



DIRECTOR OF ADMINISTRATION REPORT

It is with pleasure that I present the Annual Report to the members of the Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club. The season has in general been very successful, however structural reforms required for future progress will provide an interesting time for all.

The season has been extremely safe on the beach, with all credit to the Patrolling members, their Patrol Captains, and to Paul Quick, the Club Captain. The large number of new active members, and awards resulting from our Director of Education and Training, Greg Collins has allowed Paul to reduce the individual patrol quota for the season. Joint share equipment (with Gosford City Council), and Water safety levy funds has allowed a quality of service not previously possible.

HERO OF THE SURF MERITORIOUS AWARD PAUL QUICK COMMENDATION

Report of incident;

G Batty and D Maguire were on patrol at Terrigal Beach when responded to call from Warringah surf to the incident at Spoon Bay and request for IRB assistance. They launched the IRB and proceeded north 3 kms to Spoon Bay to assist in the rescue in large seas.

On arrival at Spoon Bay, the Terrigal IRB locate and took on board the rescuer S Harvey who had earlier placed his victim into the IRB from Wamberal SLSC.

P Quick was off duty at Wamberal Lake attending surfboat training when a member of Wamberal patrol located him and told him he was requested on the Jet Ski at Terrigal to assist at Spoon Bay. P Quick began jogging towards Terrigal and meet the Terrigal ATV coming to pick him up and return the 2 kms back to Terrigal to launch the Jet Ski. P Quick then proceeded to Spoon Bay and on arrival met the Terrigal IRB with S Harvey. S Harvey asked P Quick to take him into shore as he was in an exhausted state, so S Harvey hopped onto the mat and they negotiated the break and rocks to beach at the rescue site on shore. P Quick then proceeded back into the surf to search for the second victim around the rocks.

Both the IRB and Jet Ski proceeded to search for the second victim around the break and rocks along with Wamberal IRB and two helicopters. P Quick returned again to shore to pick up a full fuel cell, as Wamberal IRB was now low on fuel. Then returned to sea and continued the search. The 2nd victim was located some 40 minutes later and the IRB and Jet Ski returned to Terrigal beach once search was called off.

The surf conditions, location and wave actions on this day made it very difficult for the craft to operate safely in their endeavors.

MAJOR AWARDS 2005-06

CLUBPERSON OF THE YEAR JOANNE JAMESON

Joanne held the positions of Patrol captain, Bronze instructor, SRC instructor, Surf Education instructor and Bar manager. Her overwhelming commitment to the club has shown her put in at least, 50 hours training squads; 50 hours training nippers; 250 hours bar duties as a volunteer and 100% patrol proficiency.

Joanne has shown innovation in implementing bar functions; nipper education and patrol team work.

YOUNG CLUBPERSON OF THE YEAR JOSHUA COLE

As a young person Joshua has shown dedication and enthusiasm in everything he does. He is very committed to patrols gaining 1005 proficiency. Helps with the club equipment and work around the club.

He is involved in the TROYS group and Duke of Edburgh scheme.

Some of the achievements this year include:

SLSA Member Recognition Awards – research of 20 years of club membership to provide Surf Life Saving Australia member recognition awards to eligible and very deserving past and present members. These awards were presented at the Club Presentation and include recognition of 10 and 15 years of 100% patrol attendance.

Junior Parent and Child Code of Conduct – while every member of Terrigal Surf Club is bound by the SLSA Code of Conduct, the Terrigal Junior Code translates the "spirit of intention" of the code into language that our Nippers and their parents can easily identify and follow. I'd like to thank all the club members who have attended these courses, they have been invaluable in providing new



Thankyou all for your faith in me this year, I have enjoyed the challenge and rewards, but mostly have enjoyed the opportunity to learn a lot more about the Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club and each of its dedicated and committed members.



Terrigal SLSC has provided a very safe and professional lifesaving service to the community and visitors to the central coast. The summary of patrol statistics in this annual report details our efforts this past season.

From 205 rostered active members, 83 members gained 100%; 33 members gained 90% and 21 members completed their duties without missing one patrol. We had over 60 young, keen and eager Rookies that helped contribute to the huge number of hours spent on patrol.



We are constantly being bombarded with the need to change and lifesaving is no different. This season everyone who re-qualified their Bronze completed a series of question to upgrade you to Cert II Public Safety (Aquatic Rescue). This is the first of many small changes to upgrade SLS to a nationally recognized training award structures.

We will see more changes in the coming season as new courses and upgrades are rolled out. Those holding current awards will apply for recognized prior learning (RPL) as many of the awards are transferable and may only require a small amount of work to upgrade.

In 2006-07 we will see massive changes in EAR and CPR as we currently know it. Compression to breath ratios will change to 30:2 with no EAR and no checks for pulse. Paul Quick and myself will need to put on some programs to get everyone trained before the season.

Anyone who has gained awards over the past couple of years and would like to train others in the skills they have learned please contact me and become a trainer. You are placed with an experienced trainer until you a competent to lead a squad and you are guided all the way by Surf Life Saving Australia course material and aids.

DIRECTOR OF JUNIOR ACTIVITIES

The Surf Lifesaving Mission Statement is that "Surf Life Saving Junior Activities will enrich the lives of children through fun, involvement and the acquisition of personal, lifesaving and competition skills in a safe aquatic environment". I can happily report that we have again achieved these objectives in the 2005/2006 season.

Surf Lifesaving NSW has become a very busy organisation and while this is very healthy for the lifesaving movement, it has proved to be a very challenging in regard to scheduling of activities. This year we had a number of clashes of events which meant late changes to our calendar which did not fit in with everyone. This included the children's Christmas party and the running of the inaugural IAG Richard Bridge memorial Parent-Child Board Rescue because of the Cronulla riots. Unfortunately, we will continue to have to work around this problem in the next few years as the surf lifesaving calendar is only going to get more crowded. However, during the season we have continued with, and expanded on, some concepts that were introduced over the last few years as well as introducing some other activities. These include:

Skills Nippers mornings – John Giffney again provided surf skills and training to the younger club members on Sunday mornings, teaching them such basic skills as wave catching, swimming out through the swell and board riding. The U/14's also came down and helped out by "buddying up" with those Nippers who were a little uncertain in the water. These activities were not only educational but were also fun. Unfortunately, John has decided that all good things must come to an end and he has decided to "retire" from this role and so we are looking to for other parents who are prepared to step up and take over this role. The U/14's and some Youth Committee members also provided assistance with water safety for the younger age groups which again helped to provide confidence for those Nippers who required it.

Twilight Nippers – this is a concept where we hold Nippers on a Saturday afternoon and then follow it up with some socialising. Unfortunately we were only able to run this once this year, because of a clash of events, but it was a very successful evening for all those who attended.

Formal Coaching - this year we have continued and expanded the formal coaching program under water coaches, Paul Lemmon and Paul Broadbent, and beach coach, Tony Clarke, providing skills training during the week throughout the season. Paul also ran some training session during the last winter season to help the nippers keep up their fitness levels. Together with their coaching teams, they have provided high quality coaching to our Nippers that is the envy of all other clubs on the Central Coast. Their efforts have resulted in improved surf skills throughout the junior club and some excellent results at the surf carnivals we have attended. Quite a number of parents have now attended coaching clinics and have received formal qualifications as

coaches. We will be looking for more parents to make this commitment in the coming year.

Surf Education - surf education is where Nippers are taught the less physical skills that are required by surf lifesavers. These include such things as identifying rips and dangerous swimming conditions, as well as performing Expired Air Resuscitation (EAR). Surf education has always been a requirement of the Nippers program but sometimes it has not been taught in an overly structured manner. This year our chief instructor, Joanne Jameson, and her assistant, Justin McDonald, have expanded on the excellent education program already in place, to ensures that all our Nippers gain the knowledge about the surf that they will require to be successful lifesavers.

At the branch level, we have had a very successful season winning all local carnivals. What was very pleasing about these carnivals was that we won across the beach as well as in the water where we have been traditionally very strong. A great deal of credit has to go to our beach coaches, Tony and Donnica Clarke, for this vast improvement in our performance on the beach. Also pleasing was that the behaviour of Terrigal Nippers. Our children have not only learnt to win graciously but they have also learnt how to behave when they lose. In the last few months Directors of Youth Activities from two surf clubs one local and one Sydney club - have taken the time and effort to write to us to congratulate us on the good sportsmanship displayed by our children.

The State Carnival must rate a special mention. Last year when we competed on a local beach, we were able to challenge

Cronulla who have been the top club for the past decade. This year we competed against them on their home beach and there was some concern that we may not be able to live up to the standard we set last year. Well, even though we eventually ran second again to Cronulla, we were the only club who effectively challenged them over the whole weekend and we scored more points this year than we did last year. A big thank you to our carnival secretary, Sharon Hudson, who made sure that all the children were entered in the correct events and a big thank you to Richard Hudson and Greg Smith, our gear stewards, who ensured that boards were available for all competitors who needed them. Unfortunately, this is the Hudson's last year in the Nippers organisation so we are looking for parents to step up and fill the large hole they will be leaving.

The State Carnival was a great success story for us and thanks must go to all coaches and age managers for their efforts during the year. Congratulations to all our competitors, especially our many individual finalists and members of the many Terrigal teams that made the finals. The performance of our teams was especially pleasing as it demonstrated the depth of talent we have in the club.

Again this year there was a focus on the stringent requirements placed on clubs with regard to providing officials and water safety personnel to help out at carnivals. The number of Terrigal competitors who attended the carnivals was again higher than in previous years. This was extremely encouraging to see but it meant that we had to provide a large number of certified officials and water safety. To act as officials or water safety, people must attend accreditation courses for officials or becomes bronze medallion holders. On behalf of the Nippers, I would like to say a big thank you to all the parents and older brothers and sisters who stepped up to the responsibility and provided the numbers we needed at the carnivals that allowed our Nippers to compete. I would also like to say thank you to those people who helped out on Sunday mornings. Without their efforts, Sundays would not have been possible. Going forward into the new season, we require more people, particularly parents of the younger children, to step up to the responsibility and attend the official accreditation courses or to obtain their bronze medallion.

A special mention for Richard Hudson, our beach setup coordinator, and his helpers, for ensuring that all the equipment was on the beach ready for the children and then getting it back in the club house at the end of the day. Thank you also to Steve Reid who was our water safety coordinator and his merry bunch of people who spent Sunday mornings getting cold and wet while setting up the water courses and ensuring that our children were safe in the water. This group included a number of people who do not have children in the nippers such as John Robertson, Daniel Hudson, Cathy Cole and the members of the Youth Committee. A special thank you to Allan Troy and Laurie Whelan, who ran the barbecue on Sunday mornings. The barbecue raises badly needed funds for the nippers and allows us to provide the nippers with the necessary equipment. Especially pleasing was seeing the large numbers of older brothers and sisters (previous Nippers) who helped out at the carnivals and on Sundays. Their attitude

bodes well for the future of the surf life saving movement.

Congratulations to all our Interbranch competitors – Amy Nurthen, Maddie Powell, Edward Gourley, Matt Eltham, Jack Moyes, Luke Eltham, Kareena Lee and Robert Annabel. Amy and Edward went on to represent NSW and Maddie was a guest competitor for the Northern Territory. This year nearly half of the junior competitors of the Central Coast Interbranch team came from Terrigal. A special mention for Amy Nurthen, Rebecca Street, Demelsa Barclay and Edward Gourley who won medals at the Australian Surf Lifesaving Titles in March, competing in the Under 15 age group.

Our young March Past team is developing nicely under the guidance of Sue Bennett and the group of supporting mums and dads. They performed extremely well throughout the year, earning the club points at each of the local carnivals, and they looked very impressive competing at the State Titles. We are looking for more members to compete in this traditional surf lifesaving event.

A big thanks again to Hilton Farquhar and Lee Lang and their merry bunch of helpers, with the U/6's and U/7's. We had over 80 young children in this group this year, and Hilton, Lee and their friends made sure that the children were continually occupied and enjoying themselves.

Thank you to our Rookie Coordinator, Jenny Schofield, for looking after our rookies, yet again, and ensuring they were allocated to a patrol and made it the other functions for the rookies. Our U/14's have performed well this year and have assisted with performing water safety for the younger age groups. They have also competed in the U/15 age group at senior carnivals and this age group has performed brilliantly throughout the year including the Australian Championships where we were the standout club in this age group. I wish them well as they move into the senior club and I would encourage them to use the skills they have gained in the time they have been in Nippers to further the ideals of the surf lifesaving movement both in patrolling the beach and in competition. Thanks to our club captains Maddie Powell and Matt Eltham and to our club vice captains Emily Pearce and Nathan Clarke. And congratulations to our Junior Lifesavers of the Year - Emily Hudson and Nathan Clarke.

Our sincere thanks to our sponsors, Bonds, for the rash vests for our children, and to Insurance Australia Group (IAG) for their sponsorship of the Richard Bridge Memorial parent-child board rescue event.

This year there were a number of families whose youngest children were in the U/14s and so they will be leaving the Nippers and moving into the senior club. Many of these people have contributed a great deal of time and effort to Terrigal Nippers over the years and will be a great loss to us and a significant gain to the senior club. Our special thanks go to these families – the Spicers, the Hannellys, the Gourleys/Lawlers, the O'Dares, the Anderssons, the Barclays, the Moores, the Reids, the Hudsons, the Polglases and the Powells. We will be looking to the parents of the younger children to fill the roles that have been left by these people.

And finally, but most importantly, my thanks to the Age Managers. A thankless job but one that is critical to the successful running of the junior club. Your efforts have enhanced our kids into becoming lifesavers of tomorrow.

This year has been another year of expansion for the Terrigal Juniors which has put a strain on many people in the club. We had nearly 200 new Nippers join the club this season. My special thanks to Kerrie Clarke, Sharon Hudson, Jenny Schofield, Lyn Annabel and Tony Clarke, who have always been happy to help out whenever the going got tough.

This has been my third season in the job of Junior Chairman. It has been an extremely fulfilling time for me and I have learnt a great deal about the running of a surf club. But it is now time for me to stand down and handover to someone else. I would encourage all parents to be part of the junior club helping out in whatever way you can. It will provide you with many rewarding moments and the interaction it will create between you and your children will provide both you and your children with memories that will stay with you forever.

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LIFE MEMBERS REPORT

The financial report has disclosed the Life Members Fund enjoys a credit balance of \$24,635.15 (Twenty Four Thousand Six Hundred and Thirty Five Dollars and Fifteen Cents). These funds are held in account number 53-878-5225 being \$50.55 and Term Deposit 56-562-1509 of \$24,584.60. This Term Deposit will mature on 18/8/2006.

The fund has disclosed an increase of assets of \$5,063.76 over the past twelve months. During this period the fund made further donations to the Senior Club of \$1,580.00. These donations to the Senior Club now exceed \$6,530.00 since the Fund was established.

The major fundraising was by way of the Melbourne Cup Function where in excess of \$4,000 was raised. This is an increase of over \$1,000 on the previous year's function. Lionel's car raffle netted \$1,220.00 and the remaining increase in assets was due to interest received of \$1,316.73 on the Term Deposit.

The cash donations totalling \$1,100 to the Senior Club are considered to be substantial in view of the small overall amount of the assets held. In addition to this the Fund committed a further \$480 for the jackets presented on the "Awards of Excellence Night".

Their assistance was greatly appreciated.

The Fund is already looking healthy for the next season with proceeds from the Car Raffle to exceed \$2,000. Two functions are to be held at later dates with "Christmas In July" and the Melbourne Cup Luncheon already being organised.

The Life Members held several meetings during the year and submitted amendments to the By-Laws for Appointment for Membership for "Life Member" and also the "Honour Blazer". Both of these were approved in the general terms as submitted, however, it is fully believed that these areas need further attention to detail and will have further follow-up action in the forthcoming season. Notice was also given to the Directors of the correct embroidery which should be utilised on the Club Blazer pocket.

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FINANCIALS

NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AAS5 Materiality

AAS8 Events Occurring After Reporting Date

AAS17 Accounting for Leases

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(A) PLANT & EQUIPMENT DEPRECIATION

Plant and equipment are recorded at cost and are depreciated over their estimated useful lives using the reducing balance method.

Plant and equipment which has an estimated useful life of one year or less have been expensed at purchase and are shown as gear purchases in the Club's profit and loss account.

(B) GST UNITS

Under the provisions of GST legislation relating to non-profit bodies, the Club has established independent accounting units for its separate functions with differing GST treatments.

The accounts of each of these independent units have been amalgamated in the preparation of the Club's accounts.

(C) INCOME TAX

The Club is exempt from income tax and accordingly no liability is recorded.

(D) LEASES

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the Club, are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Leased assets are amortised on a straight line basis over

their estimated useful lives where it is likely that the Club will obtain ownership of the asset or over the term of the lease. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the period in which they are incurred.
