

### PRESIDENTS REPORT

It is an honour to be presenting my President's report for Terrigal SLSC. Terrigal has had another very hectic and rewarding season for its members and the community. The season started off with once again Mother Nature having her way and taking most of the sand from our beach from the rock pool end up to the carpark. This exposed a bit of the Terrigal history along with concrete stairs and timber pilings. But as has happened over many years, the sand did come back to the beach and Terrigal was able to portray another great location for the summer season for our locals and visitors alike.

Over the course of the 2015-16 seasons, our club membership stands at approx. 1,040 members, plus around the surf club every day from dawn to dusk is a hive of activity with swimmers, exercise groups, coffee goers, walkers, joggers and members training, creating a large mix of people along Terrigal beach. Members volunteered over 8,700 patrol hours looking after Terrigal beach and beyond. This included 563 hours of water safety watching over our junior members. Rescues this season numbered 34, with a huge 3,786 preventative actions performed. Our skilled first aiders treated 3 major cases along with a further 950 people with minor injuries (the majority being stingers). Our patrol members not only looked after our immediate area on Terrigal beach, but also attended to many major incidents around the Terrigal business area, the Esplanade, north to Wamberal beach and around the Haven when called upon. We owe a huge gratitude to the time and effort of all our volunteer patrol captains, first aiders, educators and patrol members for a job well done.

Our junior members (numbering 369) once again had a busy season with their days at Terrigal learning their Surf education skills, training and attending carnivals. They have been involved in many activities around the central coast for our Branch and the community.

Once again our senior and masters competitors in every category of surf sports were hard at it training and competing up and down the east coast of Australia. As highlighted in this annual report Terrigal also had members gain great honours in representing not only our club, but NSW and Australia in SLS teams.

I congratulate our Terrigal SLSC winners from our season of the clubs major awards, the Branch awards and those that went onto State awards. Our Duke of Edinburgh participants also ventured to WA to gain their awards in this worthy movement for youth of Australia.

Terrigal beach has over the season provided many community activities such as the ANZAC Day Dawn service, Saturday markets, end of the 5 Lands walk as well as Ocean swims, junior carnivals, IRB carnivals, surf boat carnival and more. Thank you to all our club members who chip in and give of their time to make these events a success.

All our efforts could not be achieved if not for our major sponsors supporting Terrigal, namely Crowne Plaza Terrigal; Raine & Horne Terrigal and Domain. Our support from The Surf Café and continued support from Gosford City Council has been invaluable to our club. Thank you also to all our minor sponsors and supporters that believe in the work that Terrigal SLSC does for our community. The club is still working away at getting our DA approved and then chasing funding for the extension to the surf club that will enable us to provide better facilities for members, community groups, beach goers and visitors alike. This will hopefully allow the club to be more self-sufficient into the future and help us to plan for the inevitable cost of maintaining and up grading our facility. We will continue to provide a safe environment for

the education and activities for our juniors, watch over the community as they enjoy the ocean in and around Terrigal and be part of the wider community and businesses with a mutual partnership and involvement.

After some time consuming and long hours delving into our club history by our historian, Cathy Cole, it would appear that Terrigal SLSC is closing in on its centenary year in 2020. This will be exciting times and we look forward to providing a pictorial history of our club and celebration with past and present members.

Thank you to all our club directors for the time and effort they put in, to Beris as our staff administrator for her work and Linda for the great work she does in running our function centre and always striving to make it better.

### OUR CLUB HISTORY REWRITTEN WITH NEW EVIDENCE

When researching what we believed was the 90th Anniversary in 2015, old newspaper articles have shown that Terrigal SLSC was, in fact, founded in the year 1920, not 1925 as we thought.

In this year the Terrigal Progress Association put a building application in to Erina Shire Council for the construction of a Clubhouse for Terrigal Surf Club. A grant of 90 pounds was received from the Erina Council to assist with the construction and approval was given in February 1920.



The first Patron of the Terrigal Surf Club, Mr W.M.Fleming was also appointed in the same month. In September of 1920 the building material had been purchased and was on site awaiting the final positioning advice from Council noting that "...the club will be in full swing this season". The fence had already been constructed, was being painted and the Surf Club Members were "...anxious to start work on the building and...to have everything complete...for the next season".

In February 1921 Council acknowledged they needed to nominate 'Trustees' for the Terrigal Surf Club building. Minutes from the AGM in February 1922 talk about the successful season (1921) just passed and "...great enthusiasm being shown at the future prospects of the club". Also that Royal Life Saving members had instructed the Terrigal members and it was hoped that they would be fully Certified in "land drill, resuscitation work and line work" within a month.



In the 1923/24 season, something happened (and may never know what!) and the decision was made, by the same President who had held that position since 1920, that the club be "reorganised". This took place with great media coverage in 1925 which is why that date has always been considered the founding date.

These facts, backed up by many more, show that Terrigal was a functioning club in 1920, active enough to gain financial support from the Council and to construct their own Surf Club premises.

As a result of this, our present Executive has altered the acknowledged formation date for Terrigal Surf Club to the season of 1920......which means that we celebrate our centenary in 2020!





# JUNIOR ACTIVITIES

The 2015/16 season was one of the most difficult in recent times with our ability to effectively run junior activities impacted by lack of beach as well as struggling for volunteer assistance across a number of key areas. As a volunteer organisation Terrigal relies on the assistance of members and parents to act as age managers, coaches, officials, water safety, BBQ coordination, managing gear and many more behind the scenes job.

The season commenced with Terrigal again hosting the Round 1 of the Newcastle Permanent Junior Iron person for the U10- U17. Terrigal did well with Bailey Johns and Jackson O'Mara taking out round wins along with consistent top three finishes from Sam Cummins and Lucy Hayes. This season competitors finishing in the top 16 headed to Newcastle in December to compete as the curtain raiser for the Nutri Grain Ironman Series. This was a huge thrill for our nippers and thanks to SLSCC for making it happen as well as Michelle Johns as Chief Judge and Tony O'Mara as the series starter.

The first week in November, Terrigal was hammered by big surf in the lead up to hosting the first Central Coast Junior Carnival which seen all beach events located to the lagoon area. Things started well but it was apparent after the first water events that it was going to be a tough day. Unfortunately conditions worsened and after several delays water events were cancelled. The impact on the beach unfortunately remained for the season.

The resulting conditions seen the Under 6 and 7s located primarily to the Haven due to lack of beach whilst the rest of the crew got use to the long walk to set up beach areas at the Lagoon for Sunday nippers.

In looking back at the season we only had five nipper days where were able to run at home. The impact of a disjointed season also seen our BBQ revenue down around 20% on previous seasons.

On a positive we welcomed Hogs Breath Café Terrigal as a sponsor which seen the provision of age and training flags as well as sponsorship of the Hogs Breath Award for each age group after Carnivals as well as the Junior Club Person of the Year which was awarded to Dylan Heinze. The Hogs Breath team also assisted with carnival catering and several junior events throughout the season as well as supplying members with frequent diner cards. Thanks to all our sponsors Hogs Breath Café Terrigal, Crown Plaza Terrigal, Chemist Outlet, Littles and Engine.

In 2015/16 a decision was made to cap the number of nippers in the U6 and U7 age groups. Whilst a number of families missed out on joining Terrigal, It had become apparent as had the numbers increased as in recent years our ability to manage and deliver quality outcomes for the nippers during their first years in surf lifesaving would have been impossible. Given the issues that we encountered throughout the season the feedback from the groups was positive.

Thanks to our junior Club Captains, Tahni DeAthe, Emmy Pettiford, Dylan Heinze and Oliver Robinson for their efforts throughout the season. On the representative front our U13's Harrison Williams and Sam Cummins gained selection in the Central Coast Branch Team and Tahni DeAthe and Dylan Heinze represented the Club in the Junior Life Saver the Year competition.

To our age managers and coaches - Paul, Luke, Joel, Richard, Rachelle, Danielle, Zak, Derek with Kylie and Kim on the beach thank you for your efforts throughout the season along with parents and siblings that assisted. Age managing and coaching are not easy tasks made harder by larger groups and varying levels of skills and surf confidence of nippers as well as finding the balance between fun and competition which is a constant challenge.

During the season Terrigal was fortunate to have surf stars, Ali Day, Tara Coleman and the King Shannon Eckstein involved in skills clinics for our nippers which were very well received.

The Rookies (U13/U14) stepped up with major fund raising including catering for the Nippers Disco, Ducks for Bucks and Cinema under the Stars. This season the Rookies raised over \$2,000 and thanks to Kate for her efforts as Rookies Coordinator and to the small band of Rookies that were on hand to assist in every fund raising event. It is also pleasing to see our Rookies once again participating and leading community events such as the ANZAC Dawn service for the fifth year. This year we committed to ensuring our relevance in the community. This was achieved by the actions of our nippers but also through our facebook page which seen over 30,000 individuals reached – thanks to all our members and friends that followed our journey.

# LIFE MEMBERS REPORT

The financial report has disclosed that the Life Members Fund enjoys a credit balance of \$66,963.97(Sixty six thousand, nine hundred and sixty three dollars and 97¢). These funds are held at National Australia Bank A/c # 53878-5225 (\$1,175.30) and Term Deposit #12-236-0215 (\$65,787.67). This Term Deposit is due to mature on 27<sup>th</sup> August, 2016. The deposit and interest due to \$918.48 will be rolled over for a further term.

The Life Members fund has seen an increase of \$2,398.67 over the past year. The increase is Term Deposit interest of \$2,398.67.

Donations to the Surf Club have now exceeded \$17,700 since the Fund was established in 1983. The vision for the establishment of the Fund was to create a "Future Fund" for the enhancement of the Club's growth in the ensuring years. The fund is not there for the utilization by any committee or committees. The Fund is fully run by the Life Members and is conducted on a perpetual basis.

Below is a short summary of the history of the Life Members Fund -

- Foundation of the Life Members Fund during 1983. Foundation members were Life Member Mark Power and Life Member Peter Wyllie.
- Fund established for future members to receive the benefit of the past and present members of the Club.
- Fund to be conducted on a perpetual basis and continue to remain this way.
- Core assets to be retained to ensure the future of the Trust.
- An amount of up to 80% of the interest earned to be donated to the Club at the discretion of the trustees on an annual basis. Thus a minimum amount of the remaining 20% of interest income will be retained to ensure future growth of the Fund.
- The Fund will not intentionally impede on the Club's fund raising efforts and all funds raised in the name of the Fund to be retained by the Fund.
- Life Member Jack Tennent made a donation from his estate in 1989-1990 season of the sum of \$1,000.
- First objective target of the Fund was \$10,000 and this was achieved in the 1992/1993 season.
- Funds in excess of \$17,700 have been donated to the Club since the Fund was established in 1983. This
  amount has been made up of direct cash donations and the value of the jackets which are presented on the
  Awards of Excellence Night.
- The vision for this Fund is that in the future the Fund will be able to provide one or more scholarships/sponsorships for the members of the Club on an annual basis. These awards will take the form of educational funding or direct sporting cost funding. This, however, will not occur until the Fund achieves sufficient capital to make this possible.

The Trustees have received several enquiries with regard to legacies to the Fund. A Trust Deed is in the process of being prepared to meet the wishes of these donors.

Through the fund all donations are making a serious investment towards the training and resourcing of our volunteer lifesavers. Legacy gifts will ensure that the next generation of up and coming lifesavers will be prepared to take on critical lifesaving tasks in the future.

The Life Members are happy to answer any enquiries on the principal function and direction of the Fund at any time.

We will also be grateful for any meaningful input on future fund raising opportunities or direct contribution to the Fund.

It was a great pleasure to have Gregory Elfick and Paul Broadbent elected as Life Members of the club at the last Annual General meeting.

Each of these members have given many years of dedicated service to ensure the Club lives up to the motto of "Vigilance and service".

It is a credit to the Club to elevate both members to the status of Life Members and we welcome them to ensure their vast experience will continue to assist the Club to maintain the standard and respect that the Club holds in the community.

The present Trustees of the Life Members Fund are Mark Power, David Mansfield and Peter Wyllie.

The Life Members held a meeting and conducted an election for the 2016-2017 season. Life Members Mark Power, David Mansfield and Peter Wyllie were re-elected for a further term. These Life Members names will be forwarded for ratification at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting.

# NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

## (a) Plant & Equipment Depreciation

Plant and equipment are recorded at cost and are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives.

The depreciation rates used for each class of assets are:

Building improvements: 4% to 20% Surf equipment: 33% Function room plant & fittings 20% Office equipment: 20%

Plant and equipment which has an estimated useful life of one year or less have been expensed at purchase and are shown as gear purchases in the Club's profit and loss account.

### (b) GST Units

Under the provisions of GST legislation relating to non-profit bodies, the Club has established independent accounting units for its separate functions with differing GST treatments.

The accounts of each of these independent units have been amalgamated in the preparation of the Club's accounts.

#### (c) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax and accordingly no liability is recorded.

### (d) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

#### (e) Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the Club, are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Leased assets are amortised on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives where it is likely that the Club will obtain ownership of the asset or over the term of the lease. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the period in which they are incurred.

### (f) Revenue

Revenue is recognised as follows:

- Members income, donations and sponsorship revenue is recognised on receipt and recording in the books of the Surf Club.
- Income from the sale of merchandise and product from the canteen is recognised when the merchandise or product from the canteen is supplied to the customer.
- Income from hire of the club house (hall hire) is recognised at the time the club house is provided to the customer.
