Terrigal club members completed a massive 9253 hours on the beach as well as an additional 522 hours in providing water safety for our Nipper training and development days.

## DIRECTOR OF LIFESAVING REPORT

It is with great pleasure that I present the Lifesaving annual report for 2008-2009 patrol season. This was a very challenging year for all patrol members and one in which every patrolling member should feel very proud of their contribution, effort and achievements. Terrigal is blessed with a large number of active patrolling members, this year we had 360 members patrolling across 17 patrols with most patrols having more than 15 members on the beach at any one time, this is the envy of many other clubs not only on the Central Coast also across the State. Each patrol attended some 10 rostered patrols, contributing 9256 hours of service to keep our beach safe. What is most encouraging is that this year more 90 members achieved 100% attendance. This is a magnificent achievement by these individuals who must be proficient in their award, attend all of their rostered patrols or get a substitute (and make up the hours) This requires great commitment and dedication, each and everyone that achieved this award should be very proud.

Our large number of active members has allowed us to help out The Entrance SLSC on 4 days throughout the season. I would like to thank all that made special effort to attend patrol at The Entrance; this was greatly appreciated by them and is a sign of your commitment and dedication to keeping the community safe. This season saw new levels of cooperation between Terrigal and our neighbours Wamberal. On a number of occasions Terrigal was able to help supplement Wamberal's patrol strength. This type of relationship gives Terrigal members the opportunity to experience different conditions and methods of patrolling. Thank you to all members that took that extra step to move out of their comfort zone to help Wamberal out.

Terrigal had more than our average number of days upon which the sea conditions were rougher and bigger than in recent times. Quick thinking and acting by our patrolling members prevented many swimmers getting into trouble. Although a large number of rescues were carried out the increased vigilance and preventative action by our members kept the rescues to acceptable numbers and again no life was lost this season. Attendance continued to increase especially during the holiday period, with an ever increasing number of non-swimmers. Patrols worked well in keeping people informed of the conditions and dangers that many of the public were blissfully unaware of, well done.

Patrol visits by the club captain and vice-captain were re-introduced. This was a very interesting and encouraging experience. Most patrols had all members in full patrol uniform (including skull cap) on the beach and near the patrol shelter; the beach was well setup with all rescue equipment correctly and well positioned. The patrol captains are to be congratulated on the way they managed their patrols.

Congratulations and big thank you to Amelia Cole and Patrol 4 in winning the "Patrol of the Year", they are setting the standard for patrols. Every member of the Patrol achieved 100%, most achieved new awards, the patrol was always well setup, members were allocated jobs and knew what was expected of them, and all of them in uniform. Thank you to Marc Gunasinghe, Goodgear/ Gun Web Systems for sponsoring this award.

It was great to see the patrol numbers boosted with the addition of new members attaining the Bronze Medallion. Congratulations to all that achieved their Bronze, hopefully this is the start of a great experience for you, helping the community along with meeting new people, expanding your skills and enjoying your time on the beach. It took a huge effort and commitment to achieve this award you should be proud of this achievement. It does not go without notice the number of members that increased their skills by achieving additional awards, congratulations and well done. Thank you to the instructors that put in many hours.

Special mention should also be made of the assessors who made extra effort to ensure that members were proficient in the various awards by the end of the season. ## LIFE MEMBERS REPORT

The financial report has disclosed that the Life Members Fund enjoys a credit balance of \$40,428.26 (Forty Thousand Four Hundred and Twenty Eight dollars 26¢). Other than the payment of interest received from Term Deposits and the Club together with payment of the car raffle from the 2006-07 there has been very little fund raising over the past two years. The Life Members have given their support for the conduct of several events to occur in the coming year. These are to be "Christmas in July" to be held on 25<sup>th</sup> July and a "Melbourne Cup" function in November. It is hoped that all members will support these fund raising efforts.

Donations to the Senior Club have exceeded \$8,700 since the Fund was established in 1983. The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

**(a) Plant & Equipment Depreciation**

Plant and equipment are recorded at cost and are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives.

The Club is exempt from income tax and accordingly no liability is recorded.

**(d) Inventories**

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

**(e) Leases**

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the Club, are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Leased assets are amortised on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives where it is likely that the Club will obtain ownership of the asset or over the term of the lease. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the period in which they are incurred.

**(f) Revenue**

Revenue is recognised as follows:

- Members income, donations and sponsorship revenue is recognised on receipt and recording in the books of the Surf Club.
- Income from the sale of merchandise and product from the canteen is recognised when the merchandise or product from the canteen is supplied to the customer.
- Income from hire of the club house (hall hire) is recognised at the time the club house is provided to the customer.
