Congratulations go to Keron Gaul for being selected in the Branch under 21 team. Peter Talbot and Will Anido must have been unlucky not to have gained selection.

Bay to Breakers Run - Swim - Run was again a highly successful event conducted on the Christmas Weekend when the traditional Twilight Surf Carnival was also held. Hopefully, it will develop into an annual event attracting top competitors from all over the State. Our thanks go to Gosford Amateur Swimming Club for their hard work and organisation for making it so successful. With both events on the one weekend, it proved to be an outstanding tourist attraction.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Although last season we had a great year, if anyone had told me that we would finish this season with:

- \$6,000 in the bank,
- A major sponsorship for the coming year,
- Fourth place in both the Branch Championships Overall and handicap point score,
- Over 70 lifesaving awards gained,
- An increase in active membership,

and best of all

- No lives lost,

I didn't think I would have believed them. However, that's the situation at the moment.

The money in the bank represents an \$8,000 improvement on last year's situation. Although everyone is to be thanked for their financial support special mention should go to Doug Anido who raised over \$8,000 with his stall, and Rick Legge for looking after all our funds to ensure that we did finish "in the black" this year. To our sponsors this season we also extend our thanks for making our job a lot easier.

On the subject of sponsors, next season sees the beginning of a hopefully long relationship with Taubmans and Mitre 10 agreeing to sponsor the club. These two companies have agreed to initially fund \$5,500 worth of gear for the 1986/87 season. Such a commitment makes budgeting and purchasing of gear for the coming year a lot easier. I hope that the club does everything possible to ensure the sponsors get their money's worth out of us.

In the competition sphere Terrigal has started to once again be a force to be reckoned with. Len Cook came from Avoca to motivate and train our competitors and quite a few people found themselves excelling at branch level. Our beach relay side even came in third in the Ettalong Fosters Challenge against the best in Australia. This improvement in competition is gratifying to see because the improvement in skills that competition brings can only be beneficial [both to the club and the competitors] in the long run. It also provides incentive for people to join the club because everyone loves a winner.

Membership, particularly active membership, has continued to grow. Over 70 lifesaving awards were gained by members this year. It is good to see that most people are not content to get just their bronze medallion-many are going for ARC and IRB awards as soon as they are able.

This attitude of increased proficiency is being displayed in the patrols too. Sixteen [16] people got 100% patrol efficiency, and as I said earlier, no lives were lost this year.

Overall this has been a very special season. It has been one of the most successful seasons which ever way you look at it. It could not have occurred without a special commitment from everyone, and I thank you all personally for that. Some people have been especially helpful to me and I would like to thank here Rick, Doug, Len Cook, Keith and Gail Grimley, Paul Hawkins, Jamie Legge, Peta Daly, Paul Martin and John Trickett.

In closing I just want to observe that this year's spectacular success seems to have occured because a lot of people have put in just a little bit of extra effort, and have got out of it a lot of extra pleasure. If this happens again next year it might just make this years successes look petty.

COMPETITION REPORT

Starting off at the beginning of the season we entered about 18 in the Mac-Masters Beach Surf Carnival. Most of these had never competed in open carnivals before. Out of the competitors were laid the foundations of one of the best seasons this club has had in its recent history.

Beach Teaming

This success was attributed mainly by the attitude of the competitors. They went into their races with nothing to lose and everything to gain. Winning was only a bonus.

Our most successful competitors during the year were as follows:-

Open Beach Relay comprising of Peter Talbot, John Trickett, Craig Adams and Paul Minto. Reserves used during the year were Gerald Cadden and Des Johns. After winning most of the local carnivals this year, the boys were unlucky to go down to a very strong Ocean Beach combination at the Branch Titles. At State they made their only mistake of the whole year by dropping their baton. Bad luck boys! Next year, if they happen to train seriously for a change, the big titles are not beyond their reach.

Peter Talbot showed his class during the season with numerous placings in the open beach sprint. With concentration Peter has the potential to go to the top. [It would be interesting to see how he would go on an early night rather than early morning.

Paul Minto started the year slowly to come through at the end with a good plac ing at Branch in his Junior Sprint. Paul moves into the seniors next season so we hope he can continue to improve.
