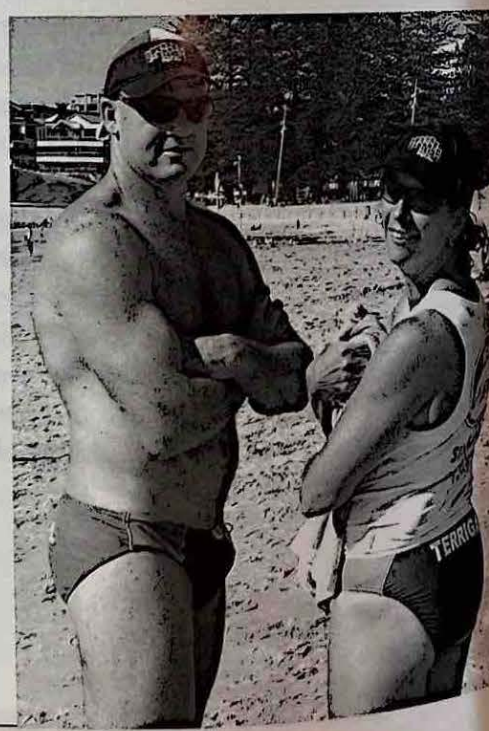

## LIFESAVING DIRECTOR'S REPORT

I have pleasure in submitting the club captain's report for Terrigal SLSC for 2004/05 patrol season.

This season the club had some 217 active bronze holders rostered on duty from September to the end of April. This equates to 70 patrolling days for the season with each patrol averaging 10 patrol dates. This season saw the standardisation of patrol hours during the season with all patrols starting at 9 am and finish at 5 pm or during prime holiday time 6 pm.

This season proved very demanding on our members over some weekends with high seas and dangerous currents, many rescues were performed and the public was kept safe by the vigilance of our patrols. As can be seen by the stats in this Annual report, the figures for rescues, preventative actions, and public attendance were quiet high. Congratulations to all patrol captains for their skills in managing their patrols and I feel a special thanks goes to Brett Larkin, Catherine Wilson, Greg Elfick,

Graham Baty and David Mansfield who's patrol strengths were half that of most others during the season yet performed equally.

Again this season it was great to see a further increase in the number of members gaining their 100% proficiency (98 members) and 28 members with 90% attendance. Also with the hard work of our instructors, our number of awards gained was again up there in high figures. Next season will see some new innovations in our patrolling policy and management which is there to strengthen and protect our members and the public that uses Terrigal beach.

## DIRECTOR OF TRAINING & MEMBERSHIP REPORT

It is with great pleasure that I present the Training and Membership report for the concluded season of life saving at Terrigal.

It has been a tragic year in surf life saving with the loss of 5 lives on the Central Coast beaches and in recent week with the loss of a member of the public who collapsed and died on Terrigal beach.

Our sympathy goes to the families of these people.

Also we must thank those surf lifesavers involved in the rescues, resuscitations and searches and spare a thought for them and their brave efforts but more importantly how these tragic circumstances have effected them and their lives.

I am certain any of them would have preferred not to be involved, and these tragedies to never have occurred, but unfortunately we have been called upon to do what we do best.

This brings me to the important part of my message to all patrolling members. We all hope these incidents will never occur on our patrol and many of us go from season to season without incident, probably becoming a little complacent with our responsibilities. When things go wrong the public expect us to take charge, to be professional and know what we are about.

Unfortunately, not all, but many of us have become under skilled. This has come about with the introduction of new equipment into surf life saving such as the new spinal boards, which will revolutionise how we handle spinal cases. Its use will come into effect next season with the roll out of a spinal care course. The introduction of defibrillators into the clubs. This is one of the

simplest to use vital pieces of equipment we have. You attach it to the patient in a CPR situation and it tells you what to do. Only 2 people did the course in 04/05. Bronze medallion need to know how to administer oxygen therapy and I am certain not many of us even know how to turn it on.

This coming season we will conduct a series of up-skilling days to lift the level of competence of patrolling lifesavers. Please ensure you get involved. This is not an exercise in identifying the short of understanding, it is to ensure we are all equipped to the best of our abilities to handle the days we hope will never happen. If you have held a bronze for a number of years and go for your annual splash around the cans and blow a bit of air into a dummy you need to up-skill. You can come and do your bronze again. You will learn all the skills and obtain Cert 2 in Aquatic Rescue

When you put on the Red and Yellow from the Rookies to the Patrol Captain the public perception is one of delivering a professional service using all the tools at our disposal with the greatest competence we can show. We need to fulfill this obligation.

This season I was fortunate to receive a high commendation from Surf Life Saving NSW in the category of Training Officer of the Year for 2004 – 2005 season.

While this is a great honor, it would not have been possible without the skills and dedication of the Training Officers Team who worked with me to train the many candidates who came forward



this season. These people delivered the highest quality training we could offer with all candidates attaining their awards. I would like to thank David Mansfield, Sue Packer, Lee Lang, Justin McDonald, Joanne Jameson, Mardi Love for the delivery of SRC and Bronze courses. Joanne Jameson for the delivery of all the nippers age group awards. Beris Meldrum for a fantastic effort in training the 25 ARC recipients and running the ARC refreshers at the beginning of the season.

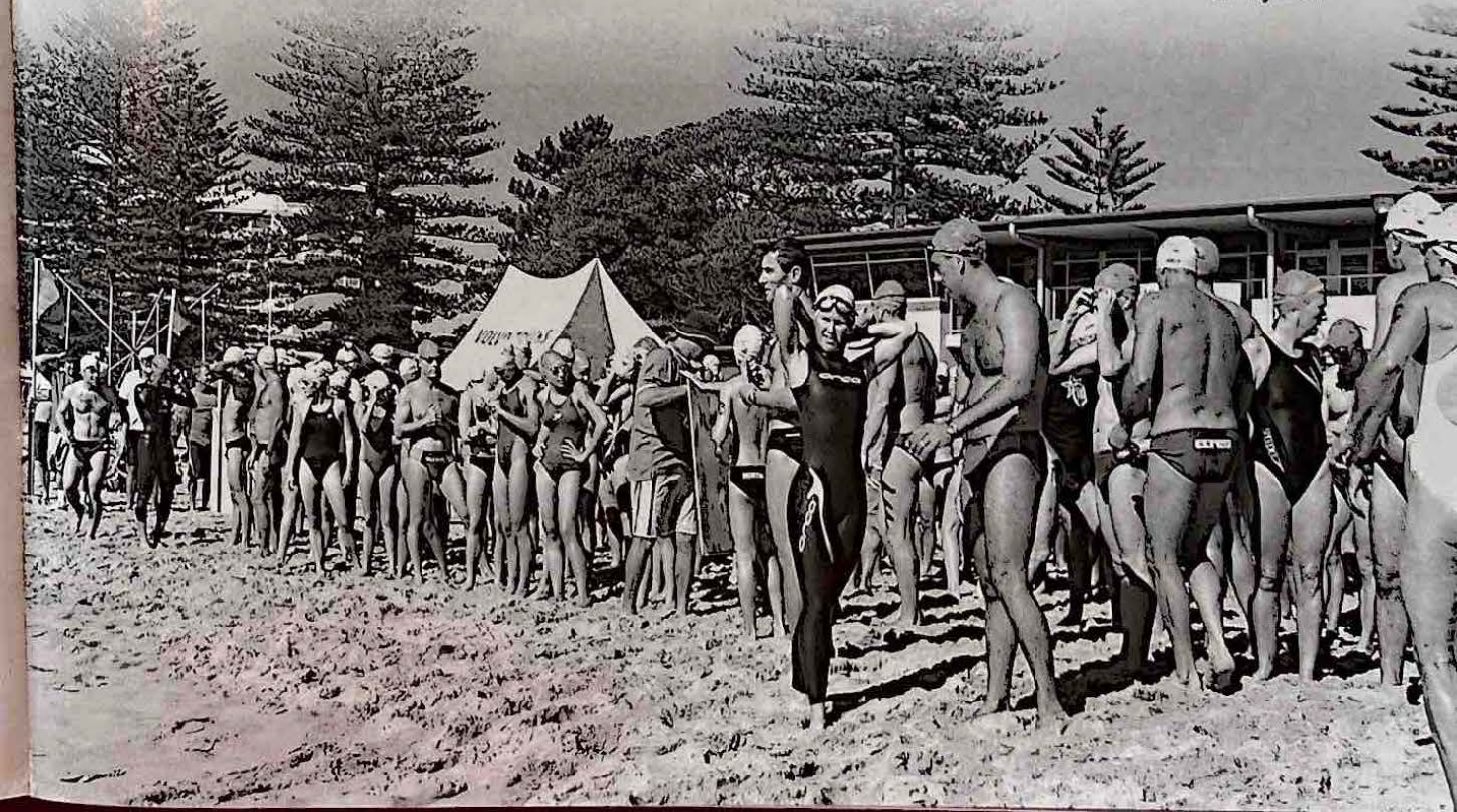
The Youth Committee is now self sufficient and run their meetings without adult assistance. Their secretary, Claire Bunch, will furnish their own report.

## DIRECTOR OF YOUTH ACTIVITIES REPORT

The Surf Lifesaving Mission Statement is that "Surf Life Saving Junior Activities will enrich the lives of children through fun, involvement and the acquisition of personal, lifesaving and competition skills in a safe aquatic environment". I can happily report that we have again achieved these objectives in the 2004/2005 season.

This season has proved to be a very challenging one in regards to scheduling of activities. With the changing of the age groups in senior carnivals, we now have some of our U/14s and U/13s who are competing in senior carnivals. This has meant we now have to take these senior carnivals into consideration when scheduling events for our Nippers. With the NSW Premiership Series and the Newcastle Ironman Series becoming permanent fixtures on the Surf Life Saving calendar, we now have a limited number of free weekends to organise normal club events. However, during the season we have continued with, and expanded on, some concepts that were introduced over the last few years as well as introducing some other activities. These include:

**Skills Nippers mornings** – John Giffney again provided surf skills and training to the younger club members on Sunday mornings, teaching them such basic skills as wave catching, swimming out through the swell and board riding. The U/14s also came down and helped out by "buddying up" with those Nippers who were a little uncertain in the water. These activities were not only educational but were also fun. The U/14s and some Youth Committee members also provided assistance with water safety for the younger age

groups which again helped to provide confidence for those Nippers who required it.

**Twilight Nippers** – this is a concept where we hold Nippers on a Saturday afternoon and then follow it up with some socialising. On both occasions that we had twilight meets, many members took the opportunity to stay on at the club after Nippers.

**Formal Coaching** – this year we have continued and expanded the formal coaching program under water coach, Paul Lemmon, and beach coach, Tony Clarke, providing skills training during the week throughout the season. Together with their coaching teams, they have provided high quality coaching to our Nippers that is the envy of all other clubs on the Central Coast. Their efforts have resulted in improved surf skills throughout the junior club and some excellent results at the surf carnivals we have attended. Quite a number of parents have now attended coaching clinic and have received formal qualifications as coaches. We will be looking for more parents to make this commitment in the coming year.

**Surf Education** – surf education is where Nippers are taught the less physical skills that are required by surf lifesavers. These include such things as identifying rips and dangerous swimming conditions, as well as performing Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR). Surf education has always been a requirement of the Nippers program but sometimes it has not been taught in an overly structured manner. This year our chief instructor, Joanne Jameson, and her assistant, Justin McDonald, have expanded on



the excellent education program put together by Cathy Cole, to ensure that all our Nippers gain the knowledge about the surf that they will require to be successful lifesavers.

The first carnival was an U/11 to Open Carnival run on Lakes Beach. This was the first carnival of this type held on the Central Coast. Terrigal won both the senior and junior sections of this carnival easily. At the next carnivals at Wamberal and North Entrance – both of which were the more traditional Nippers Carnivals, we won easily from Avoca. What was very pleasing about these carnivals was that we won across the beach as well as in the water. Terrigal has traditionally been very strong in the water but somewhat vulnerable on the beach. A great deal of credit has to go to our beach coaches, Tony and Donnica Clarke, for this vast improvement in our performance on the beach. At the branch carnival at Shelly Beach, we scored a massive 621.5 points beating second placed Avoca by nearly 300 points. Also pleasing was that the behaviour of Terrigal Nippers and their parents improved with each carnival.

And then there was the State Carnival at Umina/Ocean Beach. This is the first State Carnival held on the Central Coast in many years and a large proportion of our members took the opportunity to participate. Umina/Ocean Beach turned on a small but challenging wave over the 3 days to test the water competitors and the high tide intruded on the sprint track enough to make things interesting for the beach competitor. After last year at Shellharbour, things ran rather smoothly although the days were long. A big thank you

to our carnival secretary, Sharon Hudson, who made sure that all the children were entered in the correct events and a big thank you to John Bellato, our gear steward, who ensured that boards were available for all competitors who needed them. Overall, Terrigal came second to Cronulla although at one stage on Sunday we were ahead of Cronulla which is something that hasn't happened in the last 8 years. A great success story for us and thanks must go to all coaches and age managers for their efforts during the year.

Congratulations to all our competitors, especially our many finalists. Special mention to our individual medallists Tim Schofield (2 gold), Matt Hurst (1 gold and silver), Edward Gourley (gold and silver), Donnica Clarke (gold and silver), Cody-Leigh Callaghan (gold), Marissa Moore (gold), Amy Croaker (silver and bronze), Hannah Jones (silver), Robert Croaker (silver), Erin Robertson (silver), Ebony Baxter (bronze), Kareena Lee (bronze), Josh Polglase (bronze) and Sam Patterson (bronze). Especially pleasing was the performance of our teams which demonstrates the depth of talent we have in the club. The teams that medalled were U/10 female board relay (gold), U/10 male board relay (gold), U/10 swim team (bronze), U/11 swim team (gold), U/11 male board relay (gold), U/11 female board relay (bronze), U/11 male board rescue (gold), U/11 female board rescue (bronze), U/12 male board rescue (gold), U/12 male board relay (silver), U/13 male board relay (gold), U/13 swim team (bronze), U/13 male beach relay (gold), U/14 swim team (gold), U/14

male board rescue (silver), U/14 male board relay (bronze) and Senior Cameron relay (gold).

We are looking forward to an even more successful State campaign next year when the State Titles will be held in the Southerland Shire. To defeat Cronulla on their own beach will be a truly magnificent achievement.

This year there was a tightening of the stringent requirements placed on clubs with regard to providing officials and water safety personnel to help out at carnivals. The number of Terrigal competitors who attended the carnivals was again higher than in previous years. This was extremely encouraging to see but it meant that we had to provide a large number of certified officials and water safety.

On behalf of the Nippers, I would like to say a big thank you to all the parents and older brothers and sisters who stepped up to the responsibility and provided the numbers we needed at the carnivals that allowed our Nippers to compete. I would also like to say thank you to those people who helped out on Sunday mornings. Without their efforts, Sundays would not have been possible. A special mention for Richard Hudson, our beach setup coordinator, and his helpers, for ensuring that all the equipment was on the beach ready for the children and then getting it back in the club house at the end of the day. Especially pleasing was seeing the large numbers of older brothers and sisters (previous Nippers) who helped out at the carnivals and on Sundays. Their attitude bodes well for the future of the surf life saving movement.

Congratulations to our Interbranch competitors Maddie Powell, Erin Robertson, Marissa Moore, Donnica Clarke, Edward Gourley, Jack Moyes, Timothy Schofield and Luke Eltham. And especially to Donnica and Tim who went on to help NSW win the Junior division at the Interstate Championships held at Maroubra in January. They both went on to the Australian Surf Lifesaving Titles in March, competing in the Under 15 age group. Donnica won 2 gold medals and Tim 1.

A special thanks to Cathy Cole who again worked with the children to have a Terrigal R&R team. Hopefully next year, when we own a new R&R reel, we will have even more children competing.

Our young March Past team is developing nicely under the guidance of Sue Bennett and Debbie Northey. They performed extremely well throughout the year, earning the club points at each of the local carnivals, and they looked very impressive competing at the State Titles.

A big thanks again to Hilton Farquhar and Lee Lang and their merry bunch of helpers, with the U/6s and U/7s. We had over 80 young children in this group this year, and Hilton, Lee and their friends made sure that the children were continually occupied and enjoying themselves.

It is with great sadness that we also remember our barbecue coordinator, Richard Bridge. Richard organised a new barbecue for the club at the beginning of the season and then ensured that the barbecue ran smoothly and provided much needed funds for the club. Richard's untimely death will leave a large hole for the Nippers and for the club in general.



Thank you to our Rookie Coordinator, Jenny Schofield, for looking after our rookies, yet again, and ensuring they were allocated to a patrol and made it to the other functions for the rookies. Our U/14s have performed well this year and have assisted with performing water safety for the younger age groups. I wish them well as they move into the senior club and I would encourage them to use the skills they have gained in the time they have been in Nippers to further the ideals of the surf lifesaving movement both in patrolling the beach and in competition. Thanks to our club captains Donnica Clarke and Robbie Bellato and to our club vice captains Erin Robertson and Tim Schofield. And congratulations to our Junior Lifesavers of the Year – Shontel Whelan and Josh Cole. Josh was also selected as the Central Coast Junior Lifesaver of the Year.

Our sincere thanks to our sponsors, Cole's Pharmacy Terrigal, for the sponsorship of the Ironman Series and the State Uniforms, Bonds for the rash vests and their sponsorship, and to Telstra for their sponsorship. The Bonds and Telstra sponsorship is being used to fund the purchase of an R&R reel.

This year there were a number of families whose children were in the U/14s and so they will be leaving the Nippers and moving into the senior club. Many of these people have contributed a great deal of time and effort to Terrigal Nippers over the years and will be a great loss to us and a significant gain to the senior club. My special thanks to Kerrie Clarke, Sharon Hudson, Debbie Northey, Debbie Robertson and Tony Clarke, who have always been happy to help out whenever the going got tough.

This has been my second season in the job of Junior Chairman. It has been an extremely fulfilling time for me and I am still learning a great deal about the running of a surf club. I would encourage all parents to be part of the junior club helping out in whatever way you can. It will provide you with many rewarding moments and the interaction it will create between you and your children will provide both you and your children with memories that will stay with you forever.

**NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS****NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

- AAS3 Accounting for Income Tax
- AAS5 Materiality
- AAS8 Events Occurring After Reporting Date
- AAS17 Accounting for Leases

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

**(A) PLANT & EQUIPMENT DEPRECIATION**

Plant and equipment are recorded at cost and are depreciated over their estimated useful lives using the reducing balance method.

Plant and equipment which has an estimated useful life of one year or less have been expensed at purchase and are shown as gear purchases in the Club's profit and loss account.

**(B) GST UNITS**

Under the provisions of GST legislation relating to non-profit bodies, the Club has established independent accounting units for its separate functions with differing GST treatments.

The accounts of each of these independent units have been amalgamated in the preparation of the Club's accounts.

**(C) INCOME TAX**

The Club is exempt from income tax and accordingly no liability is recorded.

**(D) LEASES**

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the Club, are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Leased assets are amortised on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives where it is likely that the Club will obtain ownership of the asset or over the term of the lease. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the period in which they are incurred.

TECHNOLOGY

1975

1. The first part of the report deals with the general situation of the industry in 1975. It is noted that the industry has been in a state of decline since 1973, with a sharp drop in production and sales.
