\*As per Item 8.8(b) of the TSLSC Constitution, Criteria for assessment of Life Membership: (i) The nominee has been an exemplary active member of the Club for at least 20 years; or (ii) have been exemplary active member of the Club for at least 15 years, including at least four (4) years on the Board of the Club. All duties must have been completed in an outstanding manner; and (iii) it is considered that they will continue to be an outstanding ambassador for the Club. Detailed information about each nomination will be provided prior to the AGM.

\*\*As per Item 19.1 of the TSLSC Constitution, self-nominations are now open for the positions listed under Agenda Items 6 and 7. Nominations should be emailed to the Director of Administration (<a href="mailto:admin@terrigalsurfclub.com.au">admin@terrigalsurfclub.com.au</a>). Nominations closed on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> August 2025 at 5pm. Applications must include your name, position applied for, statement of claim (why you want the role and what you will bring to the role). Names of applicants will be shared with members via surfguard prior to the meeting.

Members nominating for Agenda Item 6, MUST BE FINANCIAL at the time of nomination and eligible to vote at the 2024/2025 AGM. If a position is not nominated for in writing, that position will remain vacant until a later date. NO NOMINATION WILL BE ACCEPTED FROM THE FLOOR. A CLOSED BALLOT will be held for the positions irrespective of the number of candidates. This ensures the membership has a vote on the suitability of that candidate.

To vote at the AGM, a member must be; (i) financial member of TSLSC for the 2024/2025 season; (ii) an active member 15 years or over on the day of the meeting; (iii) a Life Member or Board Member; or (iv) a current Associate Member with a minimum of 3 consecutive of seasons TSLSC membership. There will be no proxy voting.

#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Another incredible season has come and gone at Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club, and what a year it has been. I want to take this opportunity to sincerely thank all our patrolling members for their dedication and commitment throughout the season. Your tireless efforts continue to make our Club the proud and respected organisation that it is.

I am immensely proud to share that Terrigal SLSC has once again been named **Central Coast Club of the Year**—our second consecutive win. Building on that, last year we achieved an extraordinary milestone: being awarded both the **New South Wales Surf Life Saving Club of the Year** and **Surf Life Saving Australia Club of the Year**. This was a first in our Club's history and a remarkable achievement that reflects the passion, hard work, and unity of our entire Club community.

These accolades are not won by individuals but by the collective efforts of many. I would like to extend special thanks to our Board members for their ongoing leadership and commitment. A heartfelt thank you to **Julie Redfern** for her tireless work in preparing the comprehensive documentation required for these prestigious awards. I also acknowledge **Adam Montgomery**, **Julie**, and **Jayden Redfern**, who represented Terrigal at the national presentations and interviews. Winning these awards is no small feat—it was a true team effort and one that we can all be proud of. The team spent endless hours preparing for the presentation and interview...and by all accounts they nailed it. We had an extraordinary year at Terrigal SLSC and to be acknowledged in this way was very exciting. On the back of great success at the NSW Awards of Excellence, we took a bus load of 40 members down the to SLSA Awards of Excellence on the 9<sup>th</sup> of November 2025. To be announced the winner was historic for our club and for Central Coast Branch.

In December 2025, we completed a major renovation of our Club facilities, including upgrades to the front foyer and entrance, the function and training room, ground floor bathrooms, and the gym. We received the Occupancy Certificate on 7<sup>th</sup> December 2025 and had a grand opening the following weekend. The renovation includes all new AV system, energy efficient lighting and display cabinets. New signage has been installed, along with enhanced security, a newly renovated gym and a beautiful new clock generously donated by **Central Coast Council**. The transformation is fantastic, and we're thrilled with the result—it truly reflects the pride we have in our Club. We could not be more happy with the result and the club is now set up for the future. The entire exterior of the club was also repainted with support of Dulux and Central Coast Council. We managed to complete the works and still have significant savings our investment account which was our goal.

Our beach continues to be a hub for the community and tourists alike, with an estimated **154,000 visitors** enjoying Terrigal Beach this season. With around **900 active members**, we're proud to report **zero drowning deaths** this season—a direct result of the dedication and vigilance of our volunteer patrols. Over the season, our members completed an impressive **7,988 patrol hours**, performing **7,149 preventative actions**, **136 first aid treatments**, and **10 rescues**. These figures highlight not only the importance of our presence on the beach but also the high level of training and readiness among our lifesavers. We have placed a strong focus on training and development, and now have many highly skilled and qualified lifesavers serving our community. I am particularly proud to say we now have 10 qualified UAV (drone) pilots and 2 drones at Terrigal to keep our beach safe. These offer a new way for monitoring the beach and we look forward to expanding the program.

Over 50 members received and were recognised with various awards including 28 Patrol Service Awards, 8 National Medals, 2 SLSA Long Service Awards, 2 x 20-year SLSNSW officiating certificates. Our Director of Administration Julie Redfern was awarded a Member of

the Order of Australia (AM) on Australia Day 2025 for "significant service to cardiology, allied health, research and education, and to the community." This is an extraordinary achievement and the first AM for Terrigal SLSC. Julie has been a member of TSLSC for 14 years including 7 on the Board. She has also been an age manager and regular official in her early years and played a huge role in successful and cost-effective delivery of our clubhouse renovation. Her role in revising our contracts, governance, documentation, communication and leadership combined with her personal work on our club of the year nominations was incredible. Thank you Julie!

We continued our partnerships with the NSW Cancer Council and Terrigal/Wamberal RSL to host ANZAC Day Dawn Service. We also created new partnerships with The Glen Rehab and Rotary for the 'Quicksand' run. Our social media continues to expand and on facebook and Instagram have 3600 and 2125 followers respectively. Thank you to our Ocean Swim Committee and all who volunteered to help out including providing water safety. This event continues to be a big success and fund-raiser for the club.

We continue to strength our volunteerism for Branch and State. This year we hosted Brach and boat carnivals. We have large numbers of junior, youth, open and Master's Athletes competing in all disciplines including ocean, pool and lifesaving events. Congratulations to all our competitors and supporters and thank you to all our coaches, officials and volunteers. Many athletes achieved personal goals, won medals Branch/State/Aussies medals in board and ski, boats, lifesaving and pool rescue; 11 members (athletes, coach, Team Manager) were selected for SLSCC Interbranch Team.

Our Director of Lifesaving, Tim Pittolo also took on the role of SEMC at Branch carnivals and others were selected for the SLSA/SLSNZ Powercraft Exchange Program. Other members hold volunteers roles for Branch and NSW and we thank all for the ongoing service. Congratulations to Kim Petley, Ryan Quick, Adam Montgomery and Stuart Bennet who were awarded Life Membership at the 2024 AGM. Also congratulations to Richard Green, Julie Redfern and Josh Cole for being awarded TSLSC Honor Blazers at the 2025 Presentation.

Terrigal SLSC continues to grow stronger each year. Our achievements are the result of the passion, teamwork, and unwavering community spirit that defines our Club. Thank you once again to all our members, the Board, volunteers, supporters, and sponsors. Here's to another safe and successful season ahead.

Terrigal Surf Lifesaving Club had another busy and very successful competition year during the 2024/2025 season. The season began with our pool rescue team competing strongly. Terrigal SLSC had a strong year in Pool Rescue, showcasing talent and teamwork across multiple major events.

**World Lifesaving Championships – August 2024** A dedicated team of five competitors represented Terrigal SLSC at the World Lifesaving Championships, held at the Gold Coast Aquatic Centre. All athletes raced exceptionally well, achieving both team and individual medals, and gaining invaluable experience at the highest level of competition.

**Surfboat Report:** This 2024/25 season Terrigal started off with 3 crews, Open men, Open women and reserve men. We also regained the services of Grant Stringer as the sweep of Open men crew a few weeks into the season. Unfortunately, due to life commitments the Open women and reserves men's crew could not see out the season. The crews competed in the Stevens Group series, Branch Champs and Aussies Champs. Unfortunately, due to an overlook we were not entered into the State champs.

### Notes To The Financial Statements For The Financial Year Ended 30 April 2025

#### 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act 2009*, the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*, the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991* and associated regulations. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is an association registered under the *Associations Incorporations Act 2009* and domiciled in New South Wales.

The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

These are special purpose financial statements that have been prepared for the purpose of complying with the *Australian Charites and Not-for-profits Commissions Act 2012* and associated regulations. The Executive Committee have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members of the Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Inc.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the AASB and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements'; AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows'; AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors'; AASB 1048 'Interpretations of Standards'; AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures' as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities.

#### **Accounting Policies**

#### Revenue

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the company and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Sale of goods

Sale of goods revenue is recognised at the point of sale, which is when the customer takes receipt of the goods, the risks and rewards are transferred to the customer and there is a valid sales contract. Amounts disclosed as revenue are net of sales returns and discounts.

Functions and Events

Revenue from functions and events are recognised once the event is held in the Club facilities and has meet its obligations to provide a venue for the expressed purpose agreed with the parties.

Membership fees

Revenue from membership fees is recognised at time of receipt.

Grants and donations

Grant & donation income is recognised as revenue when received unless they are designated for a specific purpose, where they are carried forward as prepaid income on the balance sheet.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

### Notes To The Financial Statements For The Financial Year Ended 30 April 2025

#### 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Cont...)

#### Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value

#### Buildinas

Buildings are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event that the carrying amount of buildings is greater than its estimated recoverable amount the decrease in value is shown in the profit and loss statement as a revaluation decrease

#### Plant and Equipment / Surf Patrol Equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event the carrying amount of plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses are recognised in the profit or loss as revaluation decreases if the impairment losses relate to the revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present.

#### Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets, including buildings and capitalised lease assets is depreciated on a straight line or diminishing-value basis over the asset's useful life to the entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease of the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are:

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at end of each reporting period.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with carrying amount. These gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss in the period which they arise. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

#### Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within short-term borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

#### **Goods and Services Tax**

Revenues, expenses and assets recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included in other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

#### Notes To The Financial Statements For The Financial Year Ended 30 April 2025

#### 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Cont...)

#### **Income Tax**

As the company is a charitable institution in the terms of subsection 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.

#### **Trade and Other Payables**

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the company during the reporting period that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

#### **Comparative Figures**

Where required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

#### **Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements**

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that may have a financial impact on the entity and that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

#### 14. Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets

Café License

The license to operate the Café is in accordance with a signed agreement which permits the operator to operate a café from the Club's premises for a period of 3 years and 99 days from commencement being 25 September 2022 (license is due to expire on the 31 December 2025).

The license fee during the current financial year, included a rent-free period during the Club's renovation and upgrade. The license fee received for the year is \$88,379 plus GST and is inclusive of consumer price index increases applied annual on the 1 October.

Other than the Café license arrangements above, the Committee members are not aware of any significant contingent liabilities or contingent assets addressing the Association at reporting date.

#### Report on the Financial Report

#### **Qualified Opinion**

We have audited the accompanying financial report of Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated (the Club), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 April 2025, statement of profit or loss & other comprehensive income, statement of changes in members' funds and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, notes comprising a summary of material accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the committee members' declaration.

In our opinion, except for the effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion section of our report, the financial report of Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is in accordance with Associations Incorporations Act (NSW) 2007 ('the Act'), including::

- (a) giving a true and fair view of the Club's financial position as at 30 April 2025 and of its performance for the year ended on that date; and
- (b) complying with Australian Accounting Standards Reduced Disclosure Requirements and the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulation 2013*.
- (c) the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991, including
  - (i) the financial report shows a true and fair view of the financial result of fundraising appeals for the year to which they relate; and
  - (ii) the financial report and associated records have been properly kept during the year in accordance with this Act and the regulations; and
  - (i) money received as a result of fundraising appeals conducted during the year has been properly accounted for and applied in accordance with this Act and the regulations; and

#### **Basis for Qualified Opinion**

The financial statements of the Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated include \$14,301 of inventories as at 30 April 2025. Fortunity Assurance did not observe the counting of physical inventories at the beginning or the end of the year, however, have assessed valuation of inventory. Due to the nature of the Club inventory, we are unable to satisfy ourselves by alternative means the inventory quantities recognised as at 30 April 2025. As a result, we were unable to determine if any adjustment with respect to the existence of inventory recorded is necessary and related impact on the income statement.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. We are independent of the Club in accordance with the auditor independence requirements and ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional accountants (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

#### **Emphasis of Matter**

The financial report of Terrigal Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial report.

#### Other Information

The Committee Members are responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Club's annual report for the year ended 30 April 2025 but does not include the financial report or our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial report does not cover the other information and accordingly we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial report, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial report or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears materially misstated.
