PRESIDENTS REPORT

This was the busiest season for at Terrigal for lifesaving in 10 years and I would like to thank all our patrolling member for the efforts that they have put in during the season. Our 281 patrolling members volunteered a total of 9068 patrol hours and we had a total beach attendance at Terrigal of over 165,000 people. Our members performed a total of 62 rescues including 30 with a board or tube and 8 with an IRB. We also performed over 130 preventive actions and 328 first aids. We also had a number of after hours call outs the year and our team was put into action on multiple occasions performing searches and recoveries in tying conditions and even during the middle of a board meeting. Terrigal also when and assisted The Entrance, Wamberal and Pacific Palms (Lower North Coast Branch) Surf Clubs to meet there patrolling requirements this season with 2 groups going up to Pacific Palms. There was a major first aid incident at Terrigal in October 2023 with an outstanding group of patrolling members responding to an unconscious member of the public where CPR and defib was required with the patient ultimately surviving and the team being praised by the public and ambulance officers for their efforts.

The 2022 – 2023 Nippers season was a successful year that saw a return to normal competition, club nights and surf education for our junior members. Age Managers, coaches, volunteers, and families at Terrigal are incredibly supportive and their willingness to volunteer their time allows the kids to improve their skills, compete well, and create new friendships. Our new nippers enjoy positive role models who demonstrate their knowledge and skills at surf lifesaving. This year the Junior Activities team took on the organisation of two local carnivals at Terrigal Beach. Our 6's and 7's age groups had regular education sessions supported by Age Managers, Patrol Captains and our Education team. I would like to especially call out Dwayne Robertson, Beris Meldrum and Stuart Bennett for their support and engaging education lessons. Building surf skills is more important than ever for our newest Nippers and I look forward to continuing to work with the education team. We ran our annual rescue day supported by many of our IRB team members and jet ski operators who I think had just as much fun as the kids! The season also saw successful events and fundraising activity. The social committee organized a Halloween Disco, Colour Run and a Christmas twilight nippers and club night. SIPS after carnivals were very well attended. The end of year awards event was a great night and celebrated a great season, strong individual outcomes, and top team results.

In the 2022/23 season, I am pleased to report that Terrigal SLSC completed over 400 re qualifications and 120 new awards. This included, 27 new SRC qualifications, 20 new Bronze Medallions and 3 Gold Medallions. In addition, our membership was awarded 7 new Silver Medallion IRB Drivers, 3 new Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue, 4 new Silver Medallion Patrol Captain, 6 new IRB crew, 5 new ART, 42 new Provide First Aid certificates, 2 new RWC and 2 new endorsed trainers. At Terrigal, we have completed significant work to move towards SLSNSW aspirations, including progression of governance towards alignment to SLSNSW policy and focusing on what is deliverable in relation to club facilities.

The 2022/2023 competition season was another very successful year for Terrigal Surf Lifesaving Club. There are many people who work behind the scenes throughout the year for the benefit of all who compete for 'Team Terrigal' I believe this all helps to make our surf sports strong and competitive. Our athletes competed at local, state and national level in Board and Ski, Pool Rescue, Boats, Board riding and IRB competition. We are also proud to have had many athletes selected for representative teams including SLSCC Interbranch, Trans-Tasmin, NSW SLS, NSW Pool Rescue and NSW IRB Development Teams.

At the Branch Championships, Terrigal won overall with 724 points winning by more than 200 points ahead of the club who came second. Our 'Boaties' also won Bronze in the Reserve Women's and rowed in the Lifesaver Relay which won silver. At the NSW Championships, the Terrigal Board and Ski team had their most successful year with many personal best performances. Special mention to Kyle Graham who won gold in the U19 Male Board Race and Jack Woodhouse who won Bronze in the U17 Male Sprint Race and Lizzy Shearer who won Bronze in the Open Female Board Race. Our Juniors also won a range of medals at state including Darcie Hall (silver in U9 surf race), Beau McKeon (silver in U11 flags), Hayden

McGregor (Gold in U14 surf race) plus our U11 male sprint team and U14 male Cameron teams won gold medals and our U14 male board relay team picked up a bronze. At the Australian SLS Championships many competitors won medals and made finals including Hayden McGregor who won Gold in the U14 Board race and Lizzy Shearer, Skye Hackshall who won Gold in the U17 Board Rescue.

At the NSW State Pool Rescue Championships Terrigal finished second in the Opens and second in the Masters division and came away with 74 medals in total. At the Australian Pool Rescue Championships Terrigal won multiple medals, 3 members (Kye Green, Jack Baker, Zahra Green) were selected in the NSW Interstate Team and Paul Lemmon and Troy Rackleyft set a new Australian and World Record in the Line Throw. Our IRB racing team also had a successful season. At the NSW IRB Championships, Terrigal won 3 Bronze medals and in the NSW IRB Premiership the team finished the season with 1 gold, 2 silver and 4 bronze medals. At the Australian IRB Championships, 4 Terrigal teams made Australian finals and 9 athletes selected in the NSW IRB Interstate Development team.

The 2022-2023 season saw 951 members rejoin across many areas from Patrolling members, nippers and associate members. The Board introduced online Board Meeting Minutes and new Constitution passed at a Special General Meeting on the 16th July 2023. These offer improvements in Governance and record-keeping and ensure Terrigal SLSC is aligned with the SLSNSW template. We are also making progress towards renovating our surf club and have been working through new drawings, working with council etc. Numerous members have completed training in areas of admin, complaints handling etc. We have also appointed a Child Safety Coordinator and Complaints Manager and look forward to the 2023/24 season. Financially, Terrigal SLSC, continues to maintain its strong financial position. We have also secured grants for a new IRB trailer, First Aid training and a NSW Women's Week luncheon that included Beris Meldrum being recognised as a NSW Hidden Treasure. We also held a highly successful Rainbow Beaches initiative that involved people of all ages and multiple clubs with a free BBQ and more than 80 people participating in an inclusive paddle out in the form of a coloured rainbow.

In summary, it has been a privilege to be part of a strong and committed Club as Terrigal SLSC over the past season. New Life Members inducted Mardi Love and Justin Kaesar along with Terrigal SLSC Honour Blazers awarded to Stuart Bennett, Ryan Quick and Adam Montgomery. Our Clubperson of the year was Julie Redfern, Youth Clubperson was Jacob Curcio and Junior Clubperson was Maleah Edwards. I am thankful for all the support of SLSCC, SLSNSW and our sponsors along with the hard work of our Board, patrolling members, coaches, officials, athletes, parents and supporters and am looking forward to the 2023/24 season.

LIFESAVING REPORT

This season was the first since the end of 2020 where there were no COVID restrictions in place for us as lifesavers and for the community. We had 13 patrols again this season with most of them managing to get enough members to be able to patrol each day.

We had our fair share of challenges delivered to us through the year like a member of the public having a cardiac arrest in front of the war memorial only to make a full recovery in front of the patrol and leave in the ambulance talking to the patrols. Numerous near drowning particularly up towards the Wamberal ruins where our members were required to assist the NSW Ambulance service to take the casualty off the beach.

With the easing of restrictions and people not wanting to travel overseas for Christmas the beach was a popular option for many Australian this year and Terrigal was not immune from this. This year we saw our beach packed with swimmers from around 10am till flags down. These higher number of visitors also meant our patrols were required to perform more rescues than normal during this period with most patrols reporting upwards of 12 rescues with boards and tubes on a patrol each time they patrolled. We have also experienced a change in the beach conditions at Terrigal over the past couple of years which has led our beach to change from a lovely safe reflective beach most of the time to a low tide terrace with a permanent bar that ran through the flags and a gully that caught a lot of unsuspecting beach goers off guard. This has also led to many in the Surf Lifesaving community to change there thoughts of Terrigal been a Latté patrolling beach to one where we have to work, which is something most of us have known for a while and its about time people realise that Terrigal is not always an easy place to patrol.

This season we had 4 members step up to fill the gaps and patrol on multiple patrols to ensure that all our patrols had the required skills to meet the requirements of the Service Level Agreement I would like to thank Beris Meldrum, Toni Jones, Mike Wilson and Allison Smith who all stepped up and took on 2 full patrols this season and would like to ask that all members please upskill in the coming year so that all patrols are in a position to be self-reliant and not need others to step up.

This season saw us engage the services of Endeavour Marine to maintain our fleet of IRB motors which see a lot of use during the season and saw our equipment been professionally maintained which meant better reliability and safeguarding our members if something was to happen there was a record of the equipment been maintained.

We also had a number of after hours call out during the year and our call out team was put into action on multiple occasions performing searches and recoveries in tying conditions and even during the middle of a board meeting which brought to light that for the first time in approximately 10 years every member of our clubs board is a qualified and actively patrolling member of our club who all kicked into gear and did what needed to be done when required.

Terrigal also when and assisted The Entrance, Wamberal and Pacific Palms (Lower North Coast Branch) Surf Clubs to meet there patrolling requirements this season with 2 groups going up to Pacific Palms the first been Patrol 12 been lead by Rob Grassi who decided as a group they would go away for the weekend and assist the club by patrolling for 2 days and getting to stay at the club over night at no cost. The second group to do this was the IRB Racing team who went away for a team building and training weekend before there season got going and reports from both parties was that they were made to feel welcomed by the Club and would go back next season. to put this in perspective Pacific Palms has a total membership of 150-200 members with 40-50 of them actively patrolling so when clubs volunteer to go up and assist them it allows them to have a weekend away from the club particularly during the busy summer period. The Entrance and Wamberal SLSC we had multiple members volunteering to assist them when they were unable to get the necessary numbers and I would like to thank those who stepped up and help out our neighbouring clubs.

As previously stated, we have had one of our busiest seasons for 10 years and I would like to thank all our patrolling members for the efforts that they have put in during the year and that they get a chance to rest and recoup before the start of the upcoming season and proudly as a club we can say **“No Lives were lost at Terrigal”**.

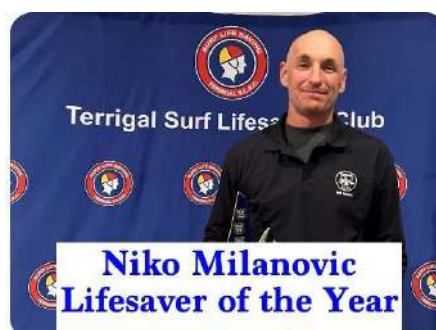

EDUCATION REPORT

Over 400 re qualifications and 120 new awards being achieved by the TSLSC members. I would recommend that members of Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club (TSLSC) read Surf Life Saving (SLS) New South Wales (NSW) Strategic Plan 2021-24, and the member survey (led by Dr Vivian Forner), that established at a macro level:

- Volunteering is on the decline. This has resulted in growing concern about the viability and sustainability of volunteering (with a 44% decline in volunteering worldwide, including Australia);
- The trend towards professionalising volunteering has put a strain on an often-dwindling pool of volunteers;
- The changing nature of volunteering is at odds with the demands of many volunteer roles;
- The number of volunteer organisations has increased; and
- As SLS is the largest volunteer organisation in Australia, therefore:
 - patrols will be harder to fill;
 - there will be an increase on demand on existing members; and
 - less access to new members.

At a micro level TSLSC challenges include:

- a changing population demographic;
- the age of many of Patrol Captains and patrol members;
- the time impost much of the administration, training and delivery required for the operation of the TSLSC;
- in the foreseeable short to medium term a tightening financial situation across society;
- the increasing number of people coming to the beach without swimming / beach skills;
- the growing legal and governance obligations; and
- alternate and competing options to involvement in SLS.

To meet the future challenges, organisational change is required and healthy, but uncomfortable. More than ever, it's important to focus on the SLSNSW vision of:

- Zero preventable deaths on the NSW coastline.

Significant work has already been undertaken in moving towards these aspirations, including progression of governance towards alignment to SLSNSW policy and focusing on what is deliverable in relation to club facilities. The foundation of the SLS movement is education and training, without which the skill sets required to achieve the outstanding outcomes of Rescues, First Aids, Preventative Actions, and the provision of a safe aquatic environment would not occur. The debt of thanks cannot be overstated to every trainer, assessor and facilitator who has given their time and energy to provide these developmental opportunities to every active club member.

ADMINISTRATION REPORT

It has been a big year and my first as Director of Administration. The Board have been working on improved Governance and communication. Board meetings are now managed via BoardPro in line with SLSCC and this enables electronic uploading of reports and documents and more transparent and simplified sharing of documents and resources. Member documents are being shared via the SLSA member portal which means club documents are shared with members rather than the general public. This follows the advice of SLSCC. Board meetings have shifted in the Agenda so the focus on decisions and issues rather than Director reports, this is enabling better action planning and approach to strategic decision-making at Terrigal SLSC.

The Board have also worked up a completely new Constitution based on the new SLSNSW template. This has been a huge job and while most of the elements remain similar, the structure and detail is completely new. The new Constitution has undergone extensive consultation with members in being drafted but has been open for member feedback via an online portal and in-person sessions held at the club. The new Constitution will go to a member vote at a Special General Meeting to be held immediately prior to the AGM on the 16th July 2023.

This past 12 months has seen a shift in the renovation strategy. At the end of 2022, it became clear that due to rising costs and changing member needs, a new training room and expensive rebuild of the surf club was not financially viable and high risk for the club. The Board commenced a process of reviewing the potential costs and feasibility of the renovation had it been proposed. The Board also held 2 in-person Q and A sessions to discussion options with members. A group of members also called a Special General Meeting that was held on 18th March 2023 - Motion 1 being voted down and Motion 2 succeeding (as per Minutes). Around 100 members came and voted at the SGM and it was great to see so many members passionate about the future of the club. The Board have then been working to consult a new architect, construction company, engineer, to liaise with Central Coast Council and NSW Department of Sport and Recreation. This work is ongoing but a new direction is now underway that will see new downstairs bathrooms, a modernised and refurbished upstairs club/function area and ideally an updated foyer and upstairs bathrooms (budget dependent).

Myself and others have attended workshops run by SLSNSW which have been great. These have included topics like Annual Report production, complaints management, child safe policies etc. We are thankful to SLSNSW for supporting our volunteers in this way. In terms of communication, the club has had a change in facebook manager as well as BluesNews and where possible we are giving a monthly Board update.

Having been new in the role, I can see there is much administrative work today, Other high priorities are producing updated Position Descriptions for all our roles to allow a better understanding for new volunteers. All ByLaws will be replaced by the new Constitution, where possible, and Policies where there is a gap. We understand this is a change for some but this is an important step forward and will help improve consistency and transparency of governance decisions.

Some work was done to review the viability of the previous Function Centre Business model and some significant inefficiencies were identified and have since been rectified. For now this area of the club is in a holding pattern until the renovations are complete and at such time, a new approach can be implemented.

I am thankful to all the volunteers at Terrigal SLSC who give so much of their time in pursuit of having a contemporary and inclusive and effective surf lifesaving club. The club takes many people to run it and each and every person is important to our success. Thank you to Glenn Bowles who started the season as President and then to Richard Green who has volunteered to take on the role at the present time.



Report on the Audit of the Financial Report

Opinion

NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Plant & Equipment Depreciation

Plant and equipment are recorded at cost and are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives.

The depreciation rates used for each class of assets are:

Building improvements:	4% to 20%
Surf equipment:	33%
Function room plant & fittings	20%
Office equipment:	20%

Plant and equipment which has an estimated useful life of one year or less have been expensed at purchase and are shown as gear purchases in the Club's profit and loss account.

(b) GST Units

Under the provisions of GST legislation relating to non-profit bodies, the Club has established independent accounting units for its separate functions with differing GST treatments.

The accounts of each of these independent units have been amalgamated in the preparation of the Club's accounts.

(c) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax and accordingly no liability is recorded.

(d) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

(e) Leases

The Club leases the land on which the Club premises are erected from a trust pursuant to the Crown Lands Act. A license has been provided to another entity to operate a café on part of those premises (refer note 19). As the Club is a not-for-profit entity the value of the lease of the premises has not been estimated. License fees from the sub-lease are taken up as income on an accrual basis.

(f) Revenue

Revenue is recognised as follows:

- Members income, donations and sponsorship revenue is recognised on receipt and recording in the books of the Surf Club.
- Income from the sale of merchandise and product from the canteen is recognised when the merchandise or product from the canteen is supplied to the customer.
- Income from hire of the club house (hall hire) is recognised at the time the club house is provided to the customer.

The license to operate the café arose from the exercise of an option on an existing licence and is for a 3 years and ninety nine days period commencing 25 September 2022.

The license per annum from 1 October 2022 is \$110,363 plus GST. Rental increases by the consumer price index on each anniversary.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 21 – SURPLUS RESERVED FOR CLUB MAINTENANCE AND RENOVATION

Funds on hand are invested to cover the ongoing running and maintenance costs of club, part funding of planned future upgrade of the club and a safety net in case our yearly income, sponsorship or grants are no longer forthcoming.

NOTE 22 – STATE GOVERNMENT GRANT & CONTINGENT LIABILITY

The Club successfully received approval of a \$500,000 Surf Club Facility Program 2021/22 grant from the NSW Office of Sport (the State Government) for alterations and additions to the Club's proposed building and facilities project (the Project) which was estimated at that time as costing approximately \$1,276,000. The Club subsequently received a first instalment of \$150,000 in the 2023 financial year in anticipation of works commencing. Further, the Club's application for a further \$500,000 grant from the Federal government was rejected and as a result the Committee decided not to proceed with the Project in its current form and proposes to modify the Project to reduce the cost. The Club has not incurred legitimate expenditure towards appropriate costs associated with the grant and is required to obtain approval from the State Government on the proposed modifications and amendments to the Project. As a result there is a risk that the Club may not obtain approval and until such time as appropriate costs are incurred, may be required to refund the first instalment of \$150,000.

NOTE 23 – EVENTS SUBSEQUENT TO REPORTING DATE

Except for the event described in Note 22 there have been no events subsequent to reporting date which would have a material effect on the Club's financial statements at 30 April 2023.
