The Terrigal SLSC Inc has faced a difficult and challenging year, however it is with great pleasure that I can report that we have reversed the situation that was inherited.

We have again enjoyed competition success with a top 10 finish at the Australian Championships. This is due to the work of all our competitors, coaching staff, parents and all our officials that have given up countless hours. I would like to pay special appreciation to Richard Hudson and Dominic Marks for their extraordinary commitment. The club coach, Paul Broadbent and his coaching staff, including Paul Lemmon, Paul Stone and Daniel Lockwood, I pass on the club's congratulations and it has been gratifying to see your hard efforts come to fruition.

To our State and Australian finalists and medallists congratulations in seeing your dreams and goals coming true. You are a credit to your own dedication to excelling in your chosen sport and competition.

To those that have continued to strive for that elusive medal or finals spot. Continue your hard work, be guided by your coaches and supporters and I am sure that you can achieve your goals.

Our lifesavers, lead by Paul Quick, once again showed due diligence, performing numerous rescues and first aid cases, having saved numerous lives, and we can again claim that there were no fatalities on Terrigal beach.

Our trainers lead by Kaye Kelly have again given up countless hours training our lifesavers, and junior members. Your team, including, Amelia Cole, Dave Mansfield, Joanne Jameson and Greg Collins is highly motivated and some of the best on the coast.

I would also like to single out some members for special recognition.

Firstly, Amelia Cole for her selection to represent the youth of Australia in addressing and posing questions to leaders and delegates at the APEC conference in 2007. This is a tremendous achievement.

Secondly, Steve Graham and John Bellato, for your work in the IRB's. Not only training but also competition. This is one of the most inclusive areas within the club, where any member can get involved. This is testament to yours and all the IRB members where you have maintained a club focus, testament to the success at the IRB championships.

This years board assumed the mantle on the management of this club with a number of challenges. These including a financial deficit, loss of a major sponsor, ongoing sponsorship concerns, the outstanding issue with the council over the clubs lease, and the sub-leasing of the café. We have tackled these issues with a view of finality.

We have turned around the \$50,000 operating deficit from last year to a \$122,000 operating profit. We have re-engaged a number of major sponsors and established links to the business community through the Chamber of Commerce. We have also finalised the lease with council and negotiated an outcome on the retrospective rent. This all without a Finance Director at the beginning of the year where as the President, I assumed this mantle, moving the club forward until the appointment of Matt Rodwell.

As part of the new focus, we held what has been reported back to us, a one of the best Sponsors Nights. The format and structure that was established, ensured that night was a success. Since the event we have had an enormous amount of positive feed back. I wish to pass on my thanks to all our sponsorship partners and supporters for your continued dedication to saving lives at Terrigal beach. As I said at the Sponsors Night, not all of us can be lifesavers, but your financial assistance places you next to the lifesaver who is doing the rescue.

The club through the significant efforts of Mark Schofield, have commenced a partnership with PKF, an accountancy firm, who join us as the major competitive sponsor for the next 3 years. This

will ensure that the club is secure in its competitive challenges for the years to come. My thanks to Mark for his tremendous efforts in securing this sponsorship.

The surf boats rowers have also received great support, initially from Rod and Gaynor Harvey who donated the 'Donnica Clarke' surf boat. We have also re-signed Terrigal Hotel, who continue their association and support of the community, and finally E-Biz Print have again joined forces with the boaties.

But despite our successes, we have again been touched by tragedy. Firstly with the sudden loss of our head sweep, Bruce Thoroughgood, and then the following day with long time member, Bill Smith loosing his fight against cancer. Then Lindsay Lyon was hospitalised with serious head injuries after a sickening accident in Terrigal.

In respect to Bruce, his loss was felt significantly throughout the club. We had developed a good relationship over the proceeding months and were working to build a plan to improve the surf boat competitive area. He was a dedicated club person, unselfish in his time that he gave, and a man that will sorely be missed. Lindsay has made a slow but steady recovery from his serious injuries.

To our major award winners, congratulations on receiving your awards, you, as general members of the club, are deserving recipients.

To our Branch and State awardees, congratulations on a superb effort this past year, you should be proud of your achievements.

Finally, I would like to public give a vote of thanks to all those members that have supported me over the past 12 months. Upon becoming the President of this club I never expected the 90 odd emails, texts and phone messages that I received from the membership.

However, I am unable, due to personal reasons, to seeking re-election. The past 12 months have been hard and difficult. I never run from a challenge, and as such leave the Presidency and the club in better position to when I took on the role.

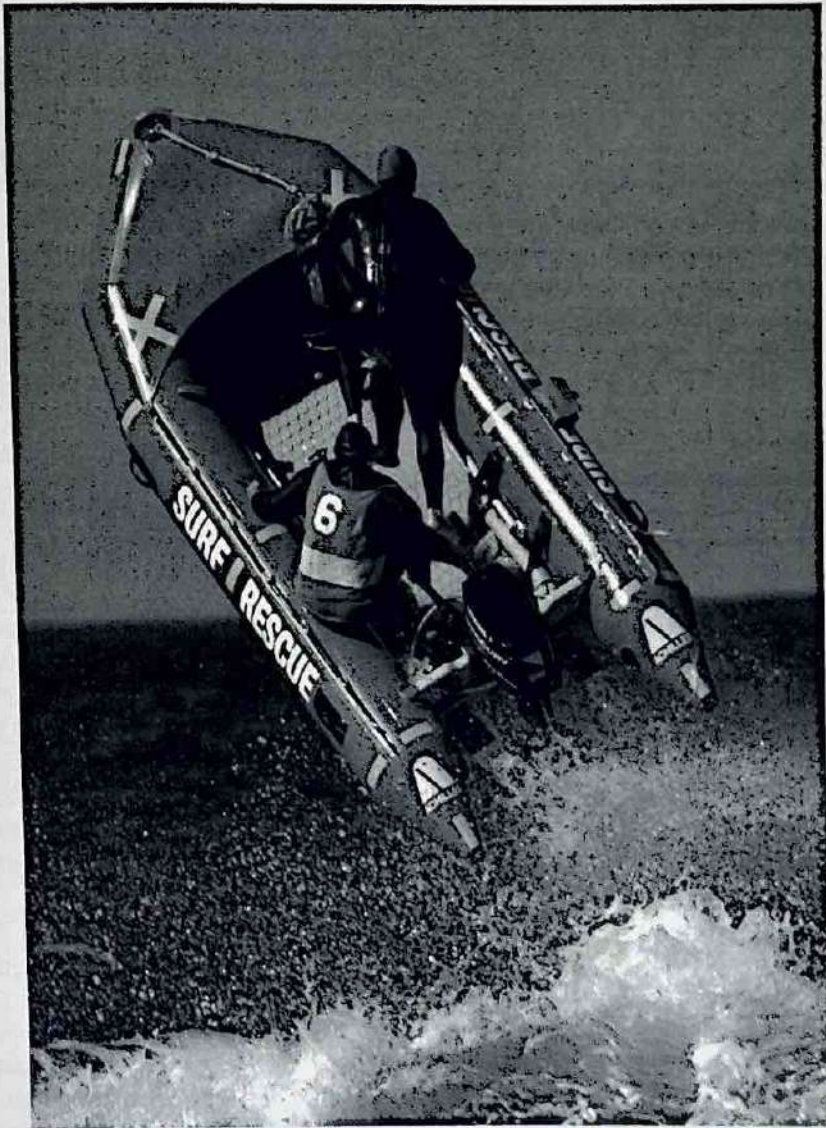

Bruce Raymond Thoroughgood

Suddenly and unexpectedly Bruce was taken from us on Wednesday 9th April 2008. Bruce suffered a clot to the heart whilst working on one of the Terrigal SLSC surf boats at his home only hours after returning from the Australian titles in Perth with his crews.

Bruce started his career at Umina beach as a rower and then as a sweep competing at a high level. He then joined Terrigal SLSC in 2000 to sweep the masters crew and help develop surf boat rowing at Terrigal further. Bruce then took on crews in reserves, open women's and u/19's and helped build Terrigal's crews from five to ten crews last season. Three years ago, along with the then boat captain and sweeps, Bruce set down a five year plan to build a high level of competition in the boat area as well as fostering and investing in the youth of our club. This resulted in five U/23 male and female crews and one U/19 crew at Terrigal

In his time at Terrigal Bruce swept crews in all divisions' to many Branch medals with the highlight been the much respected Dick Gee Memorial trophy for the Open boat crew in 2004. Bruce enjoyed success at many NSW carnivals and won Australian medals at Kurrawa in Reserve boats in 2003/04 and masters in 2004/05.

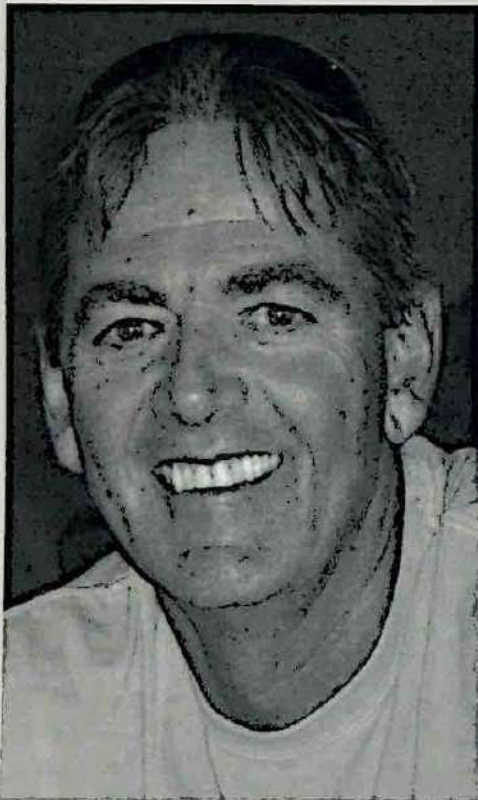
As a lifesaver, Bruce gained many awards over the years and recently gained his RWC award doing many hours of jet ski patrol along the C Coasts 15 beaches. Bruce put many hours in patrolling at Terrigal and often gained his 100% proficiency each season.

Director of Lifesaving Report

The 2007-2008 Surf lifesaving season has finished between the flags for us, but the work behind the scenes never stops for those involved in the progression of Terrigal SLSC and its members. I am proud to have held the position of Club captain of Terrigal SLSC for the past 5 years and the longest serving Club captain since H Payne back in 1932-38. It is good to work alongside the volunteer patrol members of our club and see the numbers increase each season. Over these years we have increased our number of patrols from 10 to 17 with now just over 300 active members. The qualifications and professionalism of our patrol members has increased markedly over the past years with the introduction of higher awards such as the Bronze medallion now been a Cert 2 in Aquatic Safety; Defibrillation award; Spinal management and RWC rescue craft (of which Terrigal have 8 operators and 1 in training). Our members have volunteered their service further afield via patrolling at The Entrance beach many weekends this season to assist this small club in its time of need. Our RWC operators have given their service not only up and down the coasts beaches, but at local carnivals, State and Aussie titles; ocean swims and other aquatic events, rescues and searches outside patrol hours and season closed. With the re-introduction of IRB racing, our standards and numbers of qualified drivers and crew has markedly improved so as to provide our beach with the best resources available. Thank you to all those who have put in their time to training these members.

A much respected thank you to the 17 patrol captains and vice captains who took on their vital roles with gusto and guided their members each weekend with enthusiasm. Terrigal expanded the hours of patrol over the busy Christmas break from 8 am to 7 pm to cater for the large numbers of beach goes over these times. This worked well with 3 patrols sharing the load each day. Again we called for volunteers on Christmas day and our members confidently stepped forward to do their duty.

Through your vigilance, Terrigal Beach has again had a safe season without any loss of life. Our trainers/instructors have delivered a quality education service to develop a large number of new Bronze members as well as up skilling awards of existing members. The time and effort put in by these people is immeasurable, thank you. Looking at the season's statistics, you can understand the worth of our volunteer service to the community. Terrigal had **176,751 visitors** to our beach. With **1310 preventative actions**, we were able to keep **rescues down to 46**. Pleasing to see that all but 6 of these were done with rescue equipment. This means our members are vigilant and prepared and use the equipment they have been trained in. We provided **595 first aid treatments** and the beach was **closed on 3 occasions** for the safety of the public.

Congratulations to our Lifesaving award winners this year with Patrolman of the year David Mansfield, Young Patrolperson Joel Collins and Rookie of the year Melissa Curtis. David is a long time patrol member, who has won this award previously, backed up to act as patrol captain for 2 patrols at end of season and still trains and assesses awards.

All this would be much harder without the support of our sponsors, listed here in the annual report. The many patrol sponsors whose flags flew each weekend : Crowne Plaza a long time partner, DHL nationally, Energy Australia, Central Coast Surf Lifesaving and Gosford City Council and it's lifeguards.

This will be my last report as I will not be standing for re-election next season. I have been on the executive of Terrigal surf club for the past 14 years since taking on the role of Junior chairperson in 1994 and holding positions of vice president, chief instructor, assessor and club captain. My time will be taken up with the Director of Surf sports role at Branch, RWC duties and coaching/sweeping roles for Terrigal. I thank you for your support and camaraderie over the years and hope all members will continue to give their bit for the club.

LIFE MEMBERS REPORT

The financial report has disclosed that the Life Members Fund enjoys a credit balance of \$443.34 (Four Hundred and Forty Three Dollars 34¢). These funds are held in account number 53-878-3225 at the NAB Bank.

On 29th May, 2007 the Fund made a loan of \$32,000 to the Senior Club. This was on the full understanding that loan and interest was to be fully repaid by the end of the current financial year of the Club. The Club has also failed to pass on the funds which totaled \$2,634.00 from the car raffle which was conducted in the 2006-2007 season. These funds and the non payment of \$3,000 in interest are reflected in the deferred assets of \$5,634.00 in the Balance Sheet.

If the Club had honoured its commitments the Life Members assets would have totaled \$38,077.34. This would have been an increase of \$6,257.36 for the financial year. This however would have been down from the \$7,184.83 achieved in the previous corresponding year. The main reason for this decline was that no Melbourne Cup function was conducted. At completion of this function the Fund has always made a donation in excess of \$1,000 to the Senior Club and the surplus is retained as fund raising for the Fund.

Donation to the Senior Club has exceeded \$7,900 since the Fund was established in 1983. The vision for the establishment of the Fund was to create a "Future Fund" for the enhancement of the Club's growth in the ensuing years. It is not there for the utilization by any committee or committees. The Fund is to be conducted on a perpetual basis and there is no exception to this rule.

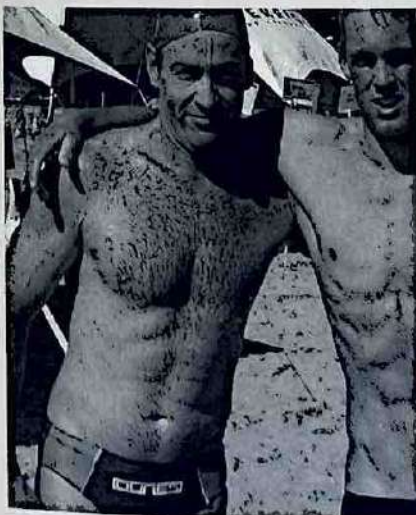
The Fund will pursue repayment of all monies owing at this time. Outstanding funds by the Club to 30.4.2008 total \$37,634.00. All outstanding interest is the Fund's income and the Fund relies on this to function on an annual basis.

The present Trustees of the Life Members Fund are MARK POWER, PAUL HAWKINS, RON STONE, BERIS MELDRUM AND JOHN HOWICK. There should only have been three (3) Trustees elected and this will be reflected in the ensuing year.

On 8th June, 2008 the Life Members conducted an election with Mark Power, Paul Hawkins and Ron Stone being the elected Trustees for the 2008/2009 season which is to be ratified at the Annual General Meeting.

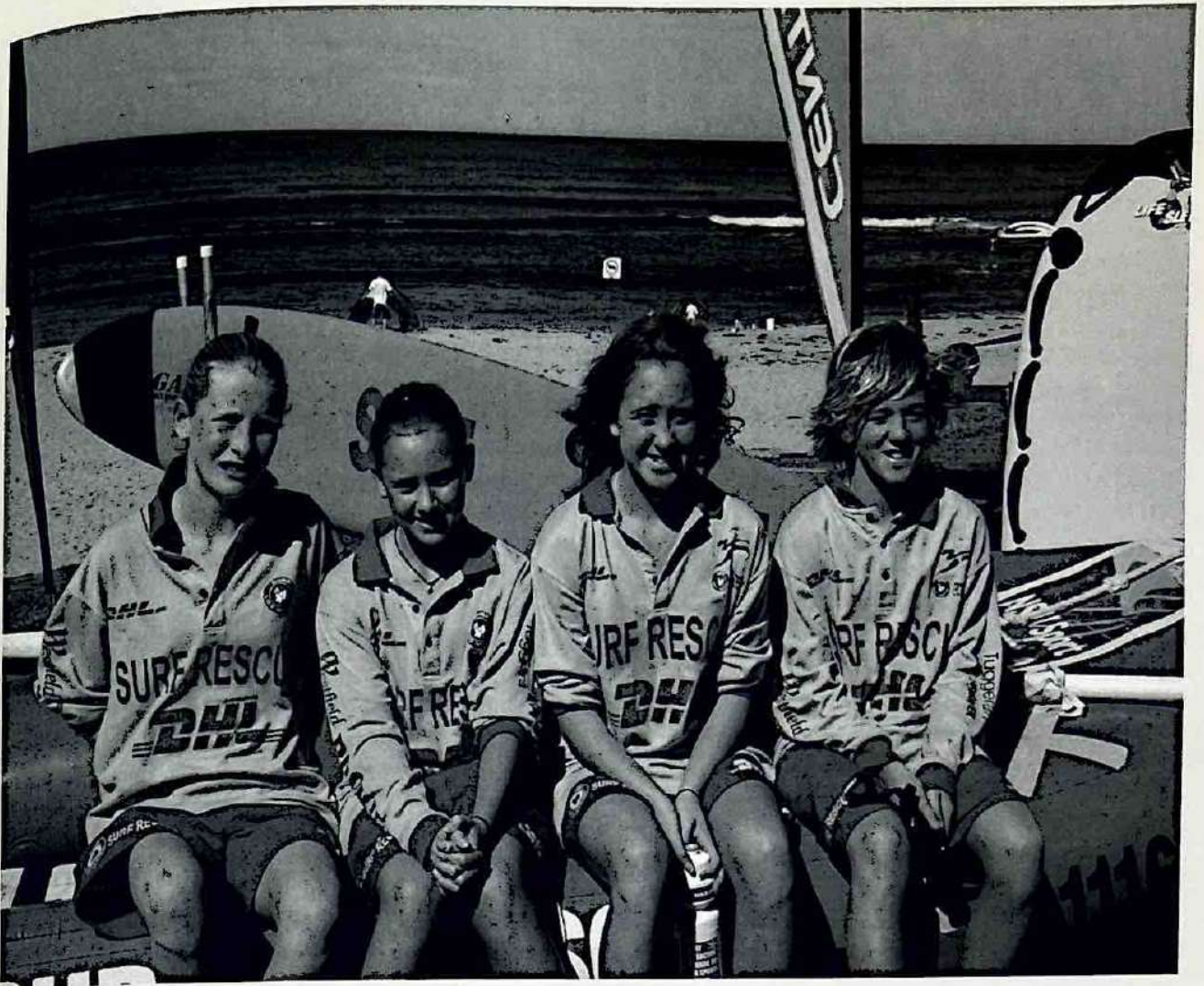

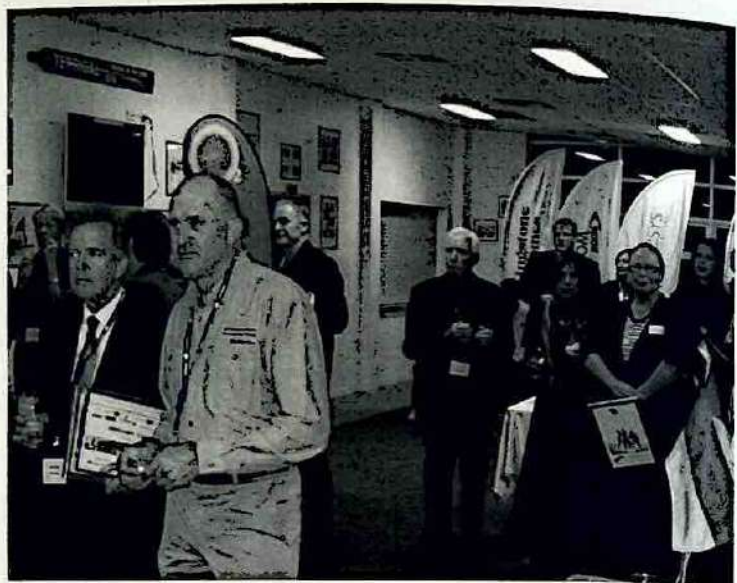
